### The Beginning of the Good News .... - This Month from Pastor Eric



This past month, the people of Livings Springs (along with many other congregations like us across the church) made it possible for our youth to be part of a marvelous life-enriching, city-transforming, hope-sharing event. Through your offerings of love, the disciples and youth of Living Springs also made it possible for an amazing 8092 diapers to be given to 3-year-olds in the impoverished regions of Detroit! On Wednesday, August 12, our Youth will be sharing their experiences at the Shareholders Thank-You Supper—and we look forward to being together with everyone to celebrate their experience!

When it comes to our youth gatherings, there is always much attention given to the activities, events, servant projects, music, speakers—but what often goes unnoticed is the amount of time and energy devoted to Scriptural themes and the life-empowering

message of God's word for our young disciples. As 30,00 Lutheran youth and leaders assembled in Detroit, the gospel of Mark stood at the centerpiece of our time together. Separate days focused on Proclaiming Justice, Proclaiming Community, and Proclaiming Story—all

under the over-arching theme of being called to "Rise Up Together" in the name of Christ to "Bear Burdens, Build Bridges, Break Chains, and Bring Hope." Key Markan passages were: Mark 2:1-12 (healing of paralytic); Mark 6:30-44 (feeding of 5000); Mark 6:47-51 (Jesus walking on water); Mark 15:33-39 (the cross); and Mark 16:1-8 (Jesus' Resurrection) - all within a huge focus on the very first verse of Mark's Gospel: "The beginning of the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of God!" (Mark 1:1).

As disciples, we continue the Good **News Story of Jesus.** We rise up together to:

- Bear Burdens
- Build Bridges
- Break Chains
- Bring Hope

As many of you from Bible Study will remember, this first verse acts as a summary title for all that follows in Mark's Gospel—the point being that everything the gospel tells us about Jesus is only the beginning of the Good News. Our own stories of faith and life are part of God's ongoing story of Good News for this world. The Good News of Jesus continues to unfold in new and miraculous ways still 2000 years later, because Jesus is alive and has sent the Holy Spirit to work in and through all those who have been baptized into Christ and marked with the cross!

**Because of the living** Lord Jesus, our own stories of faith and life are part of God's ongoing story of Good News for this world!

The Good News story of Jesus certainly continued in Detroit last month as young disciples rose up together to bear burdens, build bridges, break chains, and bring hope. But the Good News story of Jesus also continued in Charleston, SC this summer as disciples offered truly amazing forgiveness in the aftermath of a horrible act of hatred and violence. The Good News story of Jesus continued this summer in Columbia as youth & adults from area Lutheran congregations joined together in the GraceWorks event to bring hope to homeless persons, elderly individuals, autistic children, disabled veterans, and more. The Good News story of Jesus continued here at Living

Springs this summer through dozens of children and youth who participated in SPARK camp. The Good News story of Jesus continued in the NC mountains through youth who shared the power of Christ at Lutheridge and Lutherock. The Good News story of Jesus continued in living rooms where Living Springs disciples gathered to share Disciple Stories and Spirit-Tugs at cottage gatherings (a make-up gathering will be held on August 30 for those who could not attend in June). The list goes on and on ....

As we move into August, I am excited about the many ways the Spirit is tugging in disciples' hearts to be part of the continuing Good News story of Jesus. Rally Day on August 23 will kick off our next Faith Alive! Sunday School year—and it will also introduce the new Adult Faith Milestones emphasis from our Lifelong Discipleship Team (the first two offerings of which will focus on Deepening our Core Relationships—a fall series on "Deepening our Relationship with God through Prayer," and a fall event for couples of all ages & stages to deepen their relationships). Growing out of our "Time of Prayer & Conversation" on July 12, a group of Living Springs disciples is emerging to plan next steps in efforts at further breaking down barriers of race and ethnicity (if you have a Spirit-Tug to be part of this, please let me know). Plans are taking shape for a big "God's Work, Our Hands" weekend in September, with a stuff-a-bus campaign for our Backpack food ministry at area grocery stores, and another Old-Fashioned Sunday meal for the residents of Epworth Children's Home and other agencies. Parents' Gatherings are being planned to develop next strategies for our 3 youth groups and build on the energy coming out of this summer's youth experiences. The annual **School Supply Drive** 



and **Blessing of Bookbags** will allow us to highlight the continuing story of Jesus' Good News in the lives of our own students and those students in need from the surrounding community. And the arrival of **Vicar Marty Wagner**, as our first full-time seminary intern in several years, will lead us to new ventures of continuing the Good News Story of Jesus here in this community of disciples (we give thanks to God for the seminary grant which made this partnership possible)!

At "Proclaim Story" Day in Detroit, over 500 youth and leaders from SC gathered for worship and learning—and throughout the afternoon, all those voices could be heard together repeatedly echoing the cheer, "Jesus is .... Good News! Jesus is .... Good News! Jesus is .... Good News!" As we move into the fall, there is so much that society entices us to cheer about, but let us never forget that as disciples, we are continuing to live out the greatest Good News of hope and light that humanity has ever known. Each and every day,

may our lives and all that we share here in this community of disciples become a living cheer echoing throughout the streets and halls of wherever we go, "Jesus is .... Good News!"




### Meet Our New Vicar - Marty Wagner



Council Devotions: "Evangelism without Additives" Ch. 7 – Do what is doable

We often set our sights too big! We need to instead focus on the small things that we are doable in our lives.

Remember the story of Jesus feeding the 5,000? His disciples gathered what they could and Jesus took it and made it enough for everyone! You just need to do the little things and Jesus will take it from there. Practice the rule of 10% - a 10% increase in your spiritual practice will provide multiple dividends.

**Challenge:** Do the small things- set a realistic goal to help someone get closer to Jesus.




