Bithynia or Macedonia? A Journey of Faith! (This Month from Pastor Eric)

FEBRURAY BOOK OF MONTH = PSALMS 1-50 Devotion Stream: Forward in Faith Friday @ 11am

A few years ago, as a congregation, we began the powerful practice of "Dwelling in the Word," as part of our journey with the Faithful Innovation project, sponsored by our SC Synod and Luther Seminary. As you know, Dwelling in the Word can be done with any passage of Scripture. However, the Faithful Innovation project introduces the practice with one specific passage, Acts 16:6-15. The story there is so powerful that some congregations spend an entire year, in every team/group meeting, just visiting and re-visiting that particular passage. In it, you may remember, Paul and his companions attempt to go to Bithynia in order to "speak the word" there. But "the spirit of Jesus did not allow them," and instead, Paul is given a vision during the night of a man "pleading with him an saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.'" So instead of following their own plan, Paul & Silas & Timothy head to the region of Macedonia-and there by the river outside the city of Philippi, at a place of prayer, they encounter a woman named Lydia. Lydia hears the word, she and her whole household are baptized, and their home becomes a center from which Paul can proclaim the Gospel to all the Philippians—none of which would have occurred if Paul had been able to follow his original plans & direction to Bithynia. And yet, Paul's original mission & purpose had been accomplished—the word had been proclaimed and hundreds of lives had been changed by the Good News of God's love for all in Jesus.

Last February, we were excited to have come out of annual Council/ Leadership Retreat with the focus, "God's Love, Our Hands & Faces" with our four ongoing sub-themes: Build Relationships, Build Partnerships, Share God's



LENTEN FISH FRY

It was in the middle of our Lenten fish fries that we had to close down because of COVID, but we still managed to make our goal of \$2,000 toward our campus ministry with the help of our faithful congregation members, CDC parents, our community, and Thrivent cards.

Because safety is our main priority and we are not able to socialize in the fellowship hall, the fish fry will be available through Fishin' Fellas, a food truck stationed in Blythewood that many of you are probably already familiar with. Of course, the fellowship, tired bodies, sore feet and entertainment will be greatly missed by all our many workers who made it possible for our success.

The price of \$10 for each adult meal at Fishin' Fellas is a choice of: Flounder & a side; 10 ct. Shrimp & a side; Shrimp Taco & a side; or Fish (Flounder) Taco and a side. Sides: Fried Okra, Hush puppies; or Fries (adult meals include a water). Kids add-on: 4 ct. Shrimp & a side (\$5).

The truck will be parked on our property every Friday in Lent (order directly from your vehicle), starting Feb. 19 and ending the Friday before Easter week Mar. 26. Time will be 5 pm - 7 pm.



Notes from: Hope Ministry

2020 Sock Drive (or other winter items) Continues Through Epiphany Season!

As of today, we have collected 1552 socks and other items. We are 468 away from our goal. Through this season of light, we will continue the project of collecting 2020 new socks (= 1010 pairs). The socks may be of any size for any age/gender, as they are badly needed by agencies serving adults who are homeless, veterans, youth at Palmetto Place, as well as children, newborns and toddlers. Other warm winter items (gloves, scarves, stocking hats) are welcome, too. There are baskets located in the office hallway.



PALMETTO PLACE MEAL

Our chili meal was delivered on the fourth Monday of the month – it smelled so good and reminded us of the Chili Cookoff that is usually held the end of January. If there were prizes, Nancy Schwind would get it for sure! In talking to the care staff person, she mentioned the girls really enjoy our home cooked meals and the activity that Gail provides each month. Last year they had one baby – this time when I asked about the girls and the babies, they now have five babies and one teen that is transferring in will be having twins. Most of us can remember having children in our early twenties and even then it was overwhelming at times – I can't imagine what it must be for a teenager; but as I was there, one of the girls proudly came down the stairs holding her precious baby out for me to see. Let's keep these girls and the staff in our prayers.

PRISMA CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL HOPE MEALS

On January 21, we started a ministry that will touch all of us – parents of children yearning to be with their little ones as they struggle through cancer and blood disorder treatments. Because of medical expenses, loss of work-time, expenses involving transportation and hotels, and lack of cafeteria availability, there are cases where buying a meal is not the top priority.

Living Springs, through our member's business, Carolina Deli, is providing (20) luncheon meals once a month on the third Thursday for parents in the above situations. The meal is supported through a Thrivent action card (\$250 each).



Congregation members, Youth, and CDC Center can help by submitting words of comfort, love, encouragement, and hope in the form of cards, pictures, knitting/croqueting squares, poems to be included the meal box that is delivered to the hospital. The preschoolers provided the cards for January – don't you agree they will bring a smile to any parent!

BACKPACK FOOD MINISTRY

We continue to need food items – options are to order through Amazon <u>https://amzn.to/2GSyWC3</u>; a local supermarket (Walmart, Sam's, Kroger) and have delivered directly to Living Springs, or drop your items off directly into our backpack shopping carts. Whatever category is your preference – individual non-perishable – juice, meat items, milk, fruit (applesauce/fruit cups), cereal, snacks, cookies, and pudding cups.

It is always fun to pack the bags – because of COVID, the limit is 2-3 people or a family. Items are sanitized before they are stacked in the backpack room and then items are placed on the tables in the fellowship hall to unpack for whoever is packing; –- as we pray over the packed bags, we know God will bless his children and see that the food goes to those in need. 


Although the landscape may have changed over the year, we are still excited about our continuation to Move Forward in Faith and see where we are lead in the coming year.

Love, Share God-Stories. I imagine we all had our own ideas of what direction that would take us (we even had an image of people having face-to-face conversations over coffee, on a walk, in the light of a sunset, etc.). But then a pandemic struck, and we were "not allowed" to go in many of the directions we ourselves had envisioned. And yet, over the past 12 months, look at where "the spirit of Jesus" led us instead. Think of the hundreds of meals we provided for front-line medical workers, senior adults in our community, Palmetto Place youth, persons in shelters, school children confined to their homes. Think of our youth reaching out virtually and providing hope to ministries in New Zealand, Australia, and NYC—places they would never traveled to otherwise. Think of Living Springs members at the nearby WaffleHouse, gas stations, and businesses passing out hundreds of free facemasks early in the pandemic, or our RushHour ministry being transformed into signs of love & hope on Hardscrabble with passers-by honking horns, waving, and even wiping tears from their eyes. Think of the door opening to a new ministry for families of children at the Prisma Richland Children's Hospital. Think of a GoogleMeet Easter Sunrise service together from our own backyards. Think of neighbors joining church members to receive God's grace & forgiveness through drive-up Holy Communion. Think of people living in other states, having their hearts touched by an on-line Live Nativity (folks who could have never shown up to see the Nativity on our lawn). Think of adults & youth & children participating in SS classes & Bible studies on-line, forming deeper relationships. Think of a drive-up, stay-in-your-car rally against gun violence or an on-line Justice Ministry Nehemiah Action Assembly. Think of brothers & sisters of faith, staying spaced & wearing facemasks, yet peacefully walking together, joyfully singing hymns, to give witness to a cry for healing justice and the power of reconciliation across our society's racial divide. Think of people all across the country being able to worship with us on Sunday morning—including nursing home residents, persons from hospital beds, even family members living in different states who had not been able to worship together since their childhood. Think of "God's Love, our Faces" being lived out by caring people Think of a call process that got extended way beyond our hoped-for timetable, but through that extended journey, brought us Pastor Carl. The list goes on and on

Last year, at the beginning of 2020, we may have had our minds set on "Bithynia;" but instead, God's vision took us to "Macedonia," where countless lives were touched by the Gospel in ways we could never have dreamed for ourselves. You see, the stories of the Bible (the Word in which we dwell) are not just stories of stuff that happened to some other people long ago. More than that, they are paradigms of how this amazing God continues to work in human beings' lives still today—through the work of the Holy Spirit, through disciples of Jesus, through God's vision of hope for the world.

On Feb. 12-13, we will conduct our next Council/Leadership Retreat (virtually, for the first time!). I ask you all to keep that process in prayer. I have no idea what may come out of that spiritual time together, but rest assured, whatever direction we are taken, it will be the vision of God, and not our own. It may not happen exactly how we plan or anticipate, but it WILL happen—God's love will be shared one life at a time, with our serving hands and our cross-marked faces. Discipling, mentoring relationships will be deepened. Partnerships for the work of God's Kingdom will be formed. God's love will be shared, and God-stories will be told. While the direction may surprise us, our mission & purpose WILL be accomplished, just as it has for 33 years at Living Springs, just as it has for 2000 years among Jesus' disciples and Christ's church—for it is never our mission, our purpose, our direction, it is always God's! With thanksgiving for each of you and your commitment to Christ's call of light for our life together

"May we simply be open to God's vision! With anticipation of what God will do!"
