One in the Spirit! - This Month from Pastor Eric



"...making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all." - Ephesians 4:3-6

Just this week, I attended our annual Campfirmation planning retreat in NC – and in the midst of all the planning, I found myself reminiscing about attending church camp as a child. There were some things I did not especially like at the time (the mattresses and showers and some of the food nothing is ever perfect!), but even after 40 years, I still have not forgotten the sense of the Spirit and how those weeks of summer camp had such a great impact on my faith – in many ways I didn't realize at the time. I especially remember gathering with hundreds of other youth for campwide vespers by the lake and all singing, "We are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord! We are one in the Spirit, we are one in the Lord – and we pray that all unity may one day be restored!"

My trip to camp was one of the first times in life that I had ventured outside my own hometown. There at that campwide vespers, there were young people from so many different

states and towns and cities and backgrounds. In contrast to the total uniformity of my small childhood circle of friends and neighbors, those youth did not all speak with the same accent, did not use the same slang words, did not all dress the same way, did not listen to the same music or follow the same sports teams. Of course, this was nothing compared to the larger diversity that exists in our world, but nonetheless it was an eye-opening (and heart-opening) experience for

a young boy – to find myself singing "We are one in the Spirit!" with folks so relatively different from what I had been accustomed.

Every year, as followers of Jesus, we celebrate 3 great occasions that define our faith: Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost. On Pentecost, we rejoice in the gift of the Holy Spirit – and how that Spirit empowers everything we do as God's people in the world (even our capacity to believe itself – see the box below, which contains our Lutheran teaching from the Small Catechism regarding the Holy Spirit as the source of our faith). There are so many aspects of the Holy Spirit we can truly celebrate, but among them, there is the wonderful God-given, Spirit-inspired, blessing of the oneness or unity we share in Christ. The original miracle of Pentecost speaks to this, as a great diversity of peoples are united in hearing the message of the Gospel: Parthians, Medes, Elamites, residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, visitors from Rome, both Jews & proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – all in their own languages hearing the apostles speaking about God's deeds of power (Acts 2:9-11). Throughout the rest of the New Testament, there is again and

again this focus on the oneness of the Spirit we have in Christ. There is the beautiful passage from Ephesians 4 (quoted at the top of the page). There are more words from the apostle Paul in Romans 12:5, "So we, who are many, are one body in Christ!" There is the great prayer which Jesus himself offers for his disciples (and for us all) in the upper room on

"I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the HOLY SPIRIT has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as the Holy Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins—mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true."

(John 17:11, 23). It is no accident that it is in this same section of John's Gospel that Jesus promises he will send us the Holy Spirit.

I am always excited about the wonderful ways we celebrate Pentecost at our Sunday morning worship experiences on that holy day – and this year will be no exception (come be part of it on May 15!). But this year, we also have a truly wonderful opportunity to celebrate the unity of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Weekend with other brothers and sisters in Christ. I hope that you will come be part of the Pentecost Weekend community picnic on Saturday, May 14 – as we gather with fellow disciples from Rehoboth Baptist, Northeast United Methodist, Adams Northeast AME, Impact Church, and others in our community. The fellowship and fun will be wonderful, the kickoff singing and worship will be uplifting, the hamburgers and hot dogs and desserts will be delicious – but most of all, we will find joy in celebrating one of the greatest blessings God has given us: the unity of the Spirit we all share in Christ, the risen and living Lord.

I truly give thanks for the unity we have in this community of disciples called Living Springs – and for the unity we have with the body of Christ throughout our community and the world. I pray that you may sense the strength and gifts of the Holy Spirit in your life each day, as you continue to sense the Spirit's tugs and encounter many disciple-stories of God's ongoing work in our world, all grounded in the Holy Spirit!

This Month from Vicar Marty

Greetings Easter People! But what does it mean to be Easter people? It means that we are loved with an everlasting love that knows no limits. But how can we share that love with others so that they personally know it is true?

One of the ways Living Springs shares that love is through the weekly Back Pack Ministry. Every week, volunteers donate and pack 50 bags of food so that children who get their meals at the school during the week, will have food to eat on the weekend. I was curious about how much all this donated food costs, and I was shocked to learn that it is about \$500 per week! I know that we have a dedicated group of people who are bringing food in each week, but I wonder if more of us could be a part of this ministry.



When the Back packers have finished packing the bags of food the two grocery carts are rolled into the center of the fellowship hall, and all the workers join hands as Pastor prays for the people who will receive the food, and for the food itself, and especially for the message of hope and love that it will bring. Today when we gathered to pray, I had the sense that we were sending a holy meal, a little like the meal we call communion. That meal brings us hope. It offers peace. It tells us we are loved. It makes us whole. Back packs are not the actual sacrament of communion, but God is there when those meals are prepared for sending.

So if you are wondering how you can share God's love I would suggest that one way might be to come and help to pack the bags, or bring some food for the Back Packs, or try doing both!

Celebrating God's work for Racial Reconciliation

On Sunday, February 27, over 200 adults and youth gathered for 4 hours in Northeast Columbia to view the movie, "Selma" and engage in a time of shared reflection, prayer, Bible study, and heart-opening dialogue. Hosted by Journey United Methodist Church (UMC), the event was co-sponsored by Adams Northeast African Methodist Episcopal, (AME) Impact Church, Journey UMC, Living Springs Lutheran, Northeast UMC, Pleasant Springs at Christ Mission, and Rehoboth Baptist, along with leadership from the SC Synod Racial Reconciliation Task Force. Individuals from these and other Columbia-area churches were intentionally seated in groups of 6-8 that merged members of traditionally white and African-American congregations. While these gatherings are the ministries of congregations, lay and rostered leaders, Mission Support creates the connections and context of mission and ministry where God is at work bringing reconciliation and enriching the life of this church. A Resolution on Public Education was adopted by the 2015 South Carolina Synod Assembly. As a result of the resolution the Public Education Task Force conducted a survey of South Carolina Synod Lutheran congregations. The survey revealed that 28 congregations are involved in Backpack Programs which provides food for hungry children; 19 congregations have members who are serving as mentors with children; 17 congregations are involved in reading to or listening to children read and/or provide tutoring; and 13 congregations are involved in collecting school supplies for their local schools. The network of ministry and mission formed through (your) Mission Support creates the efficient and effective base where God is making a difference in the lives of children in local communities. Helping to Bring Relief to Flood Victims and Rebuild the Community

When the "Thousand Year Flood" hit South Carolina in October of 2015, thousands of our neighbors were impacted in ways beyond our previous imagination. Good Shepherd Lutheran Church experienced the power of God's people responding together as community not only in our witness of those whose homes were destroyed and damaged by the flood, but also in the way that the community came together to support our first responders. Because of significant flooding to the Forest Acres Police Department, the police used Good Shepherd's fellowship space as their base of operations for over two weeks. Additionally a unit from the National Guard set up a base at GSLC with troops sleeping in the youth room, narthex, and every other quiet space. While the work of Flood Relief is made possible through special gifts, Mission Support creates the connections and context of mission and ministry that makes that work both efficient and effective. In times of disaster, the presence and mission of the church means that we are already and the church is able to commit to spending 100% of those specific disaster gifts for their intended purpose alone. - * Finance Ministry Team: Presented motion for Worship & Music ministry team to begin prioritizing necessary sound system upgrades and worship space repairs. Motion approved by council.
- † Finance Ministry Team: Presented a motion to test digital giving through Givlify with a small group of people. Motion approved by council.

- * Racial Reconciliation: Picnic event at Sesquicentennial Park to be held on May 14 with area churches.

Here are just a few ways that we have seen people of Jesus' story in just the past 4 weeks.

- The final Lenten Fish Fry, where we heard about the powerful ministry of Lutheran Services' Foster Care and where we culminated 6 Friday evenings of incredible servanthood so that once again we might share \$2000 to support our vitally important Lutheran Campus Ministry in Columbia;
- A wonderful group greeting the sunrise on Easter morning, gathered for worship under the picnic shelter with the Good News proclaimed by Vicar Marty and hundreds more gathered for joyful worship, receiving "People of Jesus' Story" Easter cards and signing the Easter board;
- * FMC Team members delivering exam baskets to our college students and taking steps to initiate a new LS Continuing Education Grant for up to 4 years of undergraduate education;
- A carload of Easter baskets to be distributed for children in need; Blessing Bags being assembled on Palm Sunday afternoon; 100 Backpacks of blessed food headed out for students to cover the Easter break, plus 50 more in each of the following weeks; another monthly hot meal being delivered to the women & children of Hannah House; members of our DHD program going to homes to do repairs and uplift disciples in need; donations received for another 7 LTSS Seminary Auxiliary Life Memberships;
- † Through Vicar's Project Abraham, disciples considering what it means to live in a world with people of faith from 3 traditions all believing in the same God who once spoke to Abraham;

The Holy Spirit has gifted this community of disciples to:

- Share their faith and passion for the Lord at our First Communion Milestone instruction day. The 7 young people engaged in a 6 hour class of storytelling from Exodus and the Gospels, bread making, chalice decorating and class discussion on the elements and communion ware. The Spirit breathed life and thought provoking questions into our young people and their parents.
- Be diligent in work and the Word to boost our Preschool Ministry to maintaining 100% occupancy for nearly 4 months!
- * Faithfully meet and ask questions of 2 very qualified musicians for our Music and Worship position. Our church staff really is a team and we desire someone who is a team player!
- Engage in discussions about our weekly "person" of God's story. The young people and some adults are enjoying meeting a new person each week and seeing how Jesus transformed their lives and how Jesus can transform our lives. These different persons have really helped our young people in dealing with some difficult daily life stuff. Very powerful.
- Attend a Seminary workshop on Human Sex Trafficking where we heard that this is a very large problem right here in Columbia. We are praying that the Spirit provides a clear path for LS to participate in some form of ministry for this horrific issue.
