G.I.F.T. Zone & Other Parent/Child-Friendly Spaces for Worship

At Living Springs, our vision is for all families to "Grow in Faith Together," especially during worship. For us, the sound of children is a joyful part of worship — and a reminder of the active group of children whom Jesus invited to come gather with him. Rather than separate children from parents, we provide Parent/Child-Friendly Spaces so that *parents may worship* with their children at every age. In addition to worshipping together in the pews, here are some other options:



Kid Friendly Worship Experience

G.I.F.T. Zone for Parent & Child (left side of sanctuary). This is a special space where parents may worship with their children in a stress-free way, while teaching children the routines & meaning worship (until they

are old enough to worship in the pews for the entire service). Feel free to sit in the special area throughout the service with your child, or perhaps go there with them after the Children's Message. Every child in the G.I.F.T. Zone should be accompanied by a family adult. Our G.I.F.T. Zone coordinators are not meant to supervise your children for you, but are there to help parents & children with activities while experiencing the atmosphere and rhythm of worship.

Narthex Rocking Area, or Outside Playground. For a child or infant who needs some re-focusing time with their parent, at any point during worship. For safety purposes, an adult must be with your child on the playground

"Calm-Down" or "Private-Time" Room for Parents & Infants/Toddlers. The room is located in the Admin Building, immediately to the right of the main doors. Here, in our youth room, you will find sofas and chairs, with easy access to a water fountain, small kitchen, and bathrooms (equipped with changing tables). Soon, there will also be a live feed of the worship service in the room. Ushers have a special fob to give a parent, to allow easy self-entry back into the sanctuary.



GATHERING: GOD-STORIES & BULLETIN SLIPS

As we gather, we reflect on God's work, with some visual examples on the display screens. We use the green slips in our bulletins to write down our God's Stories (and prayer concerns). Where have you seen or experienced God at work in yourself, in the lives of others, or the world this past week? Names are NOT required. Green slips may be placed in the offering plate.

We face the cross at the entrance of the sanctuary. We turn to follow the cross as it enters.



Lector: A reading from Genesis.

The Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. SECOND READING

Lector: A reading from Romans.

What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness. For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. (Romans 4:1-5, 13-17)



Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? "Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you

do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:1–17)

OFFERING OF "DEEPER" PRAYER OVALS

As you come forward for Communion, you are invited to pick up a 2 prayer ovals and drop them in the corresponding water container at the base of the baptismal font (gold = Christ, blue = Grace, red = Love):

- 1) Offer one oval with a prayer of thanks for one special person whom God used to have an impact on your life and take you deeper in grace, love, or Christ.
- 2) Offer the 2nd oval with prayer for one individual either known or unknown upon whom God may use you to have an impact this year, taking their life deeper in grace, love, or Christ.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

This meal is the Lord's Supper of grace and is open to ALL Christians of any denomination or back-ground. As Lutheran Christians, we believe in **Christ's true presence** in, with, and under the elements. We invite you to have your name tag visible so that the ministers may include **your name** as they offer you the elements. Communion at Living Springs is by **intinction** (bread is dipped into the wine or grape juice). In response to the words, "Body of Christ, given for you. Blood of Christ, shed for you," each worshipper may respond with, "**Amen."** If you require a **gluten free wafer**, please let your worship assistant know so they can accommodate you. Each chalice contains two compartments: wine is located in the larger compartment, while **alcohol-free grape juice** is located in the smaller compartment for those who require it. After receiving the elements, you are welcome to remain kneeling at the rail for meditation and prayer (others may simply fill in the open spaces). **Children** who have not received communion instruction will be offered a special blessing, as well as anyone else not desiring to receive the elements. Simply fold your hands to indicate you would like to receive the blessing.



SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT:

A Teacher Learns

Who doesn't love a good question? Well-timed, carefully worded inquiries open up worlds beyond what is already familiar and known. Preschoolers model this beautifully when they seek information to help them make sense of the unfamiliar or when they are curious about how something new fits into their worldview. Routinely children ask "Why?" and keep themselves open to embrace possibility instead of certainty. Innovators, too, are celebrated for asking lots of questions. Some people contend that asking questions is the single most important habit for a person to cultivate. Yet, sometimes we fail to ask questions for fear of what others might think.

Nicodemus, a Jewish leader in Jesus' time, seems to have been caught somewhere between curiosity and fear. Although it likely was fear that had him seek out Jesus in the shadows, his propensity to ask questions drives today's story from John.

Having watched and listened, Nicodemus was full of questions for the rabbi Jesus. While he already knew Jesus to be a "teacher who has come from God" (John 3:2), the Pharisee simply could not make sense of it when Jesus spoke of "being born from above" (John 3:3). Jesus replied with a kind of riddle about wind and new birth that surely gave rise to many more questions—both for Nicodemus the teacher and for people of later generations similarly struggling to understand the saving ways of the one who would be crucified and then would rise to new life.

In the end, the answer Nicodemus was seeking is found in Jesus himself. And beyond giving us one of the best-known lines in all the Bible (John 3:16), this story shows us the importance—even the necessity—of asking questions in order to mature and grow in our lives of faith. Surely that is good news for us as inquisitive, child-like ones who sometimes wonder, as did Nicodemus, "How can these things be?" (John 3:9).

BULLETIN GREEN SLIPS - may be completed and placed in the offering plate for prayer requests, God Stories, guest information, address/phone updates, and a record of communing. Please complete at least one slip during 2020 to ensure we have a record of communing.

SEASONAL NAME TAG – In order to show hospitality, we ask everyone to stop by the table under the portico and complete a name tag with our seasonal scripture verse. The tags allow everyone to use names as we share the Peace - and allow communion ministers to speak your name (*please make sure your name is visible when you come to the altar rail*).

RESTROOMS — are located in the Administration Building on both levels. Greeters/ushers will be happy to show you the way. Main level restrooms are equipped with diaper changing stations. For your child's safety, please accompany them when they leave the Sanctuary to use the restrooms.

LARGE PRINT BULLETINS - are now available, please see an usher or greeter.

HEARING ASSISTANCE – The ushers have headsets which will amplify the sound for you. Please return to an usher or leave in the pew at the conclusion of the service.

GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS & ALCOHOL-FREE GRAPE JUICE— are available during communion, for those who desire either.

G.I.F.T. ZONE - is a special area in our worship space for parents and young children who wish to worship together with more child-friendly furniture and special resources to utilize during worship.

CHILDREN'S BULLETINS – are distributed during the children's sermon.

CHILD SAFETY — is very important to us, so we ask at least 1 adult to accompany your child if he/she leaves the Sanctuary during worship. Please do not allow children to play on the playground without parental supervision. During the week, church doors are kept locked to maintain security for our Preschool. Please ring the intercom by the office doors to check in.

COFFEE FELLOWSHIP TIME – is held each week following the 8:15 service and prior to the 10:45 service, inside the education building.

OUR PRAYER MINISTRY – As a community of disciples, we pray for one another and others - not just in times of illness, but also for praise, thanksgiving, and forgiveness.
