For Christians throughout the world, each November begins with the celebration of "All Saints" - as we give thanks to God for all those who have died in faith and passed to life in the Church Triumphant since last November. At Living Springs, on **All Saints Sunday (this year, Nov. 7)**, candles will burn for these faithful servants around the baptismal font, in the shadow of the great Easter Paschal candle and the white-draped cross—for it is in baptism that God's grace & forgiveness come to us, that we are joined to the death & resurrection of Christ, that we are blessed with the Holy Spirit, and that we are "set apart by God" (the Biblical meaning of *saint*) to fulfill God's purpose with our lives and be living beacons of God's Hope for the world. It has the feel of a mini-Easter (as does every Sunday, in fact), as we celebrate Jesus' victory over death and the sure & certain Hope of the Resurrection to Eternal Life for all the saints who have gone before us in faith! What an inspiring day!

This year, Nov. 7 will be doubly meaningful, as we **recognize our veterans/active military** at both worship services—and pause that afternoon at 3pm to gather on the lawn for fellowship & singing, accompanied by our Veterans Witting Tree recognition (we hold these daily from Nov. 1 thru 11—if you have

Pastor Carl's Corner

Brothers and Sisters, it has been a minute since I have written in the journal. As you all may know, I have been dealing with some severe lower back issues since Pentecost Sunday. I have endured and maintained to the best of my ability. I have seen our church thrive and our children excel spiritually. I did not do self-care, and my back stopped me in my tracks on September 12, right after service. I am thankful for all the prayer and support you have shown and given; it means a lot. I can say that today October 27, 2021, I am feeling better. I have some good days, and I have some bad days, and there are still some hills to climb, but through it all, I know that God is with me step by step.

Okay, enough about me, let us talk about our youth. Our youths are unique and fun to be around, from our CDC kids to our Sr. youth. Over the last two months, a lot has happened.

- 1. September was the start of our Faith Formation led by Seminarian Adriana McMurphy and London Mancuso. It is growing as the word continues to spread. We have Sunday school from 0915 to 1015 on Sundays, and we have a weekly check-in on Thursdays at 630pm.
- 2. Confirmation started on September 19. We had food, fun, and study sessions. Jan Berger did an excellent job with our youth, and they all seemed eager to jump in and learn. They were asked to do a summer confirmation project, and they presented their projects to the group and explained their reasoning for the project.
- 3. Our Sr. youth with Leslie Bloss also began the prep work for our journey next summer 2022 to the National Youth Gathering themed BOUNDLESS. Every month we meet and have devotions centered around the Youth Gathering and our youth mission at the church.
- 4. In October, we continued with Faith Formation, Confirmation, and youth meetings.
 - a. Without Faith Formation (Little Lutherans), we had five to go through their Communion Milestone. It

Sunday, Nov. 14 will also be a doubly important day for us at Living Springs: "Giving Hope" Intent Sunday (each worship service) and our Annual Congregation Meeting (starting at 9:15). The Annual Meeting will occur between the Worship Services in the sanctuary, but you can



also participate from the lawn, the parking lot, or by GoogleMeet. This is an important event in the life of our congregation, as we elect 2022 Council members and adopt our 2022 Ministry spending plan—a quorum is required, so everyone please plan to participate (in whatever format is best for you)! At both worship services, we will come forward as individuals, couples, and families to place our 2022 Giving Intents to God on the special Lighthouse Beacon—to symbolize that the Holy Spirit is empowering us to live out our mission as God's saints in the world, by giving Hope to others through our faithful giving to God.

Sunday, Nov. 21 will be a very inspiring day as well! It is **Christ the King Sunday**—the final Sunday of our Christian year, the Sunday prior to Advent Season. Between worship services, we will have our **Advent-Palooza activity stations** on the front lawn, where every household can pick up your Advent Devotional Items, help pack food backpacks, prepare Christmas Hope cards, or decorate your at-home Advent food donation box. After each worship service, everyone will also have the opportunity to greet **Virginia Herlong** on her final Sunday at Living Springs - and say thank you for all her faithful service with us as part-time choir director over the past 2 years. What an incredible blessing Virginia has been for us!

There are so many exciting moments here in November. In addition to these 3 very important Sundays, we are excited to offer the first installment of our LS "Hoping-Coping Skills" Series. During the past 2 months, we had many responses to our Hoping-Coping Skills for Life survey, with several focusing on issues dealing with grief & loss. So, our first session will focus on "**Grieving Our Losses from 2021 + Grieving through the Holiday Season.**" There are 2 options: **Sunday, Nov. 14 @ 3pm,** and again **Wednesday, Nov. 17 @ 7pm.** You can come in-person to the church or participate on-line). Please spread the word and invite your friends, neighbors, or family members to join you. If there is interest, this may also lead to some follow-up times in upcoming months for persons to continue to gather for support & prayer.

I will leave you all with this devotional from Sydnie Taylor to the Council a few days ago---- Isaiah 40:29-31

There are times in everyone's life when we grow **weary**. We feel like our **talent** is not enough, our **strength** is fading, our **treasure** is not where we want it to be, times when we feel like we are trying our hardest --- and time, is not on our sides.

When waiting goes against what we naturally and culturally want to do, but when our natural inclination is to step on the gas, God often tells us to hit the brakes.

Waiting is often tricky because we equate it with inactivity. However, waiting, which can also translate as **hoping**, means waiting with expectation and looking **for it** to be there. The implication is that we are waiting and watching with expectation towards what God is going to do.

During these periods of waiting, God is often refueling and refining us for what He has in store. Everything around you needs refueling after much use.

Well----- today is not over-----there is still time to **pray**---still time to say **thank you** ---still time to be a **good neighbor** -----why----because we **have HOPE that the Lord will renew our strength**.

THAT---We will soar on the wings like eagles; THAT---we will run and not grow weary; and when we walk---not be faint-----why because it is in us-----forged in trials, tribulations, exhaustion, pain and--- Joy!!!

From Tammy Mancuso, Director

"What gives you goosebumps?"

I don't mean that physical reaction to the air conditioner suddenly coming on in your office, or the frightening moment type goosebumps that makes you quiver for a moment, I mean that lump in your throat, tear in your eye goosebumps when you truly see God at work.

I had the sincere pleasure to witness many of these in just a short 30 minutes or so as we all gathered in worship through music time.

I was making my way upstairs to the workroom to check my mailbox when I heard a wee voice say, "Ms. Tammy walk with us" and a hand gently slipped into mine. Some of the classes were on their way to weekly music time in the fellowship hall, which is generally lead by the dynamic duo of Ms. Daneequa and Ms. London. Although my intent was not to stay, it is simply too difficult to walk away when you hear feet tapping, giggles begin and can feel the sheer joy of anticipation as the energy begins to rise.

Teachers and children slowly begin to enter and find places to sit, making enough room to move about freely, while sharing space with others. Ms. Daneequa begins with a familiar tune, "Jesus Loves Me". The children move their hands in motion to the words as they sign, slowly, thoughtfully, knowingly. Then Ms. Daneequa announces "reboot", the song changes tempo and a new beat begins, children laugh, voices get louder, and hands begin to clap.

As the children sing, some are seated, and a toddler curiously crawls up to one of our 4/5 yr olds and promptly sits in his lap. The older child gently wraps his arms around him securing that he won't fall off. The younger child looks up and smiles warmly, knowing he is safe.

As we move on to the next song and it calls for the children to gently lie down in green pastures, one child scoots close to his sister and cradles her as they pretend to sleep.

In closing as the song gains energy, feet begin to romp, bodies begin to roll around and the combination of song and laughter fills the space. Faces are bright with smiles, then as the voices get softer, children calm, and we end in prayer.

I know how difficult it is for families during these extra challenging times when you aren't yet able to step inside, to have sidebar quick conversations or simply to watch how your child is playing. Please know that we are here, we thank you for allowing us to have this time with your children and to be a part of your lives.

My neighbor stopped by and during our conversation, she asked if I was still attending Living Springs and I said yes. She proceeded to say how much she and her family's life was blessed by our Child Development Center who cared for all three of her girls (one daughter now attends Harvard!). She then recounted a story of when one of her girls went to tour the public school for her Kindergarten year and after the tour, the daughter asked, "Mom, this is a great school, but where's the chapel?" It touched her heart that the early formation of her daughter's life at LS CDC prepared her to simply assume every school had a Chapel and holy time to talk to Jesus. The mom shared that she said there wasn't a chapel in this new school, but that Jesus is always in your heart and you can talk to him all day long at your new school!

Our ministry to children in this community is appreciated, valued, loved, and cherished.....even after many years. May the Spirit continue to bless our children, teachers, and staff!

Notes from: Hope Ministry

THE WITTING TREE

"Witting" means to be cognizant, deliberate, and aware of the facts of a situation. Each year, more than a dozen faith communities and organizations join in hosting a Witting Tree ceremony at their site. Living Springs will be hanging 22 sets of dog tags on the big tree by the entrance driveway in a public awareness of 22 veterans who take their lives each day with suicide (that is one veteran who takes their life each 80 minutes.) Notes from: Justice Ministry

On October 25, Justice Ministry members from Living Springs Lutheran Church joined virtually and in person with partner congregations from all over the city. The Community Problems assembly was held at Reid Chapel AME Church. It was so hopeful to finally gather in person to hear the concerns and lift up stories from all of our house meetings.

This year, many of the stories and themes that came to the surface were related to issue campaigns we continue to work on.

Gun violence and crime and community safety.

Lack of safe and affordable housing is an increasing problem.

Rising rates of mental illness and wanting to know law enforcement is equipped with training to deal with a crisis situation.

Additionally house meetings shared a concern for our environment from clean drinking water,, to flooding, to increased utility bills.

Because issues of housing and safe living conditions overlap with environmental challenges, the beloved community voted to continue working on the existing campaigns without introducing a separate new issue.

The policy to create an Affordable Housing Trust Fund has been in development for over a year while 16,000 families are still in need of affordable safe housing. Unless we make this a top priority, kids learning suffers, physical and mental health declines as housing instability grows. This problem is not new. A long term solution is needed!

Watch for information on an upcoming Rally for Housing! Please plan to attend.

We continue to work toward the problem of gun violence. This problem has not improved but gotten worse during the pandemic. Going forward we continue to press for a partnership with the National Network For Safe Communities. The Group Violence Intervention model they have developed is proven to reduce gun violence sometimes by half. This model brings police, community, and service providers together to provide solutions that fit our specific community. On Thursday November 18th, at 6:30 we will begin our research kick off. Please join us as we move forward on these most important issues!!

As we gather on Sundays to pray and worship we are inspired to work for God's kingdom here on earth.


