Giddy with gratitude? This week, I came across this quote—and it has not left my mind. How wonderful it would be to live life, so that when the journey on earth is complete, we were described with such a simple phrase, "Oh, yes, that's someone who was *giddy with gratitude!*" Giddy with gratitude...for all the gifts God has given us!

Over the years, I have lamented the way that in our society, the month of November and its meanings seem to be lost—as we move straight from Halloween decorations of October to holiday decorations & store displays pointing toward December. And yet, November contains many meaningful moments set aside to remind us of "all the gifts God has given us" - so that perhaps we CAN live more fully as people "giddy with gratitude."

On **All Saints Sunday (Nov. 6)**, we are reminded of all those people of faith in our lives who have born witness to God's love & grace and now rest in the eternal arms of our Lord. Hey Y'ALL ...

It has been another busy month. October presented us with many opportunities to be present in our communities. Our Little Lutherans, 5th grade and below, continue to gather in the G.I.F.T. "Witting" means to be cognizant, deliberate, and aware of the facts of a situation. Each year, more than a dozen faith communities and organizations join in hosting a Witting Tree ceremony at their site. Living Springs will be hanging 22 sets of dog tags on the big tree by the entrance driveway in a public awareness of 22 veterans who take their lives each day with suicide (that is one veteran who takes their life each 80 minutes.) Notes from: Justice Ministry

Fall is an exciting time for Justice Ministry! On October 17th there were 31 Living Springs Network Members at the MORE Justice Community Problems Assembly at Shandon Presbyterian Church. We were grateful to have over 240 people there that night, representing our 27 sister congregations! We listened, prayed, reflected, and voted on a new community problem area to address this year: Food Insecurity. We also will continue our ongoing work with Affordable Housing and Gun Violence.

Food Insecurity is a problem for many of our neighbors, especially those living in parts of Columbia where grocery stories have been closed and many residents do not have their own transportation to go shopping miles away. Adding an Uber or taxi fare to weekly grocery trips only increases the cost for the family. As a result, lower income residents end up doing their food shopping at the near-by dollar stores and convenience stores. Choice is limited, fresh food is a rarity, and grocery bills are higher than they need to be. The research process begins this month as we look more closely at what is happening in the Midlands with Food Insecurity and begin to identify evidence-based solutions to the problem.

In the coming weeks there are many opportunities to live out God's command to "do Justice" (Micah 6:8).
