"Languages from the Spirit- Languages of Hope for a Hurting

JUNE "BOOK(S)" OF THE MONTH = Philemon, James (PASTOR TIME: Sun, June 19 @ 9:20am)

"In our own languages, we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power!" - Acts 2:11b

As I write this article, the celebration of Pentecost fills my heart, as we focus upon one of the 3 greatest festival days in our lives as followers of Jesus (Christmas—Easter—Pentecost). On the day of Pentecost nearly 2000 years, the promise of the ancient prophets (cf. Joel 2) and of Jesus himself (cf. John 14) was fulfilled, and the Holy Spirit truly transformed human beings into something they never imagined they could be. Ordinary, uneducated Galileans who were holed up in a room of fear were suddenly filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit—and found themselves boldly going into the streets of crowded Jerusalem, speaking the hope-filled Good News of God's forgiveness & love for all people through Jesus—in languages they had never spoken before, languages that could be understood by peoples of many foreign lands.

I think about all the tragic, heart-breaking events that fill the news today—all the ways we human beings still inflict pain upon one another through war and acts of senseless violence. I think about all the languages that are spoken over websites & social media & among walledoff groups of like-minded thought—languages of hatred towards people of differing colors, genders, orientations, nationalities & faiths; languages which perpetuate fear & bigotry; languages which feed the downward spiral of vulnerable persons struggling with mental health; languages which resist God's invitation for honest confession & forgiveness by trying to white-wash history and deny (or stay silent about) mistakes and evils from the past.

Martin Luther described sin as "being turned inward on oneself." It makes me think about the temptation for us all to turn inward with a sin-filled desire to get "others" to learn "my" language; i.e. wanting everyone else to speak in words that support "my" own way of

From the Desk of Pastor Carl

Sister and brothers,

As we look back at May, we are reminded of the importance of loving one another without conditions. For if we love with conditions, we do not embody the greatest love of all -- the unconditional love of God. I write this with a sad heart for where we are in the world today. We have one issue after another. We come out of a 20-year war to send troops to another one. We are wracked with uncontrollable gun violence across the country, the pandemic still rages on, and to top it off, we do not Love the way Jesus commanded before he ascended back to the Father. I wonder whether we know who or whose we are. Are we here doing it our way, with our deliberate acts that yield unintended consequences? These are real questions for the world we live in today. A world that God created and filled with his love and beauty, a world that struggles with its identity, and looking at the shooting in Buffalo, NY, is far from the last commandment Jesus gave in the Gospel of John 13: 34-35 which is to *Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another*." Yes, my heart is sad for all of the things I cannot control, the wars I cannot stop, the gun violence I cannot control, the pandemic I cannot contain, and the pain of this world that never seems to go away.

However, I still see God in all that sadness, loss, hurt, and pain. I see God in all we have done here at Living Springs for our community. I see God in the way we endlessly respond to our world's tragedies. I see how we pray and pour out our love for our community, city, state, country, and world. I see the love in the dozens of Mother's Day cards for our Rice Estate ministry and our bucket offerings for Lutheran Services Women's Recovery ministry. I see the love poured out to our Child Development Center as they continue to push through the stress of the pandemic to educate the little people that attend. I see the love poured out to our Senior, Junior, and Little Lutherans in the way we celebrate their spiritual journeys, especially on Youth Sunday. I see it in how we respond to one crisis after

I think how the Holy Spirit once came and completely CHANGED those original apostles from people wanting to hole up in their room speaking just to themselves—to people who were letting go of their fears and moving out into the mass of others to speak words of HOPE in whatever languages all those "other" people needed to hear! I think about how you and I, and all the baptized people of God, were given the gift of that same Holy Spirit when we were washed in God's grace and marked with the cross of Jesus. I think about the words God gave us for this year 2022, as God's people here at Living Springs: "being stretched by the cross," "continuing to break down barriers," "moving from surviving to thriving," "experiencing the life-changing power of God," walking together with each other & our community, the Spirit calls us..."

The Spirit calls us ... The Spirit calls us ... The Spirit calls us!

I think about all the languages the Spirit works in you, the people of Living Springs, to speak in ways people can hear—examples of diverse languages "spoken" in just recent weeks. I think about the "language" of 13 LS Pew Prayer Bears driven to Buffalo and delivered to the families of shooting victims there. I think about the "language" of your monthly meals, speaking God's hope to Children's Hospital families & Palmetto Place Youth. I think about the "language" of hope bags & signs being held by you for drivers in rush-hour traffic. I think about the "language" of Meals-on-Wheels delivered to the elderly, disabled, and impoverished. I think

about the beautiful "language" of free ice cream handed to a child or a free pizza being freshly cooked for a family, because that is the language by which the Holy Spirit mysteriously communicates to them that there is hope because they are valued by God's people.

I think about the "language" of hand-sewn Quillows & blessings for high school graduates. I think about the "language" of flower vases delivered to Rice Estate residents and other homebound (not just on the single weekend of Mother's Day, but continuing in the weeks of May afterward). I think about the "language" of backpack food bags for children and blessing bags for those experiencing homelessness. I think about the "language" of coins & dollars dropped in a Sunday bucket to give hope for women in recovery. I think about the "language" of car rides & furniture for an Afghani refugee family. I think about the "language" of providing facilities for girls & boys to hear hope through Boy Scout & Girl Scout troops—and for men & women to hear hope at a weekly Narcotics Anonymous recovery meeting. I think about the "language" of our Justice Ministry members, gathering in prayer vigils against community violence & showing up at County Council meetings to advocate for affordable housing. I think about the "language" of hope & joy shared by our youth on a Confirmation Outing or their Youth Sunday. I think about the "language" of music, handbells, anthems, hymns, instruments—and the "language" of little GIFT Zone children's worship kits. I think about the "language" of your bold response out in the world—whenever you say something against any word of hate you hear spoken or posted by others.

Oh, yes, come, Holy Spirit, come! Continue to transform each of us & empower us to boldly speak in every needed language of hope for a hurting world—so that all may hear God's HOPE! With so much thanksgiving for you, Paster Eric

The past week you helped Mike. He was a homeless man and recovering addict who had relapsed. Because you gave, we were able to help him. After meeting with him about his past and current problems, we asked him if he would be willing to go to an addition recovery program. While he was waiting for a spot to open, you fed him and gave him a few nights in a hotel. When he came back to CAB on Thursday, he looked like a completely new man. He thanks us for the food, bed, and hot shower and said, "I clean up good, don't I?" Our volunteers met with him as he interviewed with the recovery program, and the very next day, a volunteer drove him to start the long road to sobriety. Last Tuesday, the Ladies Bible Study gathered at our LS sanctuary HOPE cross for a blessing of 13 Prayer Bears - for families of 10 persons killed & 3 injured in the recent Buffalo shooting. The prayer bears were then driven to Our Savior Lutheran in East Buffalo, only ½ mile from the Tops supermarket shooting site & the home church of the mother of the security officer who was killed. The bears were received with tears & so much thanks!

Please continue to hold this Buffalo neighborhood in prayer, as well as the Taiwanese church shooting at Geneva Presbyterian in California. More than that, as God's people, we all must work to stop this murderous hatred of people due to race & nationality. Please speak up whenever you hear anyone spew thoughts of hatred toward others – as we cannot continue to infect young people (or anyone) with the disease of hateful human bigotry!

FAMILY PROMISE CAMP IMPACT



Notes from: Justice Ministry

Justice Ministry at Living Springs touches many different programs and activities. In the Sunday morning Adult Bible class we experienced this first-hand. The class has been reading the Easter season worship service lessons from Revelation. Revelation isn't easy to understand and talking about it together helped. We read descriptions of what the "city of God" might look like: the "gates will never be shut..." (Rev. 21:26) and all are welcome there; there will be "healing of the nations" (Rev. 22:2); and "there will be no more night" (Rev. 22: 5).

We also read a God story that sounded like it could have occurred at a Living Springs' MORE Justice event this year:

The elderly pastor had served his congregation and community faithfully for over 50 years. He had lived for as many years in the city and knew it well. He knew its history in the deep South – the divisions between black and white, the economic and social barriers that kept people apart. He had been instrumental in civil rights issues in the 1960's; and more recently, he had participated in dialogues on race relations and poverty. He knew the issues of the city. And so, he was asked to be the speaker at an interfaith gathering...

(The elderly pastor) began softly..."I know of a city...where there is no need for churches, because the whole city is a sanctuary, holy and righteous unto God. I know of a city...that doesn't separate people into black and white, rich or poor, north and south... Someday you and I will dwell in that city. But we're in this city now. And we are called as we live in this city to help people to know of that holy city and get a glimpse of (God's city) in what we say and do here in this, our city." (*Daily Faith Practices, Easter Six, 2013*)

How do you envision the holy city of God? No more darkness or violence? No more hunger or thirst? No more homelessness or despair? How might we help others in the Midlands know the promise of such a city of God?








Celebrate Your Baptism
