
FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

March 1, 2020 - 10:45 AM Deeper in Discipleship Sunday



Today's gospel tells of Jesus' temptation in the desert. His forty-day fast becomes the basis of our Lenten pilgrimage. In the early church Lent was a time of intense preparation for those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Hungry for God's mercy, we receive the bread of life to nourish us for the days ahead.

G.I.F.T. Zone & Other Parent/Child-Friendly Spaces for Worship

At Living Springs, our vision is for all families to "Grow in Faith Together," especially during worship. For us, the sound of children is a joyful part of worship — and a reminder of the active group of children whom Jesus invited to come gather with him. Rather than separate children from parents, we provide Parent/Child-Friendly Spaces so that *parents may worship* with their children at every age. In addition to worshipping together in the pews, here are some other options:



Kid Friendly Worship Experience

G.I.F.T. Zone for Parent & Child (left side of sanctuary). This is a special space where parents may worship with their children in a stress-free way, while teaching children the routines & meaning worship (until they

are old enough to worship in the pews for the entire service). Feel free to sit in the special area throughout the service with your child, or perhaps go there with them after the Children's Message. Every child in the G.I.F.T. Zone should be accompanied by a family adult. Our G.I.F.T. Zone coordinators are not meant to supervise your children for you, but are there to help parents & children with activities while experiencing the atmosphere and rhythm of worship.

Narthex Rocking Area, or Outside Playground. For a child or infant who needs some re-focusing time with their parent, at any point during worship. For safety purposes, an adult must be with your child on the playground

"Calm-Down" or "Private-Time" Room for Parents & Infants/Toddlers. The room is located in the Admin Building, immediately to the right of the main doors. Here, in our youth room, you will find sofas and chairs, with easy access to a water fountain, small kitchen, and bathrooms (equipped with changing tables). Soon, there will also be a live feed of the worship service in the room. Ushers have a special fob to give a parent, to allow easy self-entry back into the sanctuary.

GATHERING: GOD-STORIES & BULLETIN SLIPS

As we gather, we reflect on God's work, with some visual examples on the display screens. We use the green slips in our bulletins to write down our God's Stories (and prayer concerns). Where have you seen or experienced God at work in yourself, in the lives of others, or the world this past week? Names are NOT required. Green slips may be placed in the offering plate.

FIRST READING

Lector: A reading from Genesis.

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die."

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.'" But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. Lector: Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!

SECOND READING

Lector: A reading from Romans.

Just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned—sin was indeed in the world before the law, but sin is not reckoned when there is no law. Yet death exercised dominion from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sins were not like the transgression of Adam, who is a type of the one who was to come. But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many. And the free gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brings justification. If, because of the one man's trespass, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ. Therefore just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. (Romans 5:12-19)





OFFERING OF 2 "DEEPER" PRAYER OVALS & DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

Today, on Deeper in Discipleship Sunday, communion is distributed at standing stations. You are invited to select 2 prayer ovals of any color (blue = Grace, red = Love, gold = Christ) and drop them into the corresponding "Deeper" cylinder at the base of the Baptismal font:

- 1) Offer one oval with a prayer of thanks for one special person whom God used to have an impact on your life and take you deeper in grace, love, or Christ.
- Offer the 2nd oval with prayer for one individual either known or unknown upon whom God may use you to have an impact this year, taking their life deeper in grace, love, or Christ.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

This meal is the Lord's Supper of grace and is open to ALL Christians of any denomination or back-ground. As Lutheran Christians, we believe in **Christ's true presence** in, with, and under the elements. We invite you to have your name tag visible so that the ministers may include **your name** as they offer you the elements. Communion at Living Springs is by **intinction** (bread is dipped into the wine or grape juice). In response to the words, "Body of Christ, given for you. Blood of Christ, shed for you," each worshipper may respond with, "**Amen."** If you require a **gluten free wafer**, please let your worship assistant know so they can accommodate you. Each chalice contains two compartments: wine is located in the larger compartment, while **alcohol-free grape juice** is located in the smaller compartment for those who require it. **Children** who have not received communion instruction will be offered a special blessing, as well as anyone else not desiring to receive the elements. Simply fold your hands to indicate you would like to receive the blessing.

The walls will be symbolically re-opened for Easter worship, as we rejoice in the Good News of the stone rolled away from our Savior's tomb!

George Herbert, hymnwriter, died 1633

An excellent scholar, Herbert served briefly in the English parliament, then became a parish priest. He was known for devoted care of his parishioners, as well as for writing poetry and hymns, including "Come, my way, my truth, my life." He died at age 40.

FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT:

Into the Wilderness

By today, the ash-drawn crosses have been washed away, no longer visible. Still, memories of them linger as we continue our Lenten pilgrimage. Perhaps as the service begins we might reach up to trace the now unseen sign of the cross, recalling God's steadfast love and praying for the still-new days of this Lenten season.

Today we prepare to receive a word that will inspire and equip us for the unfolding journey. Likely we are surprised, then, when the gospel names Jesus famished, already having fasted forty days and forty nights. Although our "forty days" are just beginning, Jesus is nearing the end of his. The Spirit that alighted on him at baptism also has led him into the wilderness. He has been stretched so far, perhaps beyond imagining; this is the cue for temptations to begin.

The tempter starts by goading Jesus with invitations to test his identity as God's Beloved, challenging Jesus to feed his hunger by turning stones to bread, or to test God's care for him by hurling himself from the temple pinnacle. Jesus resists, pushing back with scripture. "One does not live by bread alone," he says (Matt. 4:4), and "Do not put the Lord your God to the test" (Matt. 4:7). A third temptation sounds untenable when the devil promises what is not his to give, namely "all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor," if only Jesus will "fall down and worship" him (Matt. 4:8-9). Jesus, however, does not argue the point; instead he retorts, "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him'" (Matt. 4:10).

Lent, for us, is not likely to be anything like the extremes of enduring the Judean desert or sparring one-to-one with the devil following a forty-day fast! But it may be that we will face our temptations differently when we remember the resistance that was empowered by Jesus' Spirit-led, scripture-grounded life.

Please take time to fill out the green slip in your bulletin and/or sign the welcome book in the narthex. New members are always welcome into our congregation. BULLETIN GREEN SLIPS - may be completed and placed in the offering plate for prayer requests, God Stories, guest information, address/phone updates, and a record of communing. Please complete at least one slip during 2020 to ensure we have a record of communing.

SEASONAL NAME TAG – In order to show hospitality, we ask everyone to stop by the table under the portico and complete a name tag with our seasonal scripture verse. The tags allow everyone to use names as we share the Peace - and allow communion ministers to speak your name (*please make sure your name is visible when you come to the altar rail*).

RESTROOMS — are located in the Administration Building on both levels. Greeters/ushers will be happy to show you the way. Main level restrooms are equipped with diaper changing stations. For your child's safety, please accompany them when they leave the Sanctuary to use the restrooms.

LARGE PRINT BULLETINS - are now available, please see an usher or greeter.

HEARING ASSISTANCE – The ushers have headsets which will amplify the sound for you. Please return to an usher or leave in the pew at the conclusion of the service.

GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS & ALCOHOL-FREE GRAPE JUICE— are available during communion, for those who desire either.

G.I.F.T. ZONE - is a special area in our worship space for parents and young children who wish to worship together with more child-friendly furniture and special resources to utilize during worship.

CHILDREN'S BULLETINS – are distributed during the children's sermon.

CHILD SAFETY — is very important to us, so we ask at least 1 adult to accompany your child if he/she leaves the Sanctuary during worship. Please do not allow children to play on the playground without parental supervision. During the week, church doors are kept locked to maintain security for our Preschool.
