When I was in seminary, one of our beloved professors had an annual tradition of doing a dramatic reading of Dr. Seuss' "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" for the entire community. At the time, I wondered why an esteemed Biblical scholar was concerned with Dr. Seuss... however, this year has made me truly appreciate his insight!

2020 might be a year when we feel as if a coronavirus grinch is trying to steal Christmas from us, as things will be different in many ways. There are congregational traditions which will not look the same. There are family and personal traditions which may not be possible to carry out. And yet, these differences may present a rare opportunity for all of us to be reminded—and more fully embrace—what Advent and Christmas are truly all about.

When the "Hoos in Hooville" went out on Christmas morning with no decorations or presents or banquet food or anything else, their joy over Christmas was still there! And their witness was so powerful and overwhelming, that it changed the heart of the bitter Grinch.

In this hurting world, there are many people whose hearts have been shrunk by suffering and injustice and pain and grief. As Christians in the Church ("little Christs" in "Christ-ville"), what will our Advent & Christmas witness be for all those in this community, and around the world? Will we sit around with sour faces, lamenting what is missing or different or not possible? Or (even if there were absolutely no decorations, no candles, no gatherings around food, no worship pieces that look like those from the past)—will we still nonetheless gave witness to the world ... that **our joy over Christmas has not been diminished in the least?!!**

For ultimately, our deep, un-rob-able joy over Christmas is about none of our human traditions. Our joy is about the gift of a Christ-child of Bethlehem, the gift of a Savior for all the world, the gift of the Word made flesh, the gift of Light shining in the darkness, the gift of Emmanuel, God with us! THIS is the Good News of glad tidings for all people ...that Christmas is all about (cf. Linus from another Christmas classic, as he quoted the Bible).

Maybe this Christmas 2020 will offer a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to help a generation of children & grandchildren better understand what Christmas is truly all about (provided we do our job as adults). Maybe, just maybe, if others throughout the world see Christians celebrating Christmas with not one diminished ounce of joy this particular year, then all those with burdened hearts can see that Christmas was never about holiday/family/church traditions, but rather has always been about the gift of God's love for the world! It may be that *this* is the very way the Holy Spirit will work in this unique Christmas, *to move humanity forward in hope, forward in love, forward in joy, forward in peace*!

I give thanks to God for all the ways the Spirit has already been at work in you, the people of Living Springs in creative ways for this journey of Advent & Christmas. Already, people have sent messages to tell us how they have been touched by an on-line Nativity, which they would have never seen if they had to come to our front lawn. Families were touched by a gift of hot chocolate packages delivered to their cars as they participated in a Drive-Thru Movie Premiere of the Nativity DVD. Already, people have been moved by lighting an

* Important Request for Prayer & Support: Call Process Update *

Our Call Committee has been working diligently in the Discernment Process to fulfill our vision for calling a full-time 2nd rostered leader. They have completed 2 rounds of interviews—and are preparing to present the name of a primary candidate for Associate Pastor to our Congregational Council in upcoming weeks. Again, this candidate will help us focus on faith formation, youth ministry, and our community outreach to the unchurched/dechurched—as well as provide pastoral, preaching, worship and leadership partnership with Pastor Eric. When the candidate has met with council, council will vote on whether or not to recommend this candidate to the congregation. If so, then there would be a called congregation meeting in January, so that possibly the Associate Pastor could begin around February 1, provided the council and congregation approve the call. All this is dependent upon our solid financial giving and our commitments for 2021—to ensure that this long-time vision can become reality. We are confident that the Spirit is working to move us forward in faith, and we ask that everyone at Living Springs join in ongoing prayer for the call process, our call committee & council, the candidate & family. We give thanks for the faithful, dedicated work of our call committee: Steve Padgett (chair), Gary Bradham, Gwen Furcron, Alison Levitt, London Mancuso, Dan Shannon.

From Council ... SPECIAL YEAR-END FOCUS: Regular Giving & Principal Paydown Drive!

In this season, we are truly thankful for all God's amazing blessings in our lives—and for the faithful giving of our Living Springs family! The *Forward in Generosity* emphasis (material included) is speaking to our hearts about growing in generosity for the year ahead – as our giving to God takes us to deeper places in our faith and will move us forward in ministry that has such a great impact on people's lives! At the same time, we encourage everyone to join us in <u>2 special emphases during the final weeks</u> of 2020:

- 1) **DECEMBER REGULAR GIVING.** Every year, we depend on significant Nov/Dec giving to assist with increased year-end expenses and put our ministry on solid foundation for the year ahead. During the pandemic, our regular giving has gradually declined to below \$28,000 per month. In past years, we have been blessed by year-end giving of roughly \$48-\$50,000 per month for Nov/Dec. Because of the impact on our Child Development Center from the pandemic, they are currently unable to contribute anything toward the mortgage, etc. This makes a robust December regular offering even more vital!
- 2) **PRINCIPAL PAYDOWN DRIVE.** We are currently seeking to refinance our mortgage to take advantage of interest rates. While doing so, we hope to paydown the mortgage amount from \$483,000 to \$400,000. This effort could reduce our loan payments by over \$30,000 next year—providing relief for the Child Development Center & giving us budget flexibility to move forward with calling our 2nd rostered leader, which will have great impact!

For some among us, this year has created financial challenges. We deeply respect everyone's situation and pray that we can continue to be a source of hope for anyone in need. For others, the year has created financial options—with stock growth, canceled travel plans, fewer expenses, etc. There may be an opportunity to give a special gift that will honor the Lord and have a great impact. There may be special abundance for some regarding stock gifts and charitable distributions—as well as the Cares Act, which allows a \$300 charitable deduction for everyone (even if you don't itemize). Whatever your situation, we ask that you would prayerfully consider a special donation for our two year-end emphases. As we each ponder our year-end giving, we ask you to join with us in remembering Christ's important ministry at Living Springs, and the life-changing impact made through God's work.

We are so thankful for the inspired response of God's people that has helped so many during this year—and pray that the

Spirit will continue to inspire our generous response to God's amazing grace, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, God's true Christmas gift of love! With prayers of thanksgiving for you,



2020 Socks (or other winter items) for Christmas 2020!

As we prepare for this 2020 celebration of Jesus' birth, we again undertake a project of collecting 2020 items as "birthday gifts" for Jesus. In lieu of canned food items, our goal for this year is 2020 new socks (= 1010 pairs). The socks may be of any size for any age/gender, as they are badly needed by agencies serving adults who are homeless, veterans, youth at Palmetto Place, as well as children, newborns and toddlers. Other warm winter items (gloves, scarves, stocking hats) are welcome, too. The collection will take place throughout Advent & Christmas Seasons, culminating on Epiphany Day, Jan. 6. There are baskets around the tree located in the office hallway.

During Lent & Easter, we had a drive to collect shoes - and now at Advent/ Christmas, we think about the tradition of hanging socks/stockings for our own gifts. This year, as a family, consider collecting pairs of new socks

around your tree, hearth, or manger scene - socks that you will give away to others as a birthday gift for Jesus, who said, "inasmuch as you have done unto the least of these, you have done unto me!"

NOTE: The 2020 Sock Drive is one of 4 HOPE project options we have for Advent/Christmas, including our Adopt-a-Youth Dove Tree, our 845 Backpack Food Drive, and the Disaster Response Bucket Collection. 

Notes from: Justice Ministry

This morning I went walking with my regular Monday companion through our neighborhood. She shared with me a quotation she'd heard: "Tell me who you walk with and I'll tell you who you are." When I got back home, I checked online to see who might have said this and it's Esmeralda Santiago, a Puerto Rican writer and actress. My friend used this quotation in teaching a Bible study. The class considered the question, "With whom do you walk?"

You may have walking companions, too, the people you literally walk around the block with. Or you may instead be thinking of your "walking companions" more metaphorically – the people with whom you share your daily life, your joys, your sorrows. These people have a big impact on us and we on them. Perhaps that's what Esmeralda Santiago had in mind when she said that if she knows who we walk with, then she knows who we are.

As Christians we walk with Jesus. We hope that our words and actions tell others who we walk with and tell who we are. Sometimes of course we fall short but with Jesus walking beside us we are able to start again, to continue our walk together.

Walking with Jesus, we are called to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God" (Micah 6:8). Walking with Jesus, we see our neighborhood through Jesus's eyes:

- Offering a <u>kind</u> word, providing a meal (or backpack lunch), or visiting someone who's otherwise alone (or at the VA), shows with whom we are walking.
- Worshipping God online or on the lawn or socially distanced in the sanctuary, shows with whom we "humbly walk."
- <u>Speaking up for injustice</u> (for the poor men who died in the Allen-Benedict housing units from leaking gas), advocating for the forgotten (for the mentally ill on the streets of Columbia), or trying to find solutions to big problems (for victims of crime and gun violence in our community), shows with whom we walk.

As the holidays arrive this year, I'm thankful for the community of Living Springs. Together we remind, encourage, and inspire each other on our walk with Jesus. We encourage each other to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God." Together we walk with God and our identity quite simply rests there.


Notes from: Women's Ministry

Through our connection with the Women of the ELCA, we are able to be partners in ministry with women beyond our own congregation: through the Midlands Conference and SC Women of the ELCA. As part of this partnership, the women of Living Springs identify 4 congregation unit leaders. We are thankful for our most recent unit leaders: Ginny Deveraeux, president; Midge Gunvalson, vice president; Jan Berger, Secretary; Marlene Jorgenson, Treasurer.

The ministries that God empowers the women to do at Living Springs are so important to share with our sisters in other congregations—sharing ideas on ministries with other sisters can sometime give them ideas on developing ministries for their specific communities.

To maintain this full partnership, we need to officially identify (or re-identify) a chairperson, treasurer, and secretary. This will help our LS women stay connected with other women in our synod and the 15 local churches of our Midlands Conference. This allows for God to use us to provide ministries on an even larger scale!

If you feel a Spirit tug to volunteer in one of the leadership role-- Chairperson, Treasurer, or Secretary, please leave a message at the church, or contact Ginny or me (Gwen Furcron) as soon as you can.
