#### **Images of God's Work - This Month from Pastor Eric**



With the seemingly never-ending parade of new phone models being rolled out on the market, I see many comments about the growing storage capacity of our smart devices. While we now have the capability to store thousands of images on those devices, neuro-scientists say this pales in comparison to the number of images we are able to store in the original smart device that God installed within us: the human brain. As we go through daily life, we are bombarded by so many images, many of which create stress or confusion or pain. One of the great blessings of being part of a faith community is that it exposes us to images that reflect the goodness of God's light and hope and grace amidst all the darkness and struggles of the world.

Each month, I am amazed by such images that unfold here among this community of disciples. Because of God's work among us in just the past few weeks, we are now

blessed to have stored in our brains the image of nearly 100 guests from the Epworth Children's Home filling the sanctuary and fellowship hall for "God's Work, Our Hands"—worshipping and talking with LS members, hugging Pew Bears, eating meat loaf & mashed potatoes & sundaes (one guest shared, "Man, this is real food—on Sundays, we're used to only pizza!"). There is the unforgettable image of those same Epworth children "wanting to help," and along with LS disciples, forming a beautiful human chain on our church lawn to unload 2 buses of food items and paper products for the Backpack ministry and Angel's House transitional women's veterans home. There are images of Meals-on-Wheels recipients receiving hand -delivered, hot meat loaf Sunday meals. There are images of Sr. Youth helping folks with shopping carts in a Bi-Lo parking lot on Stuff-a-Bus Saturday—and a young child handing a bag to one of our adults outside the IGA and saying, "My mommy told me what your bus was for—and I want those kids to have some

There are images of Club 3456 Youth making prayer bracelets for at-risk youth and Sr. Youth headed out for Youth Day at Newberry College with our seminary intern. There are images of Lutheran Men singing God's praises on Men's Sunday and sharing their excitement about morning Bible studies, retreats, monthly breakfasts, and mission projects. There are image sof 80 JV football players linking arms in devotion & prayer with LS disciples who care enough to feed and talk with them each Thursday before a game. There are images of choirs, musicians, and congregation giving thanks to God for the amazing musical leadership provided by Nickie Riley over the past 7 years. There are images of educators of faith from 3 school districts & 2 preschools sitting together in prayer at our LS quarterly P.I.E. (Partners in Education) Gathering. There are images of disciples gathered around various prayer stations in the sanctuary, embarking on a journey to grow deeper in our relationship of God. There are images of parents greeted by staff at our Preschool/ASC Showcase afternoon, to share the joy of how their children are being nurtured in faith. There are images of the education building filled with activity on a Sunday afternoon: K-2 youth & parents having fun with Bible activities; Women of the ELCA gathered around another table planning & praying; Confirmation students laughing and learning in the youth room with their teacher; Confirmation parents meeting in an adjacent room with pastor to talk about the lessons so they can be reinforced at home. Every Sunday, there are wonderful images of worshippers with Scripture-themed name tags, sharing Christ's peace with each other

and receiving the Lord's Supper ... by name. So many, many images of God's light and hope and joy!

As we find ourselves uplifted by such images from the month past, we also begin clearing space in our "brain-storage devices" for images of hope and light that God will bring us in the month ahead: the image

of children & family members having a day together at our first Fishing Fellowship Event (Oct. 3); the image of Faith Friends being blessed in their call to nurture the gift of faith across the generations (Oct. 4); the image of pets receiving prayers at the Animal Blessing Service (Oct. 4); the image of LS disciples and friends gathered on a fall Saturday at Poinsett Park for fellowship, supper, and Campfire Communion (Oct. 17); the image of a Reformation Sunday School celebration and Caroline, Connor, and Jack kneeling before the altar to affirm their faith in the Rite of Confirmation (Oct. 24); the image of our church lawn and fellowship hall filled with children, youth, and families for Trunk-r-Treat (Oct. 29); the image of our new

food packings, youth gatherings, ministry teams, football feedings, and more. So many, many images .....





# 500th Anniversary of the Reformation Kickoff

#### **A Mighty Fortress is Our God**

The one hymn that most symbolizes the Protestant Reformation is "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." In it, Martin Luther proclaims his confidence in God and rallies all Christians to war against evil. Basing his words on Psalm 46, he victoriously states "We will not fear, for God has willed His truth to triumph through us." Those persecuted and martyred for their convictions during the Reformation sang these words.

Luther understood the power of evil: After he posted his ninety-five theses on the door of Wittenberg's Castle in 1517, he faced years of trials and persecution, he was excommunicated from the Roman church, and he continually faced threats against his life and his freedom. Other reformers had been persecuted and burned at the stake. But he also knew "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in danger" (Psalm 46:1) and so he wrote "A Mighty Fortress is our God," proclaiming boldly that "the prince of darkness grim, we tremble not for him . . . one little word shall fell him."

Since he wrote it in 1529, Luther's hymn has been translated into nearly every language. There are said to be over eighty English translations alone to this hymn, but the version most used in the United States is the translation by Frederic Henry Hedge in 1852.

The first line of "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" is inscribed on the tomb of Martin Luther at Wittenberg. And its powerful words and tune continue to live. The hymn was sung at the funeral of President Dwight D. Eisenhower at the National Cathedral in Washington DC, March 1969. And it was also included in the National Service of Prayer and Remembrance, held shortly after the September 11, 2001 attacks against America.

<u>Council Devotions:</u> "Evangelism without Additives" Ch. 10 – Have You Lusted Lately?

We all engage in bad things, but God doesn't just look at the bad things...but how good does something have to be to make up for the bad? Matthew 24:40 "Whatever you have done for the least of these, you have done for me"...When you do things for others, we shouldn't be looking for gratification immediately because that's not the purpose in the first place. Little things can really make a difference: lay the foundation/make an attempt and then leave it in God's hands to where it will lead. God opens opportunities because He senses when they are being done for the right reasons. God's math doesn't always add it...the little things can add it – know the invisible, small, and ordinary ways to interact.

#### **Council Actions:**

- A motion from Worship and Music Ministry was made that on the weekend of October 17-18 (camping weekend) we continue to provide two full services at LS on Sunday, October 18. The formal service at the campout will be held in the afternoon/evening of Saturday, October 17. An informal service will also be held on Sunday, October 18 at the campground. Motion carried.
- A motion was made to accept membership of the Lander Family. Motion carried.

## As we continue to fulfill God's Vision, here are some of the mighty works that God has been doing in and through the people of Living Springs:

- An entire new Community Outreach Food Ministry materialized out of nothing- and to date; we have received monetary and Thrivent donations in excess of \$1,000 to already provide 350+ meals for 80-some JV football young men. More than food, it has been the power of God present in those meals, with young men sharing their personal struggles in private conversations and coming up to offer thanks for "reminding us that God is with us!"
- An amazing new Adult Faith Milestones program has been initiated by the Lifelong Discipleship Teamand dozens of disciples have already indicated their Spirit Tugs to: 1) grow deeper in their relationship with God through a prater series; and 2) grow deeper in their relationship with their spouses through an amazing Marriage Care retreat planned for November with Air Force Chaplain, Kris Cox.
- On alternating Tuesday and Wednesday nights, Sr. Youth have been forming tighter bonds and growing in faith with Vicar Marty and our youth advisors- as well as making a special trip to Newberry College Youth Day, to be hosted by Ashley Ramsey, one of LS own college students.
- A group of LS disciples held their first meeting to consider our call to be people of healing and reconciliation; disciples from LS appeared on the evening news broadcast, as they gathered with other Lutherans and members of traditionally African-American congregations to view the movie "Selma" together and take steps in our synod's journey of overcoming racial barriers- all of which has been inspired by the miraculous forgiveness and grace shown in the aftermath of the Emmanuel AME tragedy in Charleston.
- \* LS disciples-youth and adults-stood by church buses in grocery store parking lots and were amazed to see complete strangers opening their hearts to contribute items for our Stuff-a-Bus campaign.
- n God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, the sanctuary floor was filled with children of all ages and backgrounds-eyes and hearts opened wide to a puppet telling about the blessing of God!
- \* Teddy Bears from our Pew Bear Ministry brought hugs of joy to young children who have known very few hugs of joy in their lives-with LS disciples stepping forward to offer donations to that those yearning children could experience that joy!
- \* LS disciples prepared meat loaf and mashed potatoes and desserts and sundaes for nearly 100 visitors from Epworth Home and Angel's House, for our Meals-on-Wheels recipients and our homebound members-leading one Epworth resident to share happiness over receiving a meal of "real food," rather than pizza we usually get.
- Epworth Children lined up side-by-side with LS youth and adults to form a human chain and unload hundreds and hundreds of items for our Backpack Children and local agencies-and also joined together to help assemble Blessing bags, make crosses for Rice Estate residents, and weave bracelets for backpack children.
- Members from 2 choirs gathered in a circle in their choir room, reflecting on how their lives have been touched through the leadership and care of Nickie, sharing many ways they have grown because of her teaching and gifts, and offering thanksgiving to God for the 7 years of ministry she has shared with the people of Living Springs.

In order for us to know God's amazing, unconditional love for each of us, we need to know God's promises from the beginning for all of us in this universe.


