What will be the final word? - This Month from Pastor Eric

In my newsletter article for last July, I asked the question that appears in the above title, "What will be the final word?" It was in reference to the shock we were feeling from the then-recent shooting at Mother Emmanuel AME in Charleston. Since last July, we have walked together through the Columbia flood and its aftermath, as well as subsequent tragedies in Paris, San Bernardino, Orlando, and now Turkey, plus the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Syria (home of some of the earliest communities of Christian believers) and many other places throughout the world. We now hold in prayer, as well, all those suffering from West Virginia floods, California fires, and other disasters.

At our **Service of Prayer, Remembrance & Hope** held at Living Springs on June 12, we lit candles and allowed the promise of John 1:5 to echo in our hearts, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." At times, with all the evil and pain we inflict upon each other as fellow human beings, I must confess that I find myself pondering this promise. And yet, in the midst of the world's darkness, the Spirit continues to reveal God's presence, and I always end up marveling at the Light of Christ's love & grace & forgiveness that continues to shine in this troubled world (just consider the amazing response of forgiveness from the member and families of Mother Emmanuel)!



The power of that Light was truly evident in the month of June, not only at that special prayer service—but in so many other ways we experienced the hope and presence of God shining among us:

* the incredible outdoor worship service on June 12, where

beautiful little Ethan Christy was baptized into the body of Christ, with his baptismal sponsors (godparents) able to join us on screen via Skype from Connecticut!

* nearly 100 SPARK children praising God with shouts of "Joy, Peace, Love", receiving smiles from snack ladies, craft helpers, story-tellers, drama leaders, and more, all while learning about the pattern of ultimate life-transforming J-O-Y (Jesus-Others-You)!

* our SPARK youth distributing flowers & hugs to Rice Estate residents, sharing blessing bags with homeless men & women, offering prayers of

thankfulness at the graves of veterans in Ft. Jackson National Cemetery!

* Rev. China of Adams Northeast AME and Rev. Thigpen of Rehoboth Baptist sharing with the SC Lutheran Synod Assembly how they sensed God's reconciling hope at work through the growing partnership with Living Springs and others in NE Columbia!

* that same assembly of nearly 500 Lutherans rising to show acclamation for the LTSS Leadership Award bestowed upon our own Lexanne Graves, for the ways the light of her leadership is shining for God's people in SC!

* LS Preschoolers and traveling hymn-singers sharing the light of Christ in song with Rice Estate residents, literally bringing tears of joy to their eyes!

* Lutheran Men (and women) bearing the sweltering heat to play golf in our annual LS Shannon Long Tournament, all to raise funds to support a mission congregation which will shine the light of Christ in people's lives!

* disciples gathered on our first Summer Hope Sunday, to learn more about breaking through barriers of silence & pain that come with Domestic Violence!



No Checks, No Cash...Givelify

Living Springs has entered into a new era: the age of anytime, anywhere digital giving. We have partnered with Givelify, the free, mobile giving app for churches. Givelify enables individuals to give digitally from anywhere, no checks or cash required; your offerings, tithes, and special gifts can be made right from the palm of your hand. There are no frustrating web forms or text-to-give codes to memorize and better yet, the app is free and totally safe and secure.

Givelify simply provides an alternative format for giving; it is not intended to replace our more traditional means for regular giving...offering envelopes, pew envelopes, or your own bank's direct bill pay*.

While we plan to officially launch Givelify later this year, you can now check it out and give it a try, or utilize it this summer while you are away.

To get started simply download the free Givelify app onto your Android device or iPhone; follow the instructions to create your account, securely enter your payment information and complete your first mobile donation. Make Living Springs your home church for quick, one-tap access and, the next time you utilize the app you can save time by using the "Tap Give Now" button since your payment information was entered with your first gift.

Several familiar offering types or "envelopes" are currently set up in the app...Congregational Offering, Children's Backpack Food Ministry, Debt / Maintenance Appeal, Disaster Response, Preschool Donations, World Hunger and Youth Ministry.

The app is free to anyone, but LS pays a nominal fee of 2.9 percent plus 30 cents per transaction. If you would like to add a dollar or two to help cover the fee, please feel free to do so – but this is not required. Givelify provides an alternative method for giving, however it is not necessarily intended to replace your current method of giving if it meets your needs. The app simply provides an alternative means for giving if you forgot your checkbook or envelope or if you do not have cash. It also provides an opportunity for giving while you are away or, perhaps a special gift.

Download the free Givelify app and give it a try!

Over the months since then, the hugs have continued, and one day, she brought me a piece of paper with her phone number written on it, saying that we might need her some time. I thank God often for this unexpected friendship and for the welcoming spirit of this young woman who continues to warm our hearts and make our days brighter.

MONTHLY HOPE SUNDAYS

As we read the Scriptures, we find many difficult situations in which the prophets called for justice, and in which Jesus worked to bring hope and healing. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to carry the torch of hope into these difficult situations of life. Starting in June, the **3rd Sunday of each month** at Living Springs will be designated as "Hope Sunday." During both worship services, we will have a brief, **3-4 minute Awareness Moment** to help us become more aware of the dynamics of particular issues – and there will be a **special prayer** for those affected by that issue. Then, between services, **from 9:30-10:30, there will be an**

informational session in the fellowship hall (with guest leader), where we can talk more about the issue and learn about opportunities and resources for hope. Hope Sundays can address any issue in which we have a Spirittug to shine Christ's light of hope, including some areas that we often find difficult to talk about. Possibilities include: domestic violence, Alzheimers, bereavement & grief, alcoholism & substance abuse, care for aging parents, human trafficking, homelessness, chronic poverty, veterans support, etc. If there is a particular hope area in which you feel a Spirit-tug, please pass it along to a member of the Hope Ministries Team, so that we can consider for our planning.



Summary of WELCA Convention in Greenville, SC



At the 2016 SC Convention, there were 199 in attendance and a total of \$10,205 was collected in offerings. The convention projects included Books for the State (1,492) and Books for Lutheran Services Carolina (4,106) at a value of \$5,096.50. 
