

Lent 2019: Warming the Waters



Holy Week & Easter: How Deep DID Jesus Go? - This Month from Pastor Eric

APRIL BIBLE BOOK OF THE MONTH = GOSPEL OF JOHN (Pastor Sessions on April 7 & 28 @ 9:30 am)

I sit at the base of the baptismal fountain in the sanctuary, waiting for the Preschool children to arrive for Bible time. I look up and see the growing pile of warming prayer stones, and I think about all the hands of God's people (your hands!) in which these stones have been held at the Communion rails on Sundays and during our Wednesday Lenten services. I think about all the individuals who have been prayed for, and for whom you have thanked God. I think about all those mentoring, discipling, inviting, involving relationships represented by those stones—and all those to whom God is sending us to warm the waters of faith and God's kingdom grace.

In the background, shrouded in purple, I see one of the crosses made from the Cross-Oak Tree that once stood at our Living Springs entrance. I close my eyes and see one of our visitors from Cristo Rey (our 2019 Mission Partner congregation). He is standing in front of that cross, having walked over to see the sanctuary during a Friday Night Fish Fry ministry. He is holding his young son in one arm and grasping a prayer stone from the basket in his other hand. "It is possible for me to pray here, and leave a stone?" he had asked. And so he stands there, with the cross of Jesus by his head, praying quietly in Spanish and clinging to that stone. His stone and his prayer are now mixed in among our stones and prayers—along with the stones & prayers of other Cristo Rey / Sagrada Familia mothers & their children who had separately come into the sanctuary and prayed.

Flowing in the background, the sound of the baptismal waters fill my ears. In my heart, I hear the words of Scripture, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4:4-6). I think about the amazing opportunity we have been given, to share our last Wednesday worship service (April 10) with our brothers and sisters in Christ at Gill Creek Baptist Church. I think about how much the Spirit has been working over the past few years to tug us through boundaries of race, ethnicity, and denomination—to give us a greater glimpse of the great company of saints and the Kingdom of God, to help us more fully understand what the apostle wrote about in those glorious words to the Ephesians.

I look at those stones again, with the cross hanging in the background. I think about the stones under Jesus' feet, as he struggles to carry his cross to Golgotha, before Simon of Cyrene (a man of different ethnicity and culture) helps ease my Savior's burden. I think about all the people throughout the world for whom Jesus carried that cross, and I think about words from the Gospel of John (which we are reading as our April Bible book of the month), "For God so loved **the world**, that God gave God's only Son" (John 3:16)

I look above the cross and remember some words that appeared on the visual screen during a Lenten sermon time: "Put out into the deep waters," Jesus said to Simon. But how deep will you go, Jesus? I think about the Holiest Week of our lives as Christians—and all that Jesus endured for me. I think about Palm Sunday shouts of "Hosanna?" turning into Good Friday shouts of "Crucify him!" I think about Jesus in that upper room on Maundy Thursday night, giving bread & wine as a sign of the new covenant of his very own body and blood. I see him getting down on his knees and washing his disciples feet as the lowliest of servants. I think about his being betrayed, arrested, denied, beaten, and nailed to that cross. I think about him going to the depths of death and hell—all for me, all for the world. HOW DEEP!!!! How deep into the waters of amazing grace and total love Jesus went for us all! I think about what it will mean to worship with you, my brothers and sisters, at each of our Holy Week worship services. And I think how amazing it will be to share with you the joy of Easter as we give praise to our Risen Lord, who once walked over the rolled-away stone of a tomb to conquer death, so that you & I and the world might know HOW DEEP God's love truly is ... for us all!



Council Clips - March 2019

Council spent its "Dwelling in the Word" time, focusing on Ephesians 4:1-16. Council reviewed our congregation's 4 Ministry Focus Areas for 2019 (Building Relationships, Building Partnerships, Sharing God's Love, Sharing God's Stories). Our Leadership Book for the rest of the year was distributed, "The Scattering: Imagining a Church that Connects Faith & Life." By Dwight Dubois. For each Ministry Team & Group, the Council Liaisons shared the passage their team used for Dwelling in the Word; 2 specific relationships being worked on by team members; 2 exciting things coming up, and at least 1 God-story from the team's ministries.



- Pastor's Report: As a congregation, we are inspired by the example of our youth and all the ways they share their gifts wherever they are (in their schools, teams, groups of friends, and more): all of us never know when God will place us in situations to share God's love and goodness with others. A place for us to experience God's love will be at the joint Lenten worship with Gill Creek Baptist Church on April 10.
- Finance: For those who choose to make their weekly/monthly/annual offerings through Givelify or other electronic means, cards are now in the pew racks, that can be placed in the offering plate so that everyone can participate in the worshipful act of giving.
- **Kingdom Vision Implementation Task Force:** The Kingdom Vision Implementation Task Force is seeking four additional individuals to assist with discernment & distribution of our tithed amount from DOT settlement funds. Based on congregation input from the fall Discipleship Gatherings, the Kingdom Vision Task Force has recommended funds should be used for community youth and hunger.
- † Child Development Center: CDC is pleased with the response to their 22:6 campaign and plan to open it up to CDC parents, grandparents and caregivers. Parents and staff members will be invited to join us for CDC Sunday celebration on May 5. A video is being prepared.
- **Facilities:** A workday is scheduled for March 30th and will be held along with Operation Inasmuch. We are confident that we will have enough volunteers for both. We are looking for people to help with painting and planting flowers.
- † Children & Youth Ministries: All leaders gathered for a productive planning time in March. Annual Egg Hunt & Easter Family Event will be Palm Sunday afternoon. Confirmands are going on retreat in April. SPARK VBS will be held June 9-12.
- † Hope Team: Lenten 40x40 collection is taking place. Operation Inasmuch Project will be March 30. VA Ministry continues.
- **Fellowship & Mutual Care:** Exam boxes are being prepared for all of our college students. Applications for Legrand/Lowman Scholarship and Continuing Education Grants will be distributed.
- † **Lifelong Discipleship:** The 3:31 Ten Commandments Adult Faith Milestone has begun. Milestone Sunday will be held April 7.
- **Good News Team:** The Good News Team reports that we have received a new camera that will provide better live streaming recordings of our worship services.
- **Justice Ministry:** The Justice Ministry reminds us that the Nehemiah Action is going to be held May 6, 2019. More details will be forthcoming.
- **Lutheran Men in Mission:** Midlands Lutheran Men in Mission conference is going to be held at Living Springs on May 13. The men are looking forward to the Shannon Long Memorial Golf Tournament on April 27 and hope that members of Cristo Ray will be able to join us.
- **WELCA:** The SC Women of the ELCA Annual Convention will be held in Lexington, SC on June 7-8, 2019. They are encouraging all women, especially those under the age of 35, to attend.
- Mission Partner Team: The next visit to Cristo Rey is scheduled for April 7. A volunteer sign-up sheet is in the office hallway. Guests from Cristo Rey (and Sagrada Familia) will be joining us for the Fish Fry on March 29.

Share A God Story!

We are blessed and gifted to see God's work in common everyday places & situations, even in ways we don't anticipate. Where have you seen or experienced God at work in yourself, the world, or the lives of others this week? If the people of past generations did not share their stories of God, we would not have the Bible or even know of Jesus.

What is your God Story?

These were shared with us last month:

- A God Moment, written down by the mother but expressed by her child....."Mommy, I prayed to God a lot recently when I had the stomach bug. I was scared and my stomach was doing things I didn't like. But I know that God was with me through it all. God doesn't want me to hurt, but when I do, Jesus is there."
- The Spirit created an opportunity of conversation when I drove through the Chick Fil A with ashes on my forehead after the noon worship service. The lady asked me, "Is it Wednesday? Yes—It's Ash Wednesday, isn't it? Where did you get those?" I shared with her about Living Springs evening worship so she can get some herself! By this point, 2 other ladies joined in on the conversation that we are dust and to dust we will return. This was cool to witness Jesus' words in action that day in the drive-thru...."wherever 2 or 3 are gathered, I am there."
- During the "Ashes To Go" morning on Ash Wednesday where we had 2 stations available to drive thru, God provided a teachable moment for me. Thea, the mom, received the ashes and prayer. When we looked over into the passenger seat to see if the son wanted ashes, the mom responded with, "Thank you but, not yet." That phrase—not yet—helped me to hear the hope in her voice, which in turn gave me hope for all of God's children. Soon and very soon, in *God's time*, all will be brought to Jesus.
- When I was pregnant, I had another panic attack. I worked in a genetics lab. So I knew what could go wrong. I felt a hand on my head and someone say, "It'll be ok. I promise!: I turned to ask my husband how he knew I was having an attack. His back as turned to me and he was snoring. I never had a panic attack while I was pregnant again. I'm forever thankful to God for that much needed calming promise.
- † I have seen God at work through the many new Christian friends that I have made.
- † I have experienced God at work through hearing my grandson talk about Jesus and sharing bible verses.
- † I saw God work in new legislation to increase gun safety which will be a blessing to all in our country.
- This week, while substituting for a kindergarten class, God continued to bless me as I used my talents to share with not only the children, but other professionals. The children uplifted me through God's spirit and grace. What a joy! And so very thankful for the opportunity. God puts me where I need to be.
- I keep a journal of things I am grateful for. One day I opened it to find my son had found it and written, "I'm grateful for my mom & dad."
- I was at an event yesterday having a difficult time. I had tears in my eyes. A young man started talking to me and sharing the struggles he has had in the past month, losing his grandfather and his father being severely injured in an accident made my worries seem not so bad.
- † I experienced God through good news I received after a medical test. The two people in our congregation undergoing surgeries were successful also.
- † I heard God's voice and saw God's love when he "blessed me and marked my forehead with the cross of Christ" through the touch and words of my grandson.
- † I experienced God through forgiving a loved one for a hurt. I forgave her and I feel peace. I also felt God through two texts from friends when needed.
- Seeing all the natural disasters world wide, we are and have been so blessed in our lives. We've been in fire evacuation. We've been in tornadoes. And yet we've never experienced a loss. Praise God!
- † I saw God in a neighbor who spend the day at the hospital helping a friend who had been in a car accident.
- † I experienced God in the blessing of the funeral promise of eternal life and exhortation to others of all lives, even clay feet are worthy.





- Tood worked with my job, helping me make a decision about it.
- I experienced God through sharing my love with my two granddaughters and my two great-granddaughters. Also God work for my bother-in-law
- † I experienced God through children holding hands and praying together in G.I.F.T. Zone.
- † I experienced God through person from Justice Ministry shared how they received one of the Rush Hour Ministry blessing
- † I saw God in the robins in our front yard in the beautiful world God made.
- † I see God through my Mom who continues to get stronger each day.
- I experienced God at my job, one of the teachers texted me scripture to begin my workday. It was such a simple reminder to let go and let God.
- Weeks ago, participants in MORE Justice from churches around the Midlands voted on the issue we would address this year. Affordable housing was chosen. Shortly thereafter the issues surrounding Allen-Benedict Court surfaced into public awareness. Was this coincidence? I don't think so. The Spirit blows where it will. God is active and at work in our community.
- † I experienced God by the Sun coming out and warming the earth
- † I thank God for my son and his volunteer work.
- † I experience God through seeing and hearing the beauty of God's world
- † I see God at work in my yard by watching as the cycle continues.
- I saw God this week when I had to leave for work before the sun had risen and when the day broke. I had to just stop and look at the splendor of light that God sends us
- I saw God at work with friends and extended family comforting a grieving family that lost their husband and father to a sudden unexpected death and then hearing the promise of eternal life.
- † I saw God at work through the Disciples of Harmony practice and the Hope Chest Build Gathering.
- † I saw God when an older person offered to pray with me and for me.
- As one of my daughters was traveling to Columbia, she witnessed a terrible wreck and called 911. I am thankful she was not in that wreck and know God was working over her and over the people in the accident.
- Every morning, a friend sends Bible scripture via text and I respond to her text. What a wonderful way to begin each day.
- We had been praying for my neighbor who was having pain trying to pass kidney stones. His doctors office was moving this week and they told him to go to the ER. Last night, I invited him and his wife to dinner. Just before they came over, he passed three kidney stones. One large to two smaller without having to use the machine that breaks them up. Our prayers were answered.
- I see God in every day life. The beauty of each sunrise, flower, blessing of a child or he speaks each day through nature.



- I was directing the Living Nativity and at the end, when London was holding the baby Jesus (little Ian) during "Joy to the World", I noticed that Ian was wiggling his fingers and touching them. It dawned on me that he had discovered his hands. Then it struck me that Jesus must have done that same thing. Then in the space of second, I thought about all the times Jesus' hands were deeply involved in our human story when he reaches out to Peter on the sea, when he healed the sick and cast out demons, when he held the children, when his hands were nailed on the cross, how we are called to be his hands in the world today. All these images happened in just a few seconds. I was overwhelmed. With tears in my eyes, I treasured this precious time where God helped me understand a little more of the mystery of Jesus' human-ness and what it means for us now.
- † I saw God at work in all the ways our church family and staff supported one of our CDC teachers dies suddenly.
- † Help continues to come to me in the lives, hands, and care of Living Spring shepherds to help me for transportation, care and concerns. I am grateful for each of them. It's kind of overwhelming to have needs answered so readily and lovingly. Thank you, God!
- † I saw God at work in the making of the Faith Chests.

- God provided peace within me during a very hectic week awaiting medical test results, an accreditation visit, an event-filled week of Read Across America activities...I felt calm despite the chaos.
- ¶ I experienced God through a friend coming to an exercise class with me just when I needed a friend.
- † I experienced God at work through my piano teacher offering to loan medical equipment.
- ¶ I experienced God at work by taking a wheelchair rental back one day late and the company, not charging a late fee.
- † I gave a new teacher at our school a pew bear one morning before work to simply welcome her. She became tearful and hugged me, telling me she needed to hear that at that moment. She had recently lost her mother and was especially missing her. She said that hear and

lost her mother and was especially missing her. She said that bear and my sentiments were reminders of God's love and gave her peace.



- I have a friend who has been struggling with many thing in life. He's been searching for a church. He is craving the word. He attended Ash Wednesday services with me and has been talking about it ever since. He as able to take from our chur4cdh family a sense of welcome, peace and calm. He intends to visit on a Sunday. I am thankful that this has opened a new door for him.
- While putting fuel in my truck at a gas station, there was a stack of Daily Bread Books. Reading these often, I said, "Cool, I will take one and keep it in my truck. Later, I stopped at a drive-in and a customer in front of me paid for my meal. Thank you, God!
- I have been feeling down about life in general and how it always seems like I can't do anything right.

 Then I noticed some robins cavorting in a yard while driving home from work. I felt this peace come over me. I knew then, that I needed to let my worries go. Just as our Lord takes care of those little birds, surely God will care for me as well. I may not be perfect, but I am a beloved child of a perfect God!
- Four years ago we saw the Friday Fish Fry sign and decided we should try Living Springs Church. The next Sunday was Easter and our first visit to the church. We have been here ever since! Love Living Springs Church and the people. Praise God!
- † I saw God at work in Children's joy over learning stories of Jesus at Christo Rey.
- † I saw God at work in a caring nurse comforting a patient who was not feeling well.
- † I saw God at work in confirmation parents gathering and sharing the blessing of Faith.
- ¶ I was in a place this week that was the work of God. I unexpectedly met up with a friend who needed my help.
- T saw God at work in a sheriff's deputy receiving ashes and a blessing of safety during Ashes to Go.
- I saw God in the face of a widow this week when I was on a casualty visit. She has 4 young sons and her husband passed of cancer but she shared with me that God would provide. What a great witness and a great way to see God.
- I saw God's work seeing all the smiling faces at the fish fry's as LSLC disciples gather to prepare meals for others.
- † I saw God in the comforting words and smile of the hospice worker who came to see Janice at the hospital in Lexington and her reassuring words of comfort.
- † I have seen God bring me comfort and reassurance as I deal with the pain of a herniated disc. I am looking forward to surgery on April 10.
- † The joy of faith shared in our Sr. Youth Sunday School class. God's spirit shines in these young people!
- Visiting Irvin and Neva who can no longer verbalize the Lord's Prayer. How as we prayed, other ladies in wheel chairs stopped by and prayed. God's presence filled the room.
- I experienced the love of Christ this past week at a MORE Justice meeting. People of different faiths, colors, and interests coming together to strive for justice.




- I see God in my four granddaughters and their parents that we visited this past week. I pray that they will always remain grounded in the Lord.

- † God's presence in the Fish Fry gathering neighbors & community members meeting strangers and sharing God's joy.
- † Someone shared a God Story that my husband had mentioned about my sone. I was touched that it was shared.
- We are so blessed to have wonderful people willing to help with our children and youth. Raising children is hard, having church people to help Is really seeing Jesus through them as they take their time to help.
- My son found an old Gideon's Bible in a drawer and it has become his favorite thing. He carries it everywhere and asks if we can read it every night. Out of all his things he wanted to take it to show & tell at preschool. It is amazing to see God's work being done as he grows his faith.
- I experienced God this week at the Friday Night Fish Fry. A fellow member brightened my day by offering me a word of encouragement.
- † I saw God by seeing my classmate at church.










Notes from: Living Springs Child Development Center

Hello Spring, we welcome you! As we come out of the cloud of pollen we are reminded of the wonders of creation. 




VA MINISTRY

Notes from: Justice Ministry

JUSTICE MINISTRY UPDATE: APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS

Spring is here and new life is apparent everywhere. Justice Ministry is no different. My grandmother used to say, "April showers bring May flowers." With Justice Ministry we are finding that April is the season for "Justice to roll down like the waters" and May 6th is when we will see the "flowers of Justice" bloom at the Nehemiah Action (May 6th, 6:30 pm). We have lots of work to do in April to prepare for the Nehemiah Action on May 6th. "April showers bring May flowers" – keep waters of the Justice ministry in your prayers this month!

On Monday, April 1, hundreds of MORE Justice Network members from 35+ congregations gathered at Reid Chapel AME Church for the annual "Rally." More than 40 Living Springs Justice Network members were there to hear final research reports on the three focus areas of Affordable Housing, Mental Illness, and Education. We planned for the Nehemiah Action together. Each Network member is committed to bringing 3+ others with them to the Nehemiah Action and at the Rally LSLC Network members discussed where we are with invitations. We know that "people power" is what enables us to ask for change and be heard. Everyone is welcomed and encouraged to be a part of the Nehemiah Action on May 6th, 6:30 pm. (Stay tuned for more details on location, LSLC bus, carpools, etc.)

Our Justice ministry learned last year just how important "people power" really is. "People power" made a real difference for those affected by Mental Illness in the Midlands. More than 1300 of us gathered at the Nehemiah Action and asked our officials to address problems with Mental Illness in our community. Today we see the "flowers" of that action: More than 100 Columbia police offers now are fully certified in mental health Crisis Intervention Training. Chief Holbrook is instituting a new 911 protocol to enable a caller to request a CIT-certified officer for a mental health crisis. In addition, a Mental Health Clubhouse for Columbia has established its 501c3 incorporation, and a team is meeting regularly with Mayor Benjamin. God was at work through MORE Justice in caring for the mentally ill and for our law enforcement officers.

Spring "flowers" with Education continue to grow. On March 21 MORE Justice held a Forum on Education at Reid Chapel AME Church for the Midlands community. We heard from a panel of teachers, education experts, community members, and others about academic success and school climate. "People power" will be needed this year as we continue to ask for change in Education. And "people power" will be needed when for the first time we ask elected officials to address the problem of Affordable Housing.

We hear the mandate from Scripture for all of us to be involved in three things: "Do justice, and love kindness, and walk humbly with our God!" These mandates are not connected with an "or". We are each required to do all three. Justice Ministry made a difference in the Midlands last year for those living with mental illness. Justice Ministry will continue to make a difference as people of faith come together to also address problems with affordable housing and education. Living Springs members are all invited to come to the Nehemiah Action on May 6 and to invite others to join us. Transportation will be provided from the church. Because God created us to be in community where we can receive comfort, support, and love, Living Spring will be offering a Grief Milestone where we will discuss what grief is, look at what that means in our relationship to God and others, and have time in a safe space to share our grief and receive care and tools for working through grief.

As a capstone to the Milestone, we will have a service to remember those whom we have lost and other ways that we have experienced grief, and also hear the good news that God is with us in the grief and gives us the Spirit and each other.

LENTEN WARMING PRAYER STONES



On "Warming the Waters" Sunday, we brought forward warming prayer stones during Holy Communion. These stones are now placed on the Baptismal Fountain. Each stone symbolizes a personal prayer, for EITHER: 1) a specific way the Spirit might warm the waters of my heart and empower me to go into deeper waters of faith and Kingdom-service; OR, 2) a specific person in my life, for whom God might use me to be a living invitation to dip their toes into deeper waters of faith and Kingdom-life. Additional stones are in the basket at the offering table. Please feel free to take a stone, warm it in your hand as you pray, and then place it on the RIM of the baptismal fountain during Communion.

"WARMING THE WATERS" CARDS FOR HOME

On "Warming the Waters" Sunday, we distributed special "Warming the Waters" cards, highlighting 4 Ministry Focus Areas that we prayerfully discerned at our 2019 leadership retreat (based on the responses from the congregation in January). Extra cards are in the narthex. We ask each person to prayerfully read through the focus areas, keep the card in a visible place in your home, and consider how the Spirit might be tugging you personally to Grow in Faith this year through one or more of these ministry focus:


