

Amazing Summer "Growing Hope!" (from Pastor

JULY BIBLE "BOOKS" OF THE MONTH = Romans 1-16, Galatians 1-6
PASTOR TIME: Sunday, 6/23 @ 9:20am

"Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!" - Matthew 13:8-9

Nearly 2000 years ago, Jesus shared his parable about the miracle of sowing God's kingdom seed. Many Biblical scholars believe that Jesus would be in particular settings and notice something around him—and then would use whatever he saw to teach people about the grace-filled, hope-growing Kingdom of God. Jesus sees a shepherd with his sheep, so Jesus teaches about the amazing Kingdom of God with a parable about a shepherd and a lost sheep. Jesus sees a farmer in a field—so Jesus teaches about the amazing Kingdom of God by sharing a parable about a sowing seed. Jesus sees laborers working in a vineyard; Jesus sees a father hugging his son; Jesus sees a wounded traveler being cared for; Jesus seesyou get the idea. Everything Jesus sees reminds him about God's amazing kingdom!

I cannot even come close to claiming I have the eyes of Jesus. But these summer weeks have again and again reminded me of that insight shared by a seminary professor long ago. Everywhere I look, I seem to see reminders of the amazing kingdom of God, which comes near and grows hope in the world.

At a **June Synod Assembly**, I am reminded about the amazing Kingdom of God, as I see countless ministries that are growing hope because SC Lutheran Christians and our congregations bond together to make possible recovery ministries, aging ministries, retreat ministries, Campus ministries, and more.

I drive by **Prisma Children's Hospital**, and I hear in my heart the powerful stories shared by their speaker at our June **LS Hope Sunday**, (including how the people of LS make such a difference with our monthly meals for families with children/youth on the cancer floor) - and I am reminded of God's kingdom hope!


From the Desk of Pastor Carl

Well, stick around till the end of this newsletter to find out. They had an absolute blast learning and gaining knowledge, all while having a great time as they ventured through the seasons.

And that's not all! In the final week of June, we kicked off our first of two Art Smart Drama Camp weeks. The kids were thrilled to embark on a journey through the story of Nicodemus. They had music, drama skits, and exciting games, all centered around Nicodemus and the idea of seeking. It was incredible to witness God working through these amazing kids. He's always at work within us, and seeing His presence shine through them was truly inspiring.



I walk into the Columbia airport arrival area, with staff from Lutheran Services, and I see smiles of amazement amid fearful eyes, as an endangered **refugee family** of 8 Syrian children & 2 parents are greeted with our LS church bus, groceries, and a hand-made welcome sign from children in our LS Child Development Center—and I am reminded about the hope grown as God's kingdom still comes near!

At our **June VBS and June Artsmart Camp**, there are countless interactions between community/cong. children and caring LS volunteers, music/drama leaders, Pastor Carl, Minister Lavone—and with all these, I am reminded how hope grows in young

lives through the amazing kingdom of God coming near!

At **Lutheridge**, I see the expression in young faces (with many tears of joy) letting you know that Jesus has found a deeper place in their hearts because of faith shared with them by college-age counselors and adult leaders amidst the wonder of God's creation—and I am reminded how hope continues to grow through the amazing kingdom of God coming near!

Also, while at camp, multiple children come running up to me from **Cristo Rey**, our LS Mission Partner congregation (who just happen to be at camp), greeting me with surprised smiles & hugs, asking about the LS "ladies" who come to spend time with them & teach them Bible lessons—and I am reminded how hope continues to grow through the amazing seeds of God's kingdom being sown!

I see an alert from the State newspaper about the city of Columbia announcing a director for a new office to address Community Gun Violence—and I rejoice at how God is growing hope through the kingdom efforts of a **Justice Ministry** shared by God's people here at LS and the Midlands!

With weekly Bible studies, Scout meetings, Meals on Wheels, 2 NA recovery groups at LS, summer hymn-sings, monthly men's breakfasts, Sunday children's messages, Wednesday Bible story readings, and more—everywhere I see reminders of how God is growing is growing the amazing hope of God's kingdom coming near!

I look at our July calendar and see: Adult Mission Experience, Youth Mystery Mission Trip, Graceworks, ArtSmart Camp#2, Christmas in July Homeless Ministry Collection, Family Promise meal, and all our other ongoing ministries—and I am reminded of the amazing hope that will be sown and grown in people's lives this month ahead, through the amazing kingdom of God still ever coming near!

As we move into the warm summer months, it's always fun to hear about where the children have been, whom they have visited, and how they have spent some of their days so far. Stories of beach days, trips to grandparents, and visits with loved ones.

We have been busy here at the CDC with lots of exciting activities and ways that we are sharing hope.

Our 4/5 year-olds welcomed summer with an end-of-year celebration. It was wonderful to once again come together in the sanctuary to honor our students and their teacher, Ms. Daneequa, for the hard work they have put in. The children sang songs, spoke about future plans, and celebrated moving on to kindergarten.

Our Summer camp is in full gear with picnics, waterplay days, art activities, and field trips. They visited The Rice Estates to deliver 72 cards to the residents in celebration of Father's Day. They also took a tour of Publix on Hardscrabble, where a shopper was so impressed with their demeanor and attitudes, that they gave each student 3 \$ to spend in the store.

We are pleased to announce that after a vet visit and a clean bill of health, our sweet kitty Martin has found a permanent home with one of our families; he is officially "Martin L. Causey".

Our staff was able to come together for a staff development day. This was the first opportunity since our last inservice in August for the staff to come together as a group and participate in prayer lunch. This is a fundamental piece of who we are as a center and what is at the core of our school family. I would guess that most people that know me would likely say that my Love Language is Food; providing, preparing, sharing, eating, experiencing, and exploring all the aspects of food and what it means to Welcome ALL to the Table. This space provides an opportunity to listen, share, learn, lean into, hear, see, and embrace the chance to get to know one another as we shed our armor and talk about the joys, hardships, and rawness of what it means to share this human experience together. This time together is precious and vital. Just today I had a former staff member visit and said that they dearly miss being a part of this school family because of the prayer lunches; the closeness that they felt and the companionship it provided. They expressed how they miss that experience since moving to the public school system.

I continue to be grateful to be a part of this ministry and love to hear the stories from staff, children, families, and the community on how LSLC-CDC has somehow touched their lives.

Notes from: Justice Ministry

Summertime offers us a moment to reflect on "doing Justice".

- Justice is holding public officials accountable for how our neighbors in Columbia are treated.
- Being a champion for justice is uncomfortable at times. We may not like confrontation. We may feel out of our comfort zone since we ourselves aren't currently hungry, homeless, a victim of violence, or living below the poverty line.
- Why "do justice"?



Why do you participate in the Living Springs Justice Ministry? Scores of LS members do this regularly.

- Perhaps it's because you've heard God's call in Micah 6:8 to "do Justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God."
- Perhaps it's because you have witnessed injustice first-hand and you want to do something about what's wrong.
- Perhaps it's because a parent or grandparent modeled for you the joy of a life engaged in doing justice.
- Perhaps it's because at Justice Ministry events you've felt the satisfaction and kinship that come from walking hand-in-hand with people different than yourself who share your commitment to making the world a fairer place.



This summer the justice work continues. MORE Justice is meeting with public officials, other concerned agencies, and people in need who are affected by problems of affordable housing, crime and gun violence, and food insecurity. This summer take a moment to reflect on why <u>you</u> do justice. It's time -- summertime!

Notes from: Worship & Music Ministry

The Wonder of Worship

In our study of the different elements that make up our Sunday morning worship services, we come to these three (one spoken; two sung):

Apostolic Greeting, Kyrie, Canticle of Praise

Here's a couple of questions for you.



Q: The words of the "Apostolic Greeting" are said every single Sunday morning by one of the pastors and by us. What are those words and why are they said?

A: The words are these (or something like this): Pastor: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all." Congregation: "And also with you." Sounds familiar, right? The Apostolic Greeting comes early in the service and it's a dialogue, but not just between the pastor and us. The words are meant to remind all of us about who we are, a people gathered together with our great God whose grace we receive and share with each other. The words are historic, spanning church history back to when the apostles Paul, Peter, and other New Testament writers used similar language in communicating with our earliest brothers and sisters in Christ, e.g., "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (2 Cor. 13:13). Using words like this to greet each other on Sundays or any time remind us to see each other as God's beloved children.

Then, immediately after the **Apostolic Greeting**, a "Kyrie" or a "Canticle of Praise" is often (not always) sung. (Sometimes both are sung). Which leads to the next question:

Q: What is a Kyrie and why do we sing it?

Lutherans are used to singing the Greek words "kyrie eleison" (KEER-ee-ay eh-LAY-zon) which mean "Lord, have mercy." But it's good to remember that this is not a plea for God's mercy to forgive our sins, right? Because the service begins with a time of confession and the assurance of God's forgiveness. Instead, the **Kyrie** is a prayer we pray/sing together asking for God's help and guidance in every aspect of our lives. It's acknowledging how much we need God's protection, intervention, guidance, and courage to make it through each day and week. We express this together as God's forgiven people.

Q: So then, what about the **Canticle of Praise** that sometimes follows a **Kyrie** or is sung in place of it?

This one's easy. A "canticle" or "song" of praise is an opportunity for God's people to pour out their overflowing gratitude and praise for the fact the God does indeed show us mercy, showering us with grace, giving us strength, wisdom, joy, hope, and all that we need to live as followers of Christ through His Holy Spirit. Think of "This is the Feast" that we sing during Easter! Is there a more joyous song than that? Sheer praise to our great God!

There's such richness in our worship services!

Crafty Ladies




LADIES BOOK CLUB

Who We Are: A group of women whose mission it is to continue to walk in the way of Jesus. This weekend changed our lives. We continued the weekend with a 12,week Renewal to deepen our understanding of our purpose and our calling to be better women of God. This is not your typical women's retreat. 
