- Cristo Rey youth receiving support for badly-needed school supplies through our LS Mission Partnership and Scholarship funds!



Hello and blessings to all,

We recently had an "Off to School Blessing" for our 5 year-olds that are headed to kindergarten. What an exciting time for families!

As we move from Summer into the traditional school year we welcome the newness with HOPE and clarity.

Recently the CDC and church staff along with the pastors were able to come together for an in-service. These days are vital to our ministry as it provides time for reflection, conversation, insight and serves as a reminder of who we are as a school family and what it means to be a ministry of LSLC.

As we spoke about HOPE, we shared moments of who we are as individuals and as disciples, teachers, leaders, and friends. How is it that we can be intentional about where we see and share HOPE more clearly? How is it that we can shift our focus to seeing God more clearly through the actions of our daily lives, thus having an impact on the children and families we serve and knowing that there is a ripple effect to all that we do and say?

There is such an importance in seeing ourselves, one another, creation, and the world more clearly and through the lens of God's Love and Hope. STUFF A BUS/BACKPACKS

THANK YOU to all that helped at our stuff a bus event - it amazes me every year the outpouring of love in people donating to our backpack program. There were two buses filled with products for our backpack program and also items that do not apply to backpack items (large boxes or containers of food) which were delivered to the Christian Assistance Bridge in Blythewood and paper products that were delivered to Transitions and Palmetto Place. The shelves are full and we are ready to start packing. In addition to food items, we also collected \$1,059 which will help supplement as we run low on items.

The 2nd and 4th Sundays are designated backpack packing days - after the 8:15 worship and before and after the 10:30 worship. Stop in and experience what the kiddos receive for food nourishment on the weekend. First backpack Sunday is Sept. 11.

A couple of God stories:

When we delivered to CAB in Blythewood, they were thrilled to receive the items as they have had a 25% increase in client applications. They weighed the items at 326 lbs.

At the Kroger on Killian Rd., we had a little lull in traffic and I was creating conversation with one of the students that volunteered to pass out flyers. She was very shy and it was a little bit of an effort to get her to respond, but after a while she did communicate what she wanted to pursue as a career and then out of the blue, she commented that her family does not attend church. I was sort of surprised at the comment and told her she is more than welcome to attend Living Springs at our 8:15 or 10:30 services. It was a few minutes that it looked like she was thinking and then came out with "I think I will come to your church next week." I don't know if she will or not and that is not important, but I thought it was neat that she felt comfortable enough in the feeling that she would be welcomed.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Everyone at Living Springs is invited to a Justice Ministry house meeting this month as we begin our sixth year together in this ministry. At the house meetings we will share our stories of individual and community problems, praying to discern where God is calling us this year. Living Springs is one of 26 congregations in the Midlands participating in MORE Justice, a faith-based organization seeking together to better "love our neighbors." More than 500 people across all of our congregations will also be participating in September in similar house meetings. On October 17th all of our congregations then will gather and vote to determine what our community focus for Justice Ministry will be this year.

In past years MORE Justice has addressed a variety of community problems, including mental health concerns, affordable housing, and neighborhood gun violence. Together we have made our community a better place: law enforcement officers have received Crisis Intervention Training to better protect themselves and those with mental illness; Richland County Council committed \$4M toward affordable housing (double the initial proposal, noting MORE Justice's involvement); the Columbia Mayor committed to an outside study of gun violence in our community. As Nehemiah's story in the scripture reminds us, one individual may not be able to do much to solve a significant community problem but together we can make a big difference.

MORE Justice Gun Violence Update 2022

Because we had nearly 700 people at our Nehemiah Action this year, Columbia Mayor Daniel Rickenmann committed to exploring and choosing an organization to complete a problem analysis so that we can get to the root of this gun violence problem.

On August 30th of this year, seven MORE Justice members attended a Columbia City Council Work Session where the Mayor proposed the "Mayor's Office for Gun Violence Prevention." This proposal includes much of what we have been pushing for since we chose to prioritize the problem of gun violence in 2019: collaboration between community stakeholders, paid staff members, and a focus on being proactive to get to the root of this problem. This is a good step that has been fueled by building our people power and it is our people power that can ensure that an evidence-based plan is implemented so that yearly shootings go from over 100 to 0.

This course is for every generation, all incomes & backgrounds. Everyone can grow in their relationship with money. It is open to Living Springs congregation & family members, LS Child Development Center families, LS Scouting families - as well as neighbors and friends.




