

It has been such a powerful Lenten journey we have shared the past weeks, focusing on "God's growing hope." In these 40 holy days, I pray you have sensed the **growing hope of God being planted in the soil of your heart**—especially in worship & times of Lenten devotions in your home, gathered around those **little pots of hope**. Each week, we have added a word to those pots: grace—hope—love—joy. And each Sunday, we have added an additional **tree of hope** in the sanctuary.

I look at the 4 growing trees of hope in the sanctuary, and behind them, I see a **5th tree**! It is the cross, a wooden "tree" on which Jesus, God's Son, was nailed in the ultimate gift of hope ever given for the world! I stare my own little devotional pot—and there protruding up from the soil is another wooden cross. That little cross, along with that 5th "tree" in the sanctuary, remind me of the **source of the growing**

I have some Good News for you.....


As I write this, we are already in the last week of the 2023 Lenten Journey, and forward we go to **Palm Sunday and into Holy week, which ends on the Cross** --- only to begin with the **Resurrection of Jesus Christ.** Yes, time passes quickly as we look back 2000+ years ago ----- to our present times ----- and where we want to be on our faith life journey.



Our Lenten journey is intended to provide us time to slow down, reflect on our faith life, and fully grasp what it means to be a follower of Christ. Our youth did just that in the month of March. We continued meeting on Wednesdays after Holden Evening prayers sharing highs, lows, and whatever was on their minds over a meal at church or a local eatery.

Our confirmands went on a confirmation retreat to Lutheridge, and it was exciting to see our youth and others participate and come together to create worship. **YES! Created** worship....it was beautiful. They created a confessional song out of the imagination of youthfulness, and let me not forget that they created a different version of the Lord's Prayer too. They talked about the Creed, The Commandments, and Holy Baptism. They asked questions and shared their thoughts and opinions about the church, where it is in their lives, and where and what they would like to see in the church. Hearing from the youth and dreaming with them was an eye-opening and humbling experience.

We finished our Lenten Wednesday night drama with a skit from the youth about the pressures of teenage bullying, suicide, and the power of Christ. It was an amazing experience to be a part of and witness. If you want to see it live,

We remember our Lord's Last Supper, and how Jesus washed his disciples' feet in the upper room. 6:45pm Worship concludes with the poignant and powerful Stripping of the Altar. For those who wish the Rite of Foot-Washing is offered before & after 6:45 worship. 6:45pm available online.

Good Friday, April 7 - Tenebrae "Words from the Cross" Service, 6:45pm Walking of the Cross, 9am & 3pm

With increasing darkness in the Tenebrae Service, we recall Jesus' 7 sayings spoken from the cross. Earlier in the day, at 9am and 3pm, we join with Christians across the world in the devotional practice of "walking the cross." Wherever we are this day, we pause in special reverence at 3:00 - the hour Jesus breathed his last. 645pm available online.

Holy Saturday, April 8- Easter Vigil, 7:30pm

We gather by a fire and enter the sanctuary to remember the waiting of that night when our Lord lay in the tomb. We hear foundational stories of Scripture, affirm our identity as God's baptized children, and welcome Easter joy!



Good Friday "Walking of the Cross" April 7 – 9am & 3pm

Over the centuries, Christians have joined in many devotional experiences to embrace the deep meaning of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross. One such practice is the "Walking of the Cross," where Christians publicly carry a large wooden cross on Good Friday. This year, Living Springs will share this experience with our neighbors, using the wooden cross from the front lawn.

At 9am (hour Jesus was nailed to the cross), we will gather with our Wooden Cross in front of Harmony (2300 Clemson Rd.) for a time of prayer with the residents there. Then, we will process safely on the sidewalk, carrying the cross ½ mile back to LS for prayer here. You can take turns with partners carrying the cross – or you can just walk along behind the cross. We will pause at various points for prayer & Scripture. At 3pm (hour Jesus died), we will do anoth-

er Walking of the Cross, beginning at WaterCrest (1951 Clemson Rd), with 0.3 mile

on the sidewalk back to LS.

You can participate in one or both of the walks. There is a sign-up sheet to help with planning. Each walk should take less than 1 hour. Walkers will carpool/bus to the starting site (just come to LS at either 8:45 or 2:45). Whether or not you can be part of a walk, please pause for prayer at 9am and 3pm on Good Friday, wherever you may be. Good Friday Tenebrae Worship will be held at church at 6:45pm.



Lenten 40X40 H.O.P.E. Collection

During Lent, we put God's love in action by making Personal Care Kits for neighbors in the poorest parts of the world. As always, our goal for Lent is 40 X 40 = 1600 total items. Today, the individual items will be assembled into full kits.

Personal Care Kits include:

- •Two bars 4-5 oz. soap (in original wrapping)
- •One lightweight bath towel 20x40 to 52x27 (dark color recommended)
- •One adult toothbrush (in original packaging)
- One sturdy comb
- One nail clipper (metal)



If you cannot stay today for the Family Event to help assemble the kits and would like to bring a complete Personal Care Kit, please drop it off during the week.

To assemble your kit ... Fold towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.

As we move into the Sneezy Spring Season we have much to celebrate. We have vast opportunities to see HOPE growing in the world around us. As we take notice of the change in season we are reminded, through God's creation, that HOPE GROWS even in the moments that seem still.

HOPE continues to GROW in our CDC ministry with the many ways we find to share and receive with one another.

The children helped hope GROW as they created about 200 Easter cards for our Senior Friends at Rice Estates and other Hope Outreach Ministries.

The CDC staff felt hope GROW as they enjoyed complimentary meals from the Lenten Fish Fry.

Our CDC children watched hope GROW as they assisted in packing items for the backpack and Rush Hour ministries.

The CDC honored the legacy of how Mr. Fred Rogers planted seeds of hope to GROW kindness on "Won't you be my neighbor day" by wearing sweaters or red shirts.

Mr. Hubbard the veteran that our children went to sing "Happy Birthday" to on his 100th birthday gave our children reminders of how hope can GROW by giving each child and staff member one of his handmade crosses.

Our CDC classes are helping to GROW hope through our HEIFER International project, as each class is raising funds for a different animal or item. The class goals are to raise enough for 2 sets of Honeybees, 2 sets of chicks, 1 pig, 1 sheep, and 1 set of garden seeds. Please feel free to donate funds if you feel moved to do so.

There is much to be thankful for as we move into the next season. The weather begins to warm, the insects begin to buzz, and the animals begin to move about with more hurried activity. Even in the quietness of the soil that looks undisturbed, there is creation, there is movement, and there is newness. We are thankful for the reminder of spring; that after the cold and dark moments, life will again appear, with newness, joy, and warmth. I continue to be grateful for the daily reminder and opportunities to see, feel, hear, and know the HOPE that GROWS from the work that God does through the ministry of Living Springs.

LENTEN FISH FRY FOR CAMPUS MINISTRY

Pastor Jesse is creating a spiritual home away from home in welcoming all students regardless of denomination, gender, religious beliefs or non-beliefs! We have a couple of Living Springs college students participating - Sydnie Taylor and Rylee Harris and also involvement of families & ministry groups providing Sunday meals. The Holy Spirit is definitely at work!













Notes from: Justice Ministry

"March-ing" into April, the Living Springs Justice Ministry has much to give thanks for and to celebrate! We saw God at work as we came together to address important community problems that plague the lives of thousands of our neighbors in the Midlands.



On March 13th the MORE Justice Rally brought together Living Springs members, along with hundreds of other people of faith, to prepare to ask public officials for changes that would address important community problems, namely, food insecurity, safe and affordable housing, crime and gun violence, and care for those with mental illness. At the Rally we heard about the research that was conducted all year to identify proven solutions to address these needs. We heard what we would be asking for when we met with our officials.

On March 27th the Justice work for this year came to fruition. Living Springs members and friends joined almost 800 other people of faith at the Township Auditorium for the Nehemiah Action to speak up for our neighbors in need. The Mayor, the Police Chief, a spokesperson from the Sheriff, and several Council members also were there, listening and responding to what they heard. The large turnout – People Power – helped make the event a success. There was a positive response to what MORE Justice was asking for: greater access to publicly owned land for local healthy food initiatives (e.g., community gardens and produce stands), exploration of ways to keep the Mobile Market financially sustainable long-term, continuing pursuit of an affordable housing trust fund, continuing progress in operationalizing the Office of Violent Crime Prevention, and continuing CIT training for law enforcement. God blessed us with a powerful evening when "Justice rolled down like the waters and righteousness like a mighty stream" (Amos 5:24)!

Coming together with 25 other congregations – People Power - made it possible to ask for changes for our neighbors and to have public officials listen and respond. Living Springs heard God's call and stepped out in faith to bring people together (as did Nehemiah) to do justice. God was present as we follow the scriptural mandate to "do Justice" (Micah 6:8) and we surely felt that blessing each and every step of the way! Thanks be to God.

The Wonder of Worship

Getting Ready to "Go to Church"

We've been talking about what it means to "worship." In worship we pour out our love for God, and God responds by pouring out love to us through water, word, meal, and the joy of Christian fellowship. This mutual relationship of love transforms our lives and then flows from us to others. While it's true that we don't have to be in a church building to worship God, when we do meet on Sundays, every gathering is meant to be a very special time—something anticipated, savored, cherished. Christians in America are blessed to have the

freedom to go to church anytime and anyplace, but we never want to take that freedom for granted or let it become too routine.

Here's a couple ways to make "going to church" more of an *adventure* . . . before you even get in the car Sunday morning! Both can be adapted for your own situation from your own imagination.



Prepare ahead of time. Come up with one or a few ways to think ahead about the purpose and joy of Sunday worship on Saturday evening and/or Sunday morning. There's a scene in *Fiddler on the Roof* where the family is rushing about trying to get everything ready before the sun goes down and Sabbath begins. The same mad dash would have happened every Friday. Things had to be done and done well; traditions (to use Tevye's word) needed to be prepared for and enjoyed because each Sabbath was so important, so precious.

How could we anticipate our "Sabbath" gatherings? A few ideas: Maybe by having a short prayer time sometime on Saturday—maybe even with some candles? We could pray for our services at Living Springs and those held all over the world. Maybe by getting an earlier start on Saturday chores so we're not as likely to fall into bed exhausted late Saturday night? And a corollary: Go to bed earlier than usual! Maybe have clothes and other stuff picked out Saturday evening so Sunday morning isn't so much of a rush? Maybe special music and/or food Sunday morning? You get the idea.

Imagine that going to church is <u>not</u> a given. First century Christians met for worship in a hostile environment. It would be centuries before the Roman Empire embraced Christianity. So "going to church," which was usually at someone's home, was potentially dangerous. You'd probably be looking over your shoulder on your trip, concerned about who might be watching. Sadly, the same is true in many places in the world today, with China just one example. A few decades ago there was some tolerance for Christians meeting together, but things have tightened up (unless you attend a state-approved church). For persecuted Christians in any era, outside pressure was and is difficult, but it also stands to make in-


