must have been to be in the German town of Wittenberg 499 Octobers ago, with folks beginning to grow in faith together anew because of the Spirit's work in a young priest and professor, Martin Luther.

A World Turned Inside Out and Upside Down Friday, October 21 @ 1pm

Martin Luther's Theological and Social Revolution

The Academy of Faith and Leadership welcomes Rev. Dr. Mark Tranvik for "A World Turned Inside Out and Upside Down: Martin Luther's Theological and Social Revolution." The year 2017 marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's attack on the sale of indulgences. Luther's reforms continue to reverberate in our age. Dr. Tranvik will explore how Luther's new

understanding of God resulted in a new way of being in the world. Dr. Tranvik is Professor of Religion at Augsburg College in Minneapolis and a Senior Fellow in the college's Christensen Center for Vocation. He introduced and edited a modern version of Martin Luther's The Freedom of a Christian and recently authored Martin Luther and the Called Life. 


Ecumenical and Interreligious Witness on the Eve of the Reformation Anniversary Webcast *Thursday, October 27*

COUNCIL CLIPS – Staff & Ministry Reports September 15, 2016 Meeting

<u>Council Devotions:</u> "The Agile Church" Chapter 5 part 2 <u>Council Actions and news (from September 15 business meeting):</u>

Finance Ministry Team: Working to complete 2015 audit for church and preschool. Also working on spending plan for 2017 to be approved at October council meeting and presented at Congregational Meeting on November 13.

Facilities: Replaced refrigerator in large kitchen with locking commercial unit. Many items from "job jar" have been completed by congregation members including; cleaned stucco on front of Preschool, cleaned preschool awning, installed mail slots/art wires/message boards outside of each preschool classroom, reinstalled cross in serenity garden, and many more. Check bulletin announcements for additional jobs to be completed.

Children/Youth Ministry: Marty Wagner and Adam Carnell will be working with the Jr High and Senior Youth group. Team still looking for a chairperson.

Fellowship & Mutual Care Team: More than 30 flu shots were given on 9/11. Ministry team will serve the first quarterly Senior Lunch on November 6th, following the 10:45 service. A soup and salad lunch will be served to those 60 and older. The team is looking for a care meal coordinator to be the contact person when meals are needed. Upcoming events: Beer & Hymns held on Sept 26; Annual Christmas party - Sunday December 4; Live Nativity -December 17 & 18

Lifelong Discipleship: Next Adult Milestone: Hearts & Treasures 9/25 - 10/23. G.I.F.T. Cottage meetings: 9/25 - 10/30. A Living Well Retreat will be held at Lutheridge 10/7 - 9.

Ministries of Hope: Hannah House Monthly Meal continues on the third Thursday each month. An estimated \$10,000 worth of food was collected during the Stuff-A-Bus on 8/27. Handicap ramp was installed on 8/27 for a Meals on Wheels client.

LMM: Bible Study continues on the 1st and 3rd Thursday each month at 6:30 am. LMM Sunday was held on 9/18. Camping trip is scheduled for 10/14 – 16 at Poinsett State Park. Continuing to serve food to Ridge View JV football team each Thursday through October.

Women's Group: Women's retreat scheduled for 9/30 – 10/2.

Preschool: Occupancy is at 97%. Plan to begin phase 2 of flooring project. In the process of renewing the N.A.E.Y.C. accreditation. Preschool teacher recognition Sunday on 10/2 with a reception to follow 10:45 worship.

Worship & Music: A task force has been created to begin working on a Rush Hour Ministry concept to begin on 11/15. Next Assisted Living Hymn Sing-along will be 11/17 at Wildwood. Technology task force is at work awaiting proposals from vendors for audio/video upgrades. Wireless microphones have been purchased and are being used during worship.

2016 Ministry Priorities: College Student Ministry is developing. Worship team is exploring different liturgy during worship.

Racial Reconciliation: Justice Bible Study beginning 9/27 @ Reid Chapel AME

Congregational meeting will be held on November 13 and will include an Annual Ministry Brunch.

God's Work. Our Hands. This expression about God using us became so meaningful when the children from the Epworth Center came and taught our adults how to make rainbow loom bracelets. The Living Springs adults were on blankets on the church lawn, playing with the children. What a gift those children were to us...and we hope that we were a gift to them, too! God provided a safe place for dialogue and an opportunity for the kids to be with adults who truly wanted to make a connection with them. It was a beautiful experience.

The Beer & Hymns celebrations have been wonderful! It's been such a great opportunity to sing praise to God and be in fellowship with other Christians. On one occasion there was a lady there in the parking lot, coming to get her pizza. She heard our singing and came in to find out what was happening. How great that our "joyful noise" was a witness to God's love in our lives!

One day I went to Lexanne to ask what Bible story she would be sharing with the preschool. She told me that it was the story of Sarah becoming pregnant. I started to cry and both Lexanne and Marty came to be with me. I asked, "Where is my Isaac?" because I had been struggling with wanting another child and not being able to conceive. Lexanne and Marty talked with me and listened, sharing their caring and love at a time that I really needed it. Through them I felt God's love and presence. A month later I was pregnant.

Last fall after Columbia's "great flood" I experienced God at work. The Living Springs Youth, along with some community members who just happened to call the church, were all looking for something to do to help those hurt by the flooding. We took the bus to deliver doughnuts to first-responders and their helpers. While we were out Pastor Eric received a call from Lisa in the Church Office that Colleen Francks had fallen and was at Providence Hospital. We were just a few miles away so we went to visit her in her hospital room. We participated impromptu in prayer, songs and devotions. I could see God at work as all of us -- the church Youth and our community neighbors - came together to support Colleen.

A "Disciple Moment" for me happens late on the Christmas Tree Lot at church every year. The youth, youth leaders, congregation, and youth parents, all come together to raise money to support the Living Springs youth programs. When the shipment of trees is delivered no instructions are needed – everyone pitches in! It is simply people helping people. You can see God at work on the Christmas Tree lot as we all come together as a team to support this ministry.

Recently I went to a nursing home to visit a 92-year old resident there. When I arrived it was clear that she was pretty agitated. I wasn't sure what to do to calm her down. Two sisters started singing old hymns to her and it worked wonders: she began to calm down. I knew that she was enjoying the singing when she said, "Yes, yes!" God was at work through these sisters: they were not only inspired to sing but led to remember the words of these familiar hymns from long ago. All of us were blessed to see God's work in this everyday place.

Last year I saw God at work in many ways through the community response to the flood. The Northeast church communities as well as the entire state all became involved to help people in need. God was present not only in these stressful times but also in the time of celebration we then shared at our community Thanksgiving service at Rehoboth Baptist Church. In times of trouble and in times of thanksgiving, God is there with us!

The Living Springs live nativity program is a highlight of the year for me. We invite church members and the entire community to come at Christmas and share the retelling of the story of Jesus's birth. I heard one visitor say that next year she will bring "all" of her kids so that they will be able to know God's love. I hope that she will – what better Christmas gift is there!

God is present in simple acts of caring that can happen at anytime and anywhere. A child at church noticed that a staff member had a "boo-boo" on her hand. He leaned over and kissed her hand and said, "I make you feel better." In everyday places and situations and through the acts of kindnesses others share, God is there for us!





Think about the last time you had a large family gathering. Maybe it was for Thanksgiving. Maybe it was Christmas, or a family reunion, or a birthday party. Can you think about what it's like to get everyone together?

Family events are often exciting. There's a sense of belonging. Often there's hugging, and laughter, and a time to share stories. Sometimes there's sorrow and tears. We take time to talk to people of different ages. We give children special things to do to help get ready—whether that's helping to set the table, or creating place cards for everyone. We often fall back on tradition—using grandma's china plates, saying a traditional prayer, or playing that same card game we play every time we get together.

Family events are also messy. It's loud. It's sometimes a little chaotic. Not every child (or adult for that matter) cooperates with the plan. Someone is late. Someone is in a bad mood. Perhaps it's clear that someone needs a nap. In the midst of our celebrations, our dysfunction as human beings often comes to the surface the most when we're with our families—because we know, no matter how chaotic life is, family is where we have a place to belong. No matter our age, or shortcomings, our personal issues, family is a place where we experience love.

Now think about worship. Consider: when we worship, we are celebrating a family meal at God's table.

When we come together as a church family, we will often find many of the same things that we do when our families celebrate. There's some basis in tradition. There's usually some chaos. We have those who are excited, those who are happy, those who are cranky, and even those who could clearly use a nap. **But it's a place where we all belong.** No matter our dysfunction, we look for ways to work together and be God's family when we are gathered.

That's what cross+generational ministry is all about, which is our goal on the 1st Sundays of every month. All members of God's family coming together. The next time you're at church, approach it like a family meal. Who will you make sure they feel welcome? How will you show love to another member of our church family?











WHAT IS THE GOSPEL TEXT ON REFORMATION ALL ABOUT ANYWAY??!!

John 8:31-36:

31 Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." 33 They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, "You will be made free'?" 34 Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. 35 The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. 36 So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.

By Dr. David Lose, theologian and President of Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia

"This text..... it's about freedom.

Jesus says that we are no longer second-class citizens in the Kingdom of God. Which was a crazy thing to say in the first century, because there were totally second-class citizens everywhere. Except they weren't called citizens at all, but slaves. Jesus knows this. He's knows people are going to have a hard time believing that someone can move you from being a slave to being free. That can only be done by the king or the heir of the king. And that's what Jesus does because that's who Jesus is. He is the heir, the one who can pronounce freedom. The one who can invite people to leave their chains behind and claim the abundant life and freedom God offers. That is the truth that makes you free: that God has *already* made you free and called you a beloved child.

It's about freedom.

The whole Reformation--From Paul's declaration that we have all been justified by grace to Luther's hammering his theses against the Wittenburg Church door to remind us that grace reigns supreme, the whole Reformation-thing was intended to tell us that, in the end, we don't need to do anything, earn anything, say anything, accomplish anything, or buy anything to earn God's love. That we already have it, and that most of the Church's problems – and, indeed, the world's problems – start when we forget we already have love and worth and dignity as a gift from God and try to earn it or take it from someone else.

It's about freedom.

The Gospel. Yeah, the good news of what God has done in Christ for us and all the world. It's about freedom, too. From time to time, we might wonder what the biblical readings have to do with our lives today, and we might wonder if the words and deeds of the Reformers 500 years ago matter, but it's finally all about freedom. We are not trapped. No matter what we may have done, no matter what may have been done to us. None of these things define us. We are free and the future is open.

Look, I know that can be really, really hard to believe. Some of what's happened to us seems so huge, so important, so all-encompassing, but it's not. Not to say that these things don't matter. They do. Illness, disappointment, hurt, whatever. They matter and they may, in fact, be *descriptively* true of us. But they do not *define* us. Nothing we have done or has been done to us captures who we are completely. Only one thing can do that: God, the creator and sustainer of all. And God has chosen to call us beloved children, holy and precious in God's sight. That's what defines us.

And so we are free. Free to risk and serve and help and care and try and struggle and laugh and all the rest. We are free, that is, to love, just as God loves us.

It's about freedom.

It's what our whole ministry in the Kingdom of God is about – **freedom**. So hear this: You are FREE......free from your past, free from regret, free from fear, free from self-limitation, free from old hurts and mistakes. You are free. You. Are. Free. I know it's hard to believe. It takes a while to get used to this truth. It takes some practice. Tell yourself you are free, and then come and worship to hear this same good news week after week, because the world will often try to convince us otherwise and so the freedom that sets you free, well, it takes a little while to sink in.

You are free, free to be what God has called all of us to be."

WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

Simply put, human trafficking is the buying and selling or trade of human beings. It is generally divided between two categories: labor trafficking and sex trafficking.

Lighthouse for Life is a 501c3 non-profit organization seeking to take steps against sex trafficking. 
