

One year ago, we were gathering in homes as groups of disciples around a lit candle and a cross, with this praver in our hearts. "Come, Holy Spirit, open our hearts and minds to God's vision for us. Allow us to sense the Risen Christ among us – and speak to us with your voice. Let your vision inspire us to be people of mission, in the shared work of our congregation and the daily ministry to which you lead each of us." What a blessing it has been over the past 12 months to see the Spirit respond to that prayer!

I think about all those disciples coming together in fall and spring cottage gatherings. I think about the Spirit leading us to 3 Vision Areas, 7 Mission Lens, 25 possible Ministry Goals, and 450+ resulting Spirit-tugs. I think about the Mission Cross last Lent,

about Mission Moments shared during Easter Season, about blue & red dots on a Mission Map, about Disciple Moment Stories being shared. I think about a church lawn filled with joy at an Outdoor Nativity; about Advent & Lenten prayer services; about the Greatest Story Bible study and our new TELS group; about a summer mission trip, a ramp being built, and 20+ Sr. Youth sharing hope with veterans, homeless, and Meals-on-Wheels recipients at Spark; about students having lives changed at confirmation camp; about a growing FAITH5 emphasis in our homes and Faith Alive excitement on Sunday morning; about Prayer Bears being delivered all over the nation; about a new Lutheran Campus Ministry partnership; about a new Associate for Sr. Youth Ministry; about our website & new prayer line and the blessing of our Communications Coordinator, Lisa Petty; about our new Preschool Staff prayer lunches and a Spirit-tug in a

I look forward to seeing each and every one of you at our Mission Vision Celebration on Oct. 19, not as an "end" to this Mission Vision process, but as a kick-off to even more amazing ways that the Spirit will respond to that original prayer – not just in what we do together here, but in what the Spirit works in YOU in your mission field every day. CONSTITUTION UPDATE (FIRST CONGREGATIONAL VOTE): SUNDAY, OCT. 19 – 10:20 AM

Everyone, don't forget our important first vote on our constitution updates! We will call the meeting to order and take the vote at 10:20 on Sunday, Oct. 19 – <u>at the end of our Mission Vision</u> <u>Celebration in the fellowship hall!</u> These updates reflect the required and suggested provisions from the larger Lutheran church, to make sure each congregation's constitution is current with up-to-date legal language and protections. This is important, so be sure to be present – we must have a quorum. The updates must be accepted by a 2/3 majority at this first vote, and then be ratified (along with by-laws) by another vote at our annual meeting on Nov. 16. Copies of the updates were distributed in our congregational mailing on Sept. 19 – extra copies are available from the office. *Reminder: Current Voting members are all confirmed members who have both contributed and communed on record during 2013-14*.

'Nurture faith at home'

"Sometime in the 1950s or '60s, churches communicated to parents that they should let the church do all of the education and faith formation for their children," Hymans said. "And parents were often happy to do that because they often didn't feel well equipped to do it."

But research shows that parents are the primary influence in their children's faith, she said, "so more churches are equipping and empowering [them] to nurture faith at home."

For example, congregations can teach families to worship every Sunday, no matter where they are. "We need to find simple ways to engage parents who are exhausted," Shallue said. "That could be small rituals like reading a Bible story, singing and praying. One of our young moms had

Living Springs Expands Food Ministry

We Welcome Laura Cunningham as our LS Food Resource Person!

Since the days of the early church, gathering around food has been characteristic of the Christian community (Acts 2:43-47). A central part of our Christian calling has also been to reach out to those who hunger (Matthew 26:31-46, James 2:15-16). During our recent Mission Vision process, the congregation identified one of our specific ministry goals to be: "establish & expand food ministries" (Ministries of Hope #H5). In response to this goal, the Spirit tugged at the heart of one of our members, Bob Gill, to explore this possibility. Council appointed Ed Brennan, Bob Turnmire, and Pastor to join Bob as a Food Ministry Task Force. They researched congregations with an active Food Ministry and discovered at least 3 different



levels: **Level 1)** a Food Resource Person who works with the congregation to support existing food ministries and develop new opportunities. **Level 2)** a part-time or full-time staff position as Congregation Food Minister. **Level 3)** a DHEC-certified kitchen, which would be necessary to feed preschool children and offer more than 12 public meals during a year.

In September, council approved moving forward with **Level 1**: a Food Resource Person who will be available to support congregational ministries and outreach efforts on an event-by-event basis. Groups, committees, or members can work with the Food Resource Person to provide food for events, gatherings, meetings, or outreach efforts. Each event should be self-supporting, via donations from participants or funding from the budget of the sponsoring group or committee. In determining cost, the Food Resource Person will calculate actual expense for food/supplies/utilities/ labor, with an added 10% for a Living Springs "Food Ministry Fund." The fund will accumulate for future expansion of the congregation's Food Ministry, as well as provide for kitchen maintenance. Congregation members will continue to hold pot-lucks, care meals, Rice Estate suppers, Fish Fries, etc. – *the Food Ministry Resource Person is not here to replace those efforts, but to help support us as needed and develop new ministries*.

At this point, the Food Resource Person is not a paid staff member – and she is not here to earn a profit. In the process, the Spirit led us to someone who has the necessary experience, plus a genuine calling to use her gifts to further the ministry of God's kingdom. This individual is Mrs. Laura Cunningham. Laura and her husband, Mark, were one-time restaurant operators (Backyard Grille at Lake Carolina), where they hosted several LS Men's breakfasts. Laura and Mark continue to help with food for various local ministries, including Midlands Youth Foster Association, the Boys & Girls Club, North Trenholm Baseball League, Hannah House, Ronald McDonald House, and Harvest Hope. Laura is a member of the Global Association of Christian Hospitality Professionals. She says, "we are very excited to see where God may be leading us and about this opportunity to get to know the disciples of Living Springs," and her theme verse is Proverbs 3:5-6, *"Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Do not depend on your own understanding. Seek His will in all you do, and He will show you which path to take."*

Already, Laura has helped us start a monthly Prayer Lunch for our Preschool staff, as well as begin a Tuesday monthly Devotional Lunch for everyone (see box). She is working with the MV Team to provide brunch for the Mission Vision Celebration on Oct. 19, and will provide breakfast for Lutheran Men on Oct. 25, as well as cook for the Thrivent District Supper on Nov. 9. We are also planning a Wednesday supper to accompany our Advent Prayer Services. Laura has many wonderful ideas about how we might reach out more in our community.

WHAT ARE THE ORANGE STAKES ON OUR PROPERTY?

We've received several questions from members regarding the orange stakes that are along the front edge of our property. As such, we thought it appropriate to provide an update. As most of you know, Hard Scrabble Road is scheduled to be widened at some point in the near future. The orange stakes are the preliminary stakes marking the new "edge" of our property. We will lose a considerable amount of property as part of this process so we are taking this situation very seriously. Our main focus is to ensure that our Church remains fully functional and accessible. Additionally, we are seeking adequate compensation from the State for the property that we will lose.

To date, we have had several conversations with the firm that is handling the negotiation on behalf of the Department of Transportation (DOT) to better understand the situation. We are currently awaiting DOT to provide the final approved plans that will specifically outline how much property we will lose. At

some point after the plans are finalized, DOT will give us a financial offer to compensate us for our property loss. This offer will start the negotiation process.

To prepare for this event, Council has taken two key actions to date:

- Established a Road Widening Committee. This committee is co-chaired by Ed Brennan and Brian Hunt (pre -school Board member). This committee is heavily involved in the logistics of this situation and is focused on evaluation options to ensure access to the Church.
- ⇒ Retained an attorney to represent us. Mike Quinn is the attorney's name and was selected by the road widening committee to represent the Church. His fee is solely contingent on getting us a better financial settlement than what DOT initially offers.

In closing, we are basically in a "hurry up and wait" situation. DOT does not have to adhere to any type of timetable and we are at their mercy regarding next steps. Providing any type of timeframe around this process at this point would be speculative at best. Rest assured that Church Council and the Road Widening Committee are doing everything possible to get prepared for this happening. Lastly, Church Congregation will play a large part in this process as any decisions regarding selling our property must be approved by the Congregation. The Road Widening Committee will also provide periodic updates to the Congregation as necessary. 



CELEBRATE YOUR BAPTISM

Don't forget to check the bulletin to see if we will be celebrating your Baptismal Anniversary during this month's Sunday worship services. Immediately below the Gathering Music, there are printed the names of those who are celebrating a baptismal anniversary **in that week**. For those who know only the month of your Baptism, you can join us on the first Sunday of the month (if you prefer some other Sunday, please let us know). <u>If you do not know your baptismal infor-</u><u>mation, then please pick a month when you would like to celebrate this gift of God's grace in your life</u><u>– and notify the office</u>, so that we can add you to the celebration list (we'll simply mark the choice of your month with an asterisk). 
