"This Changes Everything!" - This Month from Pastor Eric



For over a year, our youth have been preparing for the amazing experience of the massive triennial Lutheran Youth Gathering with 30,000+ other youth and leaders – and as you read this, we will either be in Houston or just returning. The site is chosen 3-4 years in advance, with much thought and prayer put into selecting a city where we as Lutheran Christians can have a positive impact both spiritually & economically through service, hope and witness in carrying the presence of Christ. In recent years, Lutheran youth have gathered in New Orleans (in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina), in Detroit (in the wake of their economic downturn), and now in Houston (in the ongoing aftermath of Hurricane Harvey and other urban issues there).

I give thanks to God for this loving congregation that provides such incredible support for our youth, that allow them to experience the life-transforming journey of faith in Christ! This not only happens through the Youth Gathering, but through all the ways the entire congregation supports our Jr. and Sr. Youth Ministries, Confirmation, Camp Week, GraceWorks, Mystery Mission trips, Sunday morning Faith Alive, SPARK, Christmas Tree Lot, Faith5 Gatherings, and so much more. You all are awesome!

In the closing words of Matthew's gospel, Jesus commands us to "go and make disciples." (cf. Matthew 28:16-20) This was not a command for just the original apostles or for those who would one day be church professionals, but for everyone who would be a believer and disciple of Jesus (i.e., YOU and ME). As disciples of Jesus, we all are called to fulfill our Lord's Great Commission, as our thankful response to everything God has first done for us. So, it is good for each of us to regularly ask ourselves, "*What am I personally doing to help make disciples?*"

According to research, the biggest impact one can have in disciple-making is to be involved in the life of a child or young person. Last month, we saw many adults step forward to assist with our SPARK VBS experience. This month, another set of adults will step forward to help with the R2 Summer Feeding Program and our GraceWorks servant week (by the way, it's July 15-20 – see Pastor or George if you would like to help out for any part of a day or several days). Many of you are helping with our summer book collection for Richland 2 and the RICH Learning effort in Allendale County. In July, we have an opportunity to help our mission partner church, Christ Mission, with

their community children's program in Denny Terrace. Throughout the year, many of you volunteer downstairs with our Preschool Ministry or help with Backpack ministry. In upcoming weeks, we will be contacting individuals to serve as prayer/faith buddies for our Confirmation Students. In a month, we will be making plans for Rally Day to kick off the next year of Faith Formation. I encourage each and every one of us to consider helping out in some way: be a volunteer leader or helper for FaithAlive Sunday School time; be a GIFT Zone adult assistant; help out with the Jr. Youth or Sr. Youth; serve as a confirmation assistant or mentor; volunteer as a preschool classroom helper or an infant rocker; help with children's music or special programs.

As a child, my parents helped with such tasks, but I must be honest, those who shaped my faith-life the most were the many people who gave of their time and love beyond my own parents: <u>loving people of my grandparents' generation, empty-</u> nesters whose own children had gone off to college, folks who had no children of their own, wonderful young adults. Sometimes (as with most aspects of the faith journey), these roles with youth or children require us to move out of our personal comfort zones. But as we see in the Bible, it is outside our comfort zones that growth in faith truly occurs most. The Good News is that in addition to Christ's Great Commission, we have Christ's promise as we step outside those comfort zones, "I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS!" As we've said many times in the past few years, our call is NOT to "stay stagnant in faith alone," but rather to "Grow In Faith Together." Surely, there is nothing more energizing than to grow together in faith with a young person, for as Jesus himself proclaimed, we find the fullest joy of God's kingdom's when we see through the eyes of a child ourselves (cf. Mark 9:13-16).

The theme for our Houston Youth Gathering was "This Changes Everything!" – meaning that our life in Christ is truly meant to change everything about us. The daily themes were: God's CALL changes everything; God's LOVE changes everything; God's HOPE changes everything; Gods' GRACE changes everything; JESUS changes everything! The reason we make disciples is not just because Jesus commanded us to do so, but also because it is these blessings (God's Call, God's Love, God's Hope, God's Grace, and Jesus himself) that have the power to bring change into our own lives, change into this world, change into our relationships and families and neighborhoods and homes.

So let the seed be planted in your heart! How might the Spirit be tugging you for a change – to do something new and adventuresome, to become involved in the life a young person, to be a change-agent in the **GraceWorks Servant Week** world? Pause in these summer months to give thanks to God for all the people who stepped Kickoff @ St. Paul's Lutheran out of their comfort zones and gave of their time and **Summer Hymn-Sings**

energy to change your life as a young person. And May the Spirit inspire us all to carry on their legacy, so that through us, another generation may know that the grace & love & call & hope of God in Jesus does wonderfully change everything!





BIG NEWS: LIVING SPRINGS SAFETY PROCEDURES – CHURCH LOCK UPDATE

Beginning in mid-July, you will notice some new little boxes on our outside church doors. So here's what is happening. With all the sad world events in recent months involving schools and churches, council formed a Safety Task Force to review our church and preschool safety procedures. At the January planning retreat, Council adopted the Task Force's various recommendations, one of which was to update our church locks with a better system. The new lock system has these five purposes:

- 1) to make our sanctuary safer during worship services;
- 2) to make our Preschool safety even better;
- 3) to improve safety for groups while they are meeting in the education and office building;
- 4) to keep track of who has access to our facilities;
- 5) to improve ease of access for congregation members.
- There will be more details in the future, but here is some initial basic information.

Once the new system is operational, there will be no more keys for the exterior doors. Rather, each person will have a plastic key-fob that provides access to three doors: the main sanctuary entrance (under the portico), the main office doors, and the interior double doors leading into the fellowship hall. The plastic key-fobs can be attached to your car-key ring or carried in your purse & wallet. They are programmable for dates and times and individuals.

Some important dates in the lock change-over timeline:

- 1) **July 15 30:** The key-fob system will be installed for a trial period with staff and facilities leaders, as we work out any glitches.
- 2) August 1 15: All congregation members may pick up their own plastic key-fobs.
- 3) August 16: All existing outside door keys will not work any longer.
- 4) July 22, July 29, August 5, August 12: Info and demonstration sessions will be held on Sundays at 9:30, between worship services.

Here are some examples of advantages to the new system.

- Choir, bells, committees, and groups can keep the outside doors locked and each person can use their keyfob to enter as they arrive. You will no longer be meeting in rooms far away from the door at night, without having any idea if an intruder might be entering because you "had to leave the door open for others to get in." The same is true for events in the sanctuary.
- We can keep the interior fellowship hall doors locked for preschool safety, while allowing congregation members to use their fobs to get in and out of the main administrative doors (even without having to bother Lisa).
- When parents put a child in nursery for Sunday morning, we can give them a temporary programmed "nursery key-fob" that allows the parents to gain access to the nursery area without leaving the nursery area open to just anyone.
- The kitchen door will no longer be a safety hazard that allows anyone with a key to come in from the outside and have direct access to the preschool area downstairs. People can use their keyfob to enter through the main administrative doors and fellowship hall – and then go to the kitchen to load/unload through the door by opening it from the inside.
- If a key-fob is lost and someone moves away, we can simply de-activate that key-fob, so that we do not have dozen of unknown church keys floating around. Also, there will be no more exterior door keys that can be duplicated by just anyone.

There are many, many more examples which we can cover at the info sessions. We have had countless meetings to cover all the options and possibilities to make our facilities as secure and safe as possible for the ministry of God's kingdom. It may take a little "getting used to", but in the end, it will be a great blessing for the people of God in this place. Thanks to all who have put so much effort into this important step forward!

Note: as part of the lock update, we will also be re-keying all the interior doors, so that a new, better set of keys can be distributed to appropriate ministry leaders, group heads, staff, and others who need them.

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"Preparing for That!" - This Month from Pastor Eric

Quite often, I will see one of toddlers growing up quickly and make a comment to mom or dad - something like, "Before long, they'll have their driver's license ..." To which the reply will inevitably come, "Oh, pastor, I'm not prepared for THAT!" Yes, it is hard to imagine these precious young preschoolers or afterschoolers becoming teenagers. It will happen all too quickly!

At the end of June, I traveled with our Living Springs teens to a massive gathering of some 30,000+ Lutheran Youth in Houston. The nation-wide gathering happens every 3 years and is filled with many life-changing experiences. In preparing for this year's gathering, Youth Ministry author Morgan Schmidt shared research that has identified three central desires of teens: **1) someone to become; 2) somewhere to belong; 3) something to do [that changes the world].** In many ways, I believe these three central desires begin to take shape in us long before our teenage years.

Here at LSPS, I witness staff helping to nurture healthy responses to these "three central desires" everyday. Led by the Spirit and power of faith, they are helping each child become the special person God created her or him to be, with unique gifts and qualities. They seek to build a loving, inclusive environment where each child feels as if he or she belongs. Finally, they begin the journey for each child to know that he or she has a purpose in this world - that as human beings, we do not find true, deep joy in living for ourselves, but rather we find joy in doing things that positively affect the lives of others and thus change the world.

In living out your sacred calling as a parent, I invite you to consider how you might already be assisting your child to fulfill those budding three central desires. Every day, through your words, actions, and love, help your child know that he or she is becoming someone special, that he or she always has a loving place to belong, and that he or she has a purpose in life – something to do that makes a difference to others. For young toddlers, this may occur on a very simple scale, in the core relationships they have with immediate family or friends or in the ways you help them see life each day. Those teenage years will be here soon enough, but in the meantime, know that God is working in you to help prepare your precious son or daughter (or grandchild) for what lies ahead – a life filled with a full sense of uniqueness, belonging, and purpose. Thank you for helping them be prepared for THAT!

May you continue to sense God's guidance and wisdom for you in your daily parenting – and may you find many blessings in these summer weeks, as your family continues to Grow In Faith Together! Pastor Eric


Thursday

Our first speaker was Elizabeth Peters and she shared about stereotypes and how they sometimes haunt us, define us and follow us no matter how much we try to shake them. G.I.F.T. ZONE Update We continue to tweak and work to improve our G.I.F.T. Zone Children's Worship Area experiment. Thanks to everyone who has provided suggestions and insight. For those who missed the April newsletter, below is a summary of information shared there. May the Spirit continue to guide us in our efforts to make worship meaningful for our younger families & children!

<u>G.I.F.T. Zone</u> (*Growing In Faith Together Zone*) is an area in the front, left transept of the Sanctuary, specifically set aside for families of younger children. The Zone consists of child-appropriate, worship-oriented materials, with parent/child-friendly worship furniture laid out in a way to help children participate in worship. It is not a "play area," but a space where children & parents are invited to participate in guided activities that help them focus—and find meaning in the Scripture Readings, Sermon, Prayers, and more! Parents are expected to accompany their children in this area. G.I.F.T. Zone does NOT replace our 10:45 nursery for infants, nor does it replace our Children's Message.

Parents are not "required" to use the G.I.F.T. Zone, but it will be a meaningful option for them.

Why is Living Springs offering this G.I.F.T. Zone?

Nowhere in modern society are young children asked to sit still for a hour. Even in school, children no longer sit at individual desks like we once did, but they are constantly working in centers. In recent years, this has had the effect of worship being more uninviting for children and becoming a negative, anxiety-creating experience for parents. Some other traditions have addressed this challenge by creating a totally separate worship site, where all young children are totally removed from adults and the main worship experience. However, our Lutheran tradition has always emphasized the importance of families worshipping together, of children experiencing & learning the rhythms of our life-giving liturgy, and of the joy we experience in having disciples of all ages worshipping, praying, and communing as one. It is important to have children together with us in worship! As you may have seen in the Lutheran magazine, some churches are creating a more child/parent-friendly space and experience within worship. The G.I.F.T. Zone is one model that has been successfully implemented. As Lutherans, one of our greatest gifts of the Reformation was the emphasis on putting worship in the modern "language of the people." If you were a child or young parent in today's world, what would such meaningful "language" or space look like for you and your 21stcentury child? Our experiment during Easter Season is to create a space where children can experience worship with their parents, grow in faith together as family, and use all of their senses to learn positively our flow of worship liturgy. One of our most important callings is to reach out to young families to experience the power of Christ in their lives. When children and parents feel welcomed and know that they belong, they will return to experience the Spirit moving in their lives!

Why does it matter that we pay attention on how we integrate children in worship?


It matters because of Ephesians 4:4-5 where Paul writes: *There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.* Kids are part of the body of Christ, and we all have something to offer and gifts to share. Sometimes we just need to go the extra mile and pay attention to the details that matter to the various age groups so that worship is meaningful for all.

Why is the <u>G.I.F.T. Zone</u> at the side of the sanctuary (rather than the back)?

Research has shown that children actually learn more when they can see what's going on (and they're too short to see from the back)! We are blessed with a perfect design in our sanctuary, with the left transept available to give a direct sight-line to the altar, pastor, font, etc. Also, this puts the G.I.F.T. Zone off to the side of other worshippers, so that it is not right behind someone's pew or in someone's sight-line. Rather than fidgety children creating

distractions in the middle of the pews, children now have something that helps parents keep them engaged with what is happening in worship in a meaningful way. Again, we are blessed with a wonderful sanctuary design, so that no one has to sit immediately next to the G.I.F.T. Zone if they wish to be further away-and can choose their pews accordingly.
