"WARMING THE WATERS" SUNDAY TRANSFIGURATION DAY, MARCH 3

As we continue to journey in this season of Epiphany, in February worship we will hear the wonderful story of Jesus calling his first disciples who are fishers by trade. "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch," Jesus tells them"Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people!" (Luke 5:4,10).

Jesus' instruction to "put out into the deep water" is much more than fishing advice. It speaks about the entire journey of faith, disciple-ship and Kingdom-life on which the Spirit leads us, in response to God's free gifts of love and saving grace in Christ. At our annual council retreat, we had much powerful, prayerful discussion about this faith-disciple journey into deeper waters. The Spirit is truly tugging us into deeper waters of faith and Kingdom-life, but all of us find ourselves at varying water-levels. For one person, "deeper waters" might mean just dipping a toe into a 1-inch pool for the very first time. Another person might already be

in the water waist-high, so "deeper waters" might mean to going chest-high. Sometimes, those who are at waist-depth fool ourselves into thinking Jesus is not instructing us to go deeper. Sometimes, we overlook another person's challenge to first put just a toe into the water. This can be true in levels of Kingdom-service, giving, worship participation, prayer, Scripture study,

or the daily-life sharing of God's love—whatever aspect of multi-faceted discipleship the "waters" might represent.

Here in the midst of winter, I am always fascinated by people who take "polar bear plunges" into frigid waters—something I could never do! It can be difficult to even put one's toes into water that is frigid cold—and it can be challenging to go into deeper waters, because the deeper you go, the colder the water is. At our council retreat, after much prayer & reflection on all the responses you gave on those "Get-to-Know-You" Sunday sticky notes, the Spirit led us to this image of "warming the waters" - all the amazing ways the Spirit works through us, reflecting God's love in human voices and faces to warm the waters for another person to go deeper in God's grace (no matter what level "deeper" might mean).

At the retreat, council spent hours processing all the input from you and from our ministry leaders - about where we have experienced God at work, about what God is doing here among this particular community of disciples at this particular time in history, about the possible visions God might have for us to enable us to build upon what God is doing. It became clear that for 2019, God is inviting us to "warm the waters"

for others through 4 focus points: **Building Relationships + Building Partnerships + Sharing God's Love + Sharing God's Stories.**

In February, we will share these concepts in ministry groups and other gatherings. Then, in March, on the final Sunday before Lent, we will celebrate with a big "Warming the Waters" Day. Go ahead and mark your calendar for March 3!

In the meantime, here in February, we continue to build excitement about our Lutheran Services Carolinas "Love One Another" campaign, with a culminating

The fruit of the Spirit truly abounds among God's people in this place. May we "warm the waters" for all, so that everyone may find joy in going into deeper waters in this life-giving journey of faith and discipleship and Kingdom-life!

Council Clips - January 2019

† Council spent **Saturday-Sunday**, **Jan. 19-20** in prayer, worship, and discernment at its annual planning retreat at Lutheridge (taking advantage of a special offer made to congregational councils). Council utilized tools from the Faithful Innovation Luther Seminary pilot project and reviewed our congregation's statement of purpose and council constitutional duties. In order to arrive at specific **Ministry Focus Areas for 2019** (see pastor's page), council spent multiple sessions reviewing all the sticky note input from our congregation "get-to-know-you" session on Jan. 13, plus blue/yellow index card input from the congregation leaders who gathered that afternoon.

Business Session:

- † **Finance**: For 2018, our regular offerings covered all ministry expenses + mortgage principal payments, with an additional \$10,749.35. Council approved Finance Team recommendation that: 1) \$3500 be distributed for additional Mission Support; 2) \$749.35 be transferred to the Family Assistance Fund; 3) \$3500 be utilized to pay forward our 2019 Justice Ministry congregational commitment; and 4) \$3000 be set aside to help implement our 2019 Congregational Ministry Focus Areas.
- **Finance**: For 2018, we received \$20,907 in Debt & Maintenance Fund offerings. Council approved Finance Team recommendation to transfer \$9500 to Long-Term Maintenance (as planned), and hold \$15,407 in reserve for principal payments or future long-term maintenance needs.
- † **Kingdom Vision Task Force:** Council received the Task Force's report and unanimously endorsed their recommendations, which were based on input from the fall disciple gatherings: 1) Tithe amount (\$58,700) of DOT settlement funds immediately be set aside for further Kingdom Work beyond the campus re-structuring; 2) This amount should address hunger (locally and/or globally), provide for ministry with children/youth in need, and make a lasting impact on the community; 3) council should appoint additional members to join the task force in developing a specific plan for distributing this tithe amount in these areas; 4) that all interest currently earned from the invested DOT funds should be distributed on a regular basis for larger mission support and Kingdom work, as determined by council.
- † **Campus Vision Task Force**: Next version of drawings still on hold until road-widening progresses further. New corner sign is ready for installation, but rain & other road work has delayed the installation.
- † **Safety Task Force**: Next major task is to identify and train a Safety Response team. Office doors still to be equipped with coded locks.
- † **Technology Task Force**: All is complete in the sanctuary except for a small display screen above the sound board (for the GIFT zone). Camera that provides video feed still needs to be replaced, in conjunction with improved video/sound for our E-outreach. In 2019, we will complete Phase II, which focuses on fellowship hall sound system & projection display for fellowship hall (which could also be used outdoors for events like the Nativity).
- † **Mission Partner Team**: Council approved recommendation that Cristo Rey in West Columbia be adopted by the congregation as our Mission Partner for 2019. Pastor Eric will meet with Pastor Leone.
- † **Lutheran Campus Ministry**: Wendy McKenzie continues as our LS rep. on the LCM board, but we can also nominate an additional member for this team. Council identified candidates.
- † **Audit Team**: Council identified candidates to begin the next 3-year term on the Audit team through 2021 (joining Nancy Schwind through 2019 & John Imbert through 2020).
- † **Music Ministry**: We continue to fill the puzzle pieces. We have contracted with individuals to play both piano and organ as part of our instrumental team. We have developed a job description and are advertising for final person to serve as choral director (position will involve 21-25 hours/month).
- **Facilities Ministry**: It was decided that we will have a work day to clean up the side and back of the church during the construction process. Council approved \$1500 from LTM funds to help with this.
- † **Next Council** Meeting: will be held February 21, 2019.



JUSTICE MINISTRY UPDATE:
ALL NETWORK MEMBERS GATHER

Monday, February 25

As a result of the fall Justice Ministry House Gatherings, the Spirit led our Justice Ministry to identify safe, affordable housing as our target focus for this year. This was months before all the recent news about housing problems in our community, so we truly believe God was working in this process. Once a problem focus area is identified, the Justice Ministry model works by forming Research Teams of representatives from the various congregations. These teams do extensive research to find a specific, verifiable solution to present to public officials at the annual Nehemiah Gathering.

So we currently have 3 Research Teams in operation: Education (from 2018), Mental Health (from 2018), and Housing (2019). Along with members from 30 other Midlands congregations, our MORE Justice members at Living Springs are actively involved in learning more about problems in our community of, affordable housing, mental health, and school climate.

We now have almost 50 individuals who are Living Springs Network Members - and would like to have 6-10 more. On Monday, February 25th at 6:30, Network Members have committed to attend our next Network Member Gathering here at Living Springs (along with Network Members from Adams Northeast AME and Rehoboth Baptist).

The Justice Ministry is making a difference in this community. There are now nearly 100 Columbia police officers fully certified in mental health Crisis Intervention Training (compared to just 8 one year ago). Chief Holbrook is instituting a new 911 protocal to be able for a caller to request a CIT-certified officer for a mental health crisis. In addition, a Mental Health Clubhouse for Columbia has established its 501c3 incorporation, and a team is meeting regularly with Mayor Benjamin.





We each hear the mandate from Scripture for all of us to be involved in 3 things: "Do justice, and love kindness, and walk humbly with our God!" (remember that these are not connected with an "or"). It was a blessing to be a part of the ribbon cutting ceremony and see the beautiful transformation of this "building" that was torn apart and rebuilt into a "home", put back together engulfed in the love of so many people. Hope thanked everyone for giving so generously and selflessly of their time and energy in this joint effort to provide a "new normal" for her and her grandchildren.



Crafty Ladies donated a quilt to each of the residents (total of 7) on the cul de sac – one of the owners had just paid off her mortgage and hugged her quilt in celebration! Hope took the other quilts and stated it will be a good way to get to know her neighbors and present them with the quilt. (Habitat worked on all the houses on the cul de sac.)

A few LS people volunteered to do the Point in Time survey counting homeless in Richland County. We were assigned to the Washington St. Soup Cellar. I will focus on one person – Troy – I sat down and asked him if I could ask him some questions for this survey – he shrugged his shoulders and said ok. He had a little bit of an attitude when I asked him one of the first questions "where did you sleep on Jan. 23". We got to the next page – "what is your name?" I got a disgusted look from him and "why do you need to know that?" Begrudgingly, he told me his first name. Next question, "what gender do you associate with?" ... well, this definitely upset him! "What kind of stupid question is that?!!!!" These are stupid questions – go away, go away! What a bunch of stupid questions!!!!" Well, this really frustrated me, especially being the first time I did something like this (outside my comfort zone) – I proceeded to start notating on the form "no more questions – person was upset" and started to close up the form and a literal transformation came over Troy and he apologized for being so rude – "I'm sorry, I'm really sorry, it's not your fault – you didn't write the questions. Come on, sit back down, we'll finish the survey." "Are you sure?" We did finish the survey with even a few chuckles about some of the questions. At the end, I thanked him very much for completing the survey with me and told him to have a nice day. "No, I did have a nice day he said - because a very rude person was forgiven today." A few tears came to his eyes and a few moments of silence, he got up, gave me a hug, and then his words were "Thank you, thank you for your compassion!" I'm still thinking about this moment it touched my heart and I remember what Adam said in our Hope meeting that sometimes these homeless people are just looking for someone to care about them - I hope that Troy knew and felt in that few minutes it took to complete the survey, that someone cared about him.

On Sunday, Feb. 24, we are all invited to make our 3-year commitments to this important emphasis. If you cannot attend worship on Feb. 24, copies of the Commitment Form are available on the special LSC narthex table. Our congregation goal for the 3 years is \$9,705. This is a very realistic goal for our generous congregation—something that will make a huge difference in the lives of many individuals.

LIVING SPRINGS GOAL = \$9705 over 3 years!

The challenges in our state and communities have never been greater. As members of Living Springs and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, our desire to help address those challenges by serving our neighbor is in our blood. We have heard Christ's command to "love one another" and we *want* to help, but sometimes we are not sure how.



One way you can help your neighbors is through our partnership with **Lutheran Services Carolinas**, **or** LSC, one of the six institutional affiliates of the South Carolina Synod. Formerly known as Lutheran Family Services, LSC is a mission-based human services organization whose professional staff members are skilled in assisting individuals facing a variety of life challenges. In South Carolina alone, LSC provides more than \$9 million in services each year on our behalf to serve our neighbors.

LSC has been approved by the Synod Council of the SC Synod of the ELCA to conduct a capital campaign in congregations between January 1, 2018, and December 31, 2019. As you may know, this opportunity rotates among the affiliated organizations of the Synod and LSC has not had an opportunity to launch such a campaign in South Carolina since 1998. LSC kicked off its \$1 million *Love One Another* campaign at the 2018 Synod Assembly and an-

nounced 2 additional challenge goals totaling \$200,000 bringing the total goal for the Campaign to \$1.2 million. Efforts are now underway to share the message about LSC's work and what it hopes to accomplish next in South Carolina. Please know that all funds raised during this campaign will be used for services in South Carolina and will not be used for administrative fundraising expenses.

The campaign will concentrate on raising funds to support three primary service areas: Guiding Young People Transitioning Out of **Foster Care** across the state; Welcoming the Stranger through **refugee services** in the Charleston metro area and the Midlands; and Encouraging **Individuals with Intellectual and/or Developmental Disabilities (I/DD)** with a focus on the Upstate and Rock Hill areas. Our two exciting challenge goals will include an emphasis on developing customized employment options for our current clients with I/DD and a new case management program for **Veterans**.





Here, at Living Springs, our "Love One Another" LSC Emphasis will take place from January 27 - March 3. We urge you to listen carefully and to open your hearts to God's call to serve. For our society to heal and flourish, it is imperative that we love one another. Surely all of us can find something among these goals that speaks to our hearts. As you will learn, our Synod has had a long partnership with Lutheran Services Carolinas. With the success of this campaign, we can be assured that LSC will remain a vibrant partner in ministry for years to come.

When's the last time you sat around your dinner table and had a conversation about what it means to be the Body of Christ? During our Ski Trip in January, the youth had "dinner church" as a form of worship. In the middle of worship, we ate delicious lasagna and had great conversations about what it means to be the Body of Christ in our world today. I'd like to invite you to join in our conversation with your family around the dinner table. Here are the questions:

Notes from: Ar. Ufouth

This month, our junior youth Sunday school leaders began using a new seasonal book of lessons. This age group is blessed to have Sunday school teachers who have continued leading sessions from last season to this one. I love sitting in on other adults' lessons on weeks when I am not scheduled to teach. An unexpected joy that I have found on multiple Sundays in this new season of lessons has been being stumped by two junior youth group members who already know more Bible stories than I do. They always give me grace if I don't know the answer to their questions.

Their parents do an excellent job of exposing them to the people and places of the Bible on a regular basis. Many of the tidbits that their guardians have shared with them or scenes from a biblical movie they recently watched come up in conversation during our Sunday school lessons. Every time they are reminded of a story which they remember their parent discussing with them, the lesson is validated and the bonds between the parent, child, and Sunday school teacher are reinforced.

This example showed me the importance of keeping faith alive at home during the week. A lot can happen in the life of a child between each Sunday worship service. When our junior youth transition from elementary school to middle school, they can experience trials and tribulations of all kinds. Self-esteem is hard to come by during this phase in their lives. Cyber bullying and peer pressure are just the beginning of the threats against them. The (not-so-distant) future leaders of our church are counting on adults like you and me to guide them, as they navigate the delicate balance between their responsibilities in school, extracurricular activities, family, youth group, and more.

Looking ahead to this summer, when Christopher and I will presumably be leaving the Columbia area for a year-long internship placement, Living Springs will be preparing for new youth group leaders. If you don't already regularly attend a Sunday school class, please consider talking to me about sitting in on a junior youth Faith Alive meeting. There is no obligation to join us on a regular basis. Even if you've never felt like you had the "right stuff" to lead a Sunday school class before, caring enough about this ministry to read this article shows me that you are probably a good candidate to try it. Building relationships with these young people will change you in ways that you did not imagine. Their innocent world view, joyful exuberance, and maybe even their movie suggestions will certainly make a positive impact upon your life.


