What a meaningful ministry "kickoff" Sunday we shared last month, on the same day the world was focused on a Super Bowl football kickoff! Photos (our church lawn filled with H.O.P.E. umbrellas, our joyful H.O.P.E. worship, the fellowship hall stacked full of donated food) can be found here in the March Journal. If you were not able to be here, you can find the Livestream posted on our <u>LS YouTube channel</u> Pastor Carl and myself found much joy in our shared sermon series, focusing on: "**Extending the Umbrella of God's H.O.P.E.," "Moving from Surviving to Thriving,"** and "**Breaking through Barriers."** In February, we also had the powerful experience of our Hoping-Coping Series #2, with counselor Laura Truesdale offering powerful strategies for navigating life in stress-filled times. What a blessing!

Now, here in Lent, we move our focus to **"Being Stretched by the Cross."** I am excited about our Wed. Dramatic Dialogues (worship @ 6:45), as we hear from New Testament people who were stretched by Jesus' message & his journey to the cross—and ponder how that same message/journey still stretches OUR hearts & minds after nearly 2000 years! On Sunday mornings, we will literally be "extending" the Lenten Cross of H.O.P.E. now adorning the altar area with added letters—and worship will conclude with a moving "processional cradling" of the cross.

Starting last Sunday, there are now 4 special prayer candles lit during worship, to symbolize ministries by which we at LS are being stretched by the Cross to extend God's H.O.P.E.

White Candle: prayer for peace in Ukraine/Europe & all those suffering.

Purple Candle: prayer for our congregation Disciple Gatherings.

Purple Candle: prayer for LS Afghan refugee family & ministry with them.



Lenten 40X40 H.O.P.E. Collection Bring a Kit Sunday, March 6

H.O.P.E. – how appropriate for this Lenten season that we can put God's love in action by making Personal Care Kits for neighbors in the poorest parts of the world. **On the first Sunday of Lent (March 6th), we invite each person/ household to assemble and bring a Personal Care Kit** - and place your kit at the base of the Lenten cross.

Personal Care Kits include:

- •Two bars 4-5 oz. soap (in original wrapping)
- •One lightweight bath towel 20x40 to 52x27 (dark color recommended)
- •One adult toothbrush (in original packaging)
- •One sturdy comb
- •One nail clipper (metal)



To assemble your kit for Sunday, March 6th... Fold towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.

For the weeks following March 6th, there will be containers in the admin building to collect multiple individual items needed to assemble even more kits during the 40 days of Lent. As always our goal for Lent 40 X 40 = 1600 total items. On Palm Sunday, April 10, the individual items will be assembled into full kits.

THIS IS A STORY OF HOPE!

Harley came to Palmetto Place at the age of 18 and stayed for four months before moving on to self-sufficiency. She received wrap-around support from a variety of staff members at Palmetto Place. Services included medical care, mental health, group that focus on self-esteem and coping skills, independent living skills, and recreational activities. Harley is feeling more optimistic about

her future, and although she still struggles from time to time, she feels Palmetto Place has equipped her with life skills that she will use and value for life. This young lady is practicing resilience and perseverance. While she may have an <u>ACE score</u> of 6 or higher, her past and lived experiences do not determine her future. Again, our youth are beating the odds and overcoming stereotypical statistics.

Since 2012, our Unaccompanied Youth program has continued to grow year after year. The unaccompanied youth program has served more than 300 homeless youth over the past 9 years. In 2021, we served 127 youth in our residential and housing program. We served an additional 40 youth in our Aftercare program. All in all, in 2021, we served youth in 21 counties in South Carolina. 90% of our youth in the Unaccompanied Youth Program had a positive housing outcome.

Time for People Power

A Living Springs teacher cares especially about homelessness because every day she sees its effect on the elementary school children in her class. A Living Springs father cares about affordable housing because his two adult children have moved back into his home with him because their jobs don't pay enough to cover monthly rent and bills. It wasn't like this when he was starting out. They are disappointed and he is, too. A Living Springs teenager is in lock-down at school because of another threat of violence on the high school campus. Within our congregation we hear how our own lives are touched every day by problems due to the lack of affordable housing and neighborhood gun violence. Our neighbors often feel the effect of the problems even more directly than we do. They are the working parents unable to afford to give their children a safe place to call home. They are the families that live in areas where drive-by shootings are commonplace.





More than 50 Living Springs members are MORE Justice Network Members again this year, acting on God's command to "do Justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God." (Micah 6:8) We "do Justice" by gathering with hundreds of other people of faith at the Nehemiah Action to ask public officials for change to make our community more closely reflect God's kingdom.

Justice ministry is addressing two problems this year, the lack of affordable housing and increases in gun violence. We would like to see the Midlands:

- Establish an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to create housing that is safe and affordable for lower- and middle-income families. (Greenville SC and Charlotte NC both have done this.)
- Conduct a comprehensive problem analysis by outside experts to assess where gun violence is happening, why, and what can be done.

Living Springs Network Members will gather at the Rally on March 14th to receive action updates on these two problems and prepare to ask for change at the Nehemiah Action.

Living Springs Network Members will gather, <u>and each bring 3+ people with them to the Nehemiah Action</u> to ask for action on Affordable Housing and Gun Violence. "People Power" is what persuades public officials to act, and we are committed to turning out 150 from the Living Springs community that evening.

Watch for the Umbrella of H.O.P.E. display in the Narthex that helps us track our "People Power" numbers as we work toward bringing 150 from the Living Springs community to the Nehemiah Action. Watch for information on transportation to the Rally and to the Nehemiah Action. Safety protocols will be in place as we gather in-person again this year.

in partnership with Lutheran Services Carolinas

Many remember the great blessing we had as a congregation several years ago when we worked with Lutheran Services to sponsor an Iraqi refugee family (who had to flee for their safety because their father had served as an US translator). Once again, Lutheran Services Carolinas is responding to an urgent need through their refugee ministry, which includes many US Ally families from Afghanistan. Living Springs had formed a "Circle of Welcome" team, so that we can serve as a sponsoring congregation for a refugee family arriving through Lutheran Services Carolinas and the extensive US gov't screening process. Typically, the families have first spent time in US military bases on foreign soil and then have been transferred to military bases here in the US, before being assigned to sponsoring care agencies like Lutheran Services of the Carolinas. In order to be a sponsoring congregation, our Living Springs team will need multiple members who are willing to be involved in various ways to support our family for 6 months - 1 year, in partnership with staff from Lutheran Services. Opportunities include airport welcome, transportation, helping with grocery-shopping, job prep, school, doctor's appointments, life skill assistance, and more. "And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful" (Colossians 3:15).

On Feb. 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching land, sea and air attacks. Russia has launched air strikes across the country, including on the capital of Kyiv and other major cities. Airports are now shut, and few railway lines are operational. Millions of civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. Over 300 civilians have been killed in the conflict so far, and damage to civilian infrastructure has left hundreds of thousands of people without water or electricity. Ukrainian men of military age (18-60) are forbidden to leave the country, so most of those fleeing the violence are women and children. According to one report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, more than 1 million people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries including Hungary, Poland, Slovakia and Moldova. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma they've endured.

Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits.

Your gifts will support Ukrainians and others. Gifts to "Eastern Europe Crisis Response" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the crisis in Ukraine and neighboring countries.

Our prayers abound for the loss and devastation experienced in Ukraine and Eastern Europe.
