
SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST June 3, 2018 - 10:45 AM



Deuteronomy makes clear that sabbath-keeping is meant for the welfare of all. God delivered the Israelites out of slavery, so they should not ever work anyone else seven days a week. Even slaves should be able to rest; even resident aliens. Yet human beings can turn even the most liberating religious practice into a lifedestroying rule. Jesus does not reject sabbathkeeping, but defends its original life-enhancing meaning. Our worship and our religious way of life are to lead to the hungry being fed and the sick being healed.

Zone so that parents may share the worship experience with their children in a meaningful, stress-free way. At the 10:45 service, our nursery is also available for ages 0 - 3 (for those yet unable to benefit from the G.I.F.T. Zone activities.)



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FIRST READING

Lector: A reading from Deuteronomy.

Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work—you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day. *(Deuteronomy 5:12-15)*

Lector: Word of God, Word of life.

People: Thanks be to God.

PSALM 81:1-10

- Lector: Sing with joy to God our strength and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacob.
- People: Raise a song and sound the timbrel, the merry harp, and the lyre.
- Lector: Blow the ram's horn at the new moon, and at the full moon, the day of our feast;
- People: for this is a statute for Israel, a law of the God of Jacob.
- Lector: God laid it as a solemn charge upon Joseph, going out over the land of Egypt, where I heard a voice I did not know:

- People: I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it.

SECOND READING


Lector: A reading from 2 Corinthians.

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. *(2 Corinthians 4:5-12)*

GOSPEL LESSON

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to Mark.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

Pastor: One sabbath [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath." Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him. (Mark 2:23--3:6)







DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

This meal is the Lord's Supper of grace and is open to ALL Christians of any background or denomination. As Lutheran Christians, we believe in **Christ's true presence** in, with, and under the elements. We invite you to have your name tag visible so that the ministers may include **your name** as they offer you the elements. Communion at Living Springs is by **intinction** (bread is dipped into the wine or grape juice). In response to the words, "Body of Christ, given for you. Blood of Christ, shed for you," each worshipper may respond with, "**Amen."** If you require a **gluten free wafer**, please let your worship assistant know so they can accommodate you. Each chalice contains two compartments: wine is located in the larger compartment, while **alcohol-free grape juice** is located in the smaller compartment for those who require it. After receiving the elements, you are welcome to remain kneeling at the rail for meditation and prayer (others may simply fill in the open spaces). **Children** who have not received communion instruction are invited to come forward for a special blessing. Simply fold your hands to indicate you would like to receive the blessing.

+ COMMEMORATIONS FOR TODAY +

The Martyrs of Uganda, died 1886

On June 3, 1886, thirty-two young men were burned to death for refusing to renounce Christianity. The confident manner in which these Christians went to their deaths contributed to a much stronger Christian presence in Uganda.

John XXIII, Bishop of Rome, died 1963

When elected pope, the former Angelo Roncalli was expected to be a short-term caretaker. He showed great spirit, though, and convened the Second Vatican Council which helped bring great changes to Roman Catholic and other churches.

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST:

Holy How?

As children, the brother and sister had very different relationships with sabbath. Under the thumb and eye of Aunt Jose, who lived with them, the sabbath was a day of tyrannical prohibitions for the sister. Aunt Jose's piety employed the third commandment with the unbending sharpness of the hat pin that attached felt and feathers to her wisps of hair every Sunday morning for services. Rules and their keeping did not plague the brother, however. Enduring chronic Sunday loneliness when friends and neighbors disappeared into activities and adventures that didn't include him was what made sabbath a dreaded day.

It wasn't whether the sabbath was or was not holy that distanced the Pharisees and Jesus from one another; it was how the sabbath would be holy that marked their miles of separation.

Sabbath, ending or beginning? Sabbath, seventh day or first day? Sabbath, law or gospel? Sabbath, restriction or freedom? Sabbath, receive or give? Sabbath, pray or work? Sabbath, must or may? Sabbath, holy how?

The debates in the grain fields and the synagogue are a radical disagreement, but not a contest pitting hunger and disease against feeding and healing. They are about how to steward the gifts God puts in our hands.

To steward sabbath only as culmination, the last day of creation, tempts us to remove ourselves from participation in God's ever-creative activity in the world. To steward sabbath only as preparation, the beginning of seven days, tempts us to imagine that the work of creation depends wholly on our own activity.

Sabbath is God's gift of grace so that we may rest from the clamoring of anxieties, illusions, and urgencies to do what we need not or cannot do. Sabbath is God's gift of grace that we may rise to greet every day as holy, to feed and to be fed, to heal and to be healed.

Observe the sabbath day and keep it as a holy how.

SEASONAL NAME TAG – In order to show hospitality, we ask everyone to stop by the table under the portico and complete a name tag with our seasonal scripture verse. The tags allow everyone to use names as we share the Peace - and allow communion ministers to speak your name (*please make sure your name is visible when you come to the altar rail*).

RESTROOMS – are located in the Administration Building on both levels. Greeters/ushers will be happy to show you the way. Main level restrooms are equipped with diaper changing stations. For your child's safety, please accompany them when they leave the Sanctuary to use the restrooms.

LARGE PRINT BULLETINS - are now available, please see an usher or greeter.

HEARING ASSISTANCE – The ushers have headsets which will amplify the sound for you. Please return to an usher or leave in the pew at the conclusion of the service.

GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS & ALCOHOL-FREE GRAPE JUICE— are available during communion, for those who desire either.

G.I.F.T. ZONE - is a special area in our worship space for parents and young children who wish to worship together with more child-friendly furniture and special resources to utilize during worship. **CHILDREN'S BULLETINS** – are distributed during the children's sermon.
