- The sound of car horns joyfully beeping and the sight of people waving & smiling—with HOPE in their faces & hearts because of the **300+ Rush Hour bags** freely given to them in love, as they sat stressed out in traffic the weeks before Christmas;
- The sight of meals being delivered to **Palmetto Place's Samantha House & Prisma Children's Hospital** to grow HOPE in youth transitioning out of foster care and families facing the challenge of a child's illness;

- The sight of little honeybee, goat, chick, and other animal/ministry ornaments being selected from our **ELCA World Hunger Good Gifts** table—all to grow God's HOPE in people's lives throughout the world with Christmas gift that really matter;
- The sight & sound of caring door-step conversations and dozens of meal delivered each week, with special Christmas additions this month, to grow God's Hope in the lives of isolated senior adults through our LS **Meals on Wheels ministry**;
- The sight of nearly 100 "Journey with Jesus" intent envelopes (a new high # for recent years), filling the sand path at the Baptismal font & representing a commitment of LS disciples to grow God's HOPE in more lives thru our giving to the Lord;




STUFF A BUS Saturday, February 10






INCLUSIVENESS NETWORK WALKING TOUR

Meet Mack, a junior engineering major. Mack entered our ministry as a curious freshman seeking connection and a faith community, and now we've become a cornerstone in her life. But beyond that, over the years she has blossomed into a confident and compassionate leader here, whether she's lifting up profound theological insights during our group discussion sermons, leading the liturgy on our Thursday Fellowship nights, jumping in on air-guitar during worship, sharing vulnerably about herself on our retreats, or being intentionally invitational with new students to help draw them in to the heart of our community. "Campus ministry has easily been the best thing to happen to me," Mack says. "I gained a loving community at a time when I needed it the most." Mack is a gift to our community and the Church.

This year Mack decided she wanted to host her own weekly Bible study in the living room of her house, and so each Tuesday night students gather there for "Desserts and Da Bible." It's an entirely student-led gathering that has grown exponentially, becoming a vibrant space where students explore God's Word, engage in deep theological conversations, and foster genuine community and connectedness — and have oh so much fun! "Desserts and Da Bible has become the most fulfilling part of my week," Mack shares. "It helps my faith grow in more ways that I could ever imagine." This Bible Study is a beautiful example of Mack cultivating the kind of community and connection that she's experienced in our ministry.

Campus ministry is more than just a place for college students to find belonging. Yes, it is a community where students can be loved exactly for who they are, and they can be met by God in worship, prayer, study, food, and fellowship – which is an incredible gift in itself! But it is also a place of *formation*. A place that is equipping students for a lifetime of faith, service, and leadership. A place that is instilling in students the gifts and skills for creating that same kind of belonging and Christ-centered connectedness wherever they might end up, throughout their whole lives.
