As a child, I remember going to the beach and being afraid to go out into the ocean. I would stop with the water about knee-high, which unfortunately, was right where the waves were breaking, constantly bouncing me around and knocking me over. My dad took me by the hand and said, "Eric, you've got to go out DEEPER!" Then, he led me out beyond the breaking waves to a point where the ocean was much more calm—and we could just stand there peacefully, enjoying the smooth, rolling water.

Each year, the Spirit leads us to a theme for our Faith Formation focus for disciples of every age. In July, our staff and various ministry team leaders met to pray and ponder over this year's theme—and with the Spirit evident in the room, we were given the theme of "DEEPER—deeper in Christ, deeper in Grace, deeper in Love!"

After that gathering, I was reminded of my experience as a child at the ocean. It seems that we can often be afraid of going deeper in our journey of faith and discipleship—and we stop at a point where life just

continues to beat us around. But there is God, our Heavenly Parent, taking us by the hand, lovingly calling out our name, and beckoning us to go deeper to a place of greater peace—a peace which passes all understanding, a peace which the world cannot give. "Come, my child, go DEEPER—deeper into Christ, deeper into my Grace, deeper into my Love!" On Sunday, August 25, we will have our annual G.I.F.T. Kickoff Sunday (Growing in Faith Together), to introduce this year's faith formation theme. I invite and encourage everyone to take advantage of this opportunity to come to a deeper place in your journey with Christ. If you have not been involved in Sunday morning Faith Alive classes or a Bible Study or a volunteer

ministry group, now is the time to go deeper—to come with God, led by the Holy Spirit, beyond the battering waves of life to a place of deeper peace with Christ's love and grace.

Lifelong Discipleship is creating a new 9:30 group that will be gathering each Sunday morning to go deeper into Christ. They will be learning about Jesus and what it means to be his follower in life—and one Sunday a month, they will be involved in going to live that out in the world. This new group is for adults of all ages. Also, our Minister of Innovative Church Outreach, Deacon Justin Rimbo, is starting a monthly "TacO 'Bout God" group that will meet at San Jose restaurant. This is open to everyone, but is particularly inviting for those who feel distant from traditional church and yet have questions about God, faith, and the journey of life. Bible Studies will be starting back as well—and now is a good time to get involved in one of those groups. August is also a great time to get involved with one of our monthly ministry outreach groups: the Hymn-a-Long ministry, Veterans Bingo ministry, the Cristo Rey ministry, Community Beer ' Hymns, or our fall JV Football ministry. There is also our big LS Stuff-a-Bus effort for the Backpack ministry on August 24. You may not be able to do all of these, but I invite to pick at least one and get involved—you will be amazed at how you witness and experience the power of Christ's love & grace!

Council opened their July meeting with a prayer led by President Adam Woodruff. It is noted that a council meeting was not held in June so that the members could attend the "Emanuel" movie with area churches.

<u>Financial Reports:</u> The Financial Secretary, Bill Franck, reported that designated, non-designated and debt and maintenance contributions for the month of June totaled \$44,652.30. The Treasurer, Mike Davidson, advised that June, 2019 Designated Funds, total and cash, equal \$57,477.93. We are blessed to have such a generous congregation.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> The Holy Spirit continues to make its presence felt among our congregation. He praised our youth, young adults, and all members as they scattered the fruits of the spirit in Spark Camp, Campfirmation, the Mystery Mission and GraceWorks.

<u>Children/Youth/Young Adults:</u> This has been a very busy and spirit-filled summer for our youth!

They have participated in Spark Camp, Campfirmation, Mystery Mission and GraceWorks. Jan Berger reported that the educational theme for next year will be "Deeper in Christ, Grace and Love." This theme will be tied into the seasons of the Church. Child Development Center: The CDC has been busy with Summer and Spark Camps. God's presence abounds as our children grow, share and play.

Hope Team: Adam Woodruff expressed gratitude for all of those special people, both inside and outside of the congregation, who help us make a positive contribution to the church and community. The Hope Team will provide a guest speaker during the Faith Formation session in August, and he reminded us that Stuff-a-Bus is scheduled for August 24th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Fellowship and Mutual Care: Wendy McKenzie told us that the committee has been busy with the Summer Feeding program and will also help with Gift Sunday. They will begin working on the Christmas Party soon. They will meet again in August. Facilities: Jeff Tenhover reported that the HVAC unit in the Fellowship Hall/Choir Room needed a new control board, the irrigation well was repaired, fire safety tests were performed on the elevator and 26 stumps in the northwest end of the property were removed. Landscaping and other routine maintenance duties were performed.

<u>Finance:</u> Bill Franck reported that a new procedure is being developed to vet the vendors that we choose to employ, in keeping with standard business practices. This will protect the church from inadvertently receiving inferior labor, materials, or services. <u>Good News Team:</u> Adam Woodruff said that Lexanne Graves is very busy with the E-Outreach Ministry. Beer & Hymns dates have been set for next season. The team is considering "Taco-bout God" nights, similar to Beer & Hymns, to offer outreach and the love of God to those who are uncomfortable in <u>church settings.</u>

<u>Justice Ministry:</u> Mike Davidson reported that our Justice Ministry leaders went to Florida to participate in a leader's conference. He announced that house meetings will resume in September or October.

<u>Mission Partner:</u> Midge Gunvalson told us that the new Cristo Rey Mission Sunday will be August 4th. A groundbreaking ceremony for a new Cristo Rey facility will be held August 11. Interested LSLC members will be able to carpool to the event. <u>Lifelong Discipleship:</u> Doug Danner reported that the team's mission is to determine how best to invite and teach people about the Bible and God's love. They are considering taking Sunday school classes out into the community to listen, talk and do. <u>Worship Team:</u> Dea Jones reported that the team is working on Rally Day. Also, Gift Sunday will be held on August 26th. They are also planning for an upcoming Blessing of the Animals.

<u>Lutheran Men in Mission:</u> Bill Franck reported that LMM Sunday will be September 29th this year. They would like to focus on highlighting one LSLC ministry team per month.

<u>WELCA:</u> Vicki Crapps reported on the South Carolina WELCA Assembly, which focused on human trafficking this year. The keynote speaker was an individual who had been trafficked for many years and was able to escape that lifestyle after she found God. In addition to installing the officers for next year, many interesting and worthwhile discussions and classes were offered to the attendees.

<u>Campus Visioning Task Force:</u> We are awaiting the topological survey and updated drawings before exterior plans can be finalized. They are expected to be delivered around the first of August.

<u>Kingdom Vision Implementation Team:</u> They met with Richland 2 and plan to meet again July 31st and the second week of August. They want to determine any road blocks and leveraging with other existing resources. The goal is to present a plan at the congregational meeting in November.

<u>Safety Task Force:</u> The Safety Team has been assembled and includes Bill Franck, Marshall Hurlbert, Rocky Berger, Todd Gunvalson, Cindy Day, and Rhett Hair. These individuals will be versed in safety procedures in case of weather, medical or other emergency situations.

<u>Faith Innovation Team:</u> Jan Berger and Julie Ann Harris will lead the team in their search for a new faith formation minister. They are seeking at least four more individuals to help them in their task. The right person can either be rostered or non-rostered. They hope to find an individual who can make a long-term commitment to LSLC to maintain continuity; especially for our younger members who suffer losses when their youth ministers have to leave through no fault of their own. Pastor Eric mentioned that if the right person is found, we may be able to partner with another Lutheran congregation to share this resource.

Notes from: Hope Ministry SUMMER FEEDING PROGRAM

I've been helping at this event for several years and I can always relate a story or two. It is always warm it seems for this week that Living Springs participates, but it was **super** "hot" ...even for me. This is the first time they did not set up the ga-ga ball pit because it was so hot and I was so disappointed because I know I would have come out a winner! What do you think was the winning activity of the day? Yes, a good old fashioned sprinkler and a bucket of water to fill up donated super soaker water blasters! You have not seen a happier bunch of kids!

The other experience was seeing one of the youngsters gravitate toward one of our helpers. This little girl only wanted to play games and do crafts with this one helper. I asked her if she wanted to play while the helper ate her lunch – no, we had to wait until the helper could play with us. What a wonderful witness to an unconditional bonding of friendship.

You spend a couple of days with these children and you can feel the barriers break down as they witness God's presence and know you are no longer a threat to them. I made a couple of warm fuzzies for some children, and the one little girl had this shocked look on her face when I handed it to her – "for me??". We made warm fuzzies, a prayer chain, tie-dyed shirts, played games (corn hole, ga-ga ball, Trouble, Connect 4), made rubber band bracelets, flew Frisbees, hula-hooped, and put together several different craft kits. The three hours goes by very fast, but you definitely do not have any trouble falling to sleep at night.

Another father had brought his two daughters to participate every day and was very cautious, not leaving their sides at any time while they were doing their activities. The next to last day, the grandfather came along to follow the girls around. The last day, I observed the father & grandfather were sitting at a picnic table and the girls were walking around to the different tables doing the activities with the different GraceWorks helpers. I sort of chuckled to myself because I know how guarded you are when your children first meet strangers, but what a reassurance it was to see that he was comfortable leaving his children in our care on that last day.


Living Springs Backpack Food Ministry Stuff-A-Bus Saturday, August 24, 9am - 1pm

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Justice Ministry House Meetings Begin in September

August gives us a chance to look back at our Justice Ministry work last year and think about what we can expect as we move into Year 3 of Justice Ministry together. Last September we began our LS House Meetings, joining more than 500 people of faith across Columbia who also were engaged in house meetings to talk about community problems that concerned us. Once all of the house meetings ended we gathered at the Community Problems Assembly to vote on a problem to address together. We chose the problem of affordable housing. As the year progressed we learned a lot about affordable housing and best practice options across the country. In April at the culminating Nehemiah Action nearly 1200 of us gathered to ask our city and county officials to establish a trust fund for affordable housing. MORE Justice wasn't the first to realize that there was a problem: sixteen years ago a recommendation was made by the City of Columbia for an affordable housing trust fund but nothing had been done. MORE Justice "People Power" at the Nehemiah Action enabled us to make a difference and now we are on the way to establishing a fund to address housing needs.

This coming September we start Year 3 with Justice Ministry. We begin with our LS House Meetings. These House Meetings offer something different from most of our meetings at church. At House Meetings we aren't there to run committees, organize programs, sponsor outreach, or any number of other important and worthwhile activities that we engage in at church on a weekly basis. At the House Meetings we are there to LISTEN to what problems in the community trouble us and what keeps us awake at night. Everyone at LS will be invited to join in. These meetings are a wonderful time to share personal stories and hear from others. God's Spirit is present at these gatherings. Once all of the House Meetings at LS and in the other 35+ congregations in Columbia have occurred we will join with other people of faith and vote on which problem to address this year. We won't know what that problem focus will be in Year 3 until we vote in late October, but we do know that it will come out of these House Meetings across Columbia and from much prayer about where God is leading us as a faith community.

What can you personally expect at the LS House Meetings? At the House Meetings we will LISTEN to your concerns about our community. We also will invite you to consider being a Justice Network Member this year. Being a Network Member doesn't take a lot of time, but it is a serious commitment. What does it entail? Each Network Member commits to attending four meetings during the year, bringing three guests to the Nehemiah Action, and considering a financial investment of \$200 in the ministry.






