July Update from Pastor Eric: The Church IS the Church, and God IS at Work!

BOOK OF MONTH = Hebrews THANKFUL TUESDAYS @ 11:00; NO FEAR FRIDAYS @ 11:00

Like many generations before us, now the time has come for our generation to experience, and live through, a tre-

mendous challenge that we have never faced before. At such times, it is important for us to cling to our core identity as people of faith – and the fundamentals that have provided guidance and strength for us as God's people throughout the everchanging, ever-unfolding journey of history.

Last month, I wrote about one such fundamental we cling to as Lutheran Christians: the truth that we are simultaneously saints and sinners (*simul iustus et peccator*) – that we as individuals and a society we are called to be honest about our sinfulness,

our mistakes, our brokenness, our imperfect pasts – and humbly & repeatedly seek God's forgiveness. Thus, we begin our worship with the order of Confession and Forgiveness. At the same time, we remember our baptism and celebrate that God is at work through us, calling and setting us apart to bear the light of God's hope & love in the world, empowering us with the Holy Spirit to carry on the ministry of Christ for others, to fulfill what Scripture requires of us – to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with our God!

This month, I find myself thinking about the fundamental identity we have as "the church" – and our need to cling to that essential truth in the times of this prolonged (and now worsening) COVID pandemic. Throughout history, the church has played many roles in society and in people's lives – and yet, we remember that the church is not a social club, a non-profit charity, a community organization, a societal institution. Rather, as Lutheran Christians, we uplift the church as "the community of believers gathered where the Word of God is proclaimed and the Sacraments are rightly administered." It is also the Body of Christ for the world, carrying out the ministry of God's Kingdom come near in Jesus – and the embodiment of God's incarnational presence – Emmanuel, "God with us."

With all the difficulties and challenges created by the COVID pandemic, we have not been able to do many things that we have been accustomed to doing here at Living Springs. But, I give thanks to God that the Holy Spirit has allowed us to cling to our fundamental identity as "the church." Albeit in different and creative ways, we have continued to gather every week to proclaim the Word of God – through our streamed Sunday worship, through Bible study groups, through adult/youth/children's Faith Formation SS classes, through confirmation classes & weekly youth group times, through additional on-line weekly devotional times such as Thankful Tuesday, Wednesday CDC Bible Time, & No-Fear Friday. We have found creative ways to ensure that Holy Communion is available and administered on a regular basis (in our parking lot and on the lawn), that our Baptism is remembered & honored, that the blessing of God's forgiveness is offered. The Church IS the church, built around Word & Sacrament – and God IS at work!

In addition, the Holy Spirit has empowered us to continue to be who we are – the body of Christ, carrying on his ministry of God's Kingdom hope & grace & love for others: through our COVID helping projects for front-line workers, community seniors, homeless families, and youth in crisis, through our ongoing regular offerings of love for the Lord, through the amazing Youth Virtual Mission Trip experience, through virtual Youth GraceWorks servant experience this month, through the LS Family Assistance Fund, through through the ministry of our Child Development Center (for families in desperate need of childcare and staff in desperate need of income), through care meals & prayer shawls, through continued work on community issues via MORE Justice, through intentional efforts to nurture our racial reconciliation ministry in our relationships with Rehoboth Baptist & Adams Northeast AME, through being a site for the Red Cross blood drive this month, through helping out our Mission Partner, Cristo Rey Lutheran, and the many families they serve, through our Summer "Scatter the Seed" Good News initiative ... the list goes on and on. God IS at work!

As we move forward in July & August, I invite you to join in the prayers of our staff and executive team – that the Holy Spirit would continue to guide and empower us as we navigate these uncharted waters. In difficult and challenging times, may God lead each of us to cling to the fundamental truth of who and whose we are: God's people blessed with the gifts of faith & grace, Word & Sacrament - so that we might be a blessing for others! WORSHIP UPDATE FOR JULY



We give thanks for the truly amazing response to our Worship Survey sent out in June. We learned from the responses that the vast majority of the Living Springs community is desiring to be very cautious and safe when it comes to the timing for resuming in-person worship. The survey responses were consistent with the very, very low # of people attending our first attempts at an in-person worship experience (the 8:30 outdoor service in June).

Based on this input, we had planned that our next move in a gradual, safe step-by-step process would be to move the 2 outdoor gathering indoors to the sanctuary during July – and see if more people were interested. **However, all this was BEFORE the tremendous COVID resurgence that we are now experiencing, especially here in SC.** The surveys were completed before this resurgence, and given the cautionary nature of the survey responses even before the resurgence, it is that much more prudent for us to be safe in these current weeks. Thus, we are delaying resumption of any in-person sanctuary gatherings for July (or other gatherings in the church facilities).

The Worship Plan for July (as it now stands):

Every Sunday @ 10:00 – On-Line Streaming of Full Worship Service (Facebook & Youtube)

July 5 and July 19 @ 11:30- parking lot Communion Distribution on 1st & 3rd Sundays

July 12 and July 26 - NO outdoor 8:30 experience (due to summer heat & COVID resurgence)

July 22 and July 29, Wednesdays, 6-7pm - parking lot Communion Distribution (new times)

Two Other Important Items:

- For those yearning to participate in worship, there are **various roles you and/or your family can play in recording of the Sunday Worship Stream**: lector, acolyte, crucifer, congregation singer/responder, altar guild, offering presenter, etc. You do not need to be "trained" for this – everyone is welcome. Please use the <u>church online sign</u> -up, or simply call the office. The total # of people must be limited to 10, but this is still a good way to be in the sanctuary if you are deeply missing that presence. The current recording time is Friday @ 12:30, but we are trying to develop some evening times for those who work during the day on Friday. Stay tuned!
- Remember: any individual or family can always **access the sanctuary for prayer, using your keyfob.** We simply require that you follow our safety protocols (masks/sanitizer/gloves are available at the station in the narthex).


ANNOUNCING: LS JULY/AUGUST COVID HELPING PROJECTS!



Notes from: Justice Ministry

Justice Ministry has been very active this summer. MORE Justice Network Members from Living Springs and more than 35 other congregations continue to meet and talk with local officials, agencies, and advocates to find solutions to problems we voted to address together: gun violence in our neighborhoods, the need for affordable housing in Columbia, and education support for teachers and students.

Gun violence is a daily concern for many people in the Midlands. MORE Justice has had research visits with Mayor Steve Benjamin, Chief Holbrook, Dr. Derick Wenning from the Children's Emergency Department at Prisma Health, as well as people from Serve & Connect and High Point Community Against Violence. More research visits this summer are scheduled as we build connections with others that are working to address this problem. We are learning more about what is happening in Columbia and solutions to make the city safer for everyone. Group Violence Intervention (GVI) is an evidence-based strategy adopted by dozens of cities to reduce gun violence in communities. GVI is designed to reduce homicide and gun violence, minimize harm to communities by replacing enforcement with deterrence, and foster stronger relationships between law enforcement and the people they serve. We are finding that agencies dealing with gun violence, community organizations, law enforcement, and local officials are interested in learning more about GVI.

Affordable Housing has never been a timelier problem to address than right now given the economic downturn. Prior to COVID, Columbia ranked 8th in the nation in evictions, and affordable housing options remain in short supply. A solution that has worked in over 750 other communities across the nation is an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to allow creation of more safe, affordable housing units. During the MORE Justice Day of Prayer and Action on June 1st hundreds of Network members and others signed a letter to the Richland County Council supporting an Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Several Council members added their names in support, and there is a work group to work on a motion to Council to move this ahead.

Justice Ministry continues to work to strengthen support for teachers and students in our schools. At the MORE Justice Day of Prayer and Action on June 1st hundreds of people of faith signed a letter asking Richland 1 Superintendent Witherspoon and School Board Chairman Devine to meet with us this summer to discuss school climate and discipline policies in the district. We continue to share information, meet with others concerned about these problems, and work toward quality education for all students in the Midlands.

Summer 2020 is an extraordinary time. A pandemic, economic downturn, and civil unrest shape every day in our city, state, and nation. In these extraordinary times we remember God's call – "to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God." (Micah 6:8). The call "to do justice" is more important than ever. If you'd like to get more involved with the Justice Ministry or one of the research teams (Gun Violence, Affordable Housing, Education), talk with one of the team leaders and join us.




Poll Workers Needed
