So it's now the first week of April. Easter has come and gone, right? Perhaps that's what the disciples where thinking as well, after that initial Easter Sunday morning. The tomb was empty, the grave-clothes were neatly folded, and Mary said she had seen the Lord. It was an astounding morning, alright, but the full miracle was that the journey with the Resurrected Jesus was only just beginning.

The Resurrected Jesus would appear to his followers walking on the Emmaus road that afternoon; he would show up in their locked room that evening and return again the following week; he go ahead to meet them in Galilee (as the messenger at the tomb had said); he would help them with their fishing expedition and cook them breakfast on the beach; he would take them to an amazing mountaintop experience; and just as promised, he would send them the Holy Spirit! Yes, Easter Sunday morning was only the beginning.

At our Son-rise service, we focused on Jesus coming to meet us with hope and new life, amidst all the tears of our lives and the world. At our later services, we considered the amazing "bracket" Jesus had to face for all humanity – and how he shocked the powers by emerging from the tomb as the champion of God's love for the world! We thought about the victory and true power of Jesus for our own life-brackets. We marveled how we are called to be more than fans or followers - for by God's grace, we are made *teammates of Jesus on his champion-ship team* (we even took home a "piece of the net" as a reminder of that Good News).

But just as with the original Easter Sunday, our Easter Sunday of 2018 is only the beginning of what God is doing among us in the weeks ahead - because during April, we have some truly amazing life and faith opportunities. The Kilbourne family has had a truly heart-touching experience of how God worked through the people of LS to begin their healing process from the tragic death of their son and brother, Brandon, last fall. With the **Vision of Giving ministry** be-

gun in Brandon's memory, they are on a summer-long trek to visit 100 congregations across the nation and share their story of hope with other families who are going through difficult times (see VisionOfGiving.org). The journey begins here at LS on April 15 with a supper of sending & blessing, co-sponsored by our Men, Women, Youth and other groups. You don't want to miss this powerful story – please invite your neighbors to come share in this experience of hope (especially any parents or families going through their own difficult times of loss or crisis).

Following Easter, the Resurrected Lord empowered his disciples to be part of his Kingdom Team that would go on to fulfill the Lord's vision to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God." On Monday, April 23, we will join with some 1500 brothers and sisters in Christ from across the Midlands for the first incredible **Nehemiah Action Assembly** - to show support for specific, well-researched proposals that can begin to make a transformative difference in 2 community areas identified by God's people at our fall House Gatherings: mental health and education. The inspiration for this type of gathering can be found in Nehemiah 5. Our goal is to have as many present for this one annual night of "doing justice" as we have present at our 52 weekly times of "walking humbly with God" in faithful worship (for LS, approx. 150 people). Most of you have read the recent bulletin insert with the story by our own Adam Woodruff and his positive experience with the Justice ministry. I encourage us all to mark our calendars for the Nehemiah Assembly on April 23 (buses and carpools with begin leaving LS at 5:30 that Monday evening). If you can attend (or have neighbors/friends who would like to go), contact any of our LS Justice Ministry Team Leaders or Network Members (see the poster in the narthex).

Also, in Àpril, the Lifelong Discipleship Team is kicking off our next LS Faith Milestone Series, to be held on 4 Wednesdays at 6:19 (see Hebrews 6:19). Timely for the Easter season, this "Resurrection & Life" Milestone will ex-

plore Biblical passages about the Resurrection, plus focus on the passage through death to new life, including how we can walk through this journey with loved ones and how we plan for this journey ourselves by offering a witness for others through

our funeral worship service and legacy decisions.



Just as God's will came to fruition among the followers of Jesus in the weeks following that first Easter Sunday, so I pray too that God's will may come to fruition among us in these amazing weeks following Easter 2018and that the joy of Easter may continue to resound in your hearts every day!

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Justice Ministry Update: "From My Perspective" by Adam Woodruff, Living Springs Lutheran Church

Let me start by saying that I am not much of a writer but I do like to tell good stories. Our Living Springs Justice Team asked me if I would share my perspective and story of the Justice Ministry. I will do my best to share what I experienced on Jan. 26th when, as a Veterans Administration Military Service Coordinator, I was asked by the M.O.R.E. Justice Ministry Research Team to meet with them to discuss my knowledge and perspective on one of their focus areas here in the Midlands, Mental Illness.

First let me say that what I thought was going to be a meeting of myself and 3-4 people turned out to be a meeting of 10-12 people. The first thing that struck me and let me know that the Justice Ministry will truly have effects is the diversity of people at the table. There were 7 different denominations of God's children gathered and they were all at varying stages of life from Young Professional to Retired. There were men, women, black and white. I truly felt God's presence in that conference room...Read the full article here

Many congregations have strong faithfulness ministries like worship and Bible study, and most have strong mercy outreach like our Backpack ministry and Meals on Wheels. But we also need a way to fulfill our Biblical mandate to "do justice" (Micah 6:8) – to address the causes behind the symptoms and to have fair treatment for all, especially those who are often overlooked. We listened to stories from across the Midlands and this past November more than 550 people from 30+ congregations met to form the Midlands Organized Response for Equity and Justice – MORE Justice. The topics raised at our house gatherings were shared – and we voted to prioritize Education and Mental Health as the community problems to address this year. Since December, we have been doing intensive research on these issues. We are finding out about school disciplinary and academic achievement concerns - and learning more about needs regarding Mental Health care. On April 23, at our first community Nehemiah Assembly, we will bring together more than 1,500 people of faith to ask Midlands-area officials to implement our specific, well-researched proposals to help address these problems. Come share the joy of making a difference for people's lives in our community!

Monday Night Faith Class?





G.I.F.T. ZONE Update We continue to tweak and work to improve our G.I.F.T. Zone Children's Worship Area experiment. Thanks to everyone who has provided suggestions and insight. For those who missed the April newsletter, below is a summary of information shared there. May the Spirit continue to guide us in our efforts to make worship meaningful for our younger families & children!

+ + +

G.I.F.T. Zone (*Growing In Faith Together Zone*) is an area in the front, left transept of the Sanctuary, specifically set aside for families of younger children. The Zone consists of child-appropriate, worship-oriented materials, with parent/child-friendly worship furniture laid out in a way to help children participate in worship. It is not a "play area," but a space where children & parents are invited to participate in guided activities that help them focus—and



find meaning in the Scripture Readings, Sermon, Prayers, and more! Parents are expected to accompany their children in this area. *G.I.F.T. Zone does NOT replace our 10:45 nursery for infants, nor does it replace our Children's Message. Parents are not "required" to use the G.I.F.T. Zone, but it will be a meaningful option for them.*

Why is Living Springs offering this G.I.F.T. Zone?

Nowhere in modern society are young children asked to sit still for a hour. Even in school, children no longer sit at individual desks like we once did, but they are constantly working in centers. In recent years, this has had the effect of worship being more uninviting for children and becoming a negative, anxiety-creating experience for parents. Some other traditions have addressed this challenge by creating a totally separate worship site, where all young children are totally removed from adults and the main worship experience. However, our Lutheran tradition has always emphasized the importance of families worshipping together, of children experiencing & learning the rhythms of our life-giving liturgy, and of the joy we experience in having disciples of all ages worshipping, praying, and communing as one. It is important to have children together with us in worship! As you may have seen in the Lutheran magazine, some churches are creating a more child/parent-friendly space and experience within worship. The G.I.F.T. Zone is one model that has been successfully implemented. As Lutherans, one of our greatest gifts of the Reformation was the emphasis on putting worship in the modern "language of the people." If you were a child or young parent in today's world, what would such meaningful "language" or space look like for you and your 21stcentury child? Our experiment during Easter Season is to create a space where children can experience worship with their parents, grow in faith together as family, and use all of their senses to learn positively our flow of worship liturgy. One of our most important callings is to reach out to young families to experience the power of Christ in their lives. When children and parents feel welcomed and know that they belong, they will return to experience the Spirit moving in their lives!

Why does it matter that we pay attention on how we integrate children in worship?

It matters because of Ephesians 4:4-5 where Paul writes: *There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.* Kids are part of the body of Christ, and we all have something to offer and gifts to share. Sometimes we just need to go the extra mile and pay attention to the details that matter to the various age groups so that worship is meaningful for all.

Why is the <u>G.I.F.T. Zone</u> at the side of the sanctuary (rather than the back)?

Research has shown that children actually learn more when they can see what's going on (they're too short to see from the back)! We are blessed with a perfect design in our sanctuary, with the left transept available to give a direct sight-line to the altar, pastor, font, etc. Also, this puts the G.I.F.T. Zone off to the side of other worshippers, so that it is not right behind someone's pew or in someone's sight-line. Rather than fidgety children creating distractions in the middle of the pews, children now have something that helps parents keep them engaged with what is happening in worship in a meaningful way. Again, we are blessed with a wonderful sanctuary design, so that no one has to sit immediately next to the G.I.F.T. Zone if they wish to be further away—and can choose their pews accordingly.



During Lent in the G.I.F.T Zone, we have had different activities helping children to grow deeper in prayer. On this white board the child can write or draw a picture of something they are sorry for. Then they can wipe it off, representing how Jesus is grace works for all of us. We confess our sense, and Jesus forgives them!!

Why did Jesus fold the linen burial cloth after His resurrection? Have you ever noticed this passage?

The Gospel of John (20:7) tells us that the napkin, which was placed over the face of Jesus, was not just thrown aside like the grave clothes. The Bible takes an entire verse to tell us that the napkin was nearly folded, and was placed separate from the grave clothes. Early Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, that one whom Jesus loved. She said, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and I don't know where they have put him!" Peter and the other disciple ran to the tomb to see. The other disciple outran Peter and got there first. He stooped and looked in and saw the linen cloth lying there, but he didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went inside. He also noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying to the side. Was that important? Absolutely! Is it really significant? Yes! In order to understand the significance of the folded napkin, you have to understand a little bit about Hebrew tradition of that day. The folded napkin had to do with the Master and Servant, and every Jewish boy knew this tradition. When the servant set the dinner table for the master, he made sure that it was exactly the way the master wanted it....The table was furnished perfectly, and then the servant would wait, just out of sight, until the master had finished eating, and the servant would not dare touch that table, until the master was finished. Now, if the master were done eating, he would rise from the table, wipe his fingers, his mouth, and clean his beard, and would wad up that napkin and toss it onto the table. The servant would then know to clear the table. For in those days, the wadded napkin meant, 'I'm done.' But if the master got up from the table, and folded his napkin, and laid it beside his plate, the servant would not dare touch the table, because...... The folded napkin meant, 'I'm coming back!' He is Coming Back!
