We are now 10 days into the official season of summer (begun June 20 this year) - and for the past several years, I have taken this occasion to lift up some themes of various important summer ministries.

In June, we had an incredible week-long experience with our youth at Confirmation Camp at Lutheridge in the NC mountains. This year's campfirmation theme was "Jesus the Way!" We shared how in the New Testament, early Christians were known as "people of the Way" - and noted how in Acts 19, the followers of Jesus were labeled as "those people who are turning the world upside-down." In the summer Gospel readings, we hear stories of how Jesus turned so many things upside down with his teachings & miracles of hope, bringing the Kingdom of God's love & grace into the lives of hurting & overlooked people—crashing through all sorts of worldly-perpetuated boundaries, labels, and religious/societal/ cultural "rules." During these summer months, what would it look like for you and/or your family to be more fully touched by the in-breaking kingdom of God's love & grace, as you consider the Way of Jesus? What does it look like for each of us to truly be living beacons of hope for the world, because (empowered & guided by the Holy Spirit), we live not for ourselves or our own interests, but rather live daily as people of "Jesus' Way" - hurdling all sorts of worldly-perpetuated labels & barriers to shine the light of God's unconditional forgiveness, grace, and love for everyone we encounter each day?

This week, we held SPARK VBS with the theme, "Come to the Table!" How incredible it was to see congregation/community youth and children in the fellowship hall, on the lawn, in the sanctuary—celebrating Bible stories where Jesus invited people to the table. How marvelous it was to witness so many people "coming to the table" of God's grace in other ways throughout the month of June: People "coming to the table" of grace during our inspiring and uplifting Youth Sunday worship! And now these three remain: Faith, Hope, and Love. But the greatest of these is Love. 1 Corinthians 13:13 Brothers and sisters,

We got a chance to see some of them graduate from various levels of education, and we got to see some of them get promoted to the next level. be true." This definition is based on doubt and uncertainty, but **Biblical HOPE** is knowing for a fact that the desired outcome will happen. It is not wishful thinking but a confident expectation. The **Bible** talks about how we have Hope for things eternal when we have faith in Christ, things that will never decay or waste away. Romans 15:13 *May the God of Hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing so that by the power of the Holy Spirit, you may abound in Hope.*

I know trying to look at the future of where things will be is scary, especially with the uncertainties of the Covid-19 strain still present in our lives. We do not know what tomorrow will bring, but when we have FAITH in Christ, we have Hope not just in this life but in the next. June had some highs and some lows, some good and some bad, some births and some deaths, but through it all, we had our Faith, Love, and Hope, with Love being the greatest of these.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, know this as we continue our hope emphasis this summer, focusing on a deeper prayer life that Christ is always with you. As we prepare for July, when so many of our current restrictions continue to be lifted, we can move more freely and engage with people more fully. Let us not forget to continue to lift all those who need prayer in our communities. Let us pray for the success of our Blood Drive, our Summer Hope Sunday, Graceworks, and our Sr. Youth Mission Retreat, all happening this month.

Lastly, brothers and sisters, we are guardians of our health and the health of those in the community to which we belong. We are also concerned about our comfort level and those who attend our Worship services. Many of us have been vaccinated, and we feel empowered to be more accessible than we have been for these last eighteen months. Nevertheless, we need to continue to be sensitive to those who do not have the same sense of empowerment. We need to be aware of the many parents who are still concerned about their children who have not been vaccinated. That could change in the next few months, but not at this time. We need to be aware that others are still concerned about compromising their health or the health of a loved one, so they will continue to be overly cautious.

As Christians, we are called to be witnesses of Christ's grace, mercy, and Love to everyone. We are the ones who are called to care for the friendless, encourage the hopeless, and help the ones who are lost find their home. We belong not only to the most loving and powerful God but the creation in which we have been placed. Faith, Hope, and Love, with the greatest of these being LOVE. 
