It was such a wonderful experience to see our congregation-wide "Journey for Jesus" theme having such a positive impact in people's hearts and lives this past month: the pre-worship Sunday sharing times; the wonderful Wednesday YouTube/Facebook postings (be sure to share with others!!!); all the special study times with youth/parents/adults/seniors; the many "Dwelling in the Word" times with church teams and groups; and perhaps most importantly, all the times spent at home, or in car rides, or other places with readings and faith discussions among family members, spouses, friends. In September, we focused on various early events in Jesus' life, including his childhood, baptism, and early ministry. Now, in October, we devote a month to looking as some of the miracles performed in the first half of Jesus' ministry.

Sometimes, the word "miracle" can lead us down a path of thinking about magic hocus-pocus stuff. To avoid this misleading path, what if we instead think about the miracles of Jesus as embodying "the activity of God which changes human lives or reveals God's power in surprising ways—even in ways that may defy our limited human thought or logic."

In this context, we can come to a better appreciation that such miracles are not just events we read about in the Bible, but that such miracles are truly around us everywhere—just as surely as Christ is with us everyday (like he promised) and the Holy Spirit is among us everyday.

Hey Everyone...

September has gone by fast. October is upon us, and the end of this year is fast approaching. Our kids have settled into a school rhythm and flow of assignments, and those active in sports have experienced the joys and pains of being an athlete.

With that being said, let me recap September for you.

- We have continued our Sunday youth meeting time on Sundays from 10 a.m. to 10:20 a.m. This space gives time for check-in and the highs and lows of the week.
- God's Work Our Hands was a good day and event. We packed backpacks for our schools and prepared and sent out to the community over 250 meals. Our six confirmands started their journey toward being confirmed on October 29, 2023.
- We did Rush Hour Ministry on Tuesday, 9-12-23, and it was good to see how God uses us to be in service to others. Having the opportunity to say God bless you, pass out a small gift of love, and hold a sign that says God is with you meant a lot to those who drove by on their way home.
- Our football ministry continues to move forward weekly, feeding between 110 and 115 football players, staff, and coaches. To see the dedication of our men each week serving and talking to these young men is a testament to our Journey with Jesus theme as we continue to share and grow with these young men and women which fuel my passion to ---- **"Reach one, Teach one --- Teach one, Be one --- Child of God."** ----- It is a joy to see future leaders in many capacities listen, embody, and share moments of our time during the meals and devotions.



The truth of Emmanuel, "God with us," is at the heart of our Journey with Jesus. And because Jesus still journeys with us here in this world and in our lives, there ARE miracles around us everyday!

Just last month, I witnessed the activity of God having an impact on people's lives in powerful life-changing, mind-expanding, logicdefying ways. I witnessed little bags of hope performing miracles in the hearts & tear-filled eyes of rush hour drives. I witnessed little snack bags & Bible crafts working miracles in the smiling hearts & faces of Cristo Rey children. I witnessed little pew prayer bears working miracles in the eyes of 3 refugee families (from Myanmar, Congo, Syria) aboard the LS bus at Columbia airport on 3 different weeks. I witnessed meals and devotions working miracles in the hearts of 100+ youth football players, mesmerized by the stories of life-changing faith in various famous athletes. I witnessed a miracle, as I felt the presence of God and heard the language of faith amidst the work of doctors and staff in the Pediatric ICU, for one of our youth who had suffered a brain aneurysm. I witnessed miracles of hope brought to numerous families this month with the assistance they received from your LS family fund and our LS R2 emergency youth fund—amid various catastrophes and devastating life situation. I witnessed another miracle of loaves & fish with dozens & dozens of old-fashioned meat-loaf meals delivered to community members in need and first responders during "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday! And these are only the tip of the iceberg - list goes on and on Miracles of God's activity having an impact on lives in powerful, mind-blowing ways!

Oh yes, this month, we will take time in our "Journey with Jesus" emphasis focusing on miracles of Jesus from the Gospels (see below). But with that, I pray we find ourselves even more greatly aware of the ongoing miracles of God's activity around us everyday! From a sunrise to fall colors to actions of love & grace & justice performed in the name of Jesus—miracles everywhere! 

The German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes:

"The first service one owes to others in a community involves listening to them. Just as our love for God begins with listening to God's word, the beginning of love for others is learning to listen to them. God's love for us is shown by the fact that God not only gives God's Word, but also lends us God's ear. ...We do God's work for our brothers and sisters when we learn to listen to them."

As our Justice Ministry house meetings continue, we have heard heartfelt conversations about concerns in our community. Across our county other house meetings among different faith families are hearing the same things.

On Monday October 30th at 6:00pm Clergy, team leaders, and MORE justice members will gather to hear some of the concerns we have shared, at our Community Problems Assembly. This is such an important part of discerning and listening. When I think back a few years ago to an assembly where we voted to focus on safe affordable housing, I remember the news headline a few days later. "Two Die from carbon monoxide poisoning at Allen Benedict Court." The work on this issue continues. We are listening!

Notes from: Worship & Music Ministry

The Wonder of Worship

Holy Communion



Communion, aka The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist (which means *thanksgiving*), doesn't need much explanation. It's explained each week from Scripture . . . In the night in which he was betrayed our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and give it to his disciples ... We're active participants as individuals and as a faith community. Everything in the service leads up to this time of special, close com-



munion with Christ and each other. It's not covered by a line or two in the bulletin, but with 4-5 pages of liturgy. When I first came to Living Springs I was deeply moved by all of this plus the fact that we celebrated Holy Communion *every single week*! It took a while, though, to understand it all, and I'd like to share a little of that journey.

Presentation of the Elements/Offering Prayer and Song: I was used to all of the elements—the bread and the wine/ grape juice—already placed on the altar when the service started, which is true in our 8:15 am service. But in the second service, why are the elements brought forward to the altar? I learned that those who present the elements are members of the congregation who represent all of us, and that the action is symbolic in two ways. First, it pictures worship in the Old Testament where God's people brought offerings of animals, birds and grain (Leviticus 1-7) and material goods (e.g., Exodus 25:1-7) to the altar to receive God's grace and mercy and show gratitude for the One who creates and sustains life. It also pictures followers of Jesus today who offer up our lives and express our desire to be continually transformed by God's grace. After the elements are presented, this section concludes with a prayer and a song.

Eucharistic Dialog & Prayer, Lord's Prayer, Invitation to Communion, Lamb of God: You know when our pastors sing/ chant "The Great Thanksgiving" and we respond: *The Lord be with you/and also with you* | *Lift up your hearts/We lift them to the Lord* | *Let us give thanks to the Lord our God/It is right to give our thanks and praise?* This liturgical dialog dates back to the 3rd century! I *love* thinking of our brothers and sisters in Christ through the centuries using these same



words to prepare their hearts for Holy Communion. This is followed by a prayer and the words of institution (partially quoted in the first paragraph) reminding us of what Jesus asked us to do to never forget Him. Then, before we come to the Lord's Table for the Lord's Supper, we pray the Lord's Prayer together. After the prayer we are invited to the table and we respond by asking in song for Jesus, the Lamb of God, to have mercy on us.

Distribution of Communion, Post Communion Blessing and Prayer: We now come to the rail (I *love* how we walk up together!) to be served the elements and be reminded that they are the body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. It's interesting to think about what happens here. Jesus wanted his disciples (then and now) to remember him, right? Which is a mental process. So why didn't he ask us to memorize and recite something? Instead, he designed something far more immersive: we walk forward/lift our hands/sometimes kneel; we hear the words said to us; we see the bread and wine; we can smell them; we touch them; we taste them; they become part of us. It's a mental, physical, spiritual action reflective of Mark 12:30: *Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and*



strength. When everyone, including the pastors and assisting ministers, has been served, Communion concludes with a blessing said over us and a prayer. Beautiful—meaningful—the highpoint of each and every week.



Camp Hands of Hope @ Camp Kinard

<u>Camp Hands of Hope</u>, a program under the Hospice & Palliative Care Foundation, is a weekend-long bereavement camp for youth ages 5-18 and their parent(s) or guardian(s) who live in South Carolina, and have experienced the loss of a loved one.

The next Camp Hands of Hope program is being hosted at Camp Kinard over <u>October 20-22, 2023.</u>

If you or someone you know has a child who has experienced the loss of a loved one in the past 3 months - 3 years, we ask you pass this information along to their parent/guardian so they can apply. Registration will be open until camp spots fill up (space is limited and they will fill up fast).

Camp Hands of Hope is hosted several times throughout year in various locations across the state of South Carolina to provide a youth centered, family focused approach to grief and healing. Camp Hands of Hope assists over 150 individuals annually. Though it costs the Hospice & Palliative Care Foundation over \$750.00 per individual to attend a week-end-long camp, they are proud to provide this resource free of charge to all that attend.

"I don't want to look back." Carl N' Drama finds new home in South Carolina


Prudenciel George Carl N' Drama says he wants to thank all Americans for helping find his freedom.

Th 53-year old refugee from Ivory Coast has only been in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina for a few months, but has already secured a job and a place to live with the help of the LSC New Americans Program.

"I want to thank all the people of the country. I thank all of the American people for giving me the opportunity to be here," Carl N' Drama said.

Ivory Coast, also know as Côte d'Ivoire, officially the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, is a country on the southern coast of West Africa. Carl N' Drama, who speaks French, felt he needed to leave when he started feeling unsafe, always looking over his shoulder. With the help of the United Nations, he found him self in Myrtle Beach. He said he has found his second family in the LSC teammates.

I can say You (LSC) are the very good people. I'm talking about the moral support they provide me. When I first came here, I had a low morale and they were able to talk to me, advise me, and increase my morale for my self-confidence," he said. "So, I appreciate the work that they do, and I thank them for doing to for me."

He added that the people of Myrtle Beach are very welcoming, and he has two part-time jobs lined up to help him become self-sufficient.

He doesn't feel the need to look over his should anymore.; He is free.

"I can say that I'm free because I am in the land of freedom. Generally, the United States is considered the land of freedom. I fee free in this country," Carl N" Drama said. "I don't want to look back. I want to live life to it's fullest."
