Each day, I continue to walk out the doors and see those large Hope Lens staring out into the world. In my head (and heart), I hear some of the words we read each Sunday prior to worship, from our H.O.P.E. theme: "walking together in faith with each other & our community, the Spirit calls us...." I think about our Faith Formation theme, "See HOPE More Clearly" - and I ponder all the ways in just the past few weeks, the Spirit has been at work to help us see God's hope more clearly as we have indeed walked in faith with each other & our community!

I have seen Hope more clearly in the faces of those 110 teenagers we feed with food and God's word every week in our LS pre-game football ministry. I have seen Hope more clearly in the joy of our children with the G.I.F.T. worship experiences we now share each week, with their cross procession, joyful noise instruments, and active faith listening for Scripture/sermon words. I have seen Hope more clearly in the powerful, heart-moving faith stories shared at our recent Child Development Ministry Sunday. I have seen Hope in the gentleman living with all his possessions on a bicycle, who tracked me



down in my car to say thank-you for a God's Work, Our Hands meat loaf meal—and ask me if there was any more meals I could take to two friends who also lived on the street. I have seen Hope in the smiles and waves of Rush Hour traffic drivers receiving a little snack bag and a caring message of love. I have seen Hope in Pastor Jesse and visiting campus ministry students so joyfully worshipping with us on Campus Ministry Sunday. 

(That is one Veteran that takes their life every 80 minutes.) The term "witting" means to be cognizant, deliberate, and aware to the facts of a situation. #### Notes from: Justice Ministry

Many of us at Living Springs have attended House Meetings this month, enjoying the chance to be together in person again. We've shared fellowship and learned more about each other. We've talked about what keeps us awake at night, what justice problems make us angry in the community. We've heard about inadequate care for seniors, people without secure housing or food, gun violence that affects our schoolchildren, and on and on.

We heard a story on Lutheran Men's Sunday (September 25) about what keeps one of our younger LS members awake at night. He's 6 years old and already understands God's call in Micah 6:8: "What does the Lord require of you? To do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God." This child asked his grandfather some very good questions and found out about the history of segregation and educational injustice for brown and black children. He was angry: "It's not right! What did you do about it?" he asked his grandfather. Justice ministry gives us all a chance to "do something about it." How important is it to "do something about it"? God commands us to do something about it. Our children and grandchildren are holding us accountable to do something about it. What is the church doing about it? The relevance and power of God's love shine through in our justice work together.

If you haven't yet attended a house meeting, there are more opportunities to participate. Please join in whether you are able to commit to being a Justice Network Member or not. House meetings are an important chance to hear where God is calling us in our community. House meetings in October:

Additional information: Living Springs is one of 26 congregations in the Midlands participating in MORE Justice, a diverse faith-based organization seeking together to better "love our neighbors." More than 500 people across all of our congregations are participating in house meetings. On October 17th all of us will gather and vote to determine what our community focus for Justice Ministry will be this year. In past years MORE Justice has addressed a variety of community problems, and together we have made our community a better place: law enforcement officers have received Crisis Intervention Training to better protect themselves and those with mental illness; Richland County Council committed \$4M toward affordable housing (double the initial proposal, noting MORE Justice's involvement); the Columbia Mayor committed to an outside study of gun violence in our community.




