He said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people!" ... As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother, John ... and Jesus called them." In the 4th chapter of Matthew's Gospel

In the 4th chapter of Matthew's Gospel, we find this account of one of the initial acts of Jesus' ministry—the calling of his first disciples. It comes immediately after Matthew tells us that Jesus came to fulfill the great prophecy of old: *"the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light."*

It is a truly profound thing! Jesus comes to bring light amidst the world's darkness and how does he begin this amazing work of God's kingdom? He reaches out to some common fishermen, calling these imperfect human beings to follow him and become his

disciples. Throughout his ministry, Jesus will continue to reach out to so many individuals one-by-one, changing their lives forever with the grace & love of God.

For several months, we have been focusing on growing deeper in Christ, deeper in grace, deeper in love. All of this leads us to **more deeply hear Jesus' call in our lives**—to be disciples who follow Jesus, the one who still comes to bring light into the darkness of the world, person by person by person. In fulfillment of John's words at the Jordan River, Jesus baptizes us with the Holy Spirit, so that we might respond to that call and be people who ourselves bring light into the world's darkness.

At our annual LS planning retreat, the Spirit spoke to our hearts about this call to be disciples who reflect and shine God's light into people's live—and how, as with so much of Jesus' ministry, this happens one person at a time. As disciples of Jesus, the Spirit calls and empower each of us to change lives by caring and sharing the light with someONE, one person at a time. It could be a co-worker, a neighbor, an acquaintance, a classmate or teammate, a stranger in the store or on the street. It could also be someONE whom the God puts in your path through the activities of

When considering disciples being "called," it is also exciting to think that the Spirit is already working to identify someONE to serve as an **additional rostered leader** here at Living Springs. The Congregational Event with Asst. to the Bishop Aebischer in January was truly wonderful—a powerful first step toward discerning and extending such a call to some Associate Pastor or Deacon. Thanks to

all who participated! Our council spent much time at its Retreat processing all the input from the event, as well as completing their required non-congregational Community Leader Interviews. Our next step is to complete the detailed Ministry Site Profile and appoint a 6-member Call Committee. Our hope is to complete these 2 steps during February, so that we might start receiving the names of potential candidates some time later in March. I invite everyONE to continue to lift up this call process daily in your prayers—so that God's light might ultimately shine even brighter and more broadly into the community through the addition of another rostered leader.

January was an amazing month of light here in our congregation, beginning with the Burning of the Greens on Epiphany Eve and culminating with the awesome Youth Sunday experience last week. Behind the scenes, our Mission Partner ministries with Cristo Rey and Journey Performing Arts continue to flourish—and the Justice Ministry is touching the lives of many in our Midlands area. The Community Youth Outreach partnership effort with Palmetto Place, Lutheran Services Carolinas, and R2 Social Workers is having a wonderful impact upon the lives of youth in crisis.



Think of all the things happening to share the light of God's love and hope here in wonder of how it all began: Jesus calling those someONE's to be disciples and follow him!

In February, we look forward to the Souper Bowl of Caring, Scout Sunday, the Scholarship Auction, all the opportunities in these boxes, plus our ongoing Epiphany Season Backpack Food Drive. Stories of compassion as we remember our sweet Beloved CoCo, the CDC guinea pig that has been a part of our CDC family for the past 7 years. We are thankful for the joy and smiles she brought to children, families and staff alike. Her happy squeaks and squeals will be missed.

RICHLAND 2 READING LITERACY BLITZ 31'ers

I wanted to clarify this program for those who are not sure if they should participate. From my experience at Bridge Creek, you are not assigned a specific child to read to every week. I attend one first grade classroom and assist with reading & helping the class with reading activities and then I head over to another first grade class and either read to someone and/or have them read to me. One week I was asked to read the story so the student could understand how to inflect emotion into the story. Another week, a little girl was asked to read to me and I started to get a little frustrated because she was not reading any of the storybook and I was sounding out most of the words in the book. I thought she was rebelling because she "had" to



read to me, but after a lot of sounding out of words, I asked her if she didn't want to sit and read to me and then

she looked up at me with these big brown eyes and said "I don't know how to read". Oh my – my heart just about broke! Talk about taking things for granted; but it instantly made me realize the need for this program in the school system. One other volunteer sits outside a first grade classroom and reads to a group of about four or five children. It takes about an hour, or more if you want, out of the week; and if you can't make it for one of the weeks, just let the teacher know. Contact <u>Karen Kranz</u> for information.

We have team leaders, but 5-6 volunteer helpers are needed each month, plus a snack for up to 24-30 children.

Winter Work

During the winter months the Justice Ministry is working hard conducting research on the community problem that we voted to address this year: crime and gun violence in the Midlands. This part of our year is just like the other parts of our year – we <u>work together</u> in community to <u>listen and learn</u> about what our neighbors in need are going through. We started in September at Living Springs and in 35+ nearby congregations with house meetings where hundreds of folks shared what keeps them awake at night. In November 550+ people of faith voted on which of the problems (raised in house meetings) to focus on this year. During the winter months our research team is learning about the problem of crime and gun violence and exploring possible changes that might make a difference to those in need.

How does the research process work? Justice Ministry Network Members and Team Leaders are meeting regularly to learn more about crime and gun violence and to discern what God may be calling us to do in this area this year. We began by clarifying what our focus would be: we voted to move from the broader problem of any and all crime and gun violence to *crime and gun violence specifically involving a gun*. We are getting information about what is happening, where it is happening, and what our community is already doing to address the problem. We are meeting with many leaders in the community who are dealing with crime and gun violence: law enforcement officials, school leaders and resource officers, community groups, victims of crime, and others who are concerned about these same issues. We also are finding out about best practices and what others in the state or region might be doing to improve neighborhood safety. As we better understand the problem of crime and gun violence, we will begin to develop an idea of what we might do together (something "do-able") that would make a difference.

This winter Justice Ministry is also continuing to do research on the problems that we have addressed the last two years: mental health, education, and affordable housing. Wonderful partnerships and relationships have been built during this time! With other congregations, organizations and agencies we are working to bring justice to our larger community.

In Micah we hear the prophet say, "What does the Lord require of me? To do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God" (Micah 6:8). 




Several youth members showed their support to one another outside of church this month whether it was praying about a sports event, checking in through text messages, or attending a dance performance.
