# "Steps of Shining Light!" (this month from Pr. Eric)

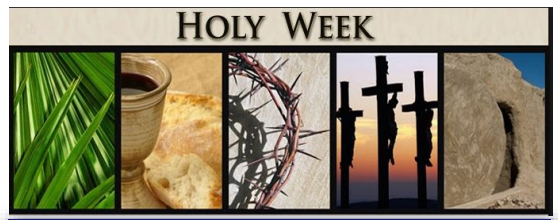

- clinging to your **prayer cross** in a moment of prayer or devotion;
- pausing to touch base with God some morning with an **8:34 prayer alert**;
- finding special meaning with your **"Guided to the Cross" daily devotional**;
- being moved by one of the **Lenten dramatic reflections** at our Wednesday services (if you missed one, they are still available on our YouTube channel);
- finding joy in making a sacrifice and giving of your time to be part of a **Friday Lenten Fish Fry**, to help bring God's love to young lives via Campus Ministry;

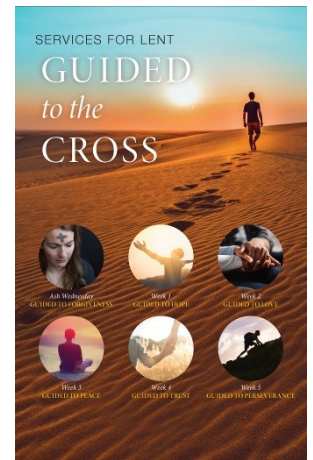

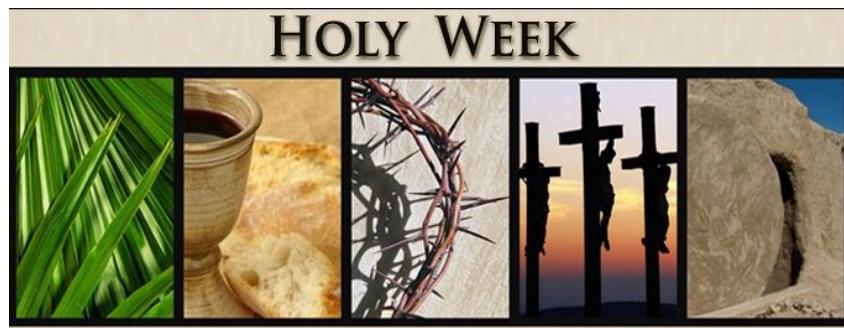
## Our Big Nehemiah Justice Assembly

LS Network Justice Members are gathering the entire congregation (with neighbors/family/friends) to attend the annual Nehemiah Action Assembly set for Monday, Mar. 18 at Eau Claire HS Auditorium. For those who wish, car-pools and buses will leave LS between 5:00 and 5:30. **LS Team leaders will be in the narthex on Sundays to make sure everyone has admission slips - for yourself, as well as those you are inviting (or you can stop by the office during the week).** Each LS Network Member is committed to bring 3 people with them - adding names to the Justice wall of "HOPE" in the narthex. Our goal is 125+ LS folks to join the hundreds who will be there (= ave. Sunday worship for just 1 night of Justice). Come be part of this important effort to respond to Scripture's call to "do justice" and work for positive change in our community (regarding increasing food insecurity, community gun violence, & the crisis for affordable housing)!



**Palm / Passion Sunday, March 24 - Procession of Palms & Passion Reading, 8:15 & 10:30am**  
***"Walking of the Cross" with Northeast UMC, 2pm***

Be sure to be present on Sunday, March 24, for this powerful worship experience to begin the holiest week of our lives. We begin on the front lawn with the Procession of Palms, and then move into the sanctuary for the full reading of Christ's Holy Passion. At 2pm, with join with fellow disciples from Northeast UMC for the devotional "Walking of the Cross" from LS to Northeast UMC.

**Holy Monday, March 25 - Service of Blessing & Healing, Noon & 7pm**

As part of this worship experience, we receive a special blessing and prayer for God's wholeness and healing in our lives, in whatever form it may be needed.

**Holy Wednesday, March 26 - "Journey with Jesus" Bible Reading/Devotion posted online @ Noon**

**Maundy Thursday, March 28 - Holy Communion, noon & 7pm**

We remember our Lord's Last Supper, and how Jesus washed his disciples' feet in the upper room. 7pm Worship concludes with the poignant and powerful Stripping of the Altar. For those who wish the Rite of Foot-Washing is offered before & after 7pm worship. *7pm also live-streamed.*

**Good Friday, April 7 - Tenebrae "Words from the Cross" Service, 7pm**  
***Walking of the Cross, 9am***

With increasing darkness in the 7pm Tenebrae Service, we recall Jesus' 7 sayings spoken from the cross. At 9am, we join with Christians across the world in the devotional practice of "walking the cross" (beginning with devotions at Harmony on Clemson Rd.) Wherever we are this day, we pause in special reverence at 3pm - the hour Jesus breathed his last. *7pm also livestreamed.*

**Holy Saturday, April 8- Easter Vigil, 7:30pm**

We gather by a fire and enter the sanctuary to remember the waiting of that night when our Lord lay in the tomb. We hear foundational stories of Scripture, affirm our identity as God's baptized children, and welcome Easter joy!

**Easter Festival Worship - 10:30am**

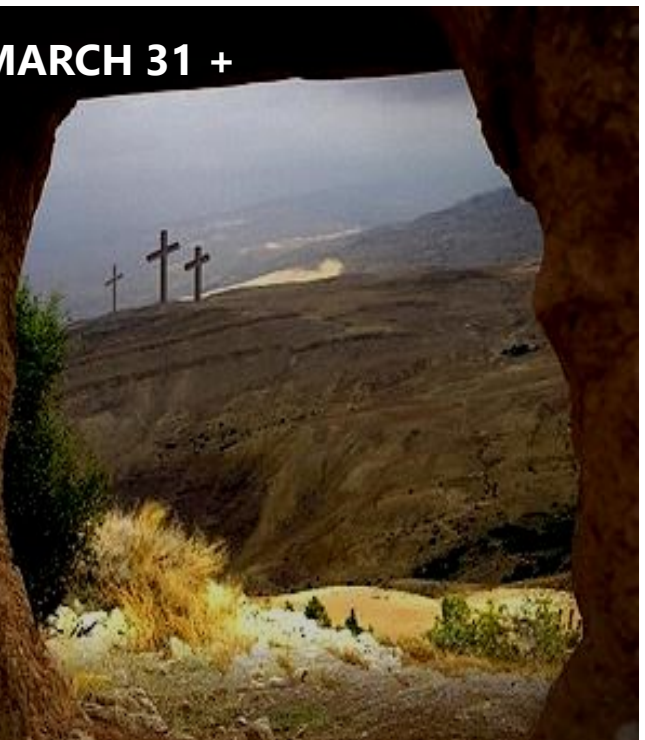

## "WALKING OF THE CROSS": 2 OPPORTUNITIES THIS YEAR!

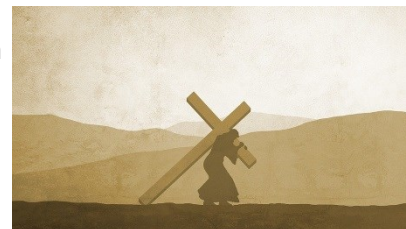
*Palm/Passion Sunday @ 2pm -AND- Good Friday @ 9am*

Over the centuries, Christians have joined in many devotional experiences to embrace the deep meaning of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross. One such practice is the "Walking of the Cross," where Christians publicly carry a large wooden cross, either on Good Friday OR the beginning of Holy Week on Passion/Palm Sunday.

On **Palm Sunday at 2pm**, we will gather at Living Springs with members of Northeast UMC and then process the cross alongside Hardscrabble for 1 mile to Northeast UMC church. Once the walk is completed, if you wish, you can spend some time in personal prayer & reflection at the Prayer Labyrinth located at Northeast UMC.

On **Good Friday at 9am** (hour Jesus was nailed to the cross), we will gather with our Wooden Cross in front of Harmony (2300 Clemson Rd.) for a time of prayer with the residents there. Then, we will process safely on the sidewalk, carrying the cross ½ mile back to LS for prayer. Meet at LS at 8:45am.

You can participate in one or both of the walks. There is a sign-up sheet to help with planning. Each walk should take less than 1 hour. We will have carpools & shuttle transportation. Along the way, you can take turns with partners carrying the cross – or you can just walk along behind the cross. We will pause at various points for prayer & Scripture, focusing on the traditional "Stations of the Cross." This is a very meaningful experience—invite someone to join you to feel the depth of Jesus' love!



## LENTEN 40X40 H.O.P.E. COLLECTION

During Lent, we put God's love in action by making Personal Care Kits for neighbors in the poorest parts of the world. As always, our goal for Lent is 40 X 40 = 1600 total items. Today, the individual items will be assembled into full kits.

### Personal Care Kits include:

- Two bars 4-5 oz. soap (in original wrapping)
- One lightweight bath towel 20x40 to 52x27 (dark color recommended)
- One adult toothbrush (in original packaging)
- One sturdy comb
- One nail clipper (metal)



***If you cannot stay today for the Family Event to help assemble the kits and would like to bring a complete Personal Care Kit, please drop it off during the week.***

*To assemble your kit ... Fold towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.*

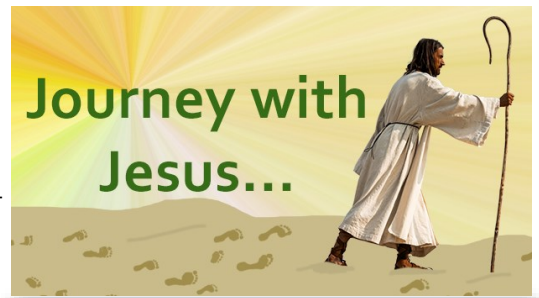
these 3 will allow us to experience the meaning & deep, fulfilling joy of taking active steps to "Shine God's Light!" for others. I do pray that everyone will be able to participate fully in these special March moments:

**Key March Moment #1: LS Ministry Focus Kickoff on March 10!** Every year, LS leaders gather for a planning retreat to discern focus areas for our community of disciples—and every year, we are amazed at what God reveals to us. This year, based on all your "Spirit-note" sharing in January, the Spirit gave us a focus of "Shining God's light" in greater ways (see box below). On March 10, the first day of Daylight Savings (greater light!), we will gather to celebrate our Ministry Focus for the months ahead. We have an exciting **overhead congregational photo** planned for the lawn Kickoff, as well as our all-congregation brunch gathering. There will be "Shine Your Light" cards & bookmarks for everyone, so come be part of this special Sunday!

**Key March Moment #2: Justice Nehemiah Assembly on March 18!** We all have been striving to take a next step of shining God's light, by responding to (and not ignoring) God's Scriptural call for each of us to actively "do justice." The Nehemiah Assembly is one straightforward way we as God's people can actively do justice—by simply showing up and giving only 90 minutes for one night, to gather with hundreds of God's people and move the needle in our community on issues of food insecurity, affordable housing, and community violence. Jesus acted so boldly to live out his Good News of God's kingdom coming near in people's lives in tangible ways. And so too, we have this opportunity to follow in Jesus' footsteps, in the Kingdom's call.

**Key March Moment #3: Holy Week!** Or better said, a whole week of key MOMENTS, plural! These is truly the holiest, and most important, week in our lives as followers of Jesus. We shout Hosanna with palms; we gather for healing; we walk the cross; we uplift the giving of our Lord's Supper; we remember Jesus' act of foot-washing in an upper room; we ponder our Savior's suffering; we are moved by the 7 words Jesus spoke from the cross; we gather by a vigil fire to remember our Baptism; we greet a "Son-rise" and celebrate the greatest victory of God's shining light in the Resurrection of Jesus! As always, it will be so powerful for us to gather in worship, prayer, and devotion for all of Holy Week—what meaning, what joy, what light!

While society focuses on "March Madness," may we as God's people focus on our "March Moments" - as we journey with Jesus to take steps of shining even more light...shining GOD'S LIGHT, beaming from a cross & empty tomb for all! Much love, *Dr. Eric*

We have hope of warmer weather and Sunshine soon on its way, even though Phil said it's a bit longer before spring arrives!

As promised, the votes from our "Groundhogs Day Food Drive" are in: Surprisingly many of our children voted for Phil to see his shadow and continue with 6 more weeks of Winter, and it looks like they were right! We had 53 votes for a longer Winter compared to 35 votes for an early Spring.

With the help of our children, staff, and families, we were able to collect 88 non-perishable items for C.A.B. in Blythewood.

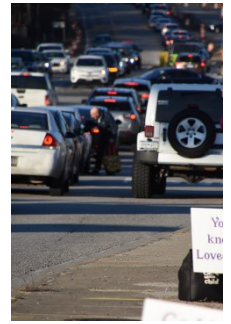

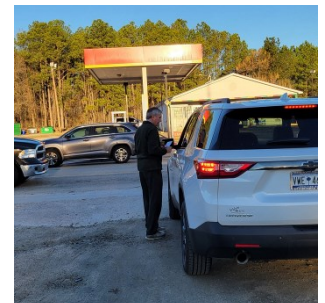

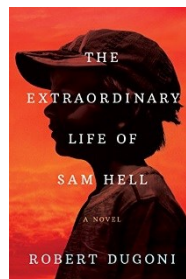
