CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Pastor: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

(Silence for reflection - we kneel as able)

Pastor: Faithful God,

- People: have mercy on us. We confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We turn from your loving embrace and go our own ways. We pass judgment on one another before examining ourselves. We place our own needs before those of our neighbors. We keep your gift of salvation to ourselves. Make us humble, cast away our transgressions, and turn us again to life in you through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.
- Pastor: God hears the cries of all who call out in need, and through his death and resurrection, Christ has made us his own. Hear the truth that God proclaims: Your sins are forgiven in the name of + Jesus Christ. Led by the Holy Spirit, live in freedom and newness to do God's work in the world.
- People: Amen.



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APOSTOLIC GREETING AND PRAYER OF THE DAY

- Pastor: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **People: And also with you.**
- Pastor: Almighty God, gracious Lord, we thank you that your Holy Spirit renews the church in every age. Pour out your Holy Spirit on your faithful people. Keep them steadfast in your word, protect and comfort them in times of trial, defend them against all enemies of the gospel, and bestow on the church your saving peace, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **People: Amen.**

We are seated FIRST READING

The renewed covenant will not be breakable, but like the old covenant it will expect the people to live upright lives. To know the LORD means that one will defend the cause of the poor and needy (Jer. 22:16). The renewed covenant is possible only because the LORD will forgive iniquity and not remember sin. Our hope lies in a God who forgets.

Lector: A reading from Jeremiah.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more. (Jeremiah 31:31-34)

Lector: Word of God, Word of life. People: Thanks be to God.

PSALM 46

Lector: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. **People:** Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, and though the mountains shake in the depths of the sea; though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble with its tumult. Lector: **People:** There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be shaken; Lector: God shall help it at the break of day. The nations rage, and the kingdoms shake; People: God speaks, and the earth melts away. Lector: The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold. Come now, regard the works of the LORD, People: what desolations God has brought upon the earth; behold the one who makes war to cease in all the world; Lector: who breaks the bow, and shatters the spear, and burns the shields with fire. "Be still, then, and know that I am God; People: I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth."

Lector: The LORD of hosts is with us;

People: the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

SECOND READING

Most likely this letter is the first written by Paul. Paul gives pastoral encouragement and reassurances to new Christians living in an antagonistic environment. Their commitment of faith, love, and hope makes them a model for other new Christian communities.


Lector: A reading from Romans.

Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law. (Romans 3:19-28)

Lector: Word of God, Word of life.

People: Thanks be to God.





GOSPEL LESSON

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?" Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:31-36)

+ AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM - RITE OF CONFIRMATION +

PRESENTATION

As names are called, the confirmands individually come forward to the Baptismal Font to re-trace the cross on their foreheads with water in remembrance of their baptism - and then step up to present themselves at the Lord's altar.

Leader: I present the following individuals who desire to make public affirmation of their baptism: Lauren Bloss, baptized July 3, 2011 Preston Ginn, baptized September 9, 2004 Anna Graves, baptized January 22, 2006 Lina Mooney, baptized August 13, 2006 Dakota Shannon, baptized August 20, 2006

A cross with their initial is given to each, inscribed with the words of Isaiah 43:11, "I have called you by your name, you are mine."

Pastor: Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for these sisters & brothers – Lauren, Preston, Anna, Lina, and Dakota - whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

People: Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Pastor: Lauren, Preston, Anna, Lina, and Dakota, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Pastor: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? *Each Confirmand (responding one by one): I renounce them.*

Pastor: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? *Each Confirmand (responding one by one): I renounce them.*

Pastor: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? *Each Confirmand (responding one by one): I renounce them.*

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Father?

Confirmands (responding together):

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Confirmands (responding together):

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Confirmands (responding together):

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

PROMISES OF COMMITMENT & LAYING ON OF HANDS

Pastor (addressing each confirmand individually):

_____, you have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each Confirmand (responding individually): I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Pastor: People of God, do you promise to support these sisters & brothers and pray for them in their life in Christ?

People: We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Confirmands kneel together before the altar.

Pastor: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

The pastor moves to each confirmand individually. The confirmands' parents come forward and place a red stole on the confirmand to signify their ministry as a disciple of Jesus. The stole is red to signify the Spirit's fire, is embroidered with the confirmation date, and has symbols created by each confirmand to reflect his/her calling of faith. After placement of their stole, hands are laid on that confirmand, and the pastor prays for God's blessing and the Spirit's power.

- Pastor: Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in _____ the gift of your Holy Spirit: confirm his/her faith, guide his/her life, empower him/her in his serving, give him/her patience in suffering, and bring him/her to eternal life.
- People: Amen.

Placement of the stole and laying on of hands is repeated for each confirmand. Each Confirmand remains kneeling and their parent(s) return to their pew.

SILENT PRAYER


CONGREGATIONAL RESPONSE

Confirmands are invited to stand and face the congregation.

Leader: Let us rejoice with these brothers and sisters in Christ.

People: We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

The Confirmands receive a personalized copy of Luther's Small Catechism from the congregation. After acclamation by the congregation, Confirmands remain at front of the sanctuary for the prayers.



DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

ALL ARE WELCOME to partake of Holy Communion, for we believe this is the Lord's Meal (not ours) and open to Christians of any background, denomination, or tradition. As Lutheran Christians, we believe in the full presence of Christ in, with, and under the elements. This Week: Confirmands & their families will be invited forward to receive communion one group at a time. All others, please remain in your places - and a communion assistant will bring the elements to you. During the COVID outbreak, we continue to temporarily utilize the sanitary-packaged individual communion elements. The wafer is located under the plastic film on top of the sealed cup - you can pull back the plastic film for the wafer, and then peel off the aluminum seal to open the cup. Feel free to either eat the wafer or drink the grape juice first, depending on which is easier for you to open. Separate individually-packaged GLUTEN-FREE wafers are also available.

REFORMATION SUNDAY:

Before the Truth Is Finished

"You will know the truth," Jesus said, "and the truth will make you free" (John 8:32).

"The truth will set you free," David Foster Wallace wrote, "but not until it's finished with you."

Before the truth is finished with us, it demands that we admit that we are not already free. We are enslaved to sin. This is the part of the truth that Luther called the law: the hard part that points out that we are controlled by our fears and desires, our self-absorption and self-doubt, our addictions and facades.

Here's the truth: You are not your Sunday best or your Facebook profile. You are broken, and enslaved by your attempts to cover it up. That can be hard to hear, but until it sinks in we are unable to be released and receive the truth of the gospel, the good news of grace.

Today we celebrate Reformation Day, and in the spirit of Martin Luther the church must be always reforming, always pointing beyond itself to God's grace. The temptation is always there to settle for so little: a cozy collective of our most presentable selves, the right side of social issues, pat answers to incomprehensible mysteries of the universe.

Jesus' invitation is to bring the mess that we're in, the mess that we are. We are called to show up as our true selves, fears and regrets and doubts and all. God can handle it. The communion of saints—that is, us, the people of God—can handle it. You are loved. You are forgiven. You are free.

The truth of God that sets us free first tears us open. Church can and must be a place where we bring our broken-open selves and encounter the healing power of a God who sees us, knows us, loves us as we are, and sets us free.
