"Come to the table!" As a child, I can still hear my mom calling the family to the table, once the meal was prepared. And once we all got there, the very fist thing that happened was ..... prayer!

In May, we shared some marvelous things as a family of faith, all centered in prayer. There was the incredible Pentecost morning worship—and the truly joyful Pentecost Celebration that afternoon on the church lawn, with fellowship, laughter, food, music, jumping of the Hope pasture, and birthday cupcakes for Christ's church. There was Rush Hour Ministry, with tears of joy and smiles of hope and horns honking and people waving and little gift bags of hope being shared with passersby stuck in traffic. There was the awesome Justice Ministry celebration and the incredible love offering for Newberry College in honor of our retiring brother in Christ, Rev. Dr. Wayne Kannaday. There were ongoing Youth Group gatherings, a Pentecost afternoon confirmation gathering, weekly Bible times with our Child Development Center children, Sunday FaithAlive classes with youth & adults, and the baptism of our newest sister in Christ, Maggie. There were Mother Day's roses, fellowship ministry care meals, Memorial Day's prayers, meals for the Children's Hospital & Palmetto Place youth, and care packages for our deployed brother, Kyle. With every one of those events, we could hear the voice of God, our Heavenly Parent, shouting out to each of us, "Come to the table! Come to the table!" - and we felt the power of prayer.

In June, our SPARK VBS experience will focus on the theme, "Come to the table!" And throughout the month, we will continue to hear the voice of God, calling each of us through the Holy Spirit: "Come to the table! Come to the table!"

Continue thinking and praying over what specific hoping-coping skills you might sense a greater need for (your own life or in the lives of friends/neighbors/loved ones). *Note: with so much happening in May, we delayed the survey until June!* 

In addition to the summer worship prayer emphasis and the Hoping-Coping Skills survey, I encourage you to embrace the Spirit's tugs with our ongoing Hope Emphasis in the following ways:

- 1) Make sure you have your personal **HOPE MENU CARD & BEACON MEDALLION** displayed on your kitchen table—including the hope items you selected for your initial 3-course "hope meal" of growth & faith.
- 2) Enjoy and share with others everywhere the weekly Pastor Carl/Pastor Eric **THURSDAY 1:21 HOPECASTS**.
- 3) During worship, fill out a HOPE PRAYER SLIP for the basket at the HOPE BEACON STATION in the communion line.
- 4) Consider sharing a 2-3 sentence **HOPE MOMENT** during worship about some way you have seen or experienced God's hope being shared in the world. See myself or Pastor Carl if you have a moment to share!

In these June weeks, I pray you can hear God's voice calling to your heart, "Come to the table, come to the table!" Oh yes, God has prepared a banquet of hope for us all, so let us gather in prayer as God's family, with joy in our hearts, Paston Eric





# **Backpacks**

In a year that we thought "how are we going to do backpacks without the stuff-a-bus project, people not shopping or bringing in food items, people not being able to sign up as a group to pack", and then the plea from Richland 2 to ask if we could provide for another school! Pastor Eric encouraged us to think creatively; so we were fortunate enough to have a matching grant opportunity, an online shopping site, and the ability to donate through your offerings. Here we are at the end of our school year and our amazing God has provided and enabled us to #10 "share in ministries that provide for life's essential needs – with special emphasis on growth in our food/hunger ministries". Thank you from the social workers at Rice Creek, Joseph Keels, and Blythewood Academy and your Hope Ministry Team!

# **Children's Hospital Meal**

"They are adorable" – this is the comment from Travis on the cards that our Child Development Center children created to go in the lunch bags that are provided to the parents of children hospitalized in Children's Hospital. Carolina Deli supplies 20 lunches on the third Thursday of the month - #12 "share God's hope through support & partnership with our LSCDC children/families/staff".

#### **Palmetto Place**

We started off with the intention of helping young female girls to learn responsibility, meal preparation – hoping-coping skills, and a spiritual inspiration activity; but that got sidelined with COVID. We continued to provide the meal, including recipes and providing a craft that was spiritual in nature and each month Ms. Mary gives us an update on the girls and babies. This month I heard the story of a young girl and her baby who had nowhere to go because they closed down her foster parent's home and all the children in that home had to be relocated. I'm not talking about a young adult – this is a young teen with a baby! Ms. Mary was so thankful when I mentioned we would pray for this girl and her baby – God's Hope for All!

#### **RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE**

The American Red Cross was founded 140 years ago, when trailblazer Clara Barton established them. Part of a growing global network of Red Cross and, later, Red Crescent societies, the American Red Cross immediately began to serve people facing emergencies and provided hope to disaster survivors, helping military heroes, people needing lifesaving blood and countless others who faced some of life's most difficult moments. # Notes from: Justice Ministry

The Lion King is a movie that many people of all ages know, either from watching it themselves, watching it with children or grandchildren, or maybe from seeing the Broadway show on a special occasion. One of the songs, **Circle of Life**, says that life is a circle, that there are cycles of "despair and hope", "faith and love", and that individually and together we journey to realize our purpose on the path of life. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=F4efZIHtiQQ">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=F4efZIHtiQQ</a>

It's the circle of life, And it moves us all, Through despair and hope, Through faith and love, 'Til we find our place,

On the path unwinding, In the circle, The circle of life.

**Circles and cycles are something the Bible also talks about.** Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 tells us that there is a time to be born, a time to die, a time to plant, a time to harvest, and so on. Cycles allow us to work hard and to rest, to grieve and to heal, to achieve and to celebrate. For people of faith the Circle of Life is intimately wrapped-up in our relationship with God. Through the up's and down's of life, we look to God to walk with us. Our "path unwinding" is a discovery of our purpose and God's mission as we experience the seasons of life.

**Our Justice Ministry at Living Springs reflects a cycle, too.** In the fall we begin our work with house meetings where we listen and share about community problems that trouble us. We then join together with 35+ other congregations of diverse backgrounds to vote on a problem to address each year. Research and community meetings follow, where we identify an evidence-based solution, proven to work to heal communities. Then we gather in large numbers (as the prophet Nehemiah most effectively did) to ask public officials for change. Finally, each May we celebrate what we have accomplished together.

On May 24<sup>th,</sup> our Celebration marked the closing of the Justice circle or cycle for the 2020-21 year. We celebrated our accomplishments from the past year, heard issue updates, and listened to testimonies about making financial investments in Justice work. Our own Peg and Jim Zieche witnessed to the blessing that this work has been to them and their response. Since it was a Celebration, there was fun, too – and Living Springs even won an award! Here are some **highlights from the Celebration**:

Living Springs won the award for Highest Nehemiah Action Turnout with 133 people! Many people at Living Springs have responded to God's command to "do Justice," even in the year of a global pandemic!

We celebrated good news on affordable housing: Given the lack of affordable housing, MORE Justice worked hard to get public officials to establish an Affordable Housing Trust Fund. The good news is that the Chair of Richland County Council agreed to bring our request forward to the Council and to support that request. Several other Council members also agreed to support the request. Prayers continue this summer that we will have a positive response as this moves forward.

On the problem of gun violence, this year MORE Justice identified an evidence-based approach to reduce gun violence. At the Nehemiah Action we were seeking \$50,000 (from a multi-million-dollar budget) to pay for an outside study of the problem. Public officials unfortunately did not attend the Nehemiah Action to listen and respond to more than 1000 concerned citizens from the faith community requesting change. We will not be deterred: we will continue to build on what we have learned, strengthen the bridges we have built with other organizations and agencies, and we will continue to focus attention on these deadly shootings. We also heard updates on MORE Justice's work to bring the Clubhouse Model to Columbia to support those with mental illness, and efforts for dialogue with Richland 1 School District to address educational disparities. There are indications that public officials are aware of our work and may be responding in quiet ways. Work here will continue next year, too.

As June arrives, the annual cycle of our Justice work for 2020-2021 comes to a **quiet summer pause**. Network Members are completing financial investments in the work of MORE Justice. Some of us are attending workshops and conferences to fur-

ther develop our understanding and skill in how to follow God's mandate to "do Justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God." (Micah 6:8) During these quieter months, we continue to pray for Justice, to pray for deeper love of neighbor and to continue responding to pressing community needs.

# We are looking for Caregivers for Karis Home.

We are looking for Caregivers to love on our residents at Karis Home. Our program supports three female survivors of sex trafficking between the ages of 12-21. As this is a safe home, we require staffing coverage 24/7 for our girls. In an effort to provide as much consistency for our residents, we ask our staff to work a 13hr shift for either the day or night shifts. A full-time position covers three shifts a week and a part-time position covers two or less shifts a week. Caregivers assist with residents' daily needs: meals, laundry, daily activities, transporting to appointments, sleep, etc..



#### Basic requirements for the Caregiver positions:

- Be a female (due to the nature of those we serve)
- Be a minimum of 23 years old

Hold a High School degree or equivalent
