Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Here in the 1st week of May, I walked outside one morning to discover the beautiful sight of an Easter lily blooming in the little flower garden by our house. Over the years, I have always taken home one of the lilies we place in the sanctuary in memory of our departed family members. After the blooms have gone, we plant it somewhere outside. Eventually, it disintegrates & decays to nothing, and I forget all about it. Then, next spring, one or more of them re-appear and come to full bloom. Because they are not being "timed" for Easter Sunday in professional greenhouses, the lilies almost always bloom in the weeks long after Easter Sunday. They serve as a joyful reminder to me that the Easter Season is still going on for 50 days after Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday (this year, May 31). But more im-

portantly, the remind me of the Resurrection victory of God's love which continues to be celebrated for all eternity!

Occasionally (like this year), the lilies will bloom on the week of Mother's Day—and they give me pause to stop and give thanks to God for the women who shaped our lives in loving ways, but now have passed to life in the Church Triumphant: Kris' mother, our 4 grandmothers, my great-grandmother I knew as a little child, our 15 aunts, and various great-aunts ... I rejoice that Easter is still happening for them in the promise of Christ's Resurrection Hope. I think how for some of them, Mother's Day was always tinged by sadness, because of miscarriages, children's deaths, or their inability to have a child. I think of others whom have had difficult or painful relationships with their mothers or children—and yet, those blooming lilies invite me to ponder how God is always at work to bring reconciliation and hope even in the midst of grief, sadness, disappointment, and human brokenness.

Occasionally, one of the lilies will also bloom during the weeks of graduations—and they give me pause to stop and give thanks to God for former many teachers & professors who shaped our lives, but too have now departed from this earth. I think of my first-grade teacher, who was sad around Mother's Day, because her son was miss-

grade teacher, who was sad around Mother's Day, because her son was missing in action in Vietnam. I think about beloved Sunday school teachers of my childhood years; about jr. high teachers & coaches who helped me through some difficult early teenage years; about my high school teacher who helped me to a deeper appreciation of how God's magnificence is revealed through the wonders of science; about college & graduate school professors who helped me to a deeper integration of faith, history, and mathematics; about seminary professors who opened a deeper understanding of the Old and New Testaments. I see those Easter lilies blooming in May—and am reminded of that glorious day to come when all wisdom and knowledge will be enfolded in the full revelation of God's kingdom upon



From Tammy Mancuso, Director

Hello, and blessings to everyone as we continue to move through this time that is likely dissimilar to any other that we have personally witnessed in our world,

Some may see this as a time for concern, worry or fear; fear of what comes next, how do we find our "new normal" and where do we go from here? There are many open-ended questions that we yearn to answer, so many unknowns and chances for fear to creep in. Yet, with all the changes, conversation, and commotion, it is amazing to see Gods hands at work in the world; clear waters, cleaner air, some people taking up yoga, dance or cooking, while others share old stories or favorite pastimes with children, still others finding time to slow down and embrace this time with one another.

A friend has recently shared with me that she is leery of going back to work in the office. Not for the fear of COVID-19 and the exposure (although she is cautious and careful), but rather of once again "losing herself" in her work. Sunday, May 3rd was "Good Shepherd Sunday" and we were reminded that God is the Shepherd and we are the sheep. As I thought about how little I could do to resolve the Coronavirus pandemic and it's impact on the Child Development Center, I was reminded that I am only a sheep and God is the shepherd. I saw how God is caring for this ministry and providing a path forward. While the "in person" Center has been closed since March 16th, **God continues this ministry in and through many people---**

- Our staff, some with limited online skills, are providing basic virtual learning for their students and continue to connect with their students and families via phone
- Pastor Eric continues weekly Chapel Time and provides spirit led guidance for this ministry
- Beginning in March and continuing through April, Mike Davidson with the support of Sherry Forsgren, worked untold hours and perservered through what seemed like endless updates, to finalize an application to gain assistance through the CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security) which will help with payroll for CDC staff for a short period of time. The Small Business Admistration issued their approval on April 30th
- In April, CDC families generously supported a 50% tuition cost sharing contribution which made a 2-week payroll for every CDC staff possible, while all additional payrolls and ongoing expenses were able to be covered through the CDC reserve fund
- Eight women of the congregation volunteered to cut out and sew cloth face masks for our CDC staff so that they will be available, when the Center is able to re-open
- Members of our congregation, who work in the law and personnel fields, continue to provide ongoing support to
 help us understand the myriad of new federal programs which Congress continues to create, as well as the guidance, that agencies responsible for implementation, create and continually update
- Our Center Director, Tammy Mancuso, continues to provide leadership and shares ideas and plans through a consortium of faith based child development program directors, in the Columbia area--- planning for the "new" normal operation of the Center when it re-opens
- The prayers that are being lifted up by so many people
- All the many other known and unknown ways that God continues to be our Shepherd.

"7x70" Covid Helping Project

We continue to give thanks for the overwhelming response to our Living Springs Holy Week Covid Helping project. We received over \$5,900, far exceeding our initial challenge of 7x70x\$5. In addition, we had several LS Thrivent members donate their \$250 Community Project cards.

Your donations have provided 200 supper meals for youth at both Palmetto Place Houses, with plans for additional meals in May. We are working with Carolina Deli to deliver 300 box lunches to front-line Prisma hospital workers, and provide \$200 in meal vouchers for Prisma medical staff who can walk across the street to the Deli. On Monday, we will deliver 1000 juice/snack packets to Dorn VA for use by the staff there during their shift breaks. We've also provided a week's worth of meals for 70 senior

adults via Senior Resources (Meals on Wheels). After hearing needs from our Richland 2 School Lead Social Worker, we have now provided 40 gift cards for her greatest at-need youth and will be preparing 200 bags of weekend food for the backpack ministry children.

We truly give thanks to God for all those who gave offerings of love for these projects, through your checks or GIVELIFY app donations!

Our high school seniors are encouraged to fill out the application for the Legrand/Lowman scholarships which we will be awarding sometime in June. Our current college students are encouraged to reflect on their year in the application for the continuing ed grants which will be awarded in July.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

In May there will be 2 opportunities for Living Springs Justice Ministry "get togethers"!

- > This first week in May our Living Springs Justice Ministry Team Leaders will have a virtual meeting to share information about what is going on with their teams and talk about how we might "stay strong" during this time when we can't get together in person.
- ➤ In mid-May we will have an online gathering of all 55 LS Justice Ministry Network Members a big crowd! We will find out where we are with research and actions on the problems of crime and neighborhood gun violence, affordable housing, and mental health care.
 - Everyone should "stay tuned" for more information on the date and time for this collective 55member LS Justice Ministry Network Member meeting!

Here are very brief updates on the community problems we are working on this year:

CRIME AND GUN VIOLENCE IN NEIGHBORHOODS:

The urgency of addressing this problem hit home this week as a 7-year old boy was killed and a 13-year old girl was wounded in their neighborhood. Law enforcement, community organizations, schools, and our neighbors -- all want this to stop! The recent MORE Justice research meetings with local law enforcement, community agencies, and other organizations concerned about gun violence have been very productive. We meet online rather than in-person of course, but we are sharing information and finding out what we might do together. We have identified a tool that other communities have found successful in stopping the violence: Group Violence Intervention (GVI). You will be hearing more about this at the LS online mid-May Network Member gathering!

AFFORDABLE HOUSING:

We continue to work toward the creation and funding of an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to provide more choices for middle- and lower-income families unable to afford a place to live. The MORE Justice Housing Committee met with Richland County Councilwoman Joyce Dickerson and she voiced her support for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund. MORE Justice has also been asked by Columbia City Councilwoman Tameika Isaac-Devine to serve on the City's Affordable Housing Task Force and we have agreed to do so. **Jim Zeiche (from Living Springs)** will be MORE Justice's representative to this important Task Force. We are looking forward to being a part of the Clty's efforts to combat the affordable housing crisis in our community. At the LS mid-May Network Member gathering, you will hear more about what's happening and how you can make a difference.

MENTAL HEALTH:

MORE Justice has made a difference for the safety of law enforcement and for those they encounter dealing with mental illness. Asking for more officers to be trained in Crisis Intervention Training has made Columbia safer for law enforcement and citizens alike. We have recently received an update from Chief Holbrook of the Columbia Police Department on Crisis Intervention Training. We are excited to share that **154 CPD officers have been CIT certified!** We applaud the CPD for all that they are doing. Three years ago, there were less than 10 CIT-trained officers.

In Micah 6:8 we read, "What does the Lord require of you but to do Justice, to love Mercy, and to walk humbly with God." Even in the current pandemic, God's people continue to work for Justice!

We're excited to have held our first virtual team meeting to begin discussions on what lies ahead. Optimism abounds, but be assured that safety will always be our priority as we discuss the future. Our choirs continue to meet via the inter net thanks to Virginia and Laura and they continue to innovate ways we can safely practice and offer anthems during our services. We are disciples of God, and look forward to the time when we can worship together side by side.





1st & 3rd SUNDAY COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION

Next Distribution - May 17th

Worship will be streamed at 10 am. After the streaming, worship will conclude with an optional distribution of Holy Communion in the church parking lot. You can arrive at any time between 11:30 and 12:30 in your vehicle. We will utilize sanitary-packaged individual communion elements, which have been consecrated during the worship service.



There will be an "usher" in the parking lot to direct vehicles to the distribution altar, and the pastor will be there, wearing mask and gloves (he will change gloves after each vehicle). Everyone MUST remain in your vehicle throughout the process. Once it's your turn, drive up and put your vehicle in park. The pastor will come to your car window(s) to distribute Holy Communion. AFTER you have consumed the elements, the Pastor will offer a blessing – and then you can pull away. While in the parking lot, everyone should be in prayerful wor-

ship-mode, as you represent God's people gathered to continue the worship experience from the morning service. Think of this in the same way you would think about "walking up to the altar rail for distribution" during an ongoing sanctuary worship service.

Update on SC WELCA 2020 Convention

The SC WELCA Board met on April 23rd via Zoom to discuss the 2020 convention and have made the following decisions:

- 1. The convention has been moved to Saturday, August 8th. It will be a one-day event at St. Philip's Lutheran Church in Newberry. Registration will start at 8:00 and the convention will begin at 9:00.
- 2. Updated <u>Registration Form for voting members</u> and visitors and Nomination Form for YWG/FTG. Registration is \$20 for voting members and \$10 for visitors and \$15 for lunch. If you have already registered, you will be contacted about your plans for this change.
- 3. For our Local project, SC Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, we are asking for gift cards. We will not be collecting supplies for the SCNCAC.
- 4. "Call for Action" from the Action Team about making face masks for SCNCAC.
- 5. For our Global project, Lutheran Disaster Response, we are asking for monetary gifts, especially during this time of world-wide pandemic, to support the work of Lutheran Disaster Response.
- 6. The silent auction to benefit Lutheran Disaster Response has been cancelled.
- 7. Our agenda will include items required under our constitution election of a president, treasurer and 4 Board members, adoption of budget for our next fiscal year, reports from Board officers and committees and greetings from other organizations.
- 8. Our Keynote Speaker will be Thomas Knapp, Executive Director of SCNCAC.
- There will be no banquet. However, our lunch will be a "modified" banquet meal.
- 10. Because of our limited time there will be no Banner Procession during Opening of Convention and no workshops. However, there will opportunities for celebration and worship throughout the day. Your convention offering and joy offering will be received during the convention or you can mail them to the SC WELCA treasurer if you are not able to attend.
- 11. There will be a reception in honor of the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination of Women following our closing worship service, beginning at 4:00.

Notes from: Men's Ministry



Notes from: Boy Scout Troop #737



ONGOING SAFETY PROCEDURES AT LIVING SPRINGS

It is important to know that our Zip Code in NE Columbia (29223) continues to be the #1 location of COVID-cases in the state of SC - with several surrounding zip codes (29229) in the top 5. <u>At Living Springs, we remain in shut-down mode by action of Executive Team & church council at least through May (with the exception being 5-9 people needed to come to church to provide worship streaming).</u> During the stay-at-home order, Lisa is working primarily from home – but will be in the office on Tuesday, Wednesday, & Friday mornings. Sherry (our bookkeeper) is checking in at the office on Monday & Thursday mornings, to take care of some things that cannot be done from home. Pastor Eric is doing a lot of work via phone, e-conferences, but continues to stop by the church daily.

In our NE Columbia area, all religious leaders have been asked to impress upon our NE congregations the absolute urgency of adhering to the stay-at-home request and other precautions (wear masks in public to protect others if you must go out, wash your hands to protect yourself, ongoing social distancing in all situations, self-isolating if you have any symptoms). We do not live in fear, but it is possible for each of us to be carrying the virus and not even know it. For the health of everyone, please follow precautions as if this is the case - no one of us wants to be responsible for infecting someone else! If for any reason you must come to Living Springs, plastic gloves are located inside the entrances. Please make sure you put on a pair before touching (or picking up) any of the items at the church. Wearing your home-made mask is also a good practice.
