#### Of Stars and Dust - This Month from Pastor Eric

Back at the end of the year, there was much news about the successful landing of the European Space Agency's Rosetta drone on a moving comet. It jogged my memory about a decade-old NASA mission called, "Stardust," whose purpose was to send a spacecraft to collect samples of a comet and return them to Earth. The report from Stardust Principal Investigator, Dr. Don Brownlee, stated, "When the international team of 200 scientists began examination of the returned particles, we found that the particles were indeed ancient building blocks of the solar system, but the nature and origin of the particles was quite unexpected .... What we found was remarkable!"





In our life together as Jesus' disciples, this month uniquely brings together the two images of "stars" and "dust." As we move through the final weeks of Epiphany, we continue to celebrate this season whose emphasis is the light of God's hope revealed to the world in the coming of Jesus, which was initially marked by the appearance of a star in the cosmos. In this season, we continue to see stars hanging above our heads as we worship in the sanctuary—stars which represent each of us in our created uniqueness as children of God who have been called and blessed to be God's living stars, shining light into this world in our daily lives, through

the radiant power of the Holy Spirit given to us in our Baptism.

On the 3rd Wednesday of this month (Ash Wednesday—Feb. 18), we living stars of Christ's light will gather in worship to be marked with a cross of ashes and hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." It is an amazing truth: that by the creative imagination of God, the power of Divine love, and the work of the

Holy Spirit, the light of Christ is emitted into the world through collections of carbon-based molecular dust (you and me!). I am reminded of lines from the old Joni Mitchell song, "Woodstock" (made famous by Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young): "I came upon a child of God, he was walking along the road, and I asked him, 'tell me where are you going?' ..... We are stardust, we are golden, we are billion-year-old carbon ...." What a deep mystery of the Divine that you and I live: by God's grace and blessing, something as ordinary as ancient carbon dust could be transformed into living stars of hope, children of God shining the light of Christ into the world!





How incredible that moment must have been at the Sermon on the Mount, when Jesus looked out upon the collection of living carbon-based molecules that had gathered before him and declared, "You are the light of the world!" Then he continued, "No one after lighting a lamp puts it under a bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven!" (Matt 5:14-16). It is no accident that these are the same words that are spoken to everyone who is joined to Christ and claimed as God's child in the waters of God's baptismal grace.

Here, at the beginning of February, we are doing 2 important things to celebrate the miracle of being God's living "stardust" for the world. On **Sunday, February 8,** the entire congregation (and

friends) will gather in the **Fellowship Hall from 9:20-10:30** to celebrate the ministries God has given us to share, so that the light of Christ may shine more fully into people's lives around us. What a joyous occasion this will be! **Now** 

through February 10, we are all completing our 2015 Time & Talent offerings (go online to <a href="http://goo.gl/forms/FlPruVckll">http://goo.gl/forms/FlPruVckll</a>). These are concrete opportunities for us to get out from under our own bushel baskets and brightly shine the star-light that God has made us to be. We may enter into something with uncertainty; we may not think of ourselves as having the right "talent" or enough "time." Yet, the Spirit tugs at every one of our hearts in special and unique ways. We offer ourselves, trusting that the outcome is not due to us, but that this same God who transforms particles



of dust into God's children will take our personal Spirit-tug and transform it into a beacon of light shining in unexpected ways. To offer our time and talents for the work of Christ is to move forward in God's Stardust mission, not knowing (or having to be in control of) what the result might be—but merely preparing ourselves to marvel at the incredible way God will allow the light of Christ to shine through us. To paraphrase Dr. Brownlee, "It was all quite unexpected ... what we found was remarkable!" And so it is, whenever we living balls of Stardust offer our time and talent to the One who created us, to behold what Light will shine!

#### SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER February 17

Join us on Tuesday, February 17 for our annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. Pancakes will be served starting at 6:00 pm by our youth. All proceeds will benefit the youth. FYI... The word *shrove* is the past tense of the English verb *shrive*, which means to obtain absolution for one's sins by way of Confession and doing penance. Thus Shrove Tuesday gets its name from the custom for Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent. Pancakes are associated with the day preceding Lent because they were a way to use up rich foods such as eggs, milk, and sugar, before the fasting season of the 40 days of Lent. The liturgical fasting emphasized eating plainer food and refraining from food that would give pleasure:

The burning of the palms will be at around 7:00 pm. (The palm ashes are then used for our Ash Wednesday Service)







Detroit, Michigan—Every Saturday or Sunday Robby Elmers loads up the family minivan. Since he is only 12 years old, Robby cannot drive so his grandmother does the honors. They drive from their small city outside of Detroit to the center core of Motown. Once there Robby sets up a table filled with hot dogs, potato salad and other treats and begins to serve the homeless of Detroit.



According to the Detroit Free Press there are some 20,000 homeless people living in the Motor City. Some people

think Robby is wasting his time and birthday and Christmas money but not Robby, "It makes me feel good to be able to help" he told the Detroit News. While Robby might only be 12 years old, he is giving hope to a group of people that often feels overlooked. "It is amazing that a child so young would be out here shaking hands, talking to everyone and caring," Shauna Johnson, A Detroit homeless woman told the Detroit News, "Robby is right out there in front."
