

"People of Jesus' Story" - This Month from Pastor Eric



As we move from February to March, we near the mid-point of this year's Lenten journey. It has been such a powerful experience to hear so many of you share about the people you have encountered in your daily journeys—and how you have recognized through the lens of God's grace, that we all are part of Jesus' ongoing story of compassion, forgiveness, and redemptive hope in the world. It has been wonderful to see persons recorded in your daily Lenten notebooks, but more than that, it has been wonderful to learn of them being etched into your hearts. I am thankful for those persons of Jesus' story that you have been lifting up in spoken prayer at our Wednesday services and for those many more you are lifting up in silent prayer at the end of our Sunday services. For me personally, it has been a moving experience to share the closing benediction/blessing not only for those present in the pews each Sunday, but also for those present in our Lenten notebooks and our hearts!!!

Carrying my own notebook each day has prompted me to take greater notice of people around me—sitting in adjacent cars at a stoplight, standing around me in a checkout line, sitting around a waiting room, standing at a bus stop, or gathered on a street corner. It has opened my ears to

hear more of what people are talking about, to listen for what is going on in their lives, and to pray for those persons whose names I do not know and whose situations I do not fully comprehend (but nonetheless God knows!). In the past week, I have even had the chance to have some individuals "autograph" my book. In explaining the book's purpose, it has prompted a few folks to say how affirming it is to be recognized as part of Jesus' story (and how special it is to have someone ask for YOUR autograph!). As we go through these final 4 weeks of Lent, I invite (indeed, urge) you to continue to carry your "People of Jesus' Story" notebooks with you every day and record your sightings: not because it will fill up your pages, but because it will subtly transform your day. Amidst all the challenges and struggles of each day, it allows you to experience somewhat of an excitement, looking forward to how the Spirit is going to

reveal something special in the most unexpected moment - an opportunity to perceive yourself & others more fully as persons in Jesus' ongoing story of God's grace and love for the world!

In the final week of March, we will together move to the most important week of our lives as people of Jesus' story. In that week, we will recount the story that gives shape to our lives as disciples and followers of Jesus. We will be reminded of people who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem with shouts of "Hosanna" and then within a week, found their shouts of praise turned into shouts of rejection and pleas that he be executed. We will be reminded of persons, who though they were his closest followers, nonetheless abandoned, denied, and betrayed him. We will be reminded of religious and governmental leaders who attacked him and witnesses who lied about him in court proceedings. We will be reminded of

people who were angered by his actions in the temple, who heard his powerful teachings, who dined with him in a sacred Passover meal, who watched him wash their feet, who wept at the foot of his cross, who placed his lifeless body in a tomb, and then on the 3rd day, found that sealed tomb opened by the power of God. In all the people of THAT life-shaping, world-transforming story, we will somehow meet ourselves—and somehow more fully encounter the overwhelming need for God's grace and forgiveness, power & victory in our own lives. We - and all those around us - are indeed people of Jesus' story in so many ways—but this holiest week of our existence, reminds us what that means at the deepest of levels. We are people of Palm Sunday ... people whose lives give praise to a servant-king, Jesus, the one who has come to us and the world in the name of the Lord! We are people of Maundy Thursday ... people fed

with the very bread of life and who have received the command that we are to love as Jesus loved us. We are people of Good Friday ... people forgiven and reconciled to God through God's own sacrifice of love for us. And, most of all, we are people of Easter ... people who walk each day with a Risen & Living Lord, finding ultimate meaning in God's victory over anything and everything that could ever threaten to separate us from God's love, even death itself. We, like those all around us, are people of this amazing story, people JESUS' STORY! For indeed, God so loved THE WORLD that God gave us Jesus!

+ PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 20 +

Worship Services - 8:15 am & 10:45 am Family Afternoon & Egg Hunt @ 4:00 pm

Our 8:15 and 10:45 Worship services begin on the church lawn, with the inspirational Procession of Palms. We enter the sanctuary to continue worship with the Reading of our Lord's Passion (suffering & death) from the Gospel of Mark. At 4:00, we return to the church for our Holy Week Family Afternoon, with activities for all ages, including an Easter Egg Hunt for children. See Upcoming Events Page for more details.

Palm Sunday, March 20—Service of Healing, 6pm

Our series of Holy Week Evening Services begins on Palm Sunday night. As part of this powerful service, we come to the rail to receive a special blessing and prayer for God's wholeness and healing in our lives, in whatever form that may be needed for each of us. Invite a friend or neighbor!

Maundy Thursday, March 24—Lord's Supper, 7pm

We remember and celebrate our Lord's Supper, along with First Communion celebration for our youth. The service concludes with the poignant and powerful Stripping of the Altar.





Good Friday, March 25—Tenebrae Service, 7pm

With extinguishing of candles and increasing darkness of the Tenebrae Service, we recall Jesus' 7 statements spoken from the cross. Worship includes the ancient bidding prayer and solemn reproaches, as we offer solemn reverence to Christ's cross of salvation. Wherever we are during the day, we pause in special reverence at 3:00 - the hour Jesus breathed his last.

Holy Saturday, March 26—Easter Vigil, 7:45pm

We gather outside by a fire with lighted candles and enter the sanctuary for the Easter Vigil. We remember the waiting of that night when our Lord lay dead in the tomb. We hear foundational stories of Scripture and affirm our identity as baptized children of God who are joined to the death and resurrection of Jesus.

This Month from Vicar Marty

WHO ARE THE YOUTH LEADERS OF LIVING SPRINGS?

On the surface this would seem to be a rather easy question to answer? Why the Youth Leaders are those people who signed up to serve in the various Youth Groups we have at Living Springs. For example, Nic and Rachel Peterson are the K-2 Youth group leaders, and Gary and Tiffany Ginn serve as the 345&6 Youth Group Leaders. For the Senior Youth, (7-12th grade), there are 3 leaders: Leslie Bloss, Adam Woodruff, and Vicar Marty. But are those 7 people the only youth leaders here at church?

No, they are not. When people are baptized into the Christian faith, we each make promises regarding the formation, nurture, and development of our congregation's youth so that they will grow in their faith, secure in the knowledge that they are appreciated, supported, and loved. Our youth need people to encourage them in their life journey, filling them with words of hope, encouragement, and truth. They need to be seen as individuals who are uniquely gifted for service in God's world. Sometimes we do not recognize our giftedness until someone else points it out. Wouldn't it be wonderful if you could help just one young person recognize an area of giftedness?

Our youth are incredibly gifted, incredibly persistent, and sometimes can be reluctant to try out a new ministry in our church because they don't want to do something poorly. So how can you, a Living Springs church family member help our youth try on new nministry areas?

I am so glad you asked that question! You can take the time to speak to our youth when you see them. If you don't know their name, then ask who they are. Introduce yourself. Tell a little about who you are, and what you like to do. Then be sure to ask that youth what they like to do. Ask them if they have any special activity or sports they like to do. Then, when you see them participate in ministry in church, make sure you tell them you appreciate their help to make our worship special. Start a relationship. Keep it going. Be real. Be a friend. Be a Youth Leader through connecting, caring, and conversing. Use these 3 C's to help lead and encourage our youth.

Guess What? These practices will make you a Youth Leader Too, and will provide strength and growth for the present and future church.

Here are just a few ways that we saw the presence of God in the sights we have been blessed to behold in just the past 4 weeks.

- The light of Christ's love shining in the faces of Grady Smith and Addie Peterson on their Baptismal days, with crosses marked on their foreheads and tears in the eyes of congregation members as they witnessed their newest sister & brother in Christ carried in their midst.
- * Young Disciples inspiring us on Youth Sunday, with song and dance and video and proclaimed messages and the sharing of our Lord's supper in a truly powerful experience of light & joy. Then, along with parents and leaders, offering us bowls of soup and collecting dollars to feed the hungry in our community.
- * Folks gathering for Wednesday Lenten services, with prayers being lifted up both silently & aloud for many individuals noted in our "People of Jesus' Story" notebooks.
- * \$70,000+ raised for World Hunger through the Super Bowl bishop's challenge of the Rocky Mtn. and NC/SC Synods, with added inspiration from our synod vice-president (Lexanne).
- † 179 coats/blankets and 100+ gloves arriving in less than 70 hours from congregation members and neighborhood friends to bring warmth to children in cold winter weather.
- * Worshippers from 5 congregations gathering in the sanctuary for a shared MLK Service & fellowship with folks inspired by Dr. Thigpen's message and uplifted by choirs/bells/men's harmonic voices praising God.
- A national blues legend singing and playing guitar in our fellowship hall at a Fish Fry, while his wife helped fry the fish all in thanksgiving to God for what our Meals-on-Wheels ministry has met responding to comments about his visit to the White House with one of Drink-isms, "forget about the White House, the Lutheran Church is the right house!"
- At the same fish fry, a national African-American folk artist, Kitty Evans, sharing her powerful stories & song, while we also welcomed & fed families from the Family Promise ministry.

The Holy Spirit has gifted this community of disciples to:

- Experience God's presence at Beer & Hymns! The waitress shared that she greatly enjoys our monthly events with her and that this is her worship! We had a visitor who on that very same day had had a 5 hour cancer treatment and yet was determined to be in a cloud of witnesses to God's glory that night! We had 4 new groups of people join us and it was awesome to see the Spirit worked through this gathered community to praise God as ONE. Very powerful evening to witness the Spirit at work!
- * Share their gifts! One in particular is a member who graciously makes the names for "People of God's Story" for our worship and weekly faith formation focus. This one gift (like a child's small lunch) is given freely and shared for many!!!! This is the gospel at work among us!
- * Step out of comfort zones and see the joy on women's faces after studying the "Bad Women of the Bible" and next up the "Really Bad Women of the Bible!" This sparks so much conversation and laughter that it is a joy to see persons, no matter their age, learning more about the people of God's story.
- * Connect a secular movie called "Big Hero 6" with people in God's story. Our Kind-2nd and Club 3456 youth groups gathered together to make these connections between present day heroes, heroes in God's story, and then ultimately seeing God as our greatest hero!
- Join hands in a kitchen making pancakes for Shrove Tuesday and sharing in laughter! For being in community to help some people rejoice and even some overcome some sadness in their life. The Power of Family Rituals

The power of ritual is, it can hold you when you can't hold yourself. Most parents have some form of a nightly ritual with their small children. They brush their teeth, put on their pajamas and sit on the side of the bed to talk about the day. Perhaps there is a story, a song, a prayer, a blessing, a hug. As children age, this child-friendly routine often fades from the schedule. Stories become less frequent. The simple, peaceful songs shared between parent and child give way to isolated smart phones and adolescent attitude music. Hugs and blessings may cease. By the time the child reaches age ten,



the ritual might simply be a "goodnight." By the time the teen years roll around, many parents feel lucky to get a "goodnight" - let alone a conversation about the events of their day.

By instilling and installing the simple FAITH5 practice in the home early enough and reinforcing it weekly with the accountability of friends at church, open nightly communication can continue as the norm in family life before the teenage years hit. Children will be used to talking to their parents. Bringing God into the conversation, singing and signing the Scriptures, praying and blessing every night will become a healthy habit. Rather than fading away, these nightly faith rituals can increase in depth, meaning and value as children age. The caring, consistent "every night" faith dialogue may become central to family communication and health.

It can help hold a family together in a world that could tear them apart.

Why My Kids Weren't At Kids Church

When our oldest daughter was pre-school age, she was obsessed with The Nutcracker Suite. Well, let's be honest, it was the Barbie version, but she loved it. She would dress up like a princess and dance around the house pretending that she was the star of the show. When the Nutcracker came to town for holidays, my husband asked her to go with him. They dressed in their finest; she even got put her hair in an up-do, and off they went.



It was a long show. There were many in attendance, almost all older than her. While she loved being with her dad and seeing the show, she was also a preschooler so she wiggled and squirmed and squealed and giggled. She had to go to the bathroom. She got hungry and wanted snacks. But when she got home, she beamed.

I asked her to tell me about it and all she could remember was the scene with The Rat King (Oooo... scary!). I asked Luke to tell me about it and much of what he could remember was her wiggliness. Then I asked if people seemed bothered by her and he said, "No. Actually I had a few people compliment me on bringing her to the ballet."

I posted an adorable picture of their date on Facebook and many similar comments were posted, things like, "So good that you are giving her this experience at such a young age" and "This is exactly what kids should be experiencing."

Surprisingly not one person commented, "Hmm, seems like a waste of money to me. I mean, did she even understand anything?" Nobody criticized us for forcing her to sit through a long performance filled with imagery and dialogue she couldn't follow. No one complained about her fidgeting or her outbursts. And nobody questioned whether this was beneficial for her.

Because everyone recognized, it wasn't about her understanding the "story" of The Nutcracker Suite or her watching the ballet with a critical eye or even her sitting still through the performance.

It was about giving her an experience, a total package, filled with sights and sounds and smells and stories that could be felt and experienced even if they couldn't be understood or comprehended.



This morning, a mom shared with me that the reason her kids didn't join us in Kids Church is because every now and then she wants to them to get to experience the traditional service at church, to hear the liturgy, to listen to the hymns, to be a part of a service that replicates the services that she grew up in and that have been part of their family's tradition.

You see, for this mom, it's not about her children understanding each word of the sermon or comprehending the history of the liturgy or the meaning of the hymns. It's about the total package; the experience of being in church, sur-

rounded by the things that have been formational for generations and by the people who make up the body of Christ. These children get to be seen, they get to see, and they get to experience church.

The church experience is much bigger than a sermon.

Big or little, child or adult, the sermon is only part of the whole experience. *Not understanding the sermon in no way negates the rest of the experience*. Seeing the people. Singing the songs. Giving our tithes and God's offerings. Praying, at your seat or at the altar or in small groups or corporately as a whole church. Reading Scripture. Reciting psalms, hymns and spiritual songs. Smelling the incense. Tasting the communion elements. Serving. Celebrating. Fellowshipping. Communing with God and with each other.

It's a total package. And much of what is included in that package is not comprehended through the mind, but through the heart.

It's not things that require a certain level of development but things that are experienced through the senses and understood through emotions. A sense of belonging, a place in community, an important part of a body. All of that can be experienced, regardless of age.

As adults, we recognize that there is more to the church service than just the sermon. The same holds true for children too. Giving them the opportunity to experience the total package is a gift; whether they understand parts of it or not.


