

"O, Give Thanks to the Lord!" - This Month from Pastor Eric

As we move into November, the mass-marketing machine will skip directly from Halloween candy &

costumes to Christmas lights & holiday decorations. Yet, falling in between, there is this day on the calendar called Thanksgiving. It is easy to skip over Thanksgiving, not just in the stores, but in our lives as well. Scripture tells us that one of the hallmark characteristics of our lives as people of God is meant to be "thanksgiving." The apostle Paul writes to Christians in Thessalonica, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you!" (I Thessalonians 5:18). Christ has come into our lives, precisely SO that we may know the deep joy (not fleeting happiness) of living a thankful life: finding occasion to give thanks in all circumstances, knowing that God's power in Christ is there to conquer all, knowing that there is a peace in Christ that surpasses human understanding, knowing that there is nothing in all creation - not even death - that can ever separate us from the love of God (see Romans 8). Over and over, the Scriptures tell us to "give thanks to the Lord" - and the main reason for this thankfulness is not temporary, earthly things, but rather something that lasts for all eternity and is there for us in all circumstances - the steadfast love of God! "Give thanks to the Lord, for his steadfast love endures forever!" echoes throughout Scripture (see 1 Chronicles 16:34, 2 Chronicles 20:21, Psalm 106:1, 107:1, 118:1, 136:1, Jeremiah 33:11). In the gift of Christ among us – and in his resurrection – we find ultimate confirmation of the glorious truth: that the steadfast love of the Lord does endure FOREVER! What a reason to give thanks!



In Christ, we discover that God's love for us is not just an

emotion in God's heart, but a love that takes action in the incarnation, cross, and empty tomb of Christ. I once heard a mother tell a story about her son, who was crying over the death of a goldfish. "Why are you crying?" she asked. "Because I LOVED my goldfish," came the reply. "Well, no," said the mom in a gentle voice, "You are emotional about your goldfish. But if you loved it, you would have fed him." Now, I'm not sure if that was perfect parenting, but the point is valid. Actual love is not about being "emotional" – it is defined by action. And the same might be applied to thankfulness.

Where will you see God's work today? It's interesting that in Scripture, "giving thanks to the Lord" is associated with 2 particular actions. "Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name, make known his deeds" (see I Chronicles 16:8, Psalm 9:1, 105:1, Isaiah 12:4). "It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart ... in the congregation" (see Psalm 92:1, 111:1). To give thanks to the Lord is to act! It is to: 1) tell others what you experience God doing in your life or what you may witness God doing elsewhere; and, 2) actively worship the Lord and sing God's praises! The things we share as a congregation are opportunities for each of us to actually do what you and I are called to do, as people of God and disciples of Jesus. We hold worship services every week, so that you & I can give thanks to the

Lord in the way that Scripture calls us. We invite one another to share those little blue-dot stories, so that we can give thanks to the Lord by making known the Lord's deeds. And so, I invite you to actively celebrate Thanksgiving – not just on Nov. 27, but every day! Give thanks to the Lord, for his steadfast love endures forever – for you, for your family, and for this world to which God sent Jesus! Let us worship the Lord – let us tell of the Lord's mighty deeds!



LS Disciples out in the Community

Last year, I had gone to Disney world with my family. There was another family there with us that has a son, around the age of four, with Leukemia. We call him "Super Luke". Since meeting this family, my granddaughter, Alyssa, keeps up with what is going on with Luke. He just recently was released from yet another hospital stay. The Spirit tugged at Alyssa with an idea to help him. She set up a stand and sold lemonade and milkshakes. God sent people to her stand so that she could raise \$37 to send to him and his family.

I was blown away when I heard something the other day at an event that God called me to attend. A 78-year-old man, Gary, was sharing his story of having cancer and how a 7-year-old boy impacted his life recently. Gary stated that he had undergone cancer treatments over the past 2 years and was now cancer free, but then his wife of 40 years was diagnosed with an inoperable form of cancer and had died 3 weeks

earlier. Gary was seeking fellowship because of his immense sadness and showed up on Wednesday night at his church's "Wonderful Wednesdays" meal and worship. That particular night they did something different at worship. All the attendees were divided up into small groups and they shared their High's and Low's of the day, read a bible verse, prayed for and blessed each other. The Spirit must have been very active that evening because Gary was put in a group with a very caring 7 year old boy who, after hearing Gary's story, wrote a prayer to be read aloud by the pastor. The prayer went something like this--"Dear God, I wish I could have had cancer so Gary for him so he wouldn't have to go through all that. Amen." Wow, such compassion from a 7-year-old boy. His prayer brought tears to Gary's eyes and opened the door for God's healing. This further showed me that we need to seize every opportunity to connect all ages together, because the Spirit will indeed intercede and teach us something through disciple of every age!

At our Mission Vision Celebration, we heard one story of how the Spirit tugged at the heart of a disciple to use her knitting skills for those struggling with cancer. This is a Disciple-dot story from a completely different Living Springs disciple, who felt a similar Spirit-tug!

A couple of weeks ago I started losing sleep over several friends who are dealing with cancer in their families. While I am not in a position to help most of them directly, there was

one teenager with a brain tumor I could help. I have a pattern for a chemo cap and I have some soft yarn. I made the girl a chemo cap to comfort her during and after treatments. Her expressions of delight made me think that I could help others who could use a pick-me-up during chemotherapy. I have a retired friend who volunteers in a hospital cancer ward. I have started using times when I am awake at night and cannot get back to sleep to accomplish something useful. Each cap has a note attached that says, "This cap was constructed with prayers for you woven throughout. Know that God cares about you and so do I." It is signed with a single initial. It is my prayer that the Holy Spirit will work these small gifts to His greater good.





This is most certainly true: Remember Eighth Commandment explanation

I remember a particularly contentious meeting with a church council when I was a synod bishop. It didn't start out that way, but bit by bit the mood changed. Council members began to question my motives, then my veracity, then my character. Finally I said, "Hey, I have a mother you know." That broke the tension. My point was that I was a human being just like them, not a bloodless functionary. I had become "The Man," which made me sad and was hugely confusing for my husband.

I would like to say this was an isolated incident in my experience of life in the church, but it was not. Nor is it confined to the church. Suspicion and blame aren't new. Bearing false witness was around way before Moses received the commandments. But it seems that the climate of distrust and accusation in society has become more heated. It's just more disappointing when it happens in the church.





<u>REINVENTING SUNDAY SCHOOL:</u> (Continuation from last month's newsletter)

A reformation in faith formation, excerpts from The Lutheran Magazine Cover Story Involving families in mission and service provides another way to do faith formation. "A lot of people are motivated to visit a nursing home or work in a community garden or homeless shelter because they are used as contexts for telling the stories and practices of the faith," Hymans said. "Before you go, you can have a meal, read Scripture and talk together."

Trinity provides such an opportunity through "Feed and be Fed," which includes an intergenerational, participatory 30-minute worship service followed by a project in the community. For example, they assembled snack packs for a local charity. Before delivering them, they talked about caring for their neighbors.

"It's an experiment for those who don't want to just sit in worship," Lutz said. "We have 3-year-olds working with 80- or 90-year-olds assembling sandwiches or planting flowers and vegetables. That's one way we do faith formation, and it doesn't look like traditional Sunday school."

STRESS AND IT'S EFFECTS

Have you ever wondered how stress can affect your performance on a daily basis? In our Mission Vision process we heard that the **constrant stress of life** was very prevalent for many of us. So in an effort to provide support and tools to handle stress, read this article for helpful tips.

Research from the University of California, Berkeley, reveals an upside to experiencing moderate levels of stress. But it also reinforces how important it is to keep stress under control. The study, led by post-doctoral fellow

Elizabeth Kirby, found that the onset of stress entices the brain into growing new cells responsible for improved memory. However, this effect is only seen when stress is intermittent. As soon as the stress continues beyond a few moments into a prolonged state, it suppresses the brain's ability to develop new cells. <u>READ MORE</u>

ELCA youth are not unlike their peers in that they are people of action, and they like to take action alongside their friends. Friends are extremely important, often influencing the direction and quality of one's life. As friends united in Christ, we begin collecting In-kind Donations for the Gathering, which Detroit residents desperately need. So will you help us too?

Diapers

Imagine sending your baby or toddler to preschool or daycare wearing a plastic grocery bag instead of diapers. That is happening in Detroit. In fact, diapers are such a hot commodity, pharmacies and stores sometimes keep them behind glass because desperate people sometimes steal to get them. On average, a newborn goes through eight to 10 diapers a day, a cost that can add up to \$100 a month for one baby. For people who are poor that cost is out of reach, and they too often have to choose between diapers and food. In addition, diapers are the first line of defense against infection and disease and are even linked to preventing depression and violence.

Non-perishable food items

The lack of access to transportation, an inadequate public transportation system, and safety issues are all factors impacting a person's ability to choose when and where they shop for food. Over half a million Detroit residents live in areas that have an imbalance of healthy food options. These people are statistically more likely to suffer or die prematurely from a diet-related disease, holding other key factors constant. Many areas in Detroit are considered, by some, to be "food deserts." Food deserts are urban areas in which it is difficult to buy affordable or good, healthy food. For too many people in Detroit the only option for food is from Dollar Stores, party stores, convenient stores and gas stations. There are 141 food pantries in Detroit to help meet the need for healthy food. In addition to the food pantries, there are federal programs like WIC (Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children). The director of the WIC program in Detroit says the program services approximately 65,000 residents per year; 75 percent are infants and children up to 5 years old. Your congregation can help by sending non-perishable, packaged food items with youth going to the Gathering. Everything collected will be sent directly to Detroit community food pantries for people who are hungry.

We believe God is calling us together to be church in this place, and that there is much we can learn from the people of Detroit. Living Springs Lutheran Church Finance Committee Report - Spending Plan 2015

Attached you will find a summary of the proposed Ministry Spending Plan for 2015, to be voted on at the <u>Annual Congregational Meeting</u> on <u>November 16, 2014.</u>

If you would like a <u>detailed</u>, <u>itemized version</u> of the Spending Plan, copies are available on the narthex table, or in the office. On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>Nov. 2</u>, and <u>Sunday</u>, <u>Nov. 16</u>, a member of the Finance Committee will be available in the narthex between services, to answer any questions you may have about the 2015 Spending Plan. You may also email questions to Finance Chairperson, Charlie Tracy, at <u>charlietracy44@gmail.com</u>.

The 2015 Spending Plan shows, for comparison, the actual income and expenses for 2013, along with the annualized 2014 income and expense, and the 2015 proposed Spending Plan. For planning purposes, in the 2015 Spending Plan, we project income to be the annualized 2014 income. Please note that for the first time in five years we have seen an increase in income.

As you can see, 92% of the foundational 2015 Spending Plan is allocated to salaries, mission support, mortgage, maintenance, utilities and administration – those essential and vital expenditures which enable Living Springs to exist as a congregation and continue all our ministries that have such a great impact upon many lives. It should be noted that our foundational Spending Plan also makes it possible for other additional, specific designated offerings to fund a significant portion of the ministry for our youth, outreach projects, social ministry, etc.

Note: The 2014 Spending Plan originally projected a deficit of \$86,500, but as of 3rd quarter, we now project to be within \$7,000 of completely covering our ministry expenditures for 2014, due to an increase in giving and a tight control of expenses. *If we pull together for a push in our offerings in the final quarter of 2014, we might be able to amazingly "break -even" for the year and even begin to repay some of the \$54,000+ we have had to borrow from our capital/designated funds over the past few years. Let's make it happen!*

We give thanks to God for all the faithful support of Christ's disciples here at Living Springs – and all the powerful ways you carry on the ministry of our Lord through your faithful stewardship of time, talent, and treasure!
