Part of Something So Much Bigger - This Month from Pastor Eric

Some 25 years ago, in June, a young man who had grown up in a small Carolina town headed out on a summer trip across the North American continent. After traveling through the Rocky Mountains and Yukon Territory into the Alaskan wilderness, I found myself thinking, "Wow, we are all part of something so much bigger than ourselves."

I wonder if the apostles might have thought something like that, as they emerged from their secluded room onto the busy streets of Jerusalem, afire with the Holy Spirit. There, on that Pentecost Day, they found themselves at the "big bang" moment of the Church. For there, on that day, the Church was born, as the Holy Spirit empowered these simple persons to proclaim (in many languages!) the Good News of God's forgiveness and grace and hope for all in the name of Jesus. And on that day, through the work of the Holy Spirit, they discovered that their lives were indeed part of something so much bigger than themselves.

Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen. *Ephesians* 3:20-21

In these months surrounding Pentecost of 2015, we here at Living Springs are reminded that, through the ongoing gift and work of the Holy Spirit in our lives, we too are part of something so much bigger than our own congregation. Our Lutheran Men are working to sponsor a <u>golf tournament</u> that will generate funds for the Shannon Long Mission Endowment, to help support a fledgling mission congregation somewhere across America (just as Trinity Lutheran Church of New Hampton, Iowa once supported Living Springs). Our Lutheran Women are busy <u>collecting items for hygiene kits</u> to that will help families in crises through the ministry of Lutheran Services. Our Lutheran Youth are making preparations to attend a <u>gathering of some 30,000 Lutheran Youth</u> from across the continent to grow in faith, to joyfully worship the Lord, and to bring more hope to the people of Detroit.



A quartet of Living Springs disciples (along with SC Synod Vice-President, our own Lexanne Graves) are participating in the annual SC Synod Assembly, where we are reminded of our partnership with 52,000 other Lutheran Christians in SC and 153 congregations. Through that partnership, the Spirit works to make possible agencies and institutions that shape and touch thousands of lives: SC Lutheran Homes, Lutheran Services Carolinas, SC Lutheran Conference & Retreat Centers, Lutheran Hospice, Young Adults in Global Mission, Lutheridge-Lutherock-Lutheranch-LutherSprings camps, Newberry College, Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, 9 different Lutheran Campus Ministries on SC campuses. Through our SC partnership with 3 worldwide Companion Synods, impoverished villagers in Tanzania are given access to clean water; Christian communities in Colombia, South America provide hope for those living in the shadow of drug war-lords; and Christians in Japan find encouragement in spite of their overwhelming minority status. Through that partnership, 100 SC disciples (including our own Aaron Smith, Katherine Wollpert, and Gwen Furcron) have been trained in practices of Everyday Evangelism, while another 50 SC disciples (including Pastor Eric) have been trained as coaches to help individuals and congregations more deeply grasp what it means to be faithful stewards of all God's blessings in our lives.

One of our Living Springs disciples, the Rev. Dr. Wayne Kannaday, is now visiting Wittenberg, Germany to provide English-speaking worship leadership in the historic home of the great Reformer, Martin Luther. Two Living Springs disciples, Bob Turnmire and Ed Brennan, just completed a weekend of the amazing SC Lutheran Men's faith and discipleship experience. Living Springs Crafty Ladies dedicated another 19 quilts to support the global ministries of Lutheran World Relief. Our current children's (and adult) bucket offering will feed dozens of people through the ELCA World Hunger Appeal and the "Always Being Made New" emphasis; while your recent offerings for Lutheran Disaster Response are now flowing to help victims of a Nepal earthquake and Midwestern US tornados and floods.

The Holy Spirit works through Living Springs disciples to share God's love and hope through the weekly delivery of Meals on Wheels, the distribution of Blessing Bags, <u>multiple Helping Hands alerts</u>, Operation Inasmuch, God's Work-Our Hands, Rice Estate meals, and this school year alone, over \$20,000 of weekend food for students in need through our <u>Backpack Ministry</u>. The Holy Spirit works through our Living Springs instrument group to bring musical joy, as they make visits to nursing home residents. In June, Living Springs bus drivers will transport youth from Columbia-area congregations in a weeklong service blitz called <u>GraceWorks</u> – and the Spirit is working through other disciples to plan outreach and faith-enriching activities during our "<u>Spark Your Faith</u>" camp. The Holy Spirit works through staff members and



Disciple Dot Stories & Spirit Tugs

Knit 3 Purl 3 – repeat ... This is the pattern for making a prayer shawl. I thought I could do it, just cast on 54 stitches and start. I read the instructions and the printed prayers for the shawl and quickly said a prayer; praying that I could remember how to knit. The counting takes all of my concentration and although I could remember how to do the stitches, the task of keeping a smooth tension in the yarn was something else. Knit 3 Purl 3 – repeat...The stiches continued and the pattern began to take shape. Knit 3 Purl 3....I began to remember how I learned this craft in an after-school knitting club when I was in fourth grade, being taught by a sixth grader. I remember the girls knitting in a circle and I say a prayer for them, hoping that Christ had been a part of their lives and had brought them comfort through the years. Knit 3 Purl 3..... I thought about my mother and the hundreds of Afghans she

knitted and crocheted in her later years. I prayed for her safety and her comfort as she lives out her years. I pray that she knows what a blessing she was to others. Knit 3 Purl 3.....The yarn is stretchy and the needles are large. Somehow the uneven tension begins to right itself and the shawl begins to take shape. I think about how God takes my imperfections and they are smoothed over by His grace; I say a prayer of thanks. As I finished the prayer shawl, I thanked God for the opportunity to make it and for the time it gave me to think and pray. I prayed one more time for the person who will receive the shawl. May it bring comfort and peace to them as they feel God's arms around them in a time of need.

The Spirit led me to read something very poignant. When ancient sailors used to create maps of their travels, they would draw out what they *feared*. Maps would have labels that said things such as: "Here be dragons"; "Here be demons"; "Here be sirens".

It was a common thing to see, the mapping of one's fears. But there was one sailor named Sir John Franklin, and his maps looked a little different. A man of faith, his maps crossed out the phrases "Here be dragons", "Here be demons", and "Here be sirens". Instead he wrote "Here be God".

I love that. "Here be God". In the midst of everything, "Here be God". In the midst of our fears. In the midst of our loneliness. In the midst of the hustle and bustle of a fast-paced world, "Here be God".

I think it is so easy to go through the motions of each day without taking the time to even think about God. It's easy to forget that God is always there with us. God is there when we are afraid or sad. There are no uncharted places in our lives where God isn't. "Here be God". God's there. It's so easy to focus on whatever is ahead of us that seems daunting. It's easy to focus on the dragons, demons, and sirens in our lives. But what would it be like if we crossed those things out and just focused on God. Focused on the fact that no matter what, "Here be God".

Driving in the car, with our son in the back, I hear "Mom, I just saw love back there." Perplexed a bit, I asked, "what kind of love did you see?" Our son says, "In that window. I saw love. Did you see it?" Sadly, I couldn't see what he was seeing, but I wanted to know what kind of love he saw. He concludes with, "Mom, there was a cross in that window. That's Jesus. I think you missed it. But I will find another cross for you so you can see the same love!" I thank God for our son who can help me to see Jesus when maybe I can't.

I had a jewelry party recently. The Spirit guided a friend/coworker of the jewelry representative to come with. We started talking about church. She had visited Living Springs around 5 years ago and has family friends here. She said her and her husband talked about visiting our church. As the Spirit guided our conversation, I was able to share what Living Springs was doing and she got excited. I told her about the blue dots, spirit tugs, Faith 5 and all the other wonderful things. As she was waking out the door, she gave me a hug and said, "See you Sunday!"

An omnipresent God is everywhere, even in the pew bear that recently traveled to Birmingham Alabama. God put it on my heart to send the little brown bear to a Down syndrome young adult who was in the hospital, waiting for a decision from the doctor whether to operate or let the wound heal. The decision was to operate. The bear was placed on this young man's chest and he held onto the bear. After surgery, the bear was put back on his chest. The doctors and nurses marveled at the way this young man clutched the bear. His father said, "Jesus is in that bear." We never know how God find ways to comfort us—it may come through a bear from Living Springs. Thanks to the pew bear ministry that made it possible for this young man and his family to experience God's love.


WORSHIP LEADER ROLE CRUCIFER ADDED TO 8:15

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION MINISTRY *Training Session to be held Sunday, June 7!*

There are often occasions when someone is unable to worship for a prolonged period due to recovery from illness, surgery, injury – or because of issues associated with aging. Our Lutheran liturgy provides a special service called "Distribution of Holy Communion" which allows such individuals to continue to be part of the worshipping community. Here's how it works:



Some of the bread and wine that are consecrated at Sunday worship are set aside – and at the end of worship, trained "Communion Distributors" come forward to receive these elements from the pastor. The distributors then deliver the elements to the home or apartment or institution of the person(s) unable to worship. In that place, they then worship together using a brief special order of prayers and liturgy, as a continuation of the Sunday morning service. Ideally, the distributor might take communion to one or two folks on a given Sunday – and a master schedule requires. A distributor might take communion to one or two folks on a given Sunday – and a master schedule would be worked out so that the distributions may be offered on, say, the 1st or 3rd Sundays. The distribution does NOT replace the other seasonal in-home communions offered through the pastor OR the pastor's visits. It is meant to be a way that we as disciples can help other disciples be part of an extended Sunday morning worship experience. You can think about it this way: our regular "communion assistants" deliver the elements from the altar to the people at the rail, while

"communion distributors" will deliver the elements from the altar to someone who is unable to be at the rail. The idea is that the person is still PART of the Sunday morning worshipping family - and is not separated from their brothers & sisters in Christ just because of physical circumstances.

On **Sunday, June 7, at 9:30**, there will be an initial training and info session for anyone who feels a Spirit-tug to be a Communion Distributor. Communion Distributors will be installed into this ministry at a special service on a later Sunday.

We all have a story to tell. God is living in us and working through us. Each of us has a story developing. Are you aware of it? Do you recognize God's Story playing out in your life?


We hope that this summer we will hear from everyone as people tell their God story. In doing so, others will recognize that God is also working in them and

A few of those golf balls of time can be spent as a faith family each Sunday sharing and praying about the "stuff in our lives" and how God encourages us to respond.








