SEE MORE CLEARLY

See more clearly! See more clearly! See more clearly! Like a repetitive prayer, those words continually beat in my heart and mind for 5 days during our **July Mystery Mission trip** with our LS Youth. You would be so proud of these inspiring young disciples, who endured bus challenges, slept on church floors, walked thousands of steps in the heat, shuttled on public transportation, began & ended each day with worship, shared powerful faith conversations—all on 5-6 hours sleep per night, getting up before 7 each morning. They delivered your donated canned goods to 2nd Harvest Food Bank, supported by our first host church, St. James Lutheran in Fayetteville, NC. They moved on to Redeemer Lutheran in McLean, VA and spent an entire night selecting & purchasing 100's of items from funds they had raised—to pack blessing bags to distribute themselves to dozens of people experiencing homelessness. They toured the Capitol building with reverence & learned about N Street Village ministry (serving 100's of women at Luther Place Lutheran Church, only blocks from the White House). They engaged in deep reflection on what they saw at the Holocaust Museum, the African-American Museum, the Museum of American History. They

witnessed the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier; prayed for soldiers whose names they found etched on the Vietnam & Korean War Memorials; held candles of hope standing on the spot where Dr. King

spoke about a dream; and shared holy communion their last night at the Lincoln Memorial. Their Mission theme was "See More Clearly" – and every day they engaged Scripture to help them see themselves, others, and the world more clearly through the eyes of Jesus. But the Youth Mission Trip was not the only time the Spirit led us to "see more clearly" this past month. There were **4 days of Graceworks** in the middle of the month, where 13 LS Youth & Adult Volunteers joined with others from Midlands Lutheran congregations to tirelessly devote themselves to serving others in need here in our community. There was the special Wednesday afternoon fun & fellowship event we helped sponsor for **dozens of refugee children**, whose families are finding a new home here in the US through the amazing ministry of Lutheran Services.



We SEE God's hope more clearly in BEING that hope for others!

There was the presentation by **Family Promise** homeless ministry at our LS July Summer Hope Sunday—which allowed us to "see more clearly" through their ministry. There was the amazing night of providing supper at **Camp Impact for 80+ homeless children & youth** who are part of various homeless ministries here in the Midlands—as well as delivering countless **Dove Tree items** for Camp Impact children, that were given at our "Christmas in July" tree. Talk about "seeing more clearly" when you are brought to tears by joy in the voice of a homeless youth!

There was the moving experience of LS visitors participating in Sunday evening worship at the **Gamecock Lutheran Campus Ministry** center, with an offering of \$5200 presented from the people of Living Springs, because of your generous hearts and commitment to our annual Lenten Fish Fry in the spring. There was the unbridled joy of dozens of children learning about Jesus with LS volunteers at the monthly **Cristo Rey Mission Children's Ministry**. There was the joy of celebrating "**Christmas in July**" without all the distractions of a co-opted societal holiday, al-

lowing us to see more clearly the true Christmas blessing of Emmanuel, the Incarnation, and Jesus. There were many ongoing meetings with our **MORE Justice Ministry** to continue work for Affordable Housing and reducing Community Gun Violence.

We move into August inspired by all the ways God has worked to permit us to "see hope more clearly" in these ways—and we look forward to our big **Rally Day Faith Formation Kickoff Celebration on Aug. 21**! In addition, this month, we have the **Blessing of School Bags (& College Student Blessing) on Aug. 14**—as well as a visit from Palmetto Place Youth & Children's Services for our Summer Hope Sunday #3. Also, we encourage everyone to head out to Kroger stores on Killian & Two Notch for our big annual **LS Backpack Food Ministry Stuff-a-Bus on Aug. 20**.

In today's world, we can be inundated with negative images & messages of despair. Yet, the truth is that God continues to work in powerful ways in this world which God still so loves, to bring God's sure & certain Hope, even in the midst of every suffering (cf. the Cross and Empty Tomb). The hope of God is always there; we just need to see it more clearly! One way we see God's hope more clearly is through active participation in Christ's community of faith: taking advantage of opportunities to join with others in studying the Word, engaging in daily devotions, worshipping together on a regular basis, being reminded of identity as baptized & forgiven Children of God, being nurtured weekly with Christ himself through Holy Communion, engaging in ministries of service & discipleship that allow us to see hope by being hope for others. I look forward to being with you on Rally Day on the 21st, as together we renew our journey of "seeing hope more clearly" in the weeks and months ahead! God in Summer. What have you discovered about God this summer? Have you heard something new? Were you in a place – geographically or emotionally or physically – where you realized something about the God of all time for the very first time? How will this new understanding shape you as summer ends?

This summer gave me a chance to walk a labyrinth in the woods, to sit by a campfire, to swim in a pond. This summer gave me the time to travel to the funeral of a centenarian, holding the hands of her one- and three-year old great-grandchildren, recalling God's hand ever-present across her great span of years.

One late night this summer a friend sang, "Humble King," and it was my summer Justice moment. The lyrics show why:

You are the God of the broken
The friend of the weak
You wash the feet of the weary
Embrace the ones in need

I want to be like You, Jesus
To have this heart in me
You are the God of the humble
You are the humble King.

In late August you will hear more about our Justice ministry plans for the year. We will start with house meetings as always, listening to one another about our concerns for our community. We will lift this in prayer, along with hundreds of other diverse people of faith here in Columbia, to identify the community problems that our Humble King is calling us to address this year.

At whatever stage you are in life – Do you need less stress in your life over finances? Do you want a healthier relationship with money?

That means asking basic questions. What is money? What is it for? How can I live in peace and wholeness I desire for the world around me?

Our Lutheran church's (ELCA) faith & life ministries have developed a wonderful tool for individuals or families, to help grow in your personal relationship with money and develop practices to help alleviate financial stress. Something especially needed in these times! We have a unique opportunity that will allow you to benefit from this course at a discounted cost.

Join with others for this special **6 Weeks of Money** course, developed by expert Tim Schuster:

- Week 1 **Values** (choose your values or someone else will choose them for you)
- Week 2 **Scarcity** (fight with scarcity with gratitude and simplicity)
- Week 3 **Agility** (for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also)
- Week 4 **Integrity** (shortcuts never are)
- Week 5 **Options** (create future options by eliminating debt or investing)

This 6-week course will be offered, starting the week **after Labor Day**. You complete a major portion of each week's session in advance at your convenience online – and then join with others weekly (virtually or in-person) for important follow-up. Discounted cost per household is **\$35** (**normally \$80**), with scholarship support via Living Springs Lifelong Discipleship Team (in partnership with SC Synod Stewardship and our ELCA Lutheran Church).

This course is for every generation, all incomes & backgrounds. Everyone can grow in their relationship with money. It is open to Living Springs congregation & family members, LS Child Development Center families, LS Scouting families - as well as neighbors and friends.
