As people of faith, we are shaped by the stories of Holy Scripture and what they reveal to us about God, who "is love." (I John 4:16). A large part of the Scriptural witness is the revelation that God works in the midst of historical difficulty to help God's people emerge into a new hope (for example, think of Joseph being sold into slavery by his brothers to emerge as 2nd-in-command of all Egypt; the Hebrew people wandering through the wilderness to get to the promised land; the despair of Good Friday resulting in the joy of Easter Resurrection). Right now, we ourselves are living through a moment of historic difficulty. While we do not claim that God *caused* this pandemic, we nonetheless believe that God is at work in these days to help each of us, our families, our congregation, the whole church, and all humanity emerge to a new place - so that even in the midst of difficulty, we find opportunity for transformation and God's new blessing.

During last week's Sunday morning adult class, someone mentioned they had been part of a meeting where the devotional leader highlighted the distinction between "crisis" and "passage." It is a helpful distinction that invites us to avoid viewing this moment in history (or this moment in our own lives) as a crisis to mire us down in fear and despair. Instead, as people of faith, we can embrace this moment as a time of passage, in which God might be working to move us forward out of old patterns into a new future with a renewed faithfulness, a deeper relationship with God, a deeper dependence on God's grace, a deeper life of discipleship, a deeper commitment to what God truly seeks of us as God's beloved human creatures—"to do justice, love

kindness, and walk humbly

with God."

As people of faith, as families, as a congregation, as society, as humanity, our desire cannot be to "go back" to life as before—as strong as that yearning may be (remember it was a strong yearning for the Hebrew people, who once in the wilderness, begin to think it would be better if they went back to their former slavery in Egypt). We must resist our own yearnings to go back to lives that had become so overfocused and over-filled with things that had no eternal importance. We must resist the yearning to go back to the "comfort zone" of our familiar, old enslavements to the routines, priorities, and treasures of this world. Rather, let us embrace this time as a "passage" of God's life-changing grace, a "wake-up" call to a new, transformed way of life more fully grounded in our relationship with God, our discipleship in Christ, our love for neighbor, our call to be vessels by which God's love for all is shared with the world!

At our August ministry leader gathering, we were discussing the challenge (and frustration) of trying to figure out how to do "the things we had been doing" in different ways. Yet, when God steps in to work powerful change in a massive, historic moment, I realized the starting point cannot be to talk about how to do what we had been doing. The real opportunity is for each ministry group to begin with a more fundamental question, "Why do we exist and what is our true purpose/mission?" From that question may arise a whole new tug of the Spirit: not a crisis, but a passage—to embrace completely different things that will now fulfill our original purpose/mission in a completely different world.

The same challenge is there for each of us in our personal lives. Rather than jumping into thoughts about how to do all the things we used to do, we have the historic personal opportunity to pause and press a huge "re-set" button: for each of us as an individual (or as a family) to "be still and know that God is God" and ask the fundamental question of "why do I exist and what is

As we continue to walk with God in this historic time, we remain committed to the central place of worship in our life together as God's people. We celebrate that since the pandemic began in March, we have not missed a single Sunday worshipping our Lord – however creative we have had to be. We also celebrate that we have been able to safely offering the Distribution of Holy Communion for everyone on a regular basis (via vehicle in the parking lot). And, we rejoice that the sanctuary has daily remained available to everyone for personal prayer & reflection, via your active keyfobs.

We are thankful for the tremendous response for the **Worship Survey** in June! From your responses, we learned that the congregation wanted to be very safe and cautious when it came to returning to in-person worship. This was consistent with what we experienced in June with our first attempts at in-person worship – when aside from worship leaders/helpers, we had only single-digit # of worshippers show up for our outdoor June worship offerings. In July, we had planned a next step of limited inside worship times, but with the COVID resurgence, we found this to be inconsistent with the survey replies everyone gave emphasizing health and safety. So instead, during July and early August, we took the following next steps: 1) move worship recording to Wednesday night so more people can participate from the sanctuary; 2) add some Wednesday night communion distribution times for those unable to come on Sundays; and 3) offer Summer Favorite Hymn greetings, for those yearning to see more faces and/or say hello to our congregation family.

As we move to the last half of August, we feel called to do some "holy experimenting" with possible in-person worship. From our Child Development Center, we learned the importance of re-starting in a gradual way in order to make sure necessary procedures are in place for everything to happen in the safest possible way. **So we are beginning with 3 optional Sundays (plus some Tuesdays for seniors), with hopes that everyone might pick one Sunday that works for them.** From your survey responses, we learned that almost no one felt it was safe to begin by offering 2 worship times on a Sunday morning, which would not allow for sufficient disinfecting time between services. We also heard the desire of Sr. Adults to possibly have a special time for those at higher risk (like designated times offered by grocery stores). We also know that public singing can have a viral spread of 3 times the distance of normal breathing. Finally, even from our very small worship recording times, we have learned how difficult it is to keep from accidentally getting too close to one another (in spite of best intentions). Inside group gatherings of any prolonged length are still very susceptible to COVID-spread, so we must proceed very cautiously: not out of fear, but out of a deep love & concern for everyone's health – and so that Living Springs continues to give a positive witness to our community that we do not become the source of an outbreak, hampering the ability of people to work, placing a greater burden on front-line workers, or endangering the health of family members, neighbors, friends. To that

end, we will take a first-step in-person trial as follows:

- 1) **Sundays, August 23, August 30, Sept. 6, at 8:15 for ANY AGE,** there will be limited in-person worship services in the sanctuary. We are choosing the 8:15 time because of classes that meet starting at 9:00 and because of the continued full-worship streaming at 10am.
- 2) **Tuesdays, August 25, Sept. 1, Sept. 8, at 12noon for SENIOR ADULTS,** there will be additional limited inperson worship opportunities. This will allow a 48-hour period for disinfecting and janitorial cleaning after the Sunday worship times.
- 3) Because space is limited, **everyone must sign up in advance,** via our on-line sign-up (in the eNews) OR by calling the office. \*We ask that each person/family begin by signing up for only 1 of the Sunday morning times (pick the one that works best for you!).
- 4) Worship Helpers, please do NOT sign up yourself on the worship service list you should sign up separately (as always) via Karen Kranz or the office. If you have family members with you, please sign them up as above.
- 5) Spaces will be limited to **32 persons in the pews** (beyond 6-8 worship helpers). Every other pew will be vacant, and the middle of all occupied pews will remain open, with person(s) from the same household sitting at pew ends. We will have a few extra spaces available should any visitors show up, so that they will not be turned away from the Lord's house.
- 6) Masks and social distancing are required at all times (please do not gather in the narthex or parking lot).
- 7) There will be **ushered seating & exiting**, in order to prevent congregating in the aisles, narthex, etc.
- 8) Following safety recommendations for public gatherings, there will be an **entrance table by the sanctuary doors** with temperature checks and name check-off (necessary for contact tracing should someone report a positive COVID test in the days after attending worship).
- 9) Please **arrive early** to allow sufficient time for entrance. There will be **distanced prayer stations on the portico** (with cross marks on the walk) for you to prepare your heart for worship as you (or family together) wait for your turn at the entrance table.
- 10) **These trial worship services will be abbreviated** in order to limit the amount of time a group is gathered indoors. Opening/closing hymn recordings by our musicians will be played on the screens (without our singing from the pews). There will be a short reflection from the pastor (no children's message), limited liturgy, and only 1-2 Scripture readings. Communion will be distributed with a distanced procedure, using the individual elements we have used at parking lot distribution. There will be no communion rails, hymnals or other items in the pew racks. Sharing of the peace will be verbal with everyone remaining in place. An offering plate will be available (but not passed in the pews).

We give thanks in advance for everyone's loving patience and understanding as we embark on this next-step reentry. The above procedures are not presented as obstacles, but rather to ensure that those who desire may worship in as safe as conditions as we can create. Following these 3 trial weeks, we will prayerfully discern what the Spirit enables us to do safely for Sundays following Labor Day, beginning with our GIFT Sunday Kickoff on Sept. 13. To be sure, we continue to gather and fully worship the Lord together every Sunday, whether in the sanctuary or via creative, virtual means. Each Sunday, the full worship service with music, hymns, liturgy, all readings, children's message, etc. will continue to be streamed for everyone at 10am.

With an update to our church database software, we are able to add a phone messaging feature - to make sure *everyone* is getting up-to-date news about worship services, faith formation classes, youth, etc.. This will be very important as we take future steps toward gradually providing safe, trial in-person worship opportunities and other exciting ministries.

It feels good to be able to afford the things that I need, to pay my tithes, to save money in a rainy day fund, and to try and pay it forward by donating to organizations like Habitat for Humanity.

I have my bear on a bench in the entryway where he greets me and my visitors. I have the quilt you gave me on display in the living room along with one another organization gave me at the dedication. I want

everyone to see the love and care that went into them. I made sure that my neighbors received the quilts that were left with me to hand out; it was a great way for me to introduce myself.

#### Notes from: Justice Ministry

This summer has been an active time for Justice ministry in the Midlands. We have made progress on the issue of gun violence in neighborhoods, affordable housing for low- and middle-income neighbors, and education. On **August 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM join us for the virtual MORE Justice Celebration**, the last event of our 2019-2020 Justice Cycle. It is a time to celebrate the relationships and accomplishments we've built this past year, to fellowship with a diverse gathering of hundreds of other people of faith, to hear issue updates, and to check-in on the investment drive. Don't miss the Justice Celebration!

Following the August Celebration, the Justice Ministry begins a new cycle of mission and ministry to love God and serve neighbor. In September, Living Springs, along with more than 35 other congregations, will begin the listening process in our individual **congregational House Meetings** to find out what concerns us in our communities and what keeps us awake at night. Look for an invitation in coming weeks to a Living Springs house meeting, whether online or offered in a safe way in person! After we complete our LS House meetings, we will meet in October with hundreds of other people of faith across the Midlands to decide what to focus on this year in our justice work together.

In the meantime, work continues on problems of gun violence in our neighborhoods, affordable housing, mental health, and education. Here are updates of what's happening:

- Gun violence is a daily concern for many people in the Midlands. We are meeting with law enforcement and other people who are knowledgeable about what is happening in Columbia and are familiar with solutions to make the city safer for everyone. Group Violence Intervention (GVI) is an evidence-based strategy adopted by dozens of cities to reduce gun violence in communities. GVI is designed to reduce homicide and gun violence, minimize harm to communities by replacing enforcement with deterrence, and foster stronger relationships between law enforcement and the people they serve.
- Affordable Housing has never been a timelier problem to address than right now given the economic downturn. Prior to COVID, Columbia ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation in evictions, and affordable housing options remain in short supply. A solution that has worked in over 750 other communities across the nation is an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to allow creation of more safe, affordable housing units. We're making progress on establishing an Affordable Housing Trust Fund for Columbia.
- This summer we've been in touch with Richland 1 about school climate and discipline policies in the district. We continue to share information, meet with others concerned about these problems, and work toward quality education for all students in the Midlands.

"What does the Lord require of you? To do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8) Does this command to do justice apply in a pandemic? Yes, of course. And together we find that doing justice as the people of God strengthens us and encourages us in our own faith life. Join us for the Justice journey again this year!


#### LADIES MORNING BIBLE STUDY Starts Back Up Tuesday, September 8 @ 10 AM



There are four other books in her Enid Blackwell series that most of us plan on reading.

Our book for October is *Pachinko* by Min Jin Lee – I have ordered a book club set from the library (15 books).



#### 2020 SYNOD ASSEMBLY UPDATE THE REV. VIRGINIA AEBISCHER IS ELECTED BISHOP OF THE ELCA SOUTH CAROLINA SYNOD



The Rev. Virginia Aebischer was elected July 25 to serve a six year term as bishop of the South Carolina Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, held July 25 online.

The Rev. Virginia Aebischer was elected on the fifth ballot, with 280 votes. The Rev. Jacqueline Utley, received 211 votes.

The Rev. Virginia Aebischer has most recently served as Assistant to the Bishop with Bishop Herman Yoos. Bishop-Elect Aebischer graduated from Upsala College in 1983. Upsala College was a Lutheran college in East Orange, New Jersey. She received her M. Div from The Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, located here in Columbia in 1989. She was ordained on September 17, 1989 after receiving a call to Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Charleston, South Carolina.

Bishop-Elect Aebischer will succeed The Rev. Dr. Herman Yoos and will take office on September 1, 2020 with an Installation service happening on September 19, 2020. Details are still being worked on as the pandemic continues.

The bishop serves as the synod's pastor and is called to administer sacraments, preach, provide pastoral care, advise, ordain, advocate, interpret, and serve as the ecumenical officer.
