As I look ahead to summer, this Scripture reading from our joyful celebration of Pentecost (May 28) echoes in my mind. I think about the many gifts of time, talent, treasure, sacrifice, and service that the Spirit works in followers of Jesus to plant seeds of God's growing hope in the world: a miracle of the Spirit I see every month here at LS, especially as we all pull together to make preparations for summer ministries that will impact so many lives.

Among them all, I remember what I affectionately called "those peanut butter cracker people" - a couple of older adults who showed up every day and smiled at each of us as they assembled peanut butter crackers and





Notes from: Worship & Music Ministry

The Wonder of Worship

Congregational Singing & Other Forms of Church Music

Q: What's the first reference to music in the Bible? Maybe Leviticus where there's lots of instructions on worshiping God? The Psalms?





Nope! Genesis 4:20-21: "Adah gave birth to Jabal; ... His brother's name was Jubal; he was the father of all who play the harp and flute." Long before Noah

there was music—even different instruments—and there are many references throughout Scripture. Moses and the Israelites sang a powerful song to the Lord after the Exodus (Exo. 15:1-18). At one point God tells Moses: "Now write down for yourselves this song and teach it to the Is-

raelites and have them sing it" (Deut. 31:19-22, with God as Composer/Lyricist!). The book of Psalms was ancient Israel's hymnbook. And on and on. Read Revelation 15:1-4, the last biblical reference, for the song we'll sing after Christ comes again!

Bottom line? The capacity to make and be moved by music was built into the human spirit by our Creator. Music is a major way we communicate with God. Some people may be particularly gifted, but the Bible makes it clear that worship music is important for **all** of God's people. So, let's take a quick look at how music functions in our services starting with a simple categorization (not the only one, but a helpful one) of Hymns and Anthems.

Hymns = Music the entire congregation sings together regardless of musical style, whether traditional (e.g., "A Mighty Fortress"), contemporary ("10,000 Reasons"), or any other style. As Lutherans we also have a subset of congregational music in the liturgical pieces that we sing or chant: Kyries, Canticles of Praise, Great Thanksgiving, Lamb of God, etc.

Anthems = Music not sung by the entire congregation, but sung and/or played by one or more people, such as the LS Choir, Disciples of Harmony, or various soloists or other groups. Anthems are also played by JuBELLation or other instruments. Here are two points to think about.

Sometimes Anthems are called "special music." A relatively small number of people rehearse ahead of 1.



time, etc. Doesn't that make it more "special" than congregational Hymns? Actually, no, once you think about the true purpose of music at church. There is nothing more important, more "special" than when the entire church body joins as one to sing praise to God! That's why we gather: to collectively pour out our praise, thanksgiving, and petitions to God through Hymns and to be reminded through the Word and through music of who we are in Christ and what we are called to do. Anthems are aimed at the very same goals. They just provide time to reflect on great truths and to experience the presence of the Spirit in different ways. And this leads to the second point:

2. Engage! Enter in! Sing out! Don't worry about what you sound like. J You're singing mainly for the Lord's ears! 
