LS Disciple Gatherings! Mid-Feb through March specific times TBA

Be on the lookout for an invitation from a gathering host, so you can join with a small group of fellow disciples for an important time of faith reflection & dialogue! In the upcoming weeks, our LS leadership will be prayerfully pondering and refining the initial ideas which sprouted during our planning retreat—and then, on the **1st Sunday in Lent, February 26**, we look forward to a **congregational kickoff** for our 2023 Ministry Focus under that wonderful theme of "Growing Hope!" In the surrounding weeks (mid-Feb through end of March), all of us will also be invited to gather in **small disciple groups** to reflect on our own journey of being part of God's growing hope in our lives—and in the world!

One powerful seed of growing hope uplifted during the retreat was our LS Emotional-Mental Wellness initiative. We had a tremendous congregational gathering in December, at which results were shared from the 80+ persons who responded to the initial survey. The Wellness Task Force has met multiple times since December, with spe-

cific updates shared at the January leadership retreat. We are now engaging in next steps with the following 6 initiatives:

1) **Monthly Emotional-Mental Wellness moments** to be shared during worship, to help continue breaking down barriers of silence and societal stigma associated with this important aspect of our wholistic beings who are all God's children!

2) Sponsoring special **Emotional-Mental Wellness Panels/Workshops** for the congregation (including our Child Development Center) and larger community at least 4-6 times throughout the year, with invited "experts" available to share resources, strategies, and support in various areas.

3) Assembling & regularly publicizing a **list of Emotional-Mental Wellness Resources & Counseling Services**, to address multiple issues faced by individuals, couples, or families in various subject areas.

4) Formation of new (or connection to already existing) **Emotional-Mental Wellness Support Groups** in a variety of areas. See the box....

5) Explore re-starting our **LS Stephen Ministry**, which had once been operative years ago (if interested, please contact Pastor Eric).

6) Establishing a new **Emotional-Mental Wellness Fund**, that can help cover the expense for expert resources, plus assist individuals, couples, or families with the growing cost for counseling & other needed Emotional-Mental Wellness professional help. The specific parameters & guidelines are still being worked out for this new Fund, but thanks to the generosity of LS members, we **already have \$14,000 donated as seed money** for this important endeavor! Thanks be to God!

Greetings and Happy 2023!

It's hard to believe that we are already welcoming a new year! We look forward to it being filled with conversation, stories, and examples of the connections of God's HOPE as it works in our lives and those around us. We are anxious and excited to see what the coming months will bring! How we as a CDC ministry will be held and kept under the umbrella of HOPE, or how we may hold that umbrella for others.

Our focus for the coming year in the CDC is sharing stories of HOPE. We want our children, families, and staff to know the importance of sharing where, how, and when we see God at work in our lives, the lives of our loved ones, and in the lives of our community. Something as simple as a smile or a card may leave an imprint of HOPE on someone when they thought there was none.

One story we want to share from this month is that our three and four-year-old students took an exciting field trip. They had the opportunity to visit a veteran at his home for his 100th birthday! The children, families, and staff created a brightly decorated banner with signatures and pictures that they hand-delivered along with 100 handmade birthday cards as they sang him, "Happy Birthday!" The morning of the field trip I received an email from a parent of one of the children that would be attending that morning:

"Good morning! I believe y'all are going to see _____ today. I may have that wrong but if it is.... Logan uses this stool every day to reach our sinks and it's made by him! It was mine and Lindsey's when we were younger. My mom actually taught with his wife at Hammond many years ago. Pretty cool I think!! I didn't think to take a picture until this morning. 





Notes from: Justice Ministry

Spring is "action season" for the Living Springs Justice Ministry. We prepare for the upcoming Nehemiah Action on March 27 by inviting others to join us as we ask our public officials for changes to make Columbia a more just and peaceful place for everyone. This Spring we are asking for Justice for our neighbors with Food Insecurity, Affordable Housing, Crime and Gun Violence, and Mental Health Care.

Asking for Justice has been going on a long time. The Parable of the Persistent Widow in Luke 18:1-8 provides a wonderful model for Living Springs this Spring in "action season".

The story opens with Jesus telling his disciples a parable "to show them that they should always pray and not give up." In a "certain town" there was a judge who didn't fear God nor care for what the people thought. And there was a widow who was being treated unjustly by "an adversary." That's what we know. The story goes on to say that the widow goes repeatedly to the judge, asking for justice, but he continually refuses to help her. Finally the judge says to himself that even though he doesn't care what God wants and he doesn't care what other people think, he is tired of being bothered by this widow. He says, "I will see that she gets justice" so that she will quit bothering him. When Jesus finishes the story he says to the disciples, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones who cry out to him day and night? Will God keep putting them off? I tell you; he will see that they get justice, and guickly."

Springtime is "action season" for the Living Springs Justice Ministry and "action" begins with prayer, persistent prayer for justice for our neighbors.

- We pray for compassion and care for those in Columbia suffering from the effects of mental illness.
- We pray for establishment of an affordable housing trust fund so that our city joins other communities in South Carolina that have a sustainable plan to provide for those needing homes.
- We pray for the newly established City of Columbia Office of Violent Crime Prevention to bring peace to our neighborhoods.
- We pray for action to reduce food insecurity across our community.
- We pray with confidence in God's promise to "bring about justice for his chosen ones who cry out to him day and night."

Like the widow, we need to be persistent in prayer. We need to pray with our lips and also pray through our actions as the widow did. We need to be persistent in our invitations to others to come to the Nehemiah Action to ask our community leaders for the changes that our neighbors need. We need to be persistent and believe God's promise to bring justice.



LS Ministry with Cristo Rey! Sunday, February 5 @ 4:15pm

We provide a Bible lesson, crafts, singing, and snacks for the children of our Mission Partner, Cristo Rey, in West Columbia. The Wonder of Worship

I've been privileged to help with the music at Living Springs for the last year or so. Some of you have been Lutheran Christians for a long time—maybe since you were born! It's been a newer journey for me to understand our liturgical style of worship which has: (1) many parts (the capitalized, bold headings in the bulletin), (2) music interspersed throughout those parts, and (3) lots of interaction and movement for the pastors, worship assistants, and congregants alike. It takes a while to see the meaning of these elements, but as you do, you see more clearly that worship services are meant to be not-like-anything-else times of interaction between us and our great God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.



I thought I'd share what I've been learning in the *Journal*. If you're newer to Living Springs, maybe my pondering will help in your own learning curve. If you're an old-timer (of any age!), maybe it'll be encouraging to see things through a newcomer's eyes. Send any thoughts or questions to shirl@livingsprings.org. This month and next the topic is:

What is Worship? (Part 1)

We worship as we gather as God's people, remember our Baptism and receive forgiveness, sing hymns to praise God, hear the Word read and proclaimed in a sermon, confess our faith & pray together, and receive the grace of Holy Communion before being sent out to represent Christ in the world. The core meaning of the word worship is to bow down, to prostrate, honor, reverence, show adoration, homage to God. True worship involves both actions and attitudes of the heart.

There are many descriptive definitions of worship, but I found one I really like: Worship is a collaborative engagement across cultures and generations in which God and the people of God 'listen' to each other and are formed in love around each other for the sake of the world. It is an imaginative, risky, and life-giving venture. -- Robert Alan Rimbo¹

Wow! So much could be said, but just three thoughts. First, I love the terms **collaborative engagement** and **listen to each other**. Worship services are unlike plays or concerts where certain people perform and an audience reacts. For us, the pastors, worship assistants, readers, musicians, and each and every person present (across cultures and generations!) collaborate together to engage with ... with God! God, the creator and sustainer of the universe! And wonder of wonders, God collaborates and engages with us! We (the people of God) and God listen to each other! Amazing! Our liturgical form of worship models this with many back-and-forths: we listen, we speak, we sing, we pray, we kneel, we sit, we stand. I could go on . . .

Second, that the people of God and God are formed in love around each other for the sake of the world is a powerful reminder of what our pastors often tell us, that gathering together is essential, but always tied to our call to take the strength, joy, and purpose nurtured in church with us as we disperse out of church as lights for Christ.

It [worship] is an imaginative, risky, life-giving venture. So cool! Each descriptor warrants discussion. A lot of imagination and creativity goes into everything we do at Living Springs, our services, ministries, outreach, etc. It makes our life together very vibrant. There's no question that worship—both corporate and individual and/or family worship—is life-giving, for that's when we pay the closest attention to God through the Holy Spirit. But risky? How is worship risky? I'll leave that for you to ponder!
