GOD'S LOVE, OUR HANDS & FACES: ONE LIFE DEEPER IN 2020!

DEEPER IN DISCIPLESHIP KICKOFF 1st Sunday in Lent, March 1

Blow the trumpet, sound the alarm, sanctify a fast, call a solemn assembly, sanctify the congregation, assemble the aged, gather the children! Return to the LORD, your God, who is gracious & merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love! See, now is the acceptable 3/1 - Coin Bag time. See, now is the day of salvation!"

On Ash Wednesday, we heard these urgent words from the prophet Joel and the apostle Paul: words that usher us into the annual spiritual journey of 40 days (+ 6 Sundays) called Lent. During these days ahead, we will be drawn yet again to the heart of our faith—the journey of Jesus to the cross and his victory over death in the empty tomb of Easter. But Lent is even more than a re-calling of Jesus journey to the cross; it is a time for our own pilgrimage to the cross, as we hear Jesus'

words for us, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me!" It is a time for deeper life reflection and deepening spiritual commitment. It is a time of deeper self-examination, with additional opportunities for deeper worship, deeper prayer, deeper devotion, deeper acts of sacrificial giving for others. The spiritual disciplines of Lent call us to a form of deeper discipleship as followers of Jesus: deeper in love, deeper in grace, deeper in Christ!

As we undertake this Lenten journey, we will re-discover the impact of Jesus' encounters with so many individuals and how those 1-on-1 encounters were such a central part of his mission of hope for the world. On Sundays, we will hear of Jesus' encounters with Nicodemus, the woman at a well, a man born blind, Mary, Martha, Lazarus, Simon Peter, and other disciples. On Wednesdays, we will hear of encounters with the woman of anointing, Judas, a Roman centurion, 2 criminals, Pilate, Mary Magdalene, John, and Mary of Nazareth. There is a great mystery and truth to these encounters: that our God is a God who chooses to work through personal impact on human lives. God has done this not only through Jesus, but continues to do this through persons such as you & me—disciples who have been called by Jesus, marked with his cross, filled with the deepness of God's grace & love, and empowered by he Holy Spirit to carry on the person-to-person ministry of Jesus in the world.

On the 1st Sunday of Lent, we will also celebrate the 2020 Ministry Focus which the Holy Spirit spoke at our annual leadership retreat: God's Love, Our Hands & Faces—One Life Deeper in 2020! Our prayerful goal is that God will work in every LS disciple in 2020 to have an impact of faith and hope in the life of one special person. What shoes might they be wearing? It may be someone you know already at work, at home, at school, in the neighborhood, in your daily life. It may be a complete stranger whom God will bring to you this year. How will the Spirit work through you to bring someone deeper in 2020? So, during March, we will not only hear stories about all those "Bible persons," but we will also hear stories from LS disciples about individuals whom God has used to impact our lives, and individuals with whom God has led us to walk in deeper places of grace, love, and Christ. You don't want to miss these powerful stories! In a world filled with darkness, despair, and fear, there is a great urgency in someone's life out there—for the mission of love, grace, and Christ we have been called to share I pray that this Lent may truly be a powerful time for each of us to sense that urgency and grow deeper in our discipleship!

Lent 2020: Deeper in the Cross

Lenten Table-Top Crosses for Each Household

Last week, we distributed Lenten tabletop oak crosses made for each household. A few extra crosses remain in the narthex for any household who was not here to receive one. Each week, we will distribute a specific devotional item to add to your cross. Second item (coin bag) will be given to you at the end of worship today. Extra items from previous weeks will also be available on the narthex table. Each cross is made from the wood we saved from the oak prayer tree which previously stood by the road at our Living Springs entrance.



Lenten "Outside-Church"/Home Groups

As part of Lent, we invite you to extend a personal invitation and gather a group of 4-10 people at your home (or a restaurant, coffee shop, park, ballfield, etc.) for intentional Bible Study or devotions around your cross. This could be a mixture of LS people, friends, co-workers, neighbors, or others. You might gather weekly or every other week – and can schedule as best fits your group. It is not meant to be a "church calendar event," but a way the Spirit works through you to be a disciple with others. You might focus on the Daily Lenten Devotional topics, or Matthew chapters covering Holy Week, or the Sunday Scripture readings, or everyone's prayer/life concerns. If you are forming a group (and/or need help with resources), please simply let Pastor Eric know, so your group can be lifted up in confidential prayer.



40X40 LENTEN COLLECTION

During Lent, we again take on the challenge to collect 1600 items: shoes (see shoe drive article), socks of all sizes/male/female/child, mini cereal boxes, juice boxes, and fruit cups. Collection bins are located in the main office lobby.


Lenten Shoe Drive: March 1 - April 10

Ladies Bible Study is good for my soul!

- Sometimes my carefully crafted plans need to change. Over commitment and heroics close off connection to God. A friend suggested we not doing something, and after a minute I realized God was speaking through her! Blessed peace, quiet time and a moment to breathe!! February Council Clips

- Council opened their February meeting with a prayer led by President Adam Woodruff. The Dwelling in the Word was from Nehemiah 13:4-14.
- Pastor and Adam Woodruff introduced the new book for the year-long book study: Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks by Diana Butler Bass. Pastor described the author's viewpoint that there is a difference between "deep gratitude" and "cheap gratitude" and the importance of the "me" and the "we" in practicing gratitude in our lives.
- Council discussed various ways to share more about the abundance of giving Living Springs has been blessed in the last year and how it is positively impacting both the church and the larger community.
- Council discussed the 2020 Ministry Goal of each LS disciple having an impact on one life during the year (a continuation of our 2019 Goals: Building Relationships, Building Partnerships, Sharing God's Love, Sharing God's Stories). The Ministry Goal also fits with the current Faith Formation Discipleship emphasis of Deeper in Christ, Deeper in Grace, Deeper in Love. Council discussed details of kickoff for the goal, starting Mar. 1.
- Council discussed the next steps in the call process, including initial steps for forming the Call Committee and the need to wait for council members' outstanding Community Interview Forms in order to turn them into the synod office.
- Council discussed the Synod's Abundancia Appeal for Cristo Rey and appointing a LS coordinator. Council agreed to start the appeal the week after Easter and run it for three weeks.
- Council suggested members for the LS Community Youth Mission Team and made plans to contact potential members.
- Council suggested members for the LS Mission Partner Team and made plans to contact them.
- Council voted to ratify the CDC Board Manual updates by replacing the Communications Committee with a new Advancement Committee, having an added focus of getting word into the community and exploring outside grants or funding opportunities.
- A draft of the LS Annual Report was distributed to council, for review.
- Council approved the Finance Committee recommendation of giving online viewing access of accounts to the LS Treasurer and Financial Secretary.
- Council heard updates and recommendations from the Worship Team to discontinue paying Nursery Staff for the 10:45 service (\$5000+ per year), as the nursery is no longer utilized by parents. We will still pay Nursery Staff for major festivals (Easter, etc.). In addition to the GIFT Zone, a rocker has been added to the narthex for any parent/
 - infant who needs some re-focusing time and we will begin sharing info that during worship services, the Youth Room (with its sofa, chairs and proximity to the restrooms with changing tables) is also available as a re-focusing/crying space. The Worship & Tech Teams are taking steps to restore the Worship Service AV feed to the Youth Room.
- Council and Pastor Eric discussed the plans concerning the Oak Devotional Crosses and devotional items to be dispersed each week during Lent.
- Mike Davidson reminded Council about the Justice Ministry Rally (Mar. 30) & Nehemiah Action (Apr. 27) and encouraged everyone to participate and get the word out.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

A Time of Preparation

People of Living Springs are preparing for the Nehemiah Action, Monday, April 27th, at 7:00 pm at the Columbia Metropolitan Convention Center. The Nehemiah Action is a night when 1700+ people of faith will come together to ask our public officials for change to serve our neighbors in need. Lent is a fitting season to prepare for the Nehemiah Action and for God to come more fully into our lives and our community. How best do we prepare?

We prepare through prayer. Remembering Micah 6:8 we ask God to help us "do Justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God." We ask to better understand what that means. We ask to listen more carefully to our neighbors in need. We ask for courage to stand up and speak for others less able than we to advocate for change. Through prayer our hearts and minds are opened to what God may be calling us to do.

We build People Power. Together with hundreds of other people of faith in more than 35 Midlands congregations, we build "people power" to ask community officials this year for change to make our neighborhoods safer from Crime and Gun Violence.

Over the last two years at the Nehemiah Actions we have asked for changes to make our community safer for the mentally ill and law enforcement, more supportive of teachers and students, and our city more able to offer affordable housing to low- and middle-income neighbors. Our prayers and actions have led to change! For example, in the last 2 years we have had more than 250 officers become certified in Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) to ensure their safety and the safety of those they encounter with mental illness - that is a 331% increase from how many officers were certified at the time of our first Nehemiah Action when we asked Chief Holbrook and Sheriff Lott to prioritize the training.


