Every January, we gather for our LS leadership retreat and spend much time to prayerfully discern what focus areas God might be uplifting for us as a community of disciples. As the year unfolds, it is always amazing to see how the Spirit leads us to action and growth. For 2019, Focus B and Focus C are: •Build partnerships—for the work of God's kingdom in our community and world!

•Share God's love—with those who are hurting, alone, marginalized, or feeling unloved!

And my, how the Spirit has been at work to unfold some incredible opportunities in each of those focus areas.

<u>ITEM 1: God at Work via our Kingdom Vision DOT Tithe!</u> CONGREGATION INFO GATHERING—SUNDAY, OCT. 13, 9:30-10:30

Last fall, the congregation participated in a series of Disciple Gatherings to share ideas about what to do with a "tithe" of the DOT funds from the road-widening condemnation. Our council-appointed Kingdom Vision Task Force processed all your input from those gatherings, which led to several consensus points:

a) The property has never been "ours," but belongs to God - and it was always intended for the work of God's Kingdom in this community.

b) In order to continue Christ's ministry here in this place, we will need to utilize a majority of funds to re-structure our campus (drives, parking lot, sound barriers, etc.). However, before any of that (just as each of us would do with our own personal financial management)—a tithe (at least 10%) should be given for God's glory to help accomplish God's work beyond ourselves.

c) Our tithe should prayerfully have a long-lasting impact on people's lives. d) Of everything discussed at our disciple gatherings, what came to the forefront was a strong emphasis on children & youth in our community—those experiencing homelessness, lacking food, having no support system, etc.

A summary report of the Kingdom Vision Task Force was shared with the congregation in our Annual Reports and endorsed by council. The council then established an expanded Kingdom Vision Implementation Team to research the best options for our tithe, that would have a long-lasting impact upon the lives of children & youth in greatest need in our community. This team included teachers & other members of our congregation who work directly with youth in our community. After initial research, the Team set up interviews with 3 significant agencies directly involved with ministering to youth here in our community:

1) Palmetto Place Children & Youth Services—which operates 2 homes for youth in crisis in Columbia (they visited LS as part of our Summer Hope series).

2) RSD2 Social Work Program—support directed by frontline local school guidance counselors, who daily deal with youth experiencing homelessness, youth without family support, youth in need of food & basic life necessities, etc.

3) Lutheran Services Carolinas—who provide support, life-skills training, basic necessities for youth transitioning out of foster care.

Our meetings with each of these agencies were truly powerful, with many heart-moving stories about the plight & surprising # of so many youth in our community who live day-to-day in very difficult circumstances. These meetings strongly affirmed what God had spoken through our disciple gatherings—and confirmed that the Spirit was leading us in this direction. We discovered that Palmetto Place has a central role in our community, being used by both the Richland 2 Social Workers and Lutheran Services as an important resource to provide housing, support, life-skills training, and more for teens in crisis. As a result, council has received & endorsed a proposal from the Kingdom Vision Implementation

Team: that the tithe of our DOT receipts (plus interest from the past year) be designated to have a long-term impact upon the lives of youth in our community as served by these 3 entities. The initial monetary tithe is intended to foster a continuing partnership between these 3 agencies. To this end, (similar to what the congregation did with the Shannon Long Mission Partner Fund many years ago), we will establish a LS Community Youth Mission Team that will continue to uplift the needs of local community youth in crisis & help plan a joint annual partnership with oppoint functions (support offerts).

ITEM 2: Welcome to Living Springs Boy Scout Troop 737!

Last month, Boy Scout Troop 737, which has been in existence for years, received news that their congregation in Pontiac could no longer continue their sponsorship, due to various transitions. Through scouting contacts at Living Springs, the troop reached out to our congregation—and council has approved Living Springs formal partnership with Troop 737. The troop has 50 registered youth from schools such as Catawba Trail, Longleaf, St. John Neumann, RNE, Ridgeview, Spring Valley, and Blythewood. Their primary leaders have 20-35 years experience in scouting, and the troop has a strong record of Eagle Scouts, community service, and congregational support. The Troop will meet in the Fellowship Hall on **Monday evenings from 7:00-8:30.** Please make the youth, parents, and leaders feel welcome as you see them on Monday evenings (and occasionally on Friday/Sunday afternoons as they depart & return from weekend camping trips). Our youth in today's society are inundated by so many negative influences, and we pray that our partnership with Troop 737 will be a positive blessing for years to come!

And over 2000 years ago, no one could have imagined the crucified Son of God conquering death and coming out of a tomb, or the Holy Spirit coming upon a room of fear-filled disciples to change the course of history. Oh, may we ever rejoice that the focus of the church's ministry is not limited by our own vision—but is always driven by the grace-filled, unimaginable vision of God! BONUS ITEM #3: JUSTICE MINISTRY UPDATE

Each year, our Justice Ministry begins a new cycle without any pre-determined issues—and we hold a new set of house gatherings to hear what God might be calling us to address in our community. Over 90 house gatherings are being held throughout 30 congregations here in the Midlands, with hundreds of people of faith in attendance. What does the Lord require of us? But to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God! -Micah 6:8

23:23 clearly tell us that God asks each & everyone one of us to do 3 things in response to God's grace for us: justice, mercy, faithfulness. For most of my personal life as a disciple, I focused on faithfulness (worship, Bible study, devotion, etc.) and mercy (helping people in need), but often overlooked God's requirement for me to do justice (actively working to bring change to the community/world so that it might more reflect God's kingdom vision for all people, especially the poor, the widow, the orphan, the stranger among us). If you were like me and overlooked the Lord's call regarding justice, our Justice Ministry is a concrete way to remedy that oversight and respond to God's call for us all. Council Clips - September, 2019



Council opened their September meeting with a prayer led by President Adam Woodruff. After reports & team sharing, we viewed the annual SC Synod DVD, entitled "Stories of God's Abundance." Notes from: *Justice Ministry* "All Are Welcome!"

This morning the song **"All Are Welcome"** is running through my mind. Know it? It's a beautiful tune with memorable words that seem fitting as I reflect on Justice Ministry work at Living Springs this month. Here are some of the lyrics from the song that stand out for me:



"Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live, A place where saints and children tell how hearts learn to forgive." I remember our Justice Ministry work together last year on Affordable Housing. News reports late in the year told us about the deaths at Benedict-Allen neighborhood and the need for 400+ families to find a place quickly where they could "**safely live**." We helped with that through MORE Justice by moving our public officials to start an Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

The song goes on: "Let us build a house where prophets speak, and words are strong and true, where all God's children dare to seek, to dream God's reign anew." Work with MORE Justice is sometimes about confrontation, something I dislike and am not comfortable with. But the song reminds me that we are called to speak in ways that are "strong and true" and to "dream God's reign anew." Together with hundreds of other people of faith we have done that to make the Midlands safer for those with mental illness and for law enforcement through Crisis Intervention Training. Our community truly is a safer place than it was 2 years ago for those involved in disputes and arrests involving people with mental illness now that hundreds of officers are trained for this work.

Where I hear the most **JOY** with Justice Ministry at Living Springs throughout the year is how this ministry truly touches us, makes our lives richer, as we have the opportunity to work closely and walk shoulder-to-shoulder with so many other people of faith -- across races, denominations, social boundaries, neighborhoods, and faiths! Many of us have longed for the "unity" in "comm-unity" for a long time! In the song "All Are Welcome" I hear the words **"Here the love of Christ shall end divisions"**! That happens week after week with Justice Ministry!

In September we at LS have been meeting in homes, talking about what keeps us awake at night and what in our community makes us angry. So many important stories have been shared and heard. We at LS are concerned about neighborhood violence, services for our seniors and veterans, childhood food poverty, education, health care, and many other problems. Lifting these concerns at our house meetings is bringing us together as Living Springs Christians and unites our hearts with those of hundreds of other people of faith here in the Midlands. In the coming weeks we will meet with other congregations, listen, and choose which problem to address this year. Stay tuned...!

If you haven't yet been a part of a Justice Ministry House Meeting, there are several more opportunities ahead. I'd encourage you to take an hour or two and invest in the conversation! Experience the fellowship and the joy of fulfilling our Lord's command: **"Do Justice, love Mercy, and Walk humbly with God."** (Micah 6:8)

Some of the team might not have noticed there were problems. They were working side-by-side on platforms, ramp portions, and post hole digs.

When the run to Lowes returned with the rest of the material to complete the ramp, the nut that had crippled our main mitre saw as replaced and product returned to normal. We turned around a couple of times and we were done. Pictures taken. Thanks from the client. Hands shaken with new friends and co-workers.

That's what I remember. And mostly, I write to say THANKS. Without your yes to our call for help that 42 foot ramp would not have been completed so quickly. And I am proud that I am one of you — a member of Living Springs — Growing In Faith Together.
