A Forgotten Season? - From Pastor Eric



Advent is the first of 6 main annual seasons in our lives as followers of Jesus: a way we order time in order to keep focused on our primary identity being people of Christ who are IN, but not OF the world!

At Preschool and Afterschool Bible times this week, students were gathered at the sanctuary steps. I say, "Now we are moving into a whole new time of the year. Does anyone know what season we' are starting?" "Christmas! Christmas!" the replies are shouted. "What has happened to Advent?" I wonder to myself.

On one level, I'm glad that children still recognize Christmas (even if they think the central figure of Christmas is a man on a sleigh or an elf on a shelf, rather than a newborn baby lying in a manger). But, alas Preschoolers and Afterschoolers are not the only ones who jump from Thanksgiving (or even Halloween) straight to Christmas, are they? Christmas decorations have been in stores for months; Christmas music started playing on Thanksgiving Eve; and the 4-week season of ADVENT seems to have disappeared from society like a relic of ancient lore. Yet, Advent remains the first of 6 main annual seasons in our lives as followers of Jesus (along with Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost). And ... Advent is so much more than a time for just counting down shopping days until Christmas!

Every Advent, we begin our Christian year by re-focusing on the promise that Christ not only has come in the past, but that Christ will come again in glory and that Christ indeed comes to us anew each day. In the midst of shortening daylight here in the Northern Hemisphere, we celebrate that God's light still shines through any darkness in the world—and in our own lives. We hear the call of the prophets and John the Baptizer - to be God's people who prepare the way for Christ's coming, in our hearts, in our lives, and in the world! We embrace this holy call by living daily as the Scriptures command—doing justice, loving kindness, and walking humbly with our God (cf. Micah 6:8, Matthew 23:23).

One of this year's church liturgical resources says the following about Advent: "Advent is about the art of waiting. Though all of us are tempted to act otherwise, now is the time for slowing down and leaning together. As with the ancients, we wait for the light. Instead of rushing to the mall, we take some extra time at home for devotion and prayer. We gather with friends of faith to worship, sing hymns that have given hope to God's people for generations, and hear readings of prophecy and promise from God's Word. In the shortest days of the year, we need one another and we need signs that the sun (and Son!) will

come again—life returning to dark and dormant land and lives. We gather each week to hear the word that does not pass away, that gives voice for our brokenness, and the promise of a Savior."

Here at LS, we began our Advent preparations with a joyful Adventpalooza gathering of folks from all generations. Lexanne Graves, our Minister of Faith and Life for Children & Young Families, shared this thought, "While our gathering last night was fun, creative, and interactive, the most important thing was that we were making God known. We were unpacking boxes and stapling candy canes to postcards so that people will hear God's love through our live nativity. We were making Nativity sets in a bottle so that our homes might literally see Jesus each day as we prepare for Jesus' return to earth. We were decorating Advent boxes for our homes, to collect food for hungry families. We were packing backpacks for children's hungry bellies so that they know they are important to God. We were singing and praising God because we are God's blessed children called to share our gifts. Thank you for making God known through your selfless acts of love last night."

In these upcoming Advent weeks, I invite each of us to remember Advent—and the blessing this season brings to our lives.

special effort to be in worship each Sunday morning; take advantage of our midweek Advent prayer services or special Advent/Christmas programs offered by our preschoolers, children, and youth; pause at work to reflect on the daily Advent e-mail devotion; set aside extra time in your home for lighting candles around an Advent devotion or Faith5; come sense God's presence and participate in the Outdoor Nativity as you share the true gift of God's love with others; donate a few hours of your time in the Tree Lot to help our youth have opportunities to grow in their faith-walk.

In these Advent weeks, **Love kindness in deeper ways** by sharing acts of mercy for others in need: help collect 2017 food items for the hungry by filling up an Advent box under your tree; get a Dove-Tree gift for one of the 20 children/youth identified by our local elementary & HS guidance counselors; come sing carols and play bingo with a disabled veteran on VA Ministry night; share joy on the caroling trip for homebound and care facility residents; join the Good News Walkers in passing out invitations of love and joy in our local neighborhoods. In these Advent weeks, commit to **doing justice in deeper ways:** participate in the make-up house Gathering between services on Dec. 3; contact one of our Justice Ministry Team Leaders and become a justice ministry network member; attend the Research-to-Action gathering on Dec. 11 to help begin the process of making concrete improvements in our first local target areas of Mental Health / Health Care and Education; pick up an ELCA Good Gift Catalogue (and ornament) and give a gift in honor of a loved one that will make a difference in the lives of "the least of these" across our planet.

In these Advent weeks, pray for the Holy Spirit to take you to a deeper place in your walk with God—sharing the Good News of God's grace and love for all in your daily attitudes, actions, thoughts, and lives. May this indeed be a holy season which prepares our hearts for Christmas in due time!

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

In this season, we are truly thankful for all God's amazing blessings in our lives—and for the faithful giving of our Living Springs family! We continue to experience a wonderful growth in ministry, touching so many lives with God's grace. This year, we particularly rejoice in the outpouring of love reflected in all the giving for many special efforts, including: Worship500; Hurricane Relief Hope Kits & \$57 Buckets; Music Ministry; Youth Ministry Projects; Campus Ministry support (fish fry); Long Mission Congregation partnerships (golf tournament); Legrand/Lowman Scholarships (auction); food pantry, hunger, homeless, and backpack food collections.

Now, as we come to the end of 2017, it is time again to make a concentrated focus on our Regular Offerings and Debt & Maintenance Fund, which both provide a solid foundation for all the special life-changing ministries that God makes possible in this community of faith.

In our Regular Offerings, we have again been blessed with stable giving during 2017, so that by the

end of October, we have been able to cover our to-date regular ministry expenses & mortgage principal by \$927. We have come a long way in the past few years (compare to 2013, when we had a \$33,000 shortfall by October). In addition, we have given \$13,738 for our Debt & Maintenance Fund, which is wonderful—but nonetheless puts us \$4,179 behind our \$17,917 October goal. The people of LS have an amazing history of special year-end offerings –and we are confident that we can respond in 2 ways in December:

1)a substantial December Regular Offering—to cover always greater end-of-year bills and expenses; 2)a special drive to bring us closer to our year-end goal of \$21,500 for the Debt/Maintenance Fund.

At year's end, we all receive appeals from various sources, and we spend lots of money on material gifts that often end up making little difference in people's lives. The amazing ministry video shared at our annual meeting again showed so many faces and stories of lives filled with the joy & hope of Christ—because a congregation called Living Springs exists here in the NE Columbia community! As we all ponder our year-end giving, we ask you to join us as council members in remembering Christ's important ministry at Living Springs.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Justice Ministry Update: Focus on Education and Mental Health/Health Care

God is working in amazing ways! In November, 541 of God's people from 29 different Midlands congregations gathered for our Midlands justice ministry's first Community Problems Assembly. Congregations in attendance were Lutheran, Episcopal, Roman Catholic, Jewish, AME, Baptist, Methodist, Unitarian, Quaker, United Church of Christ, Presbyterian. Living Springs was represented by 42 folks (the 3rd most of any congregation)! At the assembly, our own Gary Ginn was chosen to speak about the challenges his family has faced with the education system. Many were deeply moved, and one 8th-grade girl who was attending the assembly wrote a heart-wrenching letter to Gary. Based on information from all the powerful stories shared from nearly 100 house gatherings, the Assembly voted on 2 areas to be our focus for this year: **Education and Mental Health/Health Care**. The next step is to develop various Research-to-Action teams (with representatives from all congregations) that will identify a specific, concrete solution to address a particular problem in each of these areas for our local Midlands community.

On **Monday, December 11, at 7:00 pm** the Research-to-Action Assembly will be held at Rehoboth Baptist, to begin organizing the teams and sub-teams who want to be part of this process. So many of us know folks dear to us who are faced with challenges in these 2 areas – and we know that God is calling us a people of faith to make a difference in our community. Many of our 42 LS Justice Network Members will be attending the gathering on Dec. 11th. If you have a tug of the Spirit to become involved in this important process, please contact any of our **LS Justice Team Leaders: Peg Zieche, Gwen Furcron, Gail Buchanan, Helen Doerpinghaus, Sarah Schultz, Jim Zieche, Mike Davidson, Wayne Kannaday, or Sally Catoe.**

Again, it is so important to remember that our Justice Ministry is NOT part of all the recent justice protests that have gained so much publicity. It is not about political protesting or marching—but rather it is a faith-based model used by congregations for several decades in various communities—to help God's people work together in concrete, community-changing ways to respond to the Bible's call to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God!"






Helping Hands!!

G.I.F.T. ZONE Update We continue to tweak and work to improve our G.I.F.T. Zone Children's Worship Area experiment. Thanks to everyone who has provided suggestions and insight. For those who missed the April newsletter, below is a summary of information shared there. May the Spirit continue to guide us in our efforts to make worship meaningful for our younger families & children!

+ + +

G.I.F.T. Zone (*Growing In Faith Together Zone*) is an area in the front, left transept of the Sanctuary, specifically set aside for families of younger children. The Zone consists of child-appropriate, worship-oriented materials, with parent/child-friendly worship furniture laid out in a way to help children participate in worship. It is not a "play area," but a space where children & parents are invited to participate in guided activities that help them focus—and find meaning in the Scripture Readings, Sermon, Prayers, and more! Parents are expected to accompany their children in this area. *G.I.F.T. Zone does NOT replace our 10:45 nursery for infants, nor does it replace our Children's Message.*



Parents are not "required" to use the G.I.F.T. Zone, but it will be a meaningful option for them.

Why is Living Springs offering this G.I.F.T. Zone?

Nowhere in modern society are young children asked to sit still for a hour. Even in school, children no longer sit at individual desks like we once did, but they are constantly working in centers. In recent years, this has had the effect of worship being more uninviting for children and becoming a negative, anxiety-creating experience for parents. Some other traditions have addressed this challenge by creating a totally separate worship site, where all young children are totally removed from adults and the main worship experience. However, our Lutheran tradition has always emphasized the importance of families worshipping together, of children experiencing & learning the rhythms of our life-giving liturgy, and of the joy we experience in having disciples of all ages worshipping, praying, and communing as one. It is important to have children together with us in worship! As you may have seen in the Lutheran magazine, some churches are creating a more child/parent-friendly space and experience within worship. The G.I.F.T. Zone is one model that has been successfully implemented. As Lutherans, one of our greatest gifts of the Reformation was the emphasis on putting worship in the modern "language of the people." If you were a child or young parent in today's world, what would such meaningful "language" or space look like for you and your 21stcentury child? Our experiment during Easter Season is to create a space where children can experience worship with their parents, grow in faith together as family, and use all of their senses to learn positively our flow of worship liturgy. One of our most important callings is to reach out to young families to experience the power of Christ in their lives. When children and parents feel welcomed and know that they belong, they will return to experience the Spirit moving in their lives!

Why does it matter that we pay attention on how we integrate children in worship?

It matters because of Ephesians 4:4-5 where Paul writes: *There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.* Kids are part of the body of Christ, and we all have something to offer and gifts to share. Sometimes we just need to go the extra mile and pay attention to the details that matter to the various age groups so that worship is meaningful for all.

Why is the <u>G.I.F.T. Zone</u> at the side of the sanctuary (rather than the back)?

Research has shown that children actually learn more when they can see what's going on (and they're too short to see from the back)! We are blessed with a perfect design in our sanctuary, with the left transept available to give a direct sight-line to the altar, pastor, font, etc. Also, this puts the G.I.F.T. Zone off to the side of other worshippers, so that it is not right behind someone's pew or in someone's sight-line. Rather than fidgety children creating

distractions in the middle of the pews, children now have something that helps parents keep them engaged with what is happening in worship in a meaningful way. Again, we are blessed with a wonderful sanctuary design, so that no one has to sit immediately next to the G.I.F.T. Zone if they wish to be further away—and can choose their pews accordingly.
