MAY "BOOK(S)" OF THE MONTH = 1 & 2 Timothy, Titus PASTOR TIMES: Sun, May 8 @ 9:20am; Tues, May 10 @ 10am

What a joyous time of year we now enter—the full 50 days of Easter season, lasting until the great festival of Pentecost (this year, June 5)! The length of Easter season is an important reminder that the Resurrection appearances of Jesus were not limited to one particular moment on one Sunday morning, but instead they extended for hours and days afterward, as the Risen Lord appeared again and again—to bring hope to so many of his hurting, grieving, bewildered (and even still doubting) disciples. As I have said often over the years, **the Easter shout of Christians is not "Christ WAS raised," but rather "Christ IS risen!"** Our joyful shout is not a statement about a one-time event that happened in the past, but a bold declaration of faith about something that is true here in the present: our Lord IS a Risen & Living Lord, who continues to be present with us in powerful, yet mysterious ways to continue bringing grace-filled hope into the brokenness of our own lives and the brokenness of our world.

The Risen Lord Jesus revealed himself in the breaking of the bread to Cleopas & his companion, and so too, the Risen Lord Jesus reveals himself to us in the breaking of the bread every week when we gather for Holy Communion, to share in Christ's real presence. The Risen Lord Jesus made himself known to the disciples who were locked away in their room of fear, offering them "Peace", reconciliation, forgiveness, and the power of the Holy Spirit; and so too, the Risen Lord Jesus continues to come to us with the power of the Holy Spirit in our own places of personal/world fear, offering us hope-filled forgiveness, reconciliation, and a peace which passes all understanding, a peace this world cannot give. "I am with you always—even to the end of the age!" the Risen Lord Jesus promised his disciples at his Ascension (40 days after Easter, this year celebrated on May 26), and so it is! The Risen Lord Jesus continues *(Continued on page 3)*

to fulfill that promise, for Christ IS Risen and with us, each of us, every moment. Alleluia! Thanks be to God!

The Lenten journey was filled with so many powerful moments: the amazing Lenten dramas (some Wednesday with 100+ persons participating online!), the incredible Nehemiah Justice Assembly, the powerful Holy Week experiences (Palm Sunday, Passion Reading, Holy Week Children's Event, Holy Monday Healing Service, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the tear-rending walking of the Cross on Clemson Road), the response to our 40x40 Lenten Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief, and the incredible Fish Fry ministry for Lutheran Campus Ministry. Then, it was wonderful to share with so many people the incredible Easter Services celebrating our Lord's Resurrection: starting with the Saturday night Easter Vigil, then including Easter Son-rise, the Easter Breakfast, 2 Easter Morning Celebration Worship Experiences—and finally concluding with the intimate on-line Emmaus at-home Communion on Easter afternoon.

Now, as we move into May, we have so much to continue celebrating during this Easter season, with the hope-filled presence of Christ. We begin with a special **in-person Disciple Gathering on Sunday, May 1 (between worship services)** - for anyone and everyone who was not able to participate in a Lenten on-line disciple gathering. Don't miss this amazing opportunity to gather with other disci-

ples, with the presence of the Risen Lord among us! Here in May, there is the Scholarship Auction Supper, which will bring hope to many college students. 

LENTEN FISH FRY

First, THANK YOU to everyone that came out to support our Lenten Friday Night Fish Fry event – that includes all volunteers who braved some difficult weather conditions and members who purchased meals in support of the Gamecock Campus Ministry and I need to include Thrivent which helped fund our weekly event. We ended up selling 492 meals and will be able to match or exceed our donation of \$4,000 last year.

Pastor Jesse is doing an amazing job of providing a spiritual connection during a time in the life of a college student when it is needed the most. Living Springs also provided the Sunday evening meal during 2022 and look forward to continuing that ministry in the fall.

A cute story about one of the fish fry nights – some of you may get the Next Door app where you can post events happening in your neighborhood. I posted the fish fry each week and one week I got a "like" with a nice comment and another person posted a "sad" so I got a little worried that someone had a bad experience. I sent a private mes-

sage apologizing if something was not right with her meal and to let me know how I could make amends. It ended up I misinterpreted her "sad" – she posted the "sad" because she was sad that she missed coming to the event! Whew!













Children's Hospital

Travis Mooney, Carolina Deli, continues to ask the hospital to let us physically bring the lunches into the hospital and be able to communicate with the parents that receive the lunches provided each month. Notes from: *Justice Ministry* Justice Ministry - Time to Celebrate!

May is the month to **CELEBRATE** justice!

On April 4th we held our Nehemiah Action and for the first time in three years we held it <u>in-person</u>! That was something to celebrate! A large crowd gathered to sing, pray, listen, participate, and ask for change to make Columbia a better community for our neighbors. The turn-out of nearly 700 people from all walks of life was truly something to celebrate – we kept adding chairs as more and more people arrived representing 35+ congregations and communities of all kinds! The excitement, lively conversations, and good will were apparent that evening which was something else to celebrate! That evening we asked Mayor Daniel Rickenmann for an outside study of gun violence, since understanding a problem is the first step toward effective solutions. We celebrate that Mayor Rickenmann said "Yes" to asking City Council to do this and funding the study! We will be meeting with him this month to talk more about getting this done soon. At the Nehemiah Action we also celebrated the sizeable increase in the number of law enforcement officers that have received Crisis Intervention Training (CIT), a commitment received at the 2018 Action from our police chief and sheriff.

Yes, there truly is much to celebrate in May! And while we celebrate, we will also continue working on two other pressing community problems, the lack of affordable housing and mental health community needs. At the Nehemiah Action on April 4th, we were disappointed that County Council Chair Overture Walker did not attend to respond to our request to ask County Council to establish an affordable housing trust fund. More than 16,000 families do not have access to safe and affordable housing, and we will continue to ask County Council to address this significant community need. That evening at the Nehemiah Action, we also acknowledged the need to continue monitoring the certification of law enforcement officers in CIT until all are trained.

If May is the time to celebrate, when is the party?

We have two opportunities to celebrate in May. On May 5th at 11:00 am at Ascension Lutheran Church we have a unique opportunity to celebrate and lift up the need to establish an affordable housing trust fund. We will paint a mural, enjoy coffee and doughnuts, and hear updates about next steps for moving ahead with our trust fund request to County Council. All are welcome!

The second chance to celebrate in May is at our annual MORE Justice Celebration on Monday, May 23rd, at 6:30 pm, at Our Lady of the Hills Catholic Church. For Network Members, this is the last event that we have committed to attend in the justice year. We will celebrate the achievements of the year, receive updates, and share fun and fellowship with others from our MORE Justice sister congregations. There will be carpools and buses from Living Springs church if you'd like a ride. Again, all are welcome!



Millions of civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma they've endured. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits.

Living Springs is participating in a special offering of HOPE through our ELCA Ukraine/Eastern Europe Disaster Response. **Donations may be placed in the offering plate** (payable to Living Springs and marked "Ukraine") - or given electronically through our Givelify app.

Our prayers abound for the loss and devastation experienced in Ukraine and Eastern Europe.
