FORWARD IN FAITH! – from Pastor Eric

Now **FAITH** is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by **FAITH** our ancestors received approval. By **FAITH** we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By FAITH through FAITH by FAITH without FAITH by FAITH by FAITH by FAITH by FAITH in FAITH by FAITH for FAITH

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our **FAITH!** (from Hebrews 11:1—12:2a)

Each July/August, our various Ministry Leaders gather in prayer to seek

the Spirit's guidance for a theme as we prepare for a new Faith Formation year. As with everything else in life, we knew our upcoming Faith Formation year was going to be significantly different due to the lingering COVID impact. However, as always, it was amazing to sense the Spirit's guidance, as our hearts and minds were directed to the above passages from Hebrews (which happened to be our congregation's Bible Book of the Month for July—no mere coincidence, I'm sure, but rather the tug of the Spirit!).

The Hebrews passage provides a long list of powerful examples of how God guided, sustained, led, and supported God's people throughout history and throughout so many difficult circumstances — all through the gift of **FAITH!** This gift of faith points through and beyond things we can see with our eyes (like the effects of a virus) to those greater things which cannot be seen readily with mere physical vision: deep, powerful, life-giving things like forgiveness, mercy, eternal grace and love. We are reminded that **by faith**, God is always working something deeper, beyond things we can see on the surface. The Cross provides a perfect example: on the surface, people could see a Galilean carpenter's son being executed by the Roman Empire along with other ordinary criminals; but beyond what could readily be seen with the eyes, God was working something so much deeper— the hope of salvation for all humanity, for all the cosmos (cf. John 3:16).

In all circumstances—through this deeper action of God that points us beyond what we readily see—we rejoice that the Spirit is always moving us **forward in faith**! On one level, we might say God is moving us **forward in faith** *in spite of* the barriers created by the COVID pandemic. We are not called to sit around, just waiting and waiting to resume God's work once things get back to what we had once called "normal." So, *in spite of* the challenges, the Spirit calls and empowers us to move forward in new, creative, and imaginative ways—as a community of disciples, in our Kingdom ministries, and in our personal journeys with God. But such "moving forward" not only happens *in spite of* those unique challenges & circumstances, it can also happen *through* the unique challenges & circumstances of our time. For while God may not cause a pandemic, God can still nonetheless use this historic time to jolt us out of our past habits, our past comfort levels, our past perspectives—and use this time to help us see possibilities that God is calling each of us to embrace: so that in our journeys of ever-growing, ever-deepening faith, we are not "going back" or staying stagnant, but allowing God to move us *forward in faith!*

Hebrews 12 concludes a great litany of faith by celebrating that we are not experiencing this forward movement of faith alone—but rather we are surrounded by a "great cloud of witnesses" who themselves were moved forward in faith by God throughout the centuries before us. Just imagine who is there, in that great eternal cloud of witnesses, cheering YOU on, as God seeks to move you **forward in faith!** (those cheers, by the way, are there not to encourage us to "go backward" or "stop where we are!"). We are called to run forward, with perseverance, in the race that is now set before us, here in our generation, in our time of history—recognizing that "the race" is not a solo sprint, but rather a massive marathon relay. Now, at this point in history, the baton has been passed on to you and me from the generations who have run their leg of the race before us **by faith**—so

I am tremendously excited, as well, about this Faith Formation year ahead and all the unique ways each of us will be involved in Bible Studies, Faith Milestones, Sunday Adult Classes, Youth Groups, Confirmation, Children's Sunday Faith Alive, Child Development Ministry, Bible Books of the Month, Faith5, at-home devotions/prayer—and all our ongoing, forward-moving ministries of Worship, Community Hope, Fellowship & Care. *Forward in faith ... forward in faith ... forward in faith!* May the Spirit empower us as we carry the baton and now run our leg of the race!

What an exciting time to be in the field of education, these are certainly unprecedented times as we work within this new norm and digital age of learning.


As we continue to have discussions about love and awareness in our world, we also share our thoughts and ideas of how we can Move Forward in Faith.



Notes from: Justice Ministry

For many of us it hasn't been an easy year. Some compare this year to 1968, a year of civil unrest and great social change. Some compare this year to 1929, the beginning of the Great Depression. Some say we can't compare 2020 to these years because we are experiencing not only civil unrest, social change, and economic downturn, but also a great pandemic. It's been a tough year for us and for our neighbors, too.

In Romans 8: 31-32 Paul writes, "³¹ What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³² He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else?" And in verse 39 Paul continues, "...for nothing will separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." What an encouraging word in a year of upheaval! **God is present for us, totally and completely, and nothing can separate us from God's love.**

I'm reminded of these scriptures as the new cycle for Justice Ministry begins in September. We engage in Justice work because God commands this and because we see our neighbor's great need. In our house meetings over the last three years we have asked what made us angry and what kept us awake at night. We heard that many in our community needed affordable housing, mental health care provision, better education, and safe neighborhoods without crime and gun violence. We voted to address these problems and to begin to find solutions.

We joined with 35+ other congregations and have made a difference in the Midlands: formation of an affordable housing trust fund is in process and many officers and deputies now are trained to engage more effectively with those with mental illness. We continue to work to address education disparities and crime and gun violence in our neighborhoods.

As God's children we stand with and stand up for our neighbors in need. **God's unwavering support and love for us that Paul writes about in Romans are what enable and spur us to support and love our neighbor. In fall 2020 this is more important than ever**: more evictions are occurring, incidence of mental health problems is increasing, education resources are strained, and gun violence continues to threaten our community. Through MORE Justice Living Springs partners with 35+ other congregations of faith to follow the command in Micah 6:8, "What does the Lord require of us but to <u>do justice</u>, love kindness, and walk humbly with God."

In September, Living Springs, will begin the listening process in our individual **congregational House Meetings** to find out what concerns us in our communities and what keeps us awake at night. Here are the dates of house meetings planned thus far:

Look for an invitation in coming weeks to a Living Springs house meeting! After we complete the LS House meetings, we will meet in October with hundreds of other people of faith across the Midlands to decide what to focus on this year in our justice work together.

Here's an update on our MORE Justice work this month:

 Gun violence is a daily concern for many people in the Midlands. We participated in a Town Hall on September 1 on Group Violence Intervention (GVI), an evidence-based strategy adopted by dozens of cities to reduce gun violence in communities. GVI is designed to reduce homicide and gun violence, minimize harm to communities by replacing enforcement with deterrence, and foster stronger relationships between law enforcement and the people they serve. Meetings with law enforcement, community leaders, and others affected by gun violence continue as we address this problem together.

- Affordable Housing has never been a timelier problem to address than right now given the economic downturn. Prior to COVID, Columbia ranked 8th in the nation in evictions, and affordable housing options remain in short supply. A solution that has worked in over 750 other communities across the nation is an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to allow creation of more safe, affordable housing units. We're making progress on establishing an Affordable Housing Trust Fund for Columbia.
- We've been in touch with Richland 1 about school climate and discipline policies in the district. We continue to share information, meet with others concerned about these problems, and work toward strengthened education for all students in the Midlands.

Join us for the Justice journey again this year! And rejoice in the good word that God is with us and nothing – not even the lifechanging events of 2020 - can separate us from God's love!


