## Incarnation, Emmanuel, Jesus, Light – "Christmas in July!" (from Pastor Eric)

JULY "BOOK(S)" OF THE MONTH = Lamentations, Song of Solomon (PASTOR TIME: Sun, July 17 @ 9:20am)

"You will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."

- Luke 2:12b Having just returned from Campfirmation at Lutheridge, my heart is overwhelmed by the experience of our youth there—and how powerful it is to see them connect so deeply with God and grow in their faith in just one week away from the world! A focus of Campfirmation week is inviting these young disciples to ponder "who they are" and "who Jesus is" by making life-connections with the way we Christians measure the year—based on our 6 Christian seasons organized around the life & ministry of Jesus: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost (ACELEP).

For several years, I have been the pastor placed in charge of our "Christmas season" at camp. In many ways, I have come to find deep meaning in that experience every summer, because it allows our youth to reflect on the actual meaning of Christmas without any of the distractions & secular traditions that have developed around a commercialized societal celebration that occurs in December (or actually starts in the stores by the end of October!). There, at camp, there is simply a babe wrapped in bands of cloth lying in a manger, complete with the hope-filled message of the **Incarnation** (= God taking on flesh as one of us), the hope-filled wonder of **Emmanuel** (= "God with us"), the hope-filled truth of that child's name, **Jesus** (= "God saves"), and the hope-filled gift of God's **Light** shining amid all the world's darkness.

I am excited and thankful that our Living Springs Worship Team initiated the idea of celebrating a "Christmas in July" here in our congregation—because it will allow all of us to share in a campfirmation-like experience of pondering God's gift of Christmas without all

# From the Desk of Pastor Carl

Hello All...

June has been a busy month, and we have done a lot in a short amount of time. Let me start by saying God is Good all the time..... Let us pray...

Rejoice, rejoice, again I say rejoice. Lift up your countenance to the Lord, for He is good, and His mercies endure forever. My Lord and my God, you are tender and merciful. Your kindness is like a cold fresh breeze that awakens us from discouragement and despair as you tend to our souls, as you know our weakness and frailty. God, you love us despite our failures and long for us to be filled with Your joy. Lord, we confess that we get distracted by the cares of life and regularly lose sight of your goodness. We tend to get discouraged easily. We confess that we focus too much on ourselves and our problems instead of focusing our attention on You.

Lord, if there is any unconfessed sin in our lives or any barrier we have placed between us that is hindering the flow of joy in our lives, please reveal it to us so we can surrender it to you. Thank you for our lives and the capacity you have given us to experience Your joy. Thank you to our families. Thank you for our homes. Thank you to friends who care about us and who share our interests. Thank you for our work, and we pray that you would fill it with meaning and purpose and give us opportunities to honor you with it. --- Lord, I ask that you fill our hearts with joy. We know Your Spirit is full of joy. Help us to experience the joy of the Lord. Please help us to find our happiness and contentment in the Joy you send and the Grace you give. Let us be humble to our neighbors and help us to love one another. In Jesus' name, Amen.

June started with a bang for my family and me as we celebrated Sydnie's graduation from High School on June 1<sup>st</sup>. We want to thank our hearts for all your prayers and congratulations. Yes, that is a time for the Taylor Family and our congregation to have Joy.

We continued that joyful experience as we celebrated Pentecost on June 5<sup>th</sup> with a beautiful worship experience and ended up Celebrating with friends, family, and the community with our School's Out Summer's Here Event. We had a blast, and people came from all over to join the Celebration. We gave out free pizza and ice cream and had games *(Continued on page 4)* 

the usual December societal distractions. In addition, it may help us to break through some of our Western Euro-centric cultural barriers and recognize that for half of the entire planet (the Southern Hemisphere), Christmas is actually a summer celebration—and has been for centuries!

And there is one more potential blessing in pausing for a "Christmas in July" reflection .... At camp every year, on "Christmas Season" night, the campers celebrate their evening canteen time with a birthday cake for Jesus, and then spend time making "birthday gifts" for the Christ-child. We talk about how on our birthdays, we expect presents & gifts for ourselves, and even drop hints or make lists of "what I want" for myself. Then, in contrast, I share a list of "birthday" gifts Jesus would desire—a list that is actually recorded in the Bible, found right in Matthew 25:31-40: "I was hungry & you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me ..... Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me!" As a consequence of this list from Jesus, the campers spend their Christmas canteen making joy-crafts, which they deliver to "Jesus" when they visit elderly nursing home residents at the nearby Lutheran Home later in the week.

It is powerful that this very same Scripture passage is the focus of our special 3-part Tuesday Bible Study focusing on "Loving Your Neighbor" and the situation in Ukraine (see page 9), here in the month we are celebrating "Christmas in July." It is also powerful that we have so many opportunities to share our own "birthday gifts" with Jesus this month:

- the Dove Tree with items for children from Family Promise transitional homeless ministry (thru July 10 & 17);
- the many people we will serve during our annual Graceworks Midlands Lutheran Servant Days (July 11-14);
- the special Refugee Youth Festival we will help sponsor as part of Graceworks (July 13);
- the meal for 175 children & adults we are serving at Family Promise Camp Impact (July 20);
- the summer Red Cross Blood Drive at Living Springs (July 27);
- the always amazing Sr. Youth Mission Trip—surprise destination! (July 24-28);
- ongoing summer bucket offering for Harvest Hope & Christian Assistance Bridge food pantries;
- ongoing love offerings for Ukraine-Lutheran Disaster Response & our Lutheran Services Afghan Refugee family;
- ongoing hope ministries of Meals on Wheels (Mon-Tue), Palmetto Place House Youth Meal (July 28), Children's Hospital Meal (July 21), Lutheran Campus Ministry worship (July 17), Cristo Rey Children's Worship (July 3 & Aug. 7).

We shared so much joy in June with the Pentecost Community Festival, our New Member Welcome Blessing, Spark mini-VBS, SC Lutheran Synod Assembly & LCY/WELCA Conventions; Campfirmation @ Lutheridge, and more (see <u>Pastor Carl's</u> <u>article</u>). Here in July, we will find much joy with **special "Christmas" worship on July 17** and the fellowship gathering afterward—but more than that, I pray we will find much joy in celebrating "Christmas" with all the gifts to be shared with Jesus via ministries of hope with the "least of these among us." May the true joy of Christmas fill our hearts not just in December (or July), but every day of the year, as we celebrate the message of Incarnation, the truth of Emmanuel, the hope of Jesus, and the Light of God's grace & love still shining in this world! # Notes from: Living Springs Child Development Center

#### From Tammy Mancuso, Director

Blessings for difficult times,

Blessings to all that have felt the heaviness of the past month. From the tragedy in Uvalde, the political upset, the war on gun violence, continuing COVID occurrences, and the ongoing struggles in Ukraine. What do we do in a time of such turmoil? We join together, we find our people, we create and immerse ourselves in connectedness, we welcome others to join us so that no one feels alone. It is in this connectedness that we find Hope, and we are reminded that Hope is indeed alive!

We at the CDC are blessed to capture these moments of Hope among our school family, as we embrace our connectedness.

A staff member's car breaks down in the parking lot and is unsure of how to get to work the next day. Hope is alive as another staff member says "I can give you a ride if you need it, just call me."

A child tells their parent they were hurt on the playground by another child, it makes way for us to have discussions about kindness, gentleness, and caring for one another as a school family. Hope is alive as those children hug, and a child says "I'm sorry I hurt you."

Katie, our resident yard watcher, sits at the edge of the lawn and greets us with a morning meow, patiently waiting for her breakfast. Hope is alive as she is learning to trust her human family.

New families arrive, turning in paperwork, handing over lunch boxes and blankets, and watching as their child walks down the hall for the first time. Hope is alive as they are able to confidently head into their day without worry, knowing their child will be wrapped in the caring arms of our educators.

Families, children, staff, and the community walk down our ramp they are greeted with our progress pride flag. Hope is alive knowing that all are loved, included, and accepted without judgment.

Our children head to chapel excited to greet the Pastor, hear the story and sing the songs. Hope is alive as they know that they are loved, seen, cherished, and accepted as the beautiful children of God they are.

May you all continue to find Hope in the life around you.



At the Nehemiah Action in April, MORE Justice asked for \$2M for an Affordable Housing Trust Fund. We didn't get the "yes" we were asking for that night, but in June, County Council awarded \$4M for Affordable Housing, noting that while not establishing a trust fund, this doubled the \$ amount MORE Justice had been seeking. They named MORE Justice when announcing the Affordable Housing decision at Council meeting! Elected officials are listening!

## **Special LS Offering for Ukraine**

Millions of civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and such neighboring countries as Poland, Moldova, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many of these Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care for people also includes pastoral and

psychological support to address the trauma they've endured. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits.

Living Springs is participating in a special offering of HOPE through our ELCA Ukraine/Eastern Europe Disaster Response. **Donation may be placed in the offering plate** (payable to Living Springs and marked Ukraine) - or given electronically through our Givelify app.

Our prayers abound for the loss and devastation experienced in Ukraine and Eastern Europe.




