



**CS**REMINDER: WE ARE UPDATING OUR OUTSIDE-DOOR CHURCH LOCKS!

- •Your current outside-door keys will no longer work after August 16.
- •Remaining info sessions are Sundays, Aug. 5 & Aug. 12 at 9:30 in the fellowship hall.
- •Ministry Leaders and other Congregation Members may pick up your personalized (plastic Key-Fob between August 1-15 during Office Hours (if you are not able to come during the day, please call Lisa in the office, to make arrangements).





### **ADDITIONAL INFO:**

You may have noticed some new little boxes on our outside church doors. So here's what is happening. With all the sad world events in recent months involving schools and churches, council formed a Safety Task Force to review our church and preschool safety procedures. At the January planning retreat, Council adopted the Task Force's various recommendations, one of which was to update our church locks with a better system. The new lock system has these five purposes:

- 1) to make our sanctuary safer during worship services;
- 2) to make our Preschool safety even better;
- 3) to improve safety for groups while they are meeting in the education and office building;
- 4) to keep track of who has access to our facilities;
- 5) to improve ease of access for congregation members.

Once the new system is operational, there will be no more keys for the exterior doors. Rather, each person will have a plastic key-fob that provides access to three doors: the main sanctuary entrance (under the portico), the main office doors, and the interior double doors leading into the fellowship hall. The plastic key-fobs can be attached to your key ring or carried in your purse & wallet. They will be programed for dates and times and individuals. Here are some examples of advantages to the new system.

- Choir, bells, committees, Bible studies, and groups can keep the outside doors locked and each person can use their keyfob to enter as you arrive. You will no longer be meeting in rooms far away from the door at night, without having any idea if an intruder might be entering because you "had to leave the door open for others to get in."
- We can keep the interior fellowship hall doors locked for preschool safety, while allowing congregation members to use their fobs to get in and out of the main outside administrative doors (without having to bother Lisa to buzz you in).
- When parents put a child in nursery for Sunday morning, we can give them a temporary programmed "nursery key-fob" that allows the parents to gain access to the nursery area without leaving the nursery area open to just anyone.
- The kitchen door will no longer be a safety hazard that allows anyone with a key to come in from the outside and have direct access to the preschool area downstairs. People can use their keyfob to enter through the main administrative doors and fellowship hall and then go to the kitchen to load/unload through the door by opening it from the inside.
- If a key-fob is lost and someone moves away, we can simply de-activate that key-fob, so that we do not have dozen of unknown church keys floating around. Also, there will be no more exterior door keys that can be duplicated by just anyone.

There are many, many more examples which we can cover at the info sessions. We have had countless meetings to cover all the options and possibilities to make our facilities as secure and safe as possible for the ministry of God's kingdom. It may take a little "getting used to", but in the end, it will be a great blessing for the people of God in this place. Thanks to all who have put so much effort into this important step forward!

Note: As Phase II of the lock update, we will eventually re-key all the interior doors, so that a new, better set of metal keys can be distributed to appropriate ministry leaders, group heads, staff, and others who need them. But this will occur at a later time.

- ± LMM: Next breakfast meeting is 7/28. The have are exploring how to make church facilities available for the Lutheran Beloved Ministry for disabled youth, as well as provided financial support. Exploring preseason cookout for the Ridge View JV football.
- $\pm$  Women's Group (WELCA): Gods Storehouse 8/13. Women's retreat to be held October  $5^{th} 7^{th}$ .
- † Preschool: Board manuals were updated and ratified by Council, with August 1 as official date for change of name to "Living Springs Child Development Center."
- Worship and Music: we will have a Unity service at 10:30 for G.I.F.T. Sunday on 8/26. Praise in the Park to be scheduled for fall.
- ± Safety Implementation Task Force modified scope of work to change church doors from panic bars to magnetic door. Information sessions are being held for key fob system at 9:30 on Sundays. As of 8/16, outside doors will not open with keys.
- † Campus Visioning Task Force is in place and has met. They are currently waiting to hear back from engineer on a different design for the parking lot, entrance, drives, and grounds.
- We are looking for coordinator(s) for Living Springs Lutheran Services Carolina's "Love One Another" campaign.
- Likingdom Visioning Task force being formed to work with Lifelong Disciple Team, so that our DOT Settlement could be used as a learning opportunity for congregational dialogue regarding our disciple-identity as stewards of God's blessings, acknowledging that "none of this is ours, but all belongs to God" and the Biblical understanding of "First-Fruits" giving.
- ‡ From Pastor Eric: As we reflect on our 2018 Ministry Focus Areas and Target Goals, there has been growth and change of Living Springs leaders and congregation, where God has lifted us up as disciples in deeper prayer, sharing and listening to God Stories.

**G.I.F.T. ZONE Update** .... We continue to tweak and work to improve our G.I.F.T. Zone Children's Worship Area experiment. Thanks to everyone who has provided suggestions and insight. For those who missed the April newsletter, below is a summary of information shared there. May the Spirit continue to guide us in our efforts to make worship meaningful for our younger families & children!

+ + +

**G.I.F.T. Zone** (*Growing In Faith Together Zone*) is an area in the front, left transept of the Sanctuary, specifically set aside for families of younger children. The Zone consists of child-appropriate, worship-oriented materials, with parent/child-friendly worship furniture laid out in a way to help children participate in worship. It is not a "play area," but a space where children & parents are invited to participate in guided activities that help them focus—and find meaning in the Scripture Readings, Sermon, Prayers, and more! Parents are expected to accompany their children in this area. *G.I.F.T. Zone does NOT replace our 10:45 nursery for infants, nor does it replace our Children's Message.* 



Parents are not "required" to use the G.I.F.T. Zone, but it will be a meaningful option for them.

### Why is Living Springs offering this G.I.F.T. Zone?

Nowhere in modern society are young children asked to sit still for a hour. Even in school, children no longer sit at individual desks like we once did, but they are constantly working in centers. In recent years, this has had the effect of worship being more uninviting for children and becoming a negative, anxiety-creating experience for parents. Some other traditions have addressed this challenge by creating a totally separate worship site, where all young children are totally removed from adults and the main worship experience. However, our Lutheran tradition has always emphasized the importance of families worshipping together, of children experiencing & learning the rhythms of our life-giving liturgy, and of the joy we experience in having disciples of all ages worshipping, praying, and communing as one. It is important to have children together with us in worship! As you may have seen in the Lutheran magazine, some churches are creating a more child/parent-friendly space and experience within worship. The G.I.F.T. Zone is one model that has been successfully implemented. As Lutherans, one of our greatest gifts of the Reformation was the emphasis on putting worship in the modern "language of the people." If you were a child or young parent in today's world, what would such meaningful "language" or space look like for you and your 21stcentury child? Our experiment during Easter Season is to create a space where children can experience worship with their parents, grow in faith together as family, and use all of their senses to learn positively our flow of worship liturgy. One of our most important callings is to reach out to young families to experience the power of Christ in their lives. When children and parents feel welcomed and know that they belong, they will return to experience the Spirit moving in their lives!

### Why does it matter that we pay attention on how we integrate children in worship?

It matters because of Ephesians 4:4-5 where Paul writes: *There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism.* Kids are part of the body of Christ, and we all have something to offer and gifts to share. Sometimes we just need to go the extra mile and pay attention to the details that matter to the various age groups so that worship is meaningful for all.

### Why is the <u>G.I.F.T. Zone</u> at the side of the sanctuary (rather than the back)?

Research has shown that children actually learn more when they can see what's going on (and they're too short to see from the back)! We are blessed with a perfect design in our sanctuary, with the left transept available to give a direct sight-line to the altar, pastor, font, etc. Also, this puts the G.I.F.T. Zone off to the side of other worshippers, so that it is not right behind someone's pew or in someone's sight-line. Rather than fidgety children creating

distractions in the middle of the pews, children now have something that helps parents keep them engaged with what is happening in worship in a meaningful way. Again, we are blessed with a wonderful sanctuary design, so that no one has to sit immediately next to the G.I.F.T. Zone if they wish to be further away—and can choose their pews accordingly.

When the gathering music begins, individuals can quietly come forward to meet Pastor Eric at the baptismal fountain. There, he will re-trace the cross with the water on your forehead and offer a special prayer of blessing for you (children may be accompanied by parents). There is nothing to be anxious about - everything is done quietly while the music is being played. For those who know only the month of your Baptism, you can join us on the first Sunday of the month (if you prefer some other Sunday, please let us know). If you do not know your baptismal information, then please pick a month when you would like to celebrate this gift of God's grace in your life – and notify the office, so that we can add you to the celebration list (we'll simply mark the choice of your month with an asterisk). Even if you don't know the exact date, it's important to celebrate this special gift of God's grace in your life. Again, we encourage everyone to research your Baptismal date and find out as much information as you can – let us know if we can help!
