"People of Jesus' Story" - This Month from Pastor Eric

"Christ Is Risen! Christ Is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!"

How wonderful it always is to hear that phrase shouted by hundreds of voices on Easter Sunday, as we gather in worship to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus! As you come to worship this month and throughout the first half of May, you will notice that we will continue to shout that Easter phrase – for although society has already moved past Easter, we in the church continue to celebrate the most significant event of our faith – an event so significant that the early community of faith often identified themselves by saying, "We are an Easter people!"

For Christians, the Easter season has historically lasted a full 50 days. The number 50 is highly symbolic. In Biblical numbering, 7 is the number which represents perfection (e.g., God's perfect creation of the universe, including the concluding time of rest, is broken down into 7 equal time periods). Thus, seven 7's (or 7x7) would represent something perfectly perfect (e.g., see Jesus' admonition to Peter as to how many times we should forgive). And 50 is even 1 beyond this ultimate perfection (50 = 1 + 7x7). [As an aside, 7 was also used to represent somewhat of an equivalent to the concept of infinity – and thus, in a foreshadowing of modern mathematical notions of "orders of infinity," 50 was a number that also represented something beyond even the "infinitely infinite."]

50 Days to Celebrate: We are an Easter people!

Now, all this numerical symbolism may seem meaningless to our modern minds – but the point is this, a full 50

in Christ's victory over death, we have been ushered into a new realm of existence!

days of Easter remind us that the central event of our faith (Christ's resurrection) opened humanity, and the entire cosmos, to a whole new realm of perfection and infinite life. We are an Easter people, because in Christ's victory over death, we have been ushered into this new realm of existence, where physical death is not the end of life with God, because God's love is so powerful that nothing in all creation, not even death itself, can separate us from that love in Christ Jesus (cf. the apostle Paul's beautiful proclamation found in

Romans 8). There are old stories of Christians who would gather in constant vigil & prayer around a person who was nearing death – and at the moment the loved one of faith took his or her final breath, those gathered would join hands and shout, "We are an Easter people! Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed, Alleluia!" To have such joy in the midst of grief-stricken tears is certainly something worth celebrating a full 50 days - indeed, worth celebrating every day of our lives.

Because Easter Sunday fell so early this year, we have a rather unique opportunity. (For those who don't remember – Easter falls on the 1st Sunday after the 1st full moon after 1st day of spring, which in and of itself, has another highly symbolic meaning. If you weren't able to participate in the Adult Worship Milestone series in January, come see me

sometime for the details). Usually, when Easter Sunday falls in April, the 50 days of Easter overlap most of May and get lost in all the other societal celebrations of graduations, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, etc. But this year, a bulk of Easter's 50 days will fall in April before all those other celebrations occur. As Christians, it gives us some extra time and space to more fully celebrate the Easter season and, more importantly, to celebrate what Easter means for us as God's human family.

We have some extra time and space to more fully focus on the truth of God's Resurrection power - the ability of God to bring life out of death, to bring new beginnings out of endings, to bring forgiveness out of failure, healing out of suffering, and wholeness out of brokenness. With Easter, we celebrate that God's love extends beyond the confines of finite time and space, and invites us into a new dimension of existence where truly, as Jesus proclaimed, "God's kingdom is at hand." In the presence of the risen Christ, God's reign of forgiveness, grace, salvation, and love remains right here in our midst! We celebrate that we are not alone in this journey of human life, but rather Jesus IS risen (not WAS risen). Jesus need not be described in past tense. Just as he promised, Jesus IS always with us - and continues to walk with us in the present tense! Jesus, Emmanuel ("God with us") lives – in a mysterious, resurrected form that defies the limits of finite time & space in a way our limited, finite human minds cannot fully grasp. Oh, yes, this is truly worth celebrating - for an entire season which extends beyond a perfectly perfect number of days!

On Easter Sunday at Living Springs, we rejoiced in the Easter truth that we are people of Jesus' story! Through

the gift of faith, in the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus' own story of resurrection and new life has become our story. On Easter Sunday, we also each received two little cards reminding us of that truth. I pray that you will carry one card with you - so it will be a constant personal reminder that YOU are an Easter person, a person of Jesus' story of victory, hope, new life, and resurrection! I pray too in the upcoming days that the Spirit will guide you to a special person, with whom you can share your 2nd card – so that through you, the Spirit might work to bring the Easter Good News to someone who desperately needs to know that they are not alone. Perhaps there is someone for whom life right now seems as dark as Good Friday, who is suffering internally or externally a



pain that seems as great as a cross. In such a circumstance, that person can find hope in knowing that he or she is truly part of Jesus' Easter story – that the stone can be rolled away and in the power of God's love, new life awaits. The power of God's Easter victory of love is for everyone – and, as part of God's beloved humanity, we ALL are part of Jesus' story. By grace, through faith, we are always an Easter people! Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen, indeed! Alleluia!

This Month from Vicar Marty

On Easter we often hear, "Hallelujah! He is Risen!"

And from other followers of Christ, we expect this joyful reply, "He is risen indeed!"

As followers of Christ, each year during "the holiest week of our lives," we journey with Jesus through the events of our Lord's last days leading up to his crucifixion. On Maundy Thursday, along with Jesus' disciples we experience again the Passover meal. We hear again the words Jesus spoke when he established Holy Communion for us and all God-followers down through the ages.

On Friday, we look on as Christ is cruelly scourged with a stone imbedded whip, the skin on his back being literally ripped to shreds. We see the hatred and fear of the religious establishment who manipulate Pilate to sentence Jesus to death on a cross. We follow Jesus who stumbles under the weight of his cross as he carries it through the streets of Jerusalem. Outside the city, at the place of the skull, we watch in horror as our humble, loving, teacher, the very Son of the living God is nailed to a cross. We wince in pain as the cross is lifted up and roughly allowed to fall into place. With that jolt, those nails that have already pierced his hands and feet, now cause his own body hold his weight precisely at those fresh wounds. We cannot look. We dare not look away. We see him struggle to breathe, painfully lifting himself to catch a breath. We cannot even breathe ourselves as we watch our beloved rabbi, teacher, and friend dying before our own eyes.

But now Easter morning has come, and along with Mary and the disciples, we have gone to the tomb; someone has moved the stone that closed the tomb. Along with Mary, we have finally gotten the courage to peer inside where we can see the neatly folded cloths from our Savior's head. This cannot mean the body has been stolen. This can only mean that Jesus, our Master has risen! Hallelujah!

But, "What does this mean?" What does it mean ultimately for me in my daily life? Does it really matter? Yes, it matters more than anything else has ever mattered in this life, in this world, in this universe. It matters because God has defeated the ultimate enemy, death, and all things that lead to death or the diminishing of life: evil and disorder, waste and pollution, and poverty and hunger, anger and war, destruction and injustice, unfaithfulness and despair. All those things have been defeated by God who created us to share in the joy and love already shared by the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Don't believe it? Come and See.

Believe it? Go and Tell.

He is risen indeed!

The letter said that this person had received CARE packages from Living Springs Lutheran Church during exam weeks when he was in college. He related that, because they meant so much to him, he was inspired to start this at his current church. I must admit I have always been doubtful that these boxes, sent over the years to many students, were appreciated. But now, knowing that this one person appreciated our efforts, has been such a blessing. Because of this ministry at Living Springs, others in a different time and place will also know of God's love for them at a significant and challenging time in their lives.

They say that God speaks in mysterious ways sometimes. In Adult Sunday School class, we were discussing that we constantly and continually sin. After a time, we realized this is all true, but that there is also Good News: Jesus forgives our sins when we ask for forgiveness — and wipes our slate clean! Just as this was spoken, I gestured toward the normally filled dry erase board. It was totally clean!

Thursday, I went with a group from our church to Hannah House, a residence for homeless women and children. We were talking a meal to share with them. There was a very small, four year old, adorable little girl running around. She had cute little pastel butterfly barrettes on her braids. She was interacting with everyone, giggling, jumping up and down and talking to anyone who would listen. All of our group, including the children that were with us, interacted with her.

One of our group began to give the blessing. As she started, I could hear someone mumbling or talking. I'm thinking, who is talking during the blessing. (Guess I was not as focused as I should have been.) Anyway, I looked around and saw that tiny head covered in pastel butterflies. Her head was bowed, hands folded with her little face pressed against her hands. Her eyes were closed and her face was intense as she repeated out loud every word of the prayer as it was being said. It was like a soft little echo to the adult's voice. I was moved. I know for sure is part of God's story.

- People of Jesus' story working in a kitchen to serve snacks and food for youth of diverse backgrounds;
- People of Jesus' story singing the praise of God and the glory of Jesus' cross at Beef O' Brady's on a Monday night with so much joy that the staff there yearn for those events, so that they might directly feel the "power of the Spirit" in that place;
- People of Jesus' story traveling to Keels Elementary to take time to read to elementary children and allow them to see positive adult male role models who value education;

The Holy Spirit has gifted this community of disciples to:

- Gather at Hannah House (Shelter for Women and Children: To give hope to women and children who are without and to help transition a dependent woman to a place of independence and self-sufficiency, capable of caring for herself and her children.) and share the gift of food and time with moms and their children. To see a child's face lessen with fear as we talked and colored... and the warmth of Jesus' Spirit is felt this is what it means to be the church. Very. Powerful. Evening.
- Be diligent in work and the Work to boost our Preschool Ministry to maintaining 100% occupancy for nearly 3 months!
- * Share written prayers to others on Social Media posts when they are having surgery, having a bad day, or simply need encouragement. This is being Jesus' hands and heart for others!
- * Courageously write down names of people in Jesus' story. Pray for them. Name them in worship. This simple notebook is encouraging us to step out of our comfort zones and seeing our neighbors as a part of our community even if we don't know their name.
- Open the hearts of our preschool and LS children to sing of Jesus' love and share it on a Friday evening at our Fish Fry. So many were grateful for that simple 15 minutes of joy we are blessed to have this preschool ministry; we are blessed to have the parents who trust in us to care for their most awesome gifts; we are blessed to have leadership who sees the importance of creating a safe space for children in our community to be wrapped in God's love.
- Encourage parents to participate with their children in our Faith Milestones Ministry which teaches the tenets of our faith (the Apostles' Creed, the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Lord's Supper, etc.). AND, that there are leaders who are Spirit filled and willing to share their time to teach these tenets of our faith. Again, this community continues to be blessed to be a blessing!





Sin by Peter Marty

It's what keeps us from becoming the people God wants us to be

Permanent ink on a white shirt is no fun. I purchased a stain remedy not long ago. It boasted of being able to remove virtually every cloth stain on the planet. When it didn't do the trick on my collared shirt, I read the fine print on the bottle. Asphalt, blood, grass and wine stains all made the list, but not ink.

A friend then put me on to rubbing alcohol: "Just blot it on there gently, Peter. Don't rub it in. Keep doing it over and over." Given my impatience with this frustrating blemish on the pocket of one silly shirt, I wanted to skip the blotting

technique and go straight for the rub. Never mind that rubbing a stain in fabric only tends to embed it further. I just wanted to be done with it. But I blotted, which takes patience and time, and was eventually rewarded with a gleaming white pocket.

The psalmist turns to language of the laundry room when addressing human sin. Here is his Introduction to Stain Removal 101: "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love ... blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin ... wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51:1,2,7).

God the launderer, who covers us with the fabric of steadfast love and abundant mercy, has the patience to lift that "sin stain" from the most complicated threads of our life. Blotting out, not rubbing in, is the Lord's way. No casual over-the-counter stain remedy will undo the ugly stubbornness of our deep-down sin.

God, with soapsuds everywhere, busy obliterating the grime of sin, makes for a striking image. The only caveat to keep in mind with this image is fair warning that we not reduce sin to mere external behaviors. This is a favorite habit of ours, cataloging sins according to their juiciest appearance, as if Christianity is really a cover for moralism stuffed with "dos" and "don'ts."

We seem especially adept at noticing the saltiness of other people's sins, perhaps because, as theologian Barbara Brown Taylor puts it, that exercise "takes the heat off the rest of us." Exposing someone else's sin to light is a clever trick for avoiding a candid look at the soiled or unseemly self that resides darkly within us.

What if we were to pay more attention to what goes on in that out-of-the-way chamber of our own heart — the duping, the self-deception, the covering of lies — than on the fascinating wickedness we like to point out in others? Jesus cares mostly about this internal character to sin. "But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart," he said (Matthew 15:18).

It might help to think of sin as a condition as inescapable as our nationality or blood type. Best intentions will not eradicate sin. "For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate," laments Paul (Romans 7:15). Only dying and rising with Jesus, to borrow his language, will keep sin from becoming our defining feature.

Note my persistent use of the word sin. The Bible does not focus on the bag of tricks we are capable of deploying. "Mistakes were made." "I used poor judgment." "It was an unfortunate lapse of good sense." The Bible does not depict God forgiving mistakes, poor judgments or lapses of one kind or another. God forgives sin. And sin is what keeps us from becoming the people God wants us to be.

The varieties of words for sin in biblical Hebrew are mind numbing in number. Yet all of them point to a hardness of heart or stiffness of neck that cause us to miss the mark, stray from the fold or overstep a line. However nasty or disrespectful we may be to an unsuspecting neighbor, stranger or friend, every sin is fundamentally a sin against God. "Against you, you alone, have I sinned," utters the psalmist (Psalm 51:4).

Perhaps this is what hurts most about sin — the daily rupturing of an otherwise precious relationship with the living God. So unintended in consequence, yet so personal. Only a gift as big as forgiveness can rectify the mess.


