

Advent 2021: Preparing for Hope (from Pastor Eric)

Throughout this year, at Living Springs, we have focused on hope: not a pie-in-the-sky wishful dreaming, but the sure & certain hope that comes from trusting that the past, present, and future are firmly held in the hands of our loving God of grace!

I think about key figures in Biblical stories of this Advent season leading into Christmas: ancient prophets like Jeremiah, Micah, Isaiah; the aging Elizabeth & Zechariah; John the Baptizer crying out in the wilderness; a young Mary; Joseph the carpenter; Gabriel the angelic messenger of God. I think about how their messages & lives were shaped by this hope they embraced, as they became vessels of God's promises to be fulfilled for the world.

I think about all the ways you, the people of Living Springs, embrace that same hope through your lives of faithful response to our God of amazing grace & love: those sealed bright yellow intent envelopes hanging from the Lighthouse Hope Beacon; the joy shared at our Christ the King celebration and Advent-Palooza; our children & youth filling the chancel on Sundays to light an Advent wreath; Advent devotional calendars & activities happening in our homes; preschool & afterschool students singing about "hearts getting ready for Jesus" in chapel; midweek worshippers bringing forth little drawings & clay shapes as creative prayers of hope; food items filling Advent Hope boxes in our homes; persons writing Advent e-devotions to be shared each morning; Advent crafts & Bible stories being prepared for the mission children of Cristo Rey; Christmas Dove gifts being dropped off for school children & teens in need (as well as LSC Recovery House adults); Sr. Youth offering cocoa cones & Christmas ornaments to help prepare for their summer mission work & national Youth Gathering trip; persons picking up "Good Gift" ornaments for World Hunger (Continued on page 4)

Greetings from Pastor Carl's Desk

Some learned in worship and Sr. Youth activities, and others learned in worship and Little Lutheran activities. Along the way, we managed to keep them involved with activities to help the children at Cristo Rey on the first Sunday and Advent Palooza on the third Sunday. Also, in the middle of all they had going on, we had Confirmation Classes twice. It may seem like a lot, but I wanted to let you all know that our youth are involved and thriving in their spiritual faith formation.

As we continue to move forward into the season of Advent, we see that it is a time of Hoping and Expectation. As we are preparing, celebrating, and anticipating the coming of Christ into the world, we do this with joyful expectation to celebrate that the Son of God first came into the world over two thousand years ago in the town of Bethlehem. In our time today, we still move into this Advent Season filled with hope and expectation. I am glad to share with you all this experience of Hoping and Expecting.

As you may be aware, we love our kids, and we want them to be a part of the Hoping and expecting aspect of Advent. On Advent Sunday, we will be sending home an Advent calendar that will look like a Nativity set once completed. Also, we will be sending home an advent Chain that will look like a chain of countries bound together in love when put together. The directions are easy to follow, and I hope you all will sit with your kids and work on each piece daily.

chicks/pigs/honeybees & more; families assembling 100's of backpack ministry food bags; disciples delivering meals of hope to the homebound; volunteers decorating the sanctuary to bring joy to worship; handbells & choir members offering musical gifts to praise our Lord; and so much more. In Advent weeks ahead, we will also be preparing hearts & lives to experience the depths of God's hope through our Outdoor Nativity Drama, through Rush Hour Ministry, through the sharing of 3000 Christmas Hope Cards, through Good News Walkers & Billboard Ministry, through special Advent & Christmas Eve worship experiences, through another Children's Hospital meal, and yes, so much more!

At our first midweek Advent Evening prayer service, a Kindergartner boldly spoke up and volunteered to read one of the Scripture lessons for worship. It brought tears to our eyes to hear a child's voice reading to the congregation about God creating a good and perfect world (Genesis 1). In that holy moment, the voice of a child was preparing all our hearts more fully for THE CHILD whom God sent to us as a babe in the manger of Bethlehem. It is that holy child, Jesus, who brought hope to countless lives, who suffered on the cross, who conquered death for all of us, who promises to be with us always, and who will come again to fulfill all hope! As we walk together through this Advent season, I pray the voice of Christ, the child of Bethlehem, will truly find a way to speak to your heart, preparing you for the fullness of hope God gives us in faith.

In the end, everything we do as God's people is done to prepare the world for the fulfillment of God's sure & certain hope. Just as Jeremiah, Isaiah, Micah, Elizabeth, Zechariah, John, Gabriel, Joseph, and Mary became beacons of God's hope, so too might each of us be a shining beacon of God's hope for others in these holy days—with the light of Christ reflecting through us, to prepare the world for God's peace and joy!

heart to him. What kind of gifts will he give? Reminders of his Father's love. A sense of hope as you face life's challenges. New insights and wisdom that you can share with your loved ones. Freedom from guilt as you lay your sins and failings at his feet. Furthermore, above all, peace and joy as he tells you that he has you in the palm of his hand.

Dear LSLC-CDC Families,

As we flip the calendar to December, we may begin to feel the urgency of the "Holiday Season", the anticipation of all that often accompanies this time of year. To some it may mean that they are busy rushing around for the "perfect gift" or feeling the stress of holiday gatherings, cooking all the favorite foods, or making certain everyone is having a good time. What is intended to be a joyous time of year can certainly become overwhelming. I know it can be easy to get caught up in the "Holiday Rush" when we are constantly seeing images on social media and television of what society is telling us is important this time of year, when what is most precious is the Hope that this season brings.

As I have conversations with children, I hear moments of Hope as they tell me how they were able to see grandparents, cousins, family, and friends for Thanksgiving.

As I answer the phone, I hear the trembles in a new parent's voice. She explains that although this is her second son, he just isn't like his brother. She is worried about his acclimation to the setting of childcare, but she is Hopeful that she will find the right fit for him. She shares the story of how he had five surgeries before he was eight months old, and that while she doesn't want to sound like "that parent" she can't help but feel nervous. I listen while she shares her story; when she pauses, I remind her that he is a perfect child of God, created with gifts and joys that belong solely to him. He is his own person, and we are not born into this world to compete with one another, but to complete one another.

I hear the Hope in the words of staff sharing stories of new beginnings.

There is Hope for a brighter future while learning to stand on their own, surrounded by a family of faith that has shown them the Hope of Christ in action.

There is Hope in finding a new a call here at LSLC-CDC followed by finding a new apartment and the Hope of settling into their new home.

There is Hope in the opportunity to return to school, while it may seem overwhelming at times, there is Hope in being surrounded by fellow staff that show support and guidance and are committed to one another's success.

There is Hope in medicine as staff see family and friends getting vaccinated, giving them Hope that they will share the Holidays with a bit less worry for the safety of loved ones.

There is Hope that this Holiday will bring joy in the midst of what some have suffered. Hope in knowing that we will once again be reminded of the story of the birth of Jesus and the promises that it brings.

My wish is that as we move ahead into 2022 we are reminded of all the wonderful moments of Hope that we have seen over the past year. The times we have been able to stop and pause, to listen and to be present; whether it has been with loved ones or sitting alone while we reflect on memories of time shared. It is in these quite spaces that we allow ourselves time to recall and reflect.

It is with a joyous heart that I wish you well this last month of 2021 and look forward to the Hope of a New Year.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

It's Advent 2021 and we are preparing our hearts to welcome the Christ child. How do we do this, how do we as God's people get ready for Christmas? We hear the familiar reading at worship:

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ²"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'" (Matthew 3:1-3)

What does it mean for us to prepare for the coming of the *kingdom of heaven*? And, what in fact is the kingdom of heaven? It's not a physical place, not an earthly location that we can visit on our next vacation. The kingdom of heaven is different. It exists in places and times where God's love and justice are found. When we participate in acts of mercy or love and when we participate in seeking justice, then we are participating in the coming of God's kingdom.

What does this mean for us at Living Springs this Advent to prepare for the *kingdom of heaven*? Preparing for that kingdom means that we <u>show God's love</u> to our neighbors (e.g., collecting canned food for the hungry, giving Christmas gifts to homeless youth, etc.) It means that we <u>work for justice</u> to make life better for our neighbors (e.g., advocating to City Council and public officials in the Midlands to establish an affordable housing trust fund, etc.)

Acts of love and acts of justice are what God's people do this Advent as the *kingdom of heaven comes near* and as we *prepare the way of the Lord.* The *December Journal* describes many opportunities to be a part of congregational love and mercy ministries. There are also opportunities to be a part of the LS Justice Ministry. This year we are working to address justice problems with affordable housing, mental health needs, and crime and gun violence in our neighborhoods.

What better way to get ready for Christmas than being a part of the coming of God's kingdom?

Monday, March 14, 6:30 pm, MORE Justice Rally (prepare for the Nehemiah Action)

Tuesday, April 5, 6:30 pm, MORE Justice <u>NEHEMIAH ACTION</u> (bring 3+ people with you to ask public officials for changes to better serve our neighbors' needs)




